Cabinet nods bill to set up authority for SCR

Agency to ensure urban development while effectively using the land and protecting the environment.

RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh cabinet on Friday approved the draft bill for establishment of an authority for the development of the Chhattisgarh Capital Region on the lines of the National Capital Region (NCR), Deputy Chief Minister Arun Sao said. The state government also decided to set up a joint venture firm in with collaboration Pan IIT Alumni Reach For India Foundation (PARFI) for the institutional development of tribal groups, poor youth, women and third gender people from other deprived sections in the state, he said.

“The cabinet approved the draft bill for the establishment of the relevant authority for the development of the Chhattisgarh Capital Region (State Capital Region) on the lines of the National Capital

Region,” Sao said.

This authority will work to plan for the capital region, promote investment, coordinate between various government and private organisations and properly control the expansion of the city, he said.

“By 2031, about 50 lakh people are expected to live in this area, so it is important to ensure urban development while effectively

this way, the Capital Region Development Authority will help in making the urban areas of Chhattisgarh better, sustainable and well-organised,” he added.

According to Sao, the formation of a non-profit joint venture company between the Chhattisgarh government and Pan IIT foundation was approved by the cabinet during its meeting chaired by Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai

at Mantralaya Mahanadi Bhawan here. Through this joint venture company, scheduled tribes and poor youth, women and third gender people of other deprived communities will be empowered through institutional vocational education, skill development and rural entrepreneurship, he said.

The firm will also work for the livelihood and socio-economic change by converging the unused funds of Tribal Sub-Plan, Scheduled Caste Sub-Plan etc. for the development of deprived communities, he said. The work of training the trainers of skill development programmes will be done by Pan IIT foundation. The work of teaching foreign languages along with the necessary skills will be done to provide employment opportunities in the international market to the trained youth, he said.

Carlos Alcaraz beats Taylor Fritz to return to the Wimbledon final



LONDON: Carlos Alcaraz moved within one victory of a third consecutive Wimbledon championship and sixth Grand Slam title overall at age 22 by defeating Taylor Fritz 6-4, 5-7, 6-3, 7-6 (6) on Friday.

The No. 2-seeded Alcaraz takes a 24-match winning streak into the final Sunday, when he will face No. 1 Jannik Sinner or 24-time major champion Novak Djokovic.

Alcaraz beat Djokovic in the 2023 and 2024 title matches at the All England Club and is 5-0 so far in major finals.

That includes a five-set comeback win over Sinner at the French Open a month ago.

The fifth-seeded Fritz, the runner-up to Sinner at last year's U.S. Open, was trying to become the first American man in the Wimbledon final since Andy Roddick lost to Roger Federer in 2009.

Fritz had two chances to forced a fifth set against Alcaraz, leading 6-4 in the fourth-set tie-breaker. But Alcaraz on the next four points to finish off the win, then rocked back on his heels, spread his arms wide and screamed.

Newborn baby mauled by stray dogs

An newborn baby was allegedly mauled by stray dogs to death and left near a drain in Hatabazar area, police said on Friday. Police said the baby was three to five days old and was found wrapped in a cloth. A girl cleaning her courtyard allegedly saw dogs attacking the baby. She immediately informed her father, Tahir, who drove the dogs away and alerted other locals. Tahir then contacted the Gagaha police who took custody of the infant's body. According to preliminary probe, the newborn appeared to be between three and five days old. A forensic team was dispatched to the site, which collected samples for examination.

Chhoker, who was arrested by Enforcement Directorate officials on May 4 from a five-star hotel in New Delhi, claimed he was subjected to physical assault during the arrest.



ana High Court granted Chhoker interim bail on medical grounds on June 19, permitting him to undergo surgery at a hospital of his choice.

However, the court explicitly stated that the bail was a “one-time measure” and ordered him to surrender before jail authorities by 5 PM on July 12. A partial working day bench comprising Justices Rajesh Bindal and

R Mahadevan, which took up the plea of Chhoker, was urged by senior lawyer Ashok Aggarwal and advocate Ashish Pandey that the high court erred by not extending the time to surrender for the old leader who was assaulted during the arrest. They also assailed the high court order which said that the interim bail on medical grounds was a “one time measure”. “The

petitioner, a senior citizen and political adversary of the ruling dispensation in the state of Haryana, has been arrested by the Enforcement Directorate in complete violation of the mandate of Article 21 of the Constitution, without following due process of law,” Pandey said.

The plea said the high court, while granting the interim bail on medical grounds on June 19, recorded that Chhoker received injuries including a fractured hand during the arrest.

Mom sentenced to death for killing her three children

The court also imposed a fine of Rs 2.5 lakh on Priyanka and Rs 1 lakh on Ashish.

AURAIYA: A court Auraiya, UP, has sentenced a woman to death for killing her three minor children by drowning them in the Sengar river in 2024, while her paramour was sentenced to life imprisonment in the case.

The woman's nine-year-old son, who survived the attempt on his life, provided crucial testimony in the case.

Additional Sessions Judge Saif Ahmed on Thursday found Priyanka guilty of murdering her own children and pronounced the death penalty. Her paramour Ashish



alias Danny was sentenced to life imprisonment. During the trial, the government counsel argued that the act of a mother conspiring with her lover to drown her innocent children was “rarest of the rare.”

The court also imposed a fine of Rs 2.5 lakh on Priyanka and Rs 1 lakh on Ashish. Furthermore, the court ordered that 75 per cent of the combined fine amount be given to Sonu, the surviving child. According to the police, Priyanka was involved in

a relationship with Ashish after her husband's death. On June 27, 2024, Priyanka along with Ashish took her four sons -- Sonu (9), Madhav (6), Aditya (4), and Mangal (2) -- to the Sengar river bank in Devarpur. They reportedly drugged the children before throwing them into the water one by one. While locals managed to rescue the eldest boy, Sonu, who regained consciousness and later provided crucial testimony against his mother, the three younger children drowned.

Rahul pleads not guilty

PUNE: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday pleaded not guilty in a defamation case pertaining to his comments on Hindutva ideologue V D Savarkar in a Pune court. Judicial Magistrate (First Class) and Special Judge (MP/MLA court) Amol Sriram Shinde read out the charge, levelled by Satyaki Savarkar, a grandnephew of V D Savarkar, to which Gandhi pleaded not guilty

through his lawyer Milind Pawar. The Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha was not present in the court and his lawyer Pawar pleaded not guilty on his behalf before the court. Advocate Sangram Kolhatkar, who is representing Satyaki Savarkar, said since the phase of recording of plea of the accused is over, the trial in the case will proceed now. The court kept the matter for next hearing on July 24.

22 Naxals with bounty of Rs 37.5 lakh surrender

NARAYANPUR: As many as 22 Naxalites, who were active in the Abhujmad area and carrying collective rewards of Rs 37.5 lakh, surrendered in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district on Friday, a senior police official said.

The cadres, belonging to Kutul, Nelnar and Indravati area commit-

tees under the Maad division of Maoists, turned themselves in before senior police, Border Security Force (BSF) and Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) officials here.

The surrendered Naxalites told the police that they were disappointed with the “hollow” Maoist ideology and growing internal differences



within the banned outfit, Narayanpur Superintendent of Police Robinson Guria said.

They were also influenced by the development work being carried out in the Maad area in the district, including rapid construction of roads, and wanted to lead a normal life, he said. Of the Naxalites who gave up arms, Manku Kunjam

(33), a divisional committee member, carried a reward of Rs 8 lakh, while three area committee members, identified as Hidme Kunjam (28), Punna Lal alias Boti (26) and Saniram Korram (25), carried a bounty of Rs 5 lakh each, the official said. Eleven cadres had a bounty of Rs 1 lakh each, while seven others had Rs 50,000 each, he said.

RAIPUR: In the heart of Chhattisgarh's Sukma district, where challenges often outweigh opportunities, two sisters from Kumharras village – Niloti Nag and Muroti Nag – have emerged as beacons of hope and inspiration. '75' REMARK

Political firestorm over Bhagwat's '75' remark: Bhupesh Baghel urges PM Modi to plan exit

RAIPUR: fresh political storm has erupted following Rashtriya Swam-sevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat's recent comment at a book release in Nagpur, where he implied that leaders should step aside after the age of 75. The statement has been widely interpreted as a veiled suggestion for Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who turns 75 this September. Reacting strongly, former Chhattisgarh Chief Minister and Congress General Secretary Bhupesh Baghel took a direct swipe at the Prime Minister. "According to what Mohan Bhagwat has said, the Prime Minister should make an exit plan, because September 17 is not very far away," Baghel told the media.

He further claimed that Bhagwat's comment reflects an internal rift between the BJP and the RSS, hinting that the delay in selecting a suc-

cessor to BJP President J.P. Nadda could be a result of this tension. "It seems they want to handle both transitions together," Baghel added, calling Bhagwat's statement an expression of "internal anger."

The controversy stems from Bhagwat's remarks during a function dedicated to RSS ideologue Moropant Pingle, where he said, "When you turn 75, it means you should stop now and make way for others." Citing Pingle's views, Bhagwat added, "If you are honoured with a shawl after the age of 75, it means you should step aside and let others come forward."

HC cracks down on unrecognized schools

RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh High Court has taken a strong stance against unrecognized private schools operating in the state. In a major order issued on July 11, 2025, the division bench of Chief Justice Ramesh Sinha and Justice Ravindra Kumar Agarwal imposed an immediate ban on new admissions in all unrecognized non-government schools.

This decision came while hearing a PIL related to the implementation of the Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009. The court also directed the Education Secretary to submit a personal affidavit explaining why schools conducting classes from Nursery to KG 2 are functioning without recognition, despite a state regulation from 2013 mandating such approval.

Test tube baby facility to surrendered naxalites

RAIPUR: In a landmark move, the Chhattisgarh government has announced a special initiative aimed at helping surrendered Naxalites reclaim a normal life – including the joy of parenthood. Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma revealed today that the government will now provide free test tube baby (IVF) facilities to surrendered Naxalites who had been sterilized

during their time with Maoist groups. Speaking to the media, Sharma said, "Naxal organizations not only alienated individuals from their families but, in many cases, also took away their chance to become parents through forced sterilization. We are now offering hope and a fresh start." He added that IVF, often costing lakhs of rupees, will be made accessible at no cost to those affected. The Deputy CM



emphasized that the government's rehabilitation policy is not limited to reintegration into society but extends to helping surrendered cadres build families and futures. "We are also planning mass marriages for

young people coming into rehabilitation centers," Sharma said, noting that the Women and Child Development Department will oversee such events. In a sepa-

rate statement, Sharma addressed ongoing anti-Naxal operations during the monsoon season. Acknowledging the tough conditions soldiers face, he said special training is being provided in Hyderabad to prepare forces for challenges unique to this time of year. He concluded by saluting the courage of security personnel, stating, "All challenges are fading before the bravery of our soldiers."

CSERC revises power tariffs with balanced approach

CSERC has approved the power tariffs for FY 2025-26 for the State’s generation, transmission, distribution Co’s and SLDC.

RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh State Electricity Regulatory Commission (CSERC) has approved the power tariffs for FY 2025-26 for the State’s generation, transmission, distribution companies, and State Load Dispatch Centre. The revision has led to an average tariff hike of only 1.89% compared to last year, which officials termed as nominal. MD of the Distribution Company, Bhim Singh Kanwar, clarified that the increase is minimal and specifically structured to shield agricultural consumers, as any cost escalation in that category will be entirely borne by the State Government.

The new tariff structure also expands or maintains subsidies for several consumer categories such as temporary connections, tribal regions, Poha-Murmura units, and printing presses, ensuring widespread economic relief.

While the actual cost of electricity to the State’s power companies stands at Rs 7.02 per unit, domestic consumers continue to receive electricity at heavily subsidized rates starting from Rs 4.10 per unit. Among the key features of the revised tariffs is a nominal hike of 10 paise



per unit for lower-middle-class domestic consumers and 20 paise per unit for other domestic users.

In a notable move, cowsheds, stay homes, and tribal hostels in areas under the Bastar and South Tribal Development Authority and Surguja and North Development Authority have been reclassified under the domestic category, making them eligible for lower domestic rates. Temporary domestic connec-

tions, which were earlier charged at 1.5 times the standard rate, will now be billed at 1.25 times the normal tariff.

To improve telecom connectivity in Left-Wing Extremism (LWE)-affected districts, the Commission has approved a 10% concession in energy charges for all mobile towers operating in these regions. For agricultural pump sets, the tariff has been increased by 50 paise per unit. However, this addi-

tional cost will be fully absorbed by the State Government, ensuring that farmers face no extra financial burden.

Non-domestic consumers will see an increase of 25 paise per unit in their power bills. Temporary connections in this category will also benefit from a reduced billing multiplier—brought down from 1.5 to 1.25 times the standard tariff.

EV charging tariff at Rs 7.02 per unit for LT connections

In a move aligned with green goals, the Commission has set the EV charging tariff at Rs 7.02 per unit for low-tension (LT) connections, matching the average cost of power supply. For high-tension (HT) consumers, the EV charging rate has been fixed at

Rs 6.32 per KVAH.

The 10% energy charge discount for businesses and enterprises run by registered women self-help groups (SHGs) has been continued, further strengthening women’s economic empowerment. Similarly, hospitals, nurs-

ing homes, and diagnostic centres operating in rural areas and tribal regions under the Bastar and South Tribal Development Authority and Surguja and North Development Authority will continue to receive a % concession on energy charges.

NIT Raipur students develop simple devices for rural healthcare

RAIPUR: Measuring children’s height is a common practice in Anganwadi centers and primary schools, but it is usually done using manual stadiometers. These devices are bulky, difficult to carry from one place to another, and require two people – one to hold the child and another to take the reading.

Recently, NIT Raipur signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with JSS Ganiyari. The aim is to help students understand rural healthcare challenges and develop low-cost, accessible, Indian-made medical devices. As most medical equipment in India is still imported, this initiative is a step towards reducing dependency on foreign products. The team is being guided by Dr. Saurabh Gupta, Associate Professor in the Department of Biomedical Engineering, NIT Raipur. Additionally, bring-



ing the child from their place to the stadiometer is also a challenge, as children are often reluctant to come forward and do not cooperate due to fear or hesitation.

To solve this problem, two students from NIT Raipur - Rishabh Ranjan Jha and Shubham Jangir - have developed a small and simple device that can measure a child’s height within 5 seconds, right where they are standing, by simply placing the device on their head. The device is light-

weight and portable. It has been tested in over 10 Anganwadi centers and 2 primary schools in the Mohla-Manpur and Ambagarh Chowki districts of Chhattisgarh on more than 250 children and showed an accuracy of 99.998%. Rishabh mentioned that although digital height meters are available in the market, this device is much easier to use according to rural needs. The device also received positive feedback from Anganwadi workers.

NIT Raipur students develop simple devices for rural healthcare

RAIPUR: Measuring children's height is a common practice in Anganwadi centers and primary schools, but it is usually done using manual stadiometers. These devices are bulky, difficult to carry from one place to another, and require two people – one to hold the child and another to take the reading.

Recently, NIT Raipur signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with JSS Ganiyari. The aim is to help students understand rural healthcare challenges and develop low-cost, accessible, Indian-made medical devices. As most medical equipment in India is still imported, this initiative is a step towards reducing dependency on foreign products. The team is being guided by Dr. Saurabh Gupta, Associate Professor in the Department of Biomedical Engineering, NIT Raipur. Additionally, bring-



ing the child from their place to the stadiometer is also a challenge, as children are often reluctant to come forward and do not cooperate due to fear or hesitation.

To solve this problem, two students from NIT Raipur - Rishabh Ranjan Jha and Shubham Jangir - have developed a small and simple device that can measure a child's height within 5 seconds, right where they are standing, by simply placing the device on their head. The device is light-

weight and portable. It has been tested in over 10 Anganwadi centers and 2 primary schools in the Mohla-Manpur and Ambagarh Chowki districts of Chhattisgarh on more than 250 children and showed an accuracy of 99.998%. Rishabh mentioned that although digital height meters are available in the market, this device is much easier to use according to rural needs. The device also received positive feedback from Anganwadi workers.

The Chhattisgarh State Electricity Regulatory Commission (CSERC) has announced new electricity tariffs for the state.

RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh State Electricity Regulatory Commission (CSERC) has announced new electricity tariffs for the state, which will come into effect on July 1, 2025. The revised rates reflect an average increase of 1.89% across all consumer categories for the financial year 2025-26.

The CSERC has approved an annual revenue requirement of 25636.38 crore for the state's power distribution company, a reduction from the 28397.64 crore initially requested. The estimated electric-



ity sales for the upcoming fiscal year have also been adjusted upwards to 36540 million units. The projected revenue deficit for the distribution company is now set at 523.43 crore, a significant decrease from earlier estimates. The average cost of electricity supply and the average billing rate are both estimated at 7.02 per unit for FY 2025-26.

Under the new order, domestic consumers will see an increase in electricity rates ranging from 0.10 to 0.20 per

unit. Certain facilities like gaushalas and government-notified stay homes in specific tribal development regions will now be categorized under domestic tariffs. The charge for temporary domestic connections has been reduced to 1.25 times the normal tariff.

For non-domestic consumers, electricity rates will increase by 0.25 per unit. Offset printers and printing presses have been reclassified, and temporary non-domestic connections will also be charged at 1.25 times the

Eighteen bodies were recovered till Thursday night, and the operation resumed on the third day with efforts being made by the teams engaged at the site to trace two more persons, who are miss-

You show me one photograph, one image, which shows any damage done to any Indian structure – even a glass pane being broken,” Doval stressed. “These satellite images are available all over the world. They (The New York Times and others) brought out images and published them. The images only showed that 13 airbases in Pakistan before and after May 10 were destroyed, whether in Sargodha, Rahim Yar Khan or Chaklala,” he said. “I am only telling you what the foreign media put out on the basis of imagery – where is the damage? We are capable of doing that (destroying terror bases and inflicting damage on Pakistani airbases),” Doval added. Indian security forces launched Operation

Sindoor in the intervening night of May 6-7, decimating nine terror camps, including the headquarters of Lashkar-e-Taiba and Hizbul Mujahideen, inside Pakistan as well as in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). The strikes were carried out in retaliation for the deadly terror attack in Kashmir’s Pahalgam on April 22, in which Pakistan-sponsored terrorists killed 26 civilians. He said India had got all the information regarding targets and under the ‘Operation Sindoor’, Indian forces performed with accuracy and precision, to cause maximum damage to targeted destinations in the Pakistan. Despite supports from China and Turkiye Pakistan could not cause any damage to Indian force, he asserted.

Squally weather conditions are also expected along the state’s coastline, leading to a ban on fishing activities. A red alert, indicating extremely heavy rainfall exceeding 20 cm in 24 hours, has been issued for Malappuram and Kozhikode on June 17. The alert is extended to Wayanad, Kannur, and Kasaragod on June 18, as monsoon activity intensifies in the northern districts. The red alert represents the most severe weather warnings, indicating extremely heavy rainfall within 24 hours. An orange alert, which signals very heavy rain ranging from 11 to 20 cm, has been announced for Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Idukki, Thrissur, and Palakkad on June 16,17. The weather department has also issued an orange alert

on June 18 in Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Kannur, and Kasaragod. Several other districts are under yellow alert, which is issued for expected heavy rainfall between 6 and 11 cm. The IMD has issued a yellow alert for Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, and Alappuzha on June 17, while on June 18 yellow alert is issued for Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Idukki, and Thrisur. NHAI tightens norms for blacklisting ‘Loose FASTags’



NEW DELHI : National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has strengthened its mechanism for reporting and blacklisting ‘Loose FASTags’ - commonly referred to as “tag-in-hand” - in a bid to enhance tolling efficiency and ensure the authenticity of FASTag usage. As India gears up for initiatives like the Annual Pass System and Multi-Lane Free Flow (MLFF) tolling, the move aims to curb misuse and operational disruptions caused by FASTags that are not affixed to vehicle wind screens. Such practices have led to lane congestion, false chargebacks, and misuse in closed-loop systems, hampering the overall efficiency of the Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) network. To tackle the issue, NHAI has issued instructions to toll collecting agencies.

An orange alert, which signals very heavy rain ranging from 11 to 20 cm, has been announced for Pathanamthitta, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Idukki, Thrissur, and Palakkad on June 16,17. The weather department has also issued an orange alert

on June 18 in Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Kannur, and Kasaragod. Several other districts are under yellow alert, which is issued for expected heavy rainfall between 6 and 11 cm. The IMD has issued a yellow alert for Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, and Alappuzha on June 17, while on June 18 yellow alert is issued for Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Pathanamthitta, Alappuzha, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Idukki, and Thrissur. In addition to rainfall alerts, the IMD has warned of squally weather with wind speeds of 40 to 50 kmph, gusting up to 60 kmph along and off the Kerala coast. These conditions are expected to prevail until June 18. Fishermen have been strictly advised not to venture into the sea during this period due to the risk of rough sea conditions. State disaster management officials have urged residents in vulnerable areas to exercise caution, particularly in hilly regions prone to landslides and flooding.

Family of eight thrashed seeking shelter during rain in Rajasthan

JAIPUR : Members of a family from Madhya Pradesh, who came to worship at a temple in Rajasthan’s Sikar district, were beaten up for taking shelter in front of a shop during the rain on Friday, police said. Two shopkeepers and two employees were arrested in connection with the incident, they said. According to police, a family of around eight people, which included three women and a minor girl, had come to worship at the Khatu Shyam temple. They stood in front of a shop near the temple as it was pouring. When the shopkeeper asked them to vacate the premise, they requested him to let them stay until the rain passed. However, he kept insisting that the family move out. The family was forced out, but the shopkeeper kept arguing with them. When a female member of the family objected to his behaviour, he brought out a stick and began hitting them. A nearby shopkeeper and their employees joined him, causing the locals to alert the police. Khatu Shyamji Station House Officer Pawan Kumar said that four people.

FASTAG

NHAI tightens norms for blacklisting ‘Loose FASTags’



NEW DELHI : National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has strengthened its mechanism for reporting and blacklisting ‘Loose FASTags’ - commonly referred to as “tag-in-hand” - in a bid to enhance tolling efficiency and ensure the authenticity of FASTag usage. As India gears up for initiatives like the Annual Pass System and Multi-Lane Free Flow (MLFF) tolling, the move aims to curb misuse and operational disruptions caused by FASTags that are not affixed to vehicle wind screens. Such practices have led to lane congestion, false chargebacks, and misuse in closed-loop systems, hampering the overall efficiency of the Electronic Toll Collection (ETC) network. To tackle the issue, NHAI has issued instructions to toll collecting agencies.

CONGRESS TARGETS BJP

‘Proved whoever goes against Dalits will be rewarded’: Congress on new Telangana BJP chief



NEW DELHI : The Congress on Friday slammed the elevation of N Ramchander Rao, who was among the accused in the 2016 Rohith Vemula suicide case, as the president of the BJP’s Telangana unit chief, and said the party has once again proved that whoever goes against Dalits and Adivasis will be rewarded by it. The opposition party demanded that the BJP rethink such appointments and also unconditionally apologise to the country. Telangana Police had last year filed a closure report in the case before a local court and given a clean chit to the accused,

including Rao. Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu said Vemula’s suicide at the University of Hyderabad had shook the country and made it reflect on what is happening under the BJP rule. “He was a PhD scholar and was an active member of the Ambedkar Students’ Association. For the discrimination he was facing, he, along with a few friends, thought they’d bring the issues to the attention of the university for the cause of self-respect and social justice for Dalits,” he said at a press conference. “When he (Vemula) was fighting for these causes, the student wing leader of the BJP, Susheel Kumar, filed a false case and brought a lot of pressure on the university authorities to book and rusticate the boys and shame them, and finally this led to the death of Rohith,” Mallu said. Then, BJP MLC Ramchander Rao came along with his “goons, did a dharna, met the vice chancellor, and forced the authorities to take action against the ASA students, filing a false case too”, and this pressure ultimately led Rohith to take his life, he claimed.

guja's coal mines, and of cutting thousands of trees in Raigarh.

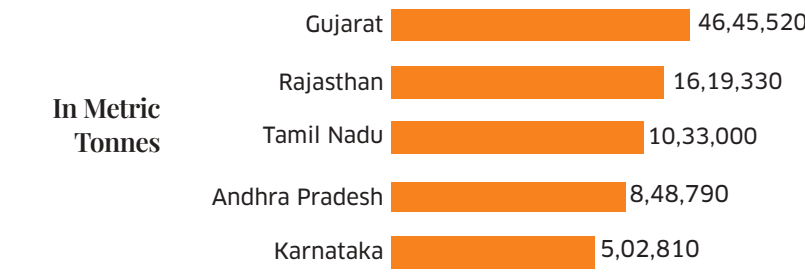
MLA Janak Dhruv also slammed the government for poor infrastructure and healthcare in

Intoxication incident leads to head teacher's suspension

MUNGELI: Head Teacher Satnamdas Patre, posted at Government Primary School Singhanpuri, Vikaskhand Mungeli, has been suspended with immediate effect for locking himself inside the school building under the influence of intoxicants and disrupting educational activities. The action was taken based on a report submitted by the Block Education Officer (BEO), Mungeli. The incident occurred on Wednesday, when other teachers arrived at the school around 11:30 am and found the school door locked from inside. Despite repeated efforts, the door remained shut, raising fears of a serious situation. The BEO reached the spot at 12:30 pm, forced the door open, and found the head teacher in an intoxicated state. He was immediately taken to the District Hospital, Mungeli, where medical tests confirmed drug consumption. Due to this misconduct, educational activities were hampered, and crucial programs like the Mid-Day Meal Scheme were disrupted. According to the BEO, the teacher's actions violated Rule 3 and Rule 23 of the Chhattisgarh Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1965, and he failed to respond to a show-cause notice.

Tesla’s 1st experience centre in India

The Elon Musk-led firm has sent out select invites presenting the inaugural event as the “launch of Tesla in India”. Tesla could not be reached for comments. Last month, Tesla India took on lease 24,565 square feet warehouse space in Lodha Logistics Park in Mumbai



for a period of five years. In June, Union Heavy Industries Minister H D Kumaraswamy stated that the electric carmaker is not interested in manufacturing cars in India but keen on establishing showrooms in the country. US President Donald Trump has said that if

Tesla were to build a factory in India to circumvent that country’s tariffs, it would be “unfair” to the US. Tesla CEO billionaire Elon Musk had said in April last year that his visit to India had been delayed due to the company’s heavy obligations. The electric car maker

was seeking an initial tariff concession that would allow it to offset 70 per cent of customs duty for cars priced less than USD 40,000, and 100 per cent for cars of higher value. However, earlier this year, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal stated that India will not tailor its policies to suit Tesla, and its laws and tariff rules will be formulated to attract all-electric vehicle manufacturers from across the globe to set up a base in the world’s fastest-growing economy.

MUMBAI: Key benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty declined for the third session in a row on Friday, dropping nearly 1 per cent, dragged by heavy selling in IT, auto and energy stocks. Tariff-related uncertainties amid mixed global market trends also added to the pressure, analysts said.

The 30-share BSE Sensex tanked 689.81 points or 0.83 per cent to settle at 82,500.47. During the day, it fell 748.03 points or 0.89 per cent to 82,442.25. Similarly, the 50-share NSE

Nifty dropped 205.40 points or 0.81 per cent to 25,149.85. From the Sensex firms, Tata Consultancy Services declined 3.46 per cent after reporting its June quarter earnings. The country’s largest IT services company on Thursday reported a 6 per cent growth in June quarter net profit at Rs 12,760 crore, helped by a jump in non-core income even as revenues grew at a tepid pace. The rupee revenue grew 1.3 per cent to Rs 63,437 crore during the quarter.

AVENUE SUPERMART’S Q1 RESULTS

Profit flat at Rs 773 cr, revenue grows 16% YoY

MUMBAI: Avenue Supermarts Ltd, the parent company of D-Mart, reported a subdued performance for the quarter ended June 2025, with net profit flat at Rs 773 crore, compared to Rs 774 crore in the year-ago period.

Revenue rose 16.3% year-on-year to Rs 16,359.7 crore, up from Rs 14,069 crore in Q1 FY25, while EBITDA grew 6.4% to Rs 1,299 crore, compared to Rs

1,221.2 crore a year ago. However, profitability remained under pressure as EBITDA margins contracted to 7.94% from 8.68% in the same quarter last year, reflecting shifts in product mix and elevated input costs. The company had earlier disclosed in its June business update that standalone revenue had grown 16% YoY, slightly below Street expectations.

During the Harshad Mehta era, when markets collapsed, Damani made bold short-selling bets and earned huge profits. Later, he invested Rs 400 crore in HDFC Bank’s IPO, betting early on India’s banking boom.

- Company-owned stores (not rented)
- No middlemen, direct supplier relationships

● A limited, essential product range

The result? Trust, efficiency, and unstoppable growth. In 2017, DMart’s IPO tripled investor money and catapulted Damani into India’s billionaire club. Today, DMart runs over 300 stores nationwide.

India’s Warren Buffett

Damani is often called the ‘Warren Buffett of India’ – and rightly so. His investing mantra: spot good businesses, buy at a fair price, and hold with patience. “Money isn’t made fast,” he believes, “It’s made with wisdom and waiting.”

Life of Simplicity, Legacy of Greatness

Always dressed in white, vegetarian, soft-spoken, and grounded – Damani’s personal life mirrors his business philosophy. His three daughters – Madhu, Manjari, and Jyoti – are actively shaping DMart’s future. The family recently purchased a Rs 1,001 crore bungalow in Mumbai – without headlines or fanfare, staying true to their quiet legacy.

Rakesh Jhunjhunwala: “I am just a disciple”

India’s most flamboyant investor, Rakesh Jhunjhunwala, often credited Damani for his own growth. “Damani ji is the real Big Bull,” he would say. “He taught me that investing is about discipline, not greed.”

Jan Suraksha Bill: Tightrope Between Security & Civil Liberty

The Maharashtra Assembly’s passage of the Jan Suraksha Bill (Maharashtra Special Public Security Bill, 2024) has stirred intense debate. Framed as a tool to combat urban Naxalism and extremist ideologies, the bill aims to strengthen internal security—but critics warn it may erode civil liberties. Introduced by the Devendra Fadnavis-led government, the bill targets organizations and individuals threatening public order and constitutional values. With 64 active left-wing extremist groups reportedly operating in Maharashtra, the government argues that central laws like the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) fall short, as they require direct proof of terrorism. Jan Suraksha seeks to bridge that gap. Key provisions include declaring organizations unlawful—only after approval from a three-member Advisory Board (a High Court judge, District Judge, and senior police officer). Investigations must be led by a Deputy Superintendent of Police, and individuals can only be arrested if proven to be active members. The bill also empowers the government to freeze bank accounts and seize assets of banned groups. After receiving over 12,500 public suggestions, the government revised the bill, adding safeguards. A Joint Committee, including opposition members, reportedly found no dissent—a rare moment of consensus. Yet concerns persist. Prakash Ambedkar of the Vanchit Bahujan Aghadi (VBA) called the bill “draconian,” warning it could criminalize dissent and undermine Maharashtra’s progressive legacy. He argued that under such a law, historic movements like the Mahad Satyagraha or texts like Gulamgiri might be deemed unlawful. The bill’s timing also raises political questions. In an era where dissent is often equated with disloyalty, laws like Jan Suraksha risk becoming instruments of suppression. The challenge lies in balancing national security with democratic freedoms. As the bill awaits approval from the Legislative Council and Governor, Maharashtra stands at a critical juncture. Its success will depend not just on legal safeguards, but on ethical governance and vigilant civil society. Security must never come at the cost of silencing voices that shape a just democracy.

75 and Out? The Political Drama of India’s Senior Leaders

RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat recently stated that retiring at 75 is ideal, sparking speculation about his and Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s future—both born in September 1950. The question arises: did Bhagwat subtly hint at Modi’s retirement? After all, Modi previously sidelined senior BJP leaders like Advani, Joshi, and Jaswant Singh under the same age rule. As the Bengali proverb goes, “Apani sikhaye dharma, parke sikheye” (Charity begins at home). Will Modi follow his own precedent? Critics argue he won’t. Congress leader Abhishek Manu Singhvi rightly noted, “Preaching without practice is dangerous.” The Margdarshak Mandal was retired at 75, yet the current leadership seems exempt. In 2024, when AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal raised similar concerns, BJP leaders J.P. Nadda and Amit Shah dismissed them, claiming no such age rule exists in the party’s constitution. Now, RSS appears to differ. Retirement at 75 is a sound principle. Elders should step aside, offering guidance rather than clinging to power. The Hindu Vedic system advocates vana-prastha and sanyasa—withdrawal from worldly affairs. As India approaches the political drama of “Come September 2025,” perhaps it’s time for Modi and Bhagwat to embrace sanyasa and make way for the next generation.

Employment Linked Incentive Scheme Boosts Jobs and Growth Nationwide

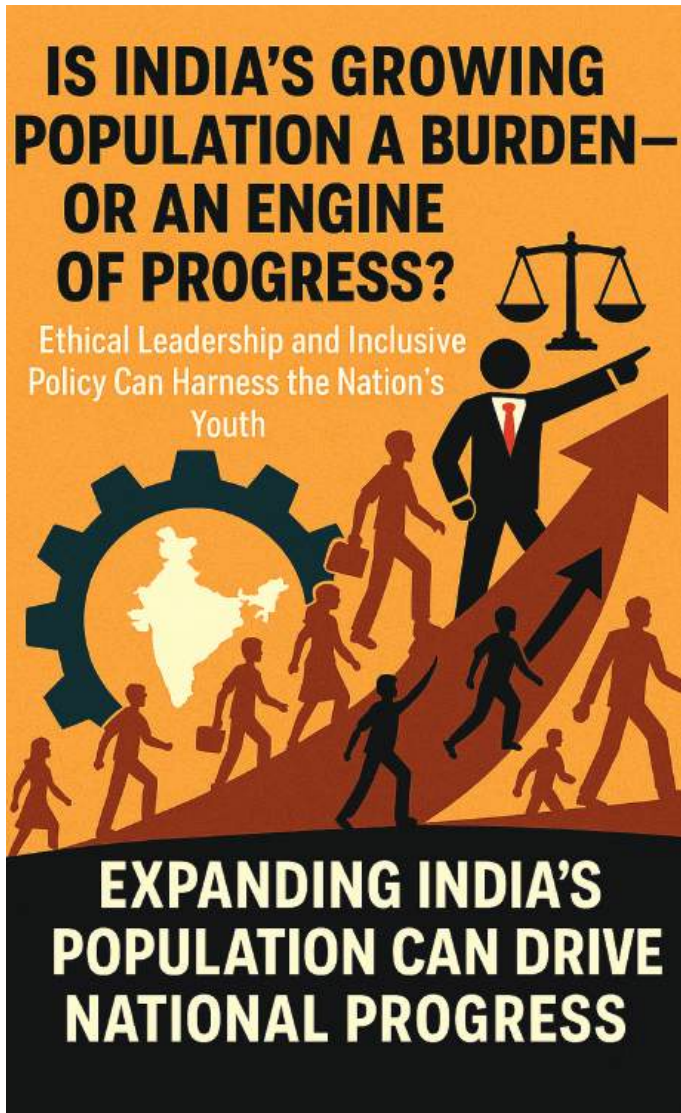

Extension in service

Centre extends Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan’s tenure till Aug 2026

NEW DELHI : The Centre on Friday extended the tenure of Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan till August 22 next year, according to an official order. The extension comes at a time when the country is preparing for the mega census with caste enumeration and amid the MHA’s resolve to end Naxalism by March next year. India’s 16th Census with caste enumeration will be carried out in 2027, with the reference date of October 1, 2026, in snow-bound areas like Ladakh and March 1, 2027, in

the rest of the country. Mohan, a 1989 batch Indian Administrative Service (IAS) officer of the Sikkim cadre, was named the Union Home Secretary in August 2024. He took over the charge from Ajay Kumar Bhalla on completion of his tenure on August 22 last year. The ACC has approved Mohan’s extension in services as Home Secretary beyond the date of his superannuation on September 30 up to August 22, 2026 or until further orders, in terms of the provisions of Fundamental Rules or FR 56 (d) and Rule 16 (1A) of the All India Services (Death-Cum-Retirement Benefits) Rules, 1958, said the order issued by the Ministry of Personnel. The rules have provisions to extend the services of such officers. With this extension, Mohan will have two years’ tenure on the crucial post mandated with mainly ensuring internal security matters



among others. He was serving as the Union Culture Secretary before being named as the Home Secretary.

Two of family die due to food poisoning

TEZPUR: Two members of a family died due to suspected food poisoning in Assam’s Sonitpur district, a top official said on Friday. Both the victims fell ill after consuming home-made ‘pithas’ (rice cakes). Sonitpur district commissioner Ankur Bharali said the family had the ‘pithas’ for breakfast on Monday, after which 53-year-old Nirupama Devi fell ill.

She was taken to the state dispensary at Basseria on Tuesday after her condition deteriorated, where she was diagnosed as hypoglycaemic and referred to Tezpur Medical College Hospital (TMCH). Though she was discharged after symptomatic treatment, her condition worsened and she breathed her last at TMCH, where was admitted for the second time, around Wednesday midnight, officials said.

Bharali said the cause of death has been mentioned as acute bowel obstruction and septicæmia. The second victim, nine-year-old Dikshita, was admitted to Basseria state dispensary on Wednesday after continuous vomiting.

“She was referred for advanced treatment and died on way to Guwahati,” the DC said. Bharali said officials of Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme and Basseria state dispensary visited the house on Thursday for case specific investigation. Rice and water samples have been collected for testing, Bharali added.

National Board for Wildlife has cleared a proposal to divert 310 hectares of forest land in Namdapha Tiger Reserve for the construction of Arunachal Frontier Highway.

NEW DELHI: The Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife has cleared a proposal to divert 310 hectares of forest land from the core area of Namdapha Tiger Reserve in Arunachal Pradesh for the construction of the Arunachal Frontier Highway (NH-913). The decision comes even as some members flagged serious concerns over inadequate wildlife mitigation measures and the planned felling of over 1.5 lakh trees. The project in the Changlang district, connects NH-215

near Kharsang to the Miao-Gandhigram-Vijaynagar road, a stretch of the strategic NH-913 corridor close to the India-Myanmar border, according

to government records. The Public Works Department (PWD), Arunachal Pradesh, had sought 248.79 hectares (ha) of forest land for intermediate laning and 61.21 ha for muck disposal. On June 26, member secretary of the committee said a meeting regarding the project proposal had been held with committee members H S Singh and R Sukumar, along with the state’s chief wildlife warden (CWW). It was observed that “the mitigation measures proposed, including underpasses, are quite rudimentary when compared

to earlier proposals”. The member secretary added that the animal passage plan lacked adequate site specific research and several proposed structures follow “standard PWD culvert or causeway designs rather than designs tailored for effective wildlife movement.” “There was consensus that a comprehensive, research-based animal passage plan is necessary, one that clearly specifies the appropriate design, location, height and length of underpasses and overpasses based on actual animal movement patterns,” he said.

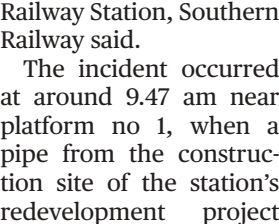

Anisimova stuns Sabalenka, sets final with Swiatek

Amanda Anisimova’s incredible comeback story continued at Wimbledon as she stunned world No. 1 Aryna Sabalenka to reach her maiden Grand Slam final, where she’ll meet Iga Swiatek.

Swiatek crushed Bencic 6-2, 6-0 to reach her first Wimbledon final, dominating with power and precision.

LONDON: Just a year ago, Amanda Anisimova’s world ranking was too low to make the main draw at Wimbledon, and she exited in the qualifiers. Now, in a dazzling turnaround, she’s through to her first Grand Slam final after toppling top-seeded Aryna Sabalenka 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 on Centre Court in a thrilling semifinal. Anisimova, who paused her career in 2023 due to mental health struggles, produced a spirited, aggressive performance to outlast Sabalenka in a two-hour, 36-minute battle under punishing heat. Her reward: a title clash with five-time major champion Iga Swiatek, who breezed past Belinda Bencic 6-2, 6-0 in just 71 minutes in the other semifinal.

Swiatek, the current world No. 8, had never reached a Wimbledon final before but was dominant throughout, hitting 26 winners and serving at up to 119 mph. The Polish star, known for her clay-court brilliance, now



proves she’s just as capable on grass. “Tennis keeps surprising me,” Swiatek admitted. “Playing well on grass for the first time feels really special.”

Anisimova, seeded 13th and still only 23,

becomes the eighth consecutive first-time women’s Wimbledon finalist. The New Jersey-born Floridian’s backhand was a major weapon, and she held her nerve even when Sabalenka, 0-3 in Wim-

bledon semifinals, threatened a comeback. Anisimova saved 11 of 14 break points and eventually closed it out with a forehand winner.

“This doesn’t feel real right now,” Anisimova said. “I was

absolutely dying out there. I don’t know how I pulled it out.”

Her triumph denied Sabalenka the chance to reach a fourth straight Grand Slam final – a feat last achieved by Serena Williams a decade ago. Sabalenka’s powerful game saw her hit serves up to 120 mph, but inconsistency at crucial moments – including a double fault to lose the first set – cost her dearly.

The match was characterized by short, aggressive rallies with both players seeking first-strike dominance. Of the 214 total points, 167 lasted fewer than five shots. With temperatures soaring to 88°F (31°C), play was briefly halted twice due to spectators feeling unwell.

Despite dropping the second set and being broken at the start of the third, Anisimova never wavered. She surged to a 5-2 lead before closing out the match after a brief wobble.

Whether she lifts the trophy or not, Anisimova is guaranteed to break into the top 10 – a remarkable ascent for someone who, not long ago, was unsure if she’d return to tennis at all.

Pak to review security before India hockey tour

KARACHI: Pakistan will assess India’s security situation before deciding whether to send its national hockey team for the upcoming Asia Cup and Junior World Cup. Rana Mashood, chairman of the Prime Minister’s Youth Development and Sports Program, stated that players would not be sent if any threat exists. He cited India’s recent Operation Sindoor as a reason for concern. The Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) has sought formal clearance from the government to proceed, as the Asia Cup also serves as a World Cup qualifier. PHF secretary-general Rana Mujahid said past tours to India had occurred, but rising tensions now demand caution. He noted the federation is monitoring social media threats directed at players.

India women target emphatic end to England T20 series

With the series sealed, India women eye a strong finish in fifth T20I versus England.

BIRMINGHAM: With an unassailable 3-1 lead, the Indian women’s cricket team will aim to finish the five-match T20I series on a high against England on Saturday. Having already clinched their first-ever T20I series win over England, the Harmanpreet Kaur-led side carries both momentum and confidence into the final clash at Edgbaston.

India’s dominant performance in the fourth T20I, particularly in the field, sealed the series. Arundhati Red-



dy’s three catches and Radha Yadav’s all-round brilliance helped restrict England to 126/7, setting up a six-wicket victory. That fielding effort was a statement of intent, adding sharpness to India’s already lethal spin-heavy bowling attack.

Spinners have been central to India’s success, snaring 22 wickets so far. Deepti Sharma, the most

successful T20I spinner, has led the charge with precision, while newcomer N Shree Charani emerged as the leading wicket-taker in the series.

In the batting department, Smriti Mandhana remains India’s top scorer, while Shafali Verma’s 19-ball 31 in the fourth T20I set up a rapid chase and earned her a recall for India A’s Australia tour.

LONDON: England vice-captain Ollie Pope defended the team’s cautious approach on day one of the third Test against India, saying the surface didn’t allow for aggressive ‘Bazball’ tactics. “This wasn’t a surface where you could come out swinging. The Indian attack held their lengths well,” said Pope, who scored a patient 44 off 104 balls. England reached 251/4 at stumps, with Joe Root on 99 and Ben Stokes unbeaten on 39, though Stokes suffered a groin niggle. Nitish Kumar Reddy impressed with 2/46, while Bumrah, Siraj, and Akash Deep tightened the scoring. Pope emphasized the importance of adapting to conditions. “It’s about reading situations better as a team,” he said, hoping Root’s knock turns into a “monster.” **PTI**

Rahul stands firm after Bumrah show

Jasprit Bumrah's fiery five-wicket haul and KL Rahul's unbeaten fifty ensured India remained competitive after Joe Root's century powered England to 387 on day two at Lord's.

Bumrah's fiery spell tore through England's lower order, securing his 15th career five-wicket haul in Test cricket.

LONDON: A gripping day of Test cricket at Lord's saw Jasprit Bumrah return to his fiery best with a five-wicket haul and KL Rahul anchor India's response with a calm, unbeaten fifty, as the visitors closed day two of the third Test at 145 for three, still trailing England by 242 runs.

Bumrah, who resumed the day with just one wicket overnight, tore through England's middle and lower order to finish with figures of 5 for 74, his 15th five-wicket haul in Test cricket and second consecutive in the ongoing series. England were bowled out for 387, having resumed at 251 for four.

Joe Root stood tall amid the collapse, crafting a fluent 104 off 199 balls – his 37th Test hundred. Root showed supreme control during his knock, stitching vital partnerships, including



one with No. 9 Brydon Carse, who hit a defiant 56. Jamie Smith also impressed with a gritty 51

as England's lower order added a valuable 84 runs across the final three partnerships.

India's reply began cautiously. Opener Yashasvi Jaiswal, fresh from his Leeds heroics,

fell early for 13 to Jofra Archer, who marked his return to Test cricket with a spirited burst. Captain Shubman Gill, seeking to surpass Rahul Dravid's record for most runs by an Indian batter in a Test series in England, perished for 16, edging behind to Jamie Smith, two short of the milestone.

KL Rahul remained solid at one end, showing maturity in his unbeaten 53 off 113 balls. He shared a vital 61-run stand with Karun Nair, who contributed a handy 40 before Joe Root's sharp one-handed catch at slip brought his stay to an end. The catch was Root's 211th in Test cricket, surpassing Rahul Dravid's record of 210 for the most catches by a non-wicketkeeper in men's Tests.

India ended the day with Rahul and Rishabh Pant (19*) at the crease, facing a crucial task on day three to reduce the first-innings deficit and gain control in the evenly poised contest.

The series, currently tied 1-1, promises further twists after India's commanding 336-run win at Edgbaston.

Sinner beats Djokovic to reach final against Alcaraz

Jannik Sinner halted Novak Djokovic's Wimbledon dominance with a commanding straight sets semi-final victory.

LONDON: World No. 1 Jannik Sinner stunned seven-time champion Novak Djokovic with a dominant 6-3, 6-3, 6-4 victory in the Wimbledon 2025

men's singles semi-final. The Italian outplayed Djokovic from the start, breaking him twice in the first set and once in the second, taking a firm 2-0 lead. In the third set, Sinner again broke Djokovic twice, holding on for a 5-4 lead before serving out the match.

This victory ends Djokovic's remarkable run of five consecutive Wimbledon finals and denies the 38-year-old a chance

at a sixth straight final appearance. Sinner, on the other hand, has now reached his first-ever Wimbledon final, marking a career milestone at the All England Club.

He will face Spanish star Carlos Alcaraz in the title clash, after Alcaraz defeated American Taylor Fritz in four sets earlier in the day. With this win, Sinner stakes his claim as the new face of men's tennis.

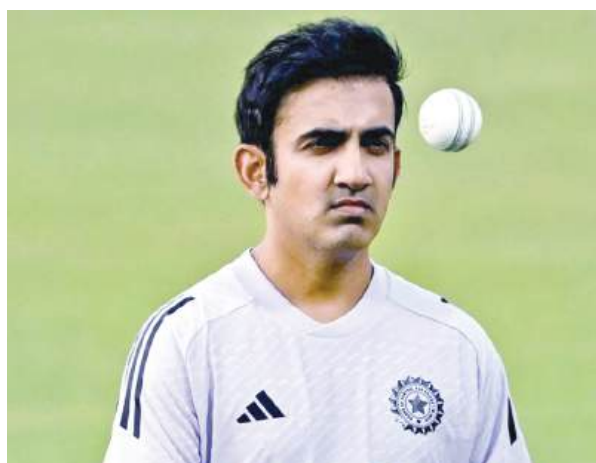
Gautam Gambhir supports BCCI's strict family policy for tours

LONDON: India head coach Gautam Gambhir has backed the BCCI's revised policy limiting players' family presence on long overseas tours, asserting that national duty must always take precedence over personal comfort.

Following India's 1-3 defeat in the 2020-21 Border-Gavaskar Trophy in Australia, the BCCI introduced a regulation capping family stays to two weeks on tours exceeding 45 days, and seven days on shorter trips.

"Families are important, no doubt," Gambhir



said during a chat with Cheteshwar Pujara on Sony Sports Network. "But this is not a vacation. You're here with a bigger purpose—to make

the country proud."

Gambhir, known for his intense focus, emphasized that representing India is a rare privilege. While Virat Kohli had

earlier voiced support for players having their families around to ease pressure, Gambhir insisted national commitment should remain paramount. "If you're truly committed to that cause, then everything else aligns. The nation must come first."

On the sidelines of the third Test at Lord's, Gambhir also revealed his struggle to mentally disconnect from the game. Even after India's win in the second Test at Birmingham, he said his mind immediately turned to strategizing for the next match.

US immigration views upbeat despite Trump deportation push

Nearly 80% of Americans now view immigration as a “good thing,” a significant increase from the previous year, with a notable shift in opinion among Republicans and independents.

WASHINGTON: Just months after President Donald Trump returned to office vowing mass deportations, the share of US adults saying immigration is a “good thing” for the country has jumped substantially – including among Republicans, according to new Gallup polling. About 8 in 10 Americans, 79 per cent, say immigration is “a good

thing” for the country today, an increase from 64 per cent a year ago and a high point in the nearly 25-year trend. Only about 2 in 10 US adults say immigration is a bad thing right now, down from 32 per cent last year. During Democratic President Joe Biden’s term in office, negative views of immigration had increased markedly, reaching a high point in the months before

Trump, a Republican, took office. The new Gallup data suggests US adults are returning to more pro-immigrant views that could compli-

cate Trump’s push for sweeping deportations in his second term. Americans’ views of immigration policies have shifted dramatically in the last year – including among Republicans, who have become much more content with immigration levels since Trump took office but who have also grown more supportive of pathways to citizenship for people in the country illegally. The broader trend also

shows that public opinion is generally much more favourable to immigrants than it was decades ago. Americans’ more positive view on immigration is driven primarily by a shift among Republicans and independents. About two-thirds of Republicans now say immigrants are “a good thing” for the country, up from 39 per cent last year. And independents moved from about two-thirds last year to 80 per cent this year.

Myanmar airstrike kills 23 at Buddhist monastery

BANGKOK: An airstrike on a Buddhist monastery in Myanmar’s central Sagaing region killed at least 23 people who were taking shelter in the compound, separate sources said Friday. The overnight aerial attack on the monastery in Lin Ta Lu village, in Sagaing region’s Sagaing township, injured about 30 other people, of which 10 were in a critical condition, according to a member of a resistance group. The resistance member – who spoke on condition of anonymity – told The Associated Press that 23 civilians including four children were killed after a jet fighter dropped a bomb around 1 am on a building in the village’s monastery where more than 150 people from nearby villages were taking shelter to avoid fighting in the region in recent weeks.

Russian drones damage Kharkiv maternity hospital, injuring nine

A Russian drone barrage targetted the centre of Kharkiv on Friday, injuring nine people and damaging a maternity hospital in Ukraine’s second-largest city, officials said.

KYIV: Mothers with newborns were being evacuated to a different medical facility, Kharkiv Mayor Ihor Terekhov wrote on Telegram. He didn’t say whether anyone at the hospital was among the injured. Russia’s recent escalation of long-range Shahed drone attacks on Ukrainian cities, which often also include ballistic and cruise missiles as well as powerful glide bombs, has brought renewed



urgency to efforts to improve Ukraine’s air defences after more than three years of war. “There is no silence in Ukraine,” Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said after the Kharkiv bombardment. Kyiv, the Ukrainian capital, has endured repeated and intensifying drone attacks in recent weeks, as have many other

regions of the country. June brought the highest monthly civilian casualties of the past three years, with 232 people killed and 1,343 wounded, the UN human rights mission in Ukraine said Thursday. Russia launched 10 times more drones and missiles in June than in the same month last year, it said. At the same time, Rus-

BANGLA ECONOMIST ARREST

Ex-Janata Bank chairman held in loan fraud during Awami League tenure

DHAKA: A prominent economist, who served the chairperson of the largest commercial bank in Bangladesh during the then prime minister Sheikh Hasina’s Awami League government, has been arrested in a 297 crore Taka (approx USD 24.4 million) fraud case, a media report said Friday. Abul Barkat, who was the chairperson of the Janata Bank, was detained by the Dhaka Metropolitan Detective Branch (DB) from the capital’s Dhanmondi area around 11.30 pm on Thursday, DB Joint Commissioner Nasirul Islam said. Barkat, a former chairman of the Economics Department at Dhaka University and ex-president of the Bangladesh Economic Association, is among 23 individuals named in the case filed by the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) on February 20 the Dhaka Tribune said. **PTI**

LEBANON ISRAEL

Lebanon’s president reveals country’s stance on relations with Israel



BEIRUT: Lebanon has no plans to have normal relations with Israel at the present time, and Beirut’s main aim is to reach a “state of no war” with its southern neighbour, the country’s president said Friday.

President Joseph Aoun’s comments came as the Trump administration is trying to expand the Abraham Accords signed in 2020 in which Israel signed historic pacts with United Arab Emirates and Bahrain. **PTI**

As Trump seeks to be peacemaker, Netanyahu leaves Washington without breakthrough on Gaza deal



WASHINGTON: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu’s trip to Washington this week netted President Donald Trump another nomination for the Nobel Peace Prize he covets, but the ceasefire the US leader sought for the war in Gaza didn’t emerge.

Despite Trump throwing his weight behind a push for a 60-day truce between Israel and Hamas, no breakthrough was announced during Netanyahu’s visit, a disappointment for a president who wants to be known as a peacemaker and has hinged his reputation on being a dealmaker. “He prides himself on being able to make deals, so this is another

test case,” said Rachel Brandenburg, the Israel Policy Forum’s Washington managing director and senior fellow.

Trump’s ability to strike a ceasefire deal in the 21-month war will reveal the boundaries of his influence with Netanyahu, especially after their recent joint strikes on Iran’s nuclear facilities that both leaders touted at the White House this week.

Beyond the back-to-back meetings Trump and Netanyahu had at the White House this week, there was little public evidence of progress at a time when the Republican US president is pushing to end the fighting. **PTI**

POLAND LAWMAKER

Polish Prosecutor Investigates Lawmaker Over Auschwitz Comments

WARSAW: Polish prosecutors launched a preliminary investigation after a far-right lawmaker described the gas chambers at the Auschwitz death camp as a “fake.” Grzegorz Braun, a member of the European Parliament, has previously been accused of antisemitism and extinguished Hanukkah candles in parliament with a fire extinguisher in 2023. He was a presidential candidate who won more than 6 per cent of the votes in the first round of the election earlier this year. Speaking to Poland’s Wnet radio on Thursday, Braun said that “ritual murder is a fact, and such a thing as Auschwitz with its gas chambers is unfortunately a fake,” news agency PAP reported. The reporter then ended the interview. Some Christians in medieval Europe believed that Jews murdered Christians to use their blood for ritual purposes, something which historians say has no basis in Jewish religious law or historical fact and instead reflected anti-Jewish hostility in Christian Europe. **PTI**

WAFRICA AID

UN food agency curtails West, Central Africa aid over funding cuts



LAGOS: The World Food Programme said Friday it is suspending food and nutritional assistance across crisis-hit West and Central African countries as a result of US aid cuts, which are grinding the organisation’s operations to a halt. While the timeline varies, food stocks are projected to last until around September for most of the affected countries, leaving millions of vulnerable people potentially without any emergency aid, according to the WFP. **PTI**
