Kotdwara: A 22-year-old man and his father have been arrested for allegedly trying to convert a young woman to Islam in Pauri district here, police said on Friday. Constable sacked

Jaipur: Amid the ongoing deadlock between the administration and the family members of a Dalit woman who was allegedly gang-raped and murdered in Bikaner, a police constable accused in the case has been terminated from service, officials said on Friday. Police have been trying to get the family members to accept the body, which is currently at the mortuary after post-mortem, but the family members have resisted all such attempts and are demanding the arrest of the accused.

Patna meet

17 parties meet vow to fight 2024 LS polls together

Patna, Jun 23 (PTI): As many as 17 opposition parties on Friday resolved to fight the 2024 Lok Sabha elections unitedly to defeat the BJP and work with flexibility by setting aside their differences and will meet in Shimla next month to chalk out a joint strategy.

Addressing a joint press conference after an almost four-hour meeting during which leaders of these parties expressed their views, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar said they will meet in the next few days to give final shape to their plan of

fighting together. "We had a good meeting and several leaders expressed their views during the meeting. Seventeen parties have decided to work together and contest the Lok Sabha elections unitedly," he told reporters. The meeting is viewed as a starting point for Opposition unity

ahead of Lok Sabha polls to unitedly take on the Narendra Modi-led BJP.

Kumar, who hosted the meeting, said they were working in the national interest and accused the BJP of acting against the country's interest as it was trying to change India's history.

13 Paki nationals charge-sheeted in arms, drugs smuggling case

New Delhi, Jun 23 (PTI):

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday charged 13 Pakistani nationals in a 2022 case related to cross-border smuggling of weapons and drugs via Gujarat to fund terrorist activities in India.

Ten of the 13 charged accused were arrested in December last year with a huge consignment of drugs and arms, hidden in gas cylinders, from a Pakistani fishing boat, the federal agency said. It said the seizure included 40 kg of heroin, six foreign-made pistols, six magazines and 120 cartridges, along with documents such as Pakistani identity cards, mobile phones and

Pakistani currency. The charge-sheet was filed in an NIA special court in Ahmedabad.

The 10 arrested accused are Kadarkash Umetan Baloch, Amanullah Musa Baloch, Ismail Sabzal Baloch, Allahbaksh Hatar Baloch, Goharbakhsh Dilmurad Baloch, Ammal Phullan Baloch, Gul Mohammad Hatar Baloch, Andam Ali Boher Baloch, Abdulgani Jungiyan Baloch and Abdulhakim Dilmurad Baloch, the NIA said.

Divisional Commissioner reprimands officials for delay in JJM projects

Bhilai, Jun 23: Divisional Commissioner Mahadev Kavre chaired a meeting on Wednesday to review the construction works being done in the division. Jambhulkar, Chief Engineer, Chhattisgarh State Power Distribution Company Limited Durg, Dinesh Bhagoria, Superintending Engineer, Water Resources Department, Durg Division; Sanjeev Brijputra, Superintending Engineer, Public Health Engineering Department, Durg Division; and Bhanupratap, Superintending Engineer CREDA was present.

Divisional Commissioner instructed the Chief Engineer of the Electricity Department to complete the repair work before the rains. Along with this, he asked to maintain stock of transformers and complete the target of pumps soon



under the Mukhyamantri Krishi Pump Yojana. In Jal Jeevan Mission, instructions were given to complete the pending electricity connection immediately and to complete the pending work for electrification at RIPAs. Along with this, the Divisional Commissioner gave clear instructions to solve the complaints received through the WhatsApp groups.

During the review of works of the Water Resources Department, the Superintending Engineer informed that in 159 contracts (amounting Rs 677 crore 41 lakh) conducted in the department till date, an amount of Rs 348 crore has been spent, in which 70 works have been completed by June 30 and the remaining works will be completed by the end of the financial year. The Divisional Commissioner gave instructions to ensure the quality of work and safety of dams.

During the review of the works conducted under the Public Health Engineering Department, the Superintending Engineer informed that under Jal Jeevan Mission, tender for water supply in 4315 villages in the division has been completed. Work order has been issued for 4014 villages. The

Divisional Commissioner expressed strong displeasure due to non-commencement of work in 324 villages. He instructed them to start the work immediately. Along with this, instructions were given to cancel the contract of the contractor.

Similarly, out of 99481 domestic connections under the scheme, 584071 connections (58 percent) have been completed so far. A target of 1800 to 2000 per day has been set.

So far, water supply work has been completed in 488 villages. The Divisional Commissioner asked the officials to collect certificates from the Gram Sabha. Under the Group Water Supply Scheme, tenders have not been done for 24 works. Kavre instructed to issue work orders soon.

The Superintending Engineer of CREDA informed that 1011 pumps have been installed against the target of 1147 under Saur Sujala Yojana, the remaining work will be completed soon. Similarly, under Jal Jeevan Mission, 512 works were completed against 536 works in Phase-1 and 265 works against 783 in Phase-2 are at the foundation level and remaining works in progress. Clear instructions have been given by the Divisional Commissioner to complete the works soon.

HYU reopens Portal for admission in first year of graduation & post graduation

Bhilai, Jun 23: In Hemchand Yadav University, Durg, the admission portal has been reopened on June 23 after the expiry of the time given till June 22 to the applicants of the first list for the first year in graduation. This admission portal will remain open till June 29. During this, such applicants who could not apply for online admission in the past due to any reason can apply till June 29.

Along with these, the names of the students that could not be included in the first admission list are also not being removed by the university. In the second admission list which will be released after June 29, the

such candidates of the first list will also be included on the basis of merit.

Dr Rajamani Patel, Deputy Registrar of Examinations of the University said that in the second phase also, those who applied online have been given the freedom to choose 05 colleges of their choice. Dr Patel told that the admission portal has been opened from June 23 to June 29 for M Com first semester and M Sc first semester of postgraduate level.

After the release of BA final result, the portal will be opened for admission in MA first semester. Dr Patel said that information was continuously being received from various student organizations, parents, and college principals

that due to holidays in schools, students are not getting transfer and character certificates and migration certificates, due to this they are not included in the admission list.

Despite joining, the concerned applicants are not able to take admission. Keeping this in mind, the portal has been opened by

the university for the second time and till then the students included in the admission list will get the desired documents from the schools.

Hemchand Yadav University, Durg (HYU) declared 07 more results of annual examination 2023. Including these, a total of 40 exam results have been declared by the university so far. The university administration is making every possible effort to declare the remaining 16 exam results by June 30. Giving this information, University Deputy Registrar Examination, Dr Rajamani Patel and Dean Student Welfare, Dr Prashant Srivastava jointly said that in the declared examination results, along with the examination results of B Com first and B Com second year, BA BED Part 02, BSc BED Part 01, 02 & 03 and MA Sanskrit pre exam results are included. Dr Patel told that out of 7056 candidates who appeared in the B Com Part 01 examination, 3879 candidates were declared passed while 1005 candidates were eligible for supplementary, 23 candidates had a cheating case. Thus the result of the examination was 55 percent. Out of 7819 candidates who appeared in the B Com Part 02 examination, 3951 candidates were declared passed while 1350 candidates were eligible for supplementary. There was a case of cheating of 22 examinees. Thus the result of the examination was 51 percent. Out of 38 candidates appeared in BA Ed Part 02, 36 were successful, whose result was 95 percent. Sickle Cell Research to thrive in Raipur's Centre of Excellence

Raipur, Jun 23: Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel performed the bhumiopjan for the Chhattisgarh Sickle Cell Institute's (CSCI) Centre of

Excellence at Raipur's Devendra Nagar. Spanning 2.96 acres, the institute will cost Rs 48.12 crore and offer world-class facilities. The centre aims to benefit not only the state's residents but also those in neighbouring states.

During a program, Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel highlighted the significant advancements made in the healthcare sector over the past four and a half years. The initiatives taken for the expansion of healthcare facilities through Haat Bazar and other means have greatly benefited the people of the state. Notably, the Malaria Mukt Bastar Abhiyan and Malaria

Chhattisgarh Abhiyan have contributed to a 65% reduction in malaria cases. Sickle cell disease affects around 10% of Chhattisgarh's population, posing a major challenge. To address this issue, the government is committed to upgrading the state's Sickle Cell Institute as a 'Centre of Excellence', enhancing facilities, and accelerating research. Alongside treatment, raising awareness about sickle cell prevention is crucial. Timely initiation of appropriate treatment and timely availability of medications can minimise physical complications and enable patients to lead longer lives. Early identification of the disease is of utmost

importance, and providing necessary counselling to individuals with the sickle cell trait can help curb the spread of the disease.

The Sickle Cell Institute currently offers free examinations, consultations, treatment, and medications for sickle cell patients. Starting from October 2022, sickle cell test and counselling centres have been established in all district hospitals and government medical colleges across the state. This initiative is now being expanded to lower levels with the setup of testing and counselling centres in community health centres at the development block level. Furthermore, the plan is to extend these centres to primary health centres as well. The identification of sickle cell patients will be carried out at the village level through Mitans (community health workers), followed by the provision of necessary treatment.

Health Minister TS Singh Deo, announced the upgrade of the Sickle Cell Institute of Raipur to a Centre of Excellence. Spanning 2.96 acres, this project will cost Rs 48 crore and focus on providing modern facilities to

benefit patients in the future. The centre will accommodate 100 beds and include essential amenities such as an emergency ward, operation theatres, intensive care units, outpatient departments, male and female wards, and a paediatric ward. Additionally, a dedicated research laboratory building will be constructed, equipped with various labs for genetic-level research. This will enable extensive studies on treatment methods for the disease and contribute to advancements in sickle cell research.

Delhi HC asks NCERT to respond to plea challenging online bids from empanelled firms

New Delhi, Jun 23 (PTI)

The Delhi High Court has sought response of the Centre and the NCERT on a plea challenging online bids from firms currently empanelled for supply of items of the new kit 'Jaadui Pitara' developed by the organisation.

The petition claimed that the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) while issuing corrigendum has set the one-sided and biased criteria of eligibility conditions and other requirements for bidders.

The plea was listed before a vacation bench of Justice Amit Mahajan which asked the Ministry

of Education and NCERT to file reply to the petition.

Petitioner Samit Khanna, proprietor of Universal Sales, who has been dealing in manufacturing and distribution of toys since 2013 and registered under the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, said he meets all the criteria set out by NCERT except the criteria of empanelled firm.

The plea, filed through advocate Juhu Arora, said, "Due to the one-sided criteria set by the respondent no. 2, petitioner is not able to submit its techno-commercial bid."

"This new kit being tendered majorly has toy items which come under

toys industry and toy manufacturers. However, the current 23 empanelled companies for which tender is restricted are manufacturers of scientific instruments, that is, science and mathematical kits," it said.

The plea said the tender does not mention the valid requirement of Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) certificate with empanelled members which is now compulsory as per a government notification.

"The one-sided criteria set by respondent no. 2 is completely against the fundamental principles of transparency, fairness, competition, economy, efficiency and accountability," it alleged.

Addressing a function on the death anniversary of Dr Mookerjee, Adityanath hailed his "sacrifice for saving Kashmir" and for "ensuring the unity of India", a statement said.

The Chief Minister said Kashmir's situation after Independence was progressively deteriorating due to Congress' shortsightedness.

In such circumstances, Dr Mookerjee raised a slogan for the country, opposing the creation of separate laws for Jammu and Kashmir and granting sep-

arate recognition to the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir," Adityanath was quoted as saying in the statement. Mookerjee launched a movement with the slogan — "Ek desh mein do vidhan, do pradhan aur do nishan nahi chalenge (There cannot be two constitutions, two prime ministers and two flags in one nation)" — and was also arrested during that period, Adityanath said. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has fulfilled Dr. Syama Prasad Mookerjee's dream by permanently removing Article 370 in Kashmir," he said. On August 5, 2019, the Modi government revoked Article 370, which gave special status to the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. The Chief Minister also emphasised the crucial role played by Mookerjee in resisting the Partition.

Kerala YouTuber arrested for publicly making objectionable remarks

Kochi/Malappuram, Jun 23 (PTI) A controversial YouTuber who has been accused of making allegedly objectionable remarks and creating a traffic block on a busy road at a recent inauguration of a shop, was arrested on Friday morning, police said. He was taken into custody from a house in Kochi early in the morning and his arrest was recorded after taking him to Valanchery in northern Malappuram, where the incident took place some days ago, they said.

A police official said they had to break open the door of his room as the YouTuber was reluctant to open it despite repeated requests. "We waited for half an hour. Still he didn't open the doors. So, we were forced to break it open and took him into custody," he told PTI.

The official said they also feared the YouTuber might destroy the evidence in his phone and laptop if he got more time.

"Thoppi" put his phone on live record and posted the arrival of the police and his custody details

through social media.

During the live streaming, the YouTuber claimed that police was trying to take him into custody for political reasons.

The cops just wanted to distract the attention of the people from ongoing political issues, he further claimed.

In the video, it could be seen how the police broke open the bottom half of the door when the man continued to be remained inside the room.

HP govt notifies Draft Shimla Development Plan

Shimla, Jun 23 (PTI)

Himachal Pradesh government has notified the Draft Shimla Development Plan to regulate construction activities in the capital city, an official said on Friday.

The state cabinet on Monday approved the final draft of the SDS, which includes new provisions with regard to the number of floors, habitable attic and garage in a building.

The cabinet, in a meeting presided by Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, cleared the draft plan presented by the urban development department.

The plan was approved

by the previous government in February 2022 but it did not materialise as the National Green Tribunal (NGT) passed stay orders, terming it illegal and in conflict with earlier orders passed in 2017 to regulate haphazard constructions in Shimla.

It was approved again after the Supreme Court's order on the matter on May 3. The apex court, however, said the draft plan will not be implemented for one month from the date of publication of the notification, issued on June 20.

The plan named "Vision 2041", when implemented, would pave the way for construction in 17 green belts with certain restrictions and also in the core area where construction activity was banned by the NGT.

Detailed guidelines regarding the number of stories, parking, attic and height of the structures have been mentioned in the plan and it has been clearly stated that felling trees would not be permitted in green areas.

The government has already decided to declare the attic as a habitable area and increase its height to 3.5 meters.

Construction of one storey with a habitable attic would be permissible in 17 green belts, two stories with a habitable attic and parking in core areas and three stories with parking and a habitable attic in non-core areas would be permissible. A total of 22,450 hectares were taken into account for revision and formulation of the Development Plan which includes, Municipal Corporation, Shimla, Special Area Development Authorities of Kufri, Shoghi and Ghanahatti Special Area and Additional Shimla Planning Area and additional villages.

The plan proposes developing Jubbarhatti and Ghandal as activity-based counter-magnet towns with a provision of adequate urban amenities like education, health, trade and commerce.

Honoured to address the US Congress: PM Modi

Washington, Jun 23 (PTI):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said he was honoured to have addressed the US Congress twice and thanked all its members for attending his historic joint address where he laid out his vision for the future of the defining bilateral partnership.

Modi on Thursday became the first Indian leader to address the joint session of the US Congress twice. His first address to a joint meeting of the US Congress was in 2016. "Honoured to address the US Congress. Gratitude to all the members of Congress who attended today. Your presence signifies the strength of India-USA ties and our shared commitment to a better fu-

In a series of tweets, Modi also thanked US House Speaker Kevin McCarthy, Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell, Senate majority leader Chuck Schumer among others for their remarks on his state visit to the US. "Your warm welcome is highly appreciated @SpeakerMcCarthy. Eager to enhance our bilateral cooperation, fostering an even stronger bond between our countries," Modi said in response to the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

India, US decide to end six trade disputes at WTO

● Delhi to remove retaliatory customs duties

Washington/New Delhi, Jun 23 (PTI): India and the US have agreed to end six key trade disputes at the World Trade Organisation (WTO) while New Delhi will also remove retaliatory customs duties on certain American products such as almonds, walnuts, and apples.

The six disputes include three initiated by India and as many by the US.

Announcing this, United States Trade Representative (USTR) Katherine Tai in a statement said that these tariff cuts will restore and expand market opportunities for US agricultural producers and manufacturers. A joint statement issued after the meeting of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President

Joe Biden said that both the countries have taken steps towards deepening bilateral cooperation to strengthen their economic relationship, including trade ties. "The leaders welcomed the resolution of six outstanding WTO disputes between the two countries through mutually agreed solutions," it said. The USTR said that the two countries "have agreed to terminate six outstanding disputes" at the WTO.

These include countervailing measures on certain hot-rolled carbon steel flat products from India, certain measures relating to solar cells and modules, measures relating to the renewable energy sector, export-related measures, certain measures on steel and aluminium products, and additional duties on some products from the US. According to trade experts, both countries can resolve the disputes on

mutually agreed terms and later inform the Geneva-based WTO about the same.

Commenting on this, commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal said that this decision is a "big victory" and will be mutually beneficial for both countries.

He said, it's a "package deal" and now there are no pending India-US disputes at WTO.

In 2018, the US imposed 25 per cent and 10 per cent import duties on certain steel and aluminium products, respectively, on grounds of national security. In retaliation, India in June 2019 imposed customs duties on 28 American products, including chickpeas, lentils, almonds, walnuts, apples, boric acid, and diagnostic reagents. The US had filed a complaint in the WTO about India's support measures to its export sector under different schemes.

Dar allegedly harasses journalist over question on elusive IMF deal

Islamabad, Jun 23 (PTI):

Pakistan's Finance Minister Ishaq Dar has found himself at the centre of a controversy for engaging in a heated exchange with a journalist, who accused the politician of slapping him over a question about the stalled IMF deal.

The incident occurred on Thursday when Dar was leaving the parliament premises after addressing a National Assembly session when he was approached by journalist Shahid Qureshi, the Dawn newspaper reported. In a video that has gone viral on social media, the reporter can be seen asking Dar if he would be willing to talk and the minister responded he had just finished speaking.

Qureshi then inquired about the progress of the



merely asked questions. At this point, Dar became visibly angry and confronted the journalist, asking him what he wanted and telling him to "fear God".

Dar then attempted to snatch the journalist's mobile phone and even instructed security personnel to seize and throw away the mobile phone, the report said.

While Dar, 73, did not reply to the questions, the journalist persisted and questioned the government's failure to secure the USD 1.1 billion deal from the Washington-based global lender. Dar then retorted that the deal could not be cracked "because people like you are in the system". The journalist defending himself asserted that reporters were not part of the system but

"The partnership between the United States and India is one of the

supply chains," it said. Modi, in his response, thanked Vice President Harris for her remarks. "Our partnership indeed holds immense potential for this century. I am equally enthusiastic about elevating our cooperation in futuristic sectors," he tweeted.

During his address to the US Congress on Thursday, Modi said, "There are millions here who have roots in India. Some of them sit proudly in this chamber. There is one behind me, who has made history."

He was referring to Harris, the first woman vice president and the highest-ranking female official in US history, as well as the first African-American and first Asian-American vice president.

Harris' mother Shyamala Gopalan, a breast cancer scientist, hailed from Chennai.

Teacher Resource Repository

The New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was adopted on 29th July 2020, which envisages the provision of quality education and equitable access to all students in a sustainable manner. During the past year and a half, schools across the world have adopted numerous innovative practices to ensure the continuity of education in the prevailing COVID 2019 pandemic. To widely disseminate school education related to quality, inclusivity, and sustainability, Shikshak Parv was organized wherein the teachers from both government and private schools shared various innovative practices adopted by their schools during and afterwards the pandemic. The initiatives were appreciated by both policy makers and practitioners.

In the light of the encouraging response and to further increase the width and depth of dissemination, a National Teacher Resource Repository (NTRR) at national level and State Teacher Resource Repository (STRR) at state levels are being created. The objective of TRR is to enhance the quality of education and highlight the contribution of

educators so that they can take pride in their profession and further train many teachers in their respective states. It also aims at recognizing and appreciating the good initiatives of teachers.

Peer-to-peer learning or mutual learning of participants of the same level in a group helps in constantly improving the skills of the whole group. Peer learning is especially well-suited for sharing innovations. The peer sharing of innovative school practices among TRR participants has the potential to inspire and motivate a large number of schools and teachers across the country. Learning from each other's experiences, teachers can be encouraged to collaborate their resources to improve the teaching learning process in their classrooms. Sharing innovations from time to time and on a continuous basis will provide the desired impetus towards quality of education for all students. This will help all the teachers, especially those in the remote areas, to improve their pedagogy. Amenities are not evenly distributed in our vast nation. The innovation and dissemination of such practices

will help in meeting the resource constraints, facilitate peer-to-peer learning, leverage technology to disseminate best practices amongst other teachers.

The TRR will be equipped with teachers from ten themes that align with the policy objectives of NPE 2020, namely (1) Early Childhood Care and Education - The Foundation of learning, (2) Foundational Literacy and Numeracy - An Urgent & Necessary Prerequisite to Learning, (3) Curtailing Drop-out Rates and Ensuring Universal Access to Education at all levels, (4) Curriculum and Pedagogy in Schools - Learning should be Holistic, Integrated, Enjoyable and Engaging, (5) Teachers, (6) Equitable and Inclusive Education - Learning for All, (7) Efficient Resourcing and Effective Governance through School Complexes/clusters, (8) Standard Setting and Accreditation for School Education, (9) Technology in Education - NDEAR, (10) Reimagining Vocational Education and Skill Building.

An innovative exercise by a teacher engages all the students in the classroom and makes the teaching-learning process enjoyable. A variety of practices has been applied during the COVID 2019 pandemic. Addressing the issue of connectivity, teaching children using different material available at home (Angana Me Shikhak), teaching children under an umbrella on a bike (Chhatri Wale Guruji), Mera Doodarshan Mera Mera Vidyalaya, Bal Samvidhan, Bal Sansad, Bal Bachat Bank,

Question Bank and Bal Samachar Patrika for shaping the personality of the children in right direction, eco-friendly activities like "Best from waste", Alternate assessment models in lieu of regular examinations including self-evaluation, peer feedback & parent feedback. Career Mitra Portal and other innovative practices on different themes, known for improvement in quality of education needs to be propagated, which will spur the teachers across the country to innovate.

The teachers from the repository will serve as a resource from which master trainers will be identified to train the teachers of other schools. The teachers of STRR will be trained by SCERTs and those under NTRR will be trained by NCERT. A WhatsApp or other group on social media of identified teachers will be created for each theme, which will share innovative practices adapted in their schools in a virtual mode.

There is no doubt that the pandemic has badly affected the human life and created hurdle to the education of the learners, but it has also opened the door for alternative and innovative way of learning and thinking. Efforts were made to cope up the alarming situation with local available resources. Several methods adopted in scattered regions, when cumulated through TRR, will certainly strengthen the education system of the nation in the long run.

First Made-in-India chips are expected to be rolled out by December 2024, Union Minister for Communications and IT Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Friday.

The minister said 4-5 semiconductor plants are expected to be set up in the country within a year.

"First Made-in-India chip will be out by December 2024," Vaishnaw said while briefing media following a joint statement issued by US President Joe Biden and Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the US.

He said that land allocation, factory design



work and tax compliance related agreement for the Micron semiconductor plant to be set up in Gujarat has been completed.

"First Made-in India chip from Micron is expected to come out in about six quarters from now," Vaishnaw said.

Computer storage chip

maker Micron will set up its semiconductor assembly and test plant in Gujarat entailing a total investment of USD 2.75 billion (around Rs 22,540 crore).

The total cost of the plant comprises USD 825 million from Micron and rest from the government in two phases. Phased construction of the facility is expected to begin in 2023. Phase 1, which will include 500,000 square feet of planned clean room space, will be operational in late 2024.

Micron has said the plant will create up to 5,000 new direct jobs and 15,000 community jobs over the next several years.

Gold falls Rs 370; silver plunges Rs 550



New Delhi, Jun 23 (PTI): Gold prices softened Rs 370 to Rs 59,180 per 10 grams in the national capital on Friday amid weak trends in overseas markets, according to HDFC Securities.

In the previous trade, the yellow metal had closed at Rs 59,550 per 10 grams.

Silver also plunged Rs 550 to Rs 70,950 per kilogramme.

"Gold edged lower on Friday, with spot gold prices in the Delhi markets trading at Rs 59,180/10 gram down by Rs 370 per 10 gram," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

In the international markets, both gold and silver were down at USD 1,916 per ounce and USD 22.30 per ounce, respectively.

The paper, authored by a team led by RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra, underlined the need for lowering inflation to revive consumer spending and boost corporate revenues and profitability.

The retail inflation based on the consumer price index (CPI), which remained above 5 per cent during 2022-23, is now on the decline and fell to a two-year low of 4.25 per cent in May, following RBI's monetary

policy actions and government measures.

"Recent national accounts data and corporate results when read in conjunction clearly show that inflation is slowing down personal consumption expenditure. This, in turn, is moderating corporate sales and holding back private investment in capacity creation,"

said the article published in the RBI's latest bulletin.

The Reserve Bank, however, said the views expressed in the bulletin articles are of the authors and do not represent the views of the Reserve Bank of India.

The article on the 'State of the Economy' stressed that bringing down inflation and stabilising inflation expectations will revive con-

sumer spending, and boost corporate revenues and profitability, which is the best incentive for private capex.

The article further said global economic activity has sustained its growth momentum in the second quarter of 2023, albeit with two diverging roads.

"While economies like India are rebounding, some others are slowing or contracting," it said.

The country's reserve position with the IMF was up by USD 34 million to USD 5,149 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.

Atmanirbhar Bharat not possible if socioeconomic disparities do not end: Gadkari

Union Minister Nitin Gadkari on Friday said the goal of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' or a self-reliant India is not possible without ending socioeconomic disparities in the country.

The minister of road transport and highway said more attention needs to be given to the agricultural, rural and tribal sectors, and pointed out that the objective of each government policy must be to double the contribution to GDP of these segments from the present 12 per cent.

In 2020, the central government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi adopted the "Atmanirbhar Bharat" goal in the middle of the Covid-19 pandemic.

"If socioeconomic disparity does not end then the Atmanirbhar Bharat is not possible," Gadkari said at an event to release a book on RBI Governors here.

The socialist and communist ideology has been completely sidelined over time, and the number of CPI and CPI(M) members in the Parliament has also thinned out over time, Gadkari said.

Recalling his visit to China as the BJP presi-

dent a few years ago on an invite from the Communist Party of China, Gadkari said only the red flags remain while the country adopted a market-centric approach to growth. Gadkari said there is a need for policies to make India a "super-economic power", and underlined the need for prioritising sectors which can deliver the most on the stated objectives.

He ruled that there is a problem with the mindset, and conservative approach is adopted by many, and said that the same needs to be changed through fast-tracked decision making.

There is a need to go beyond financial audits and also do performance audits to look at the outcomes, he said.





"Having to carry the legacy of obviously Mumbai cricket and Indian cricket is not an easy one and he's done it with a lot of grace and class," said Dravid.

However, as he completes 16 years in international cricket, the best compliment from a distance would certainly be from Virat Kohli.

HC suspends 10-year jail term of Zimbabwean woman in narcotics case

New Delhi, Jun 23 (PTI)

The Delhi High Court has suspended the 10-year jail term of a Zimbabwean woman in a narcotic recovery case, noting there was an alleged non-compliance of the procedure for sampling the seized substance and that the accused has already undergone over four years in custody.

Justice Anish Dayal said the standing orders issued by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and the Ministry of Finance ought to be respected by the probe agencies and the lack of compliance of these provisions imports an element of reasonable doubt, which would also impact the issue of proving the guilt of the accused.

"In this case, besides the fact that the appellant may have a case to argue on the issue of defective sampling at the time of seizure, the appellant has also undergone a substan-

tial period of sentence and the appeal is likely to take some time for hearing," stated the court in its recent order passed on an appeal by the accused against her conviction and sentencing by a trial court.

"This court deems it fit to suspend the sentence of the appellant. It is, therefore, directed that the sentence of the appellant be suspended pending the hearing of the appeal, on furnishing a personal bond in the sum of Rs 1,00,000 with one surety bond of the like amount," the court ordered.

It noted that the Supreme Court has said that in cases other than life sentence cases, the broad parameter of 50 per cent of the actual sentence undergone can be the basis for grant of bail.

"The appellant is a 38-year-old lady who is a citizen of Zimbabwe and has already undergone four years, 11 months and 18 days in custody," the court said.

"The court said the issue of improper sampling would have to be considered carefully at the time of adjudication of the appeal since *prima facie* it

seemed that the results of two samples drawn were not completely placed on record and there was evidently a mix of both the packets which were seized.

The court observed that the standing orders serve a purpose and cannot be rendered optional for compliance to the investigating agencies and their non-compliance invokes a reasonable doubt relating to the process of sampling which is the most critical procedure to be carried out in order to ascertain the nature of the substance and its quantity.

"In this court's view, the standing orders ought to be respected by the investigating agencies... The procedures prescribed in the said orders are based upon a certain logic which ought to be respected, or else it would be a worthless piece of paper... The lack of compliance of these provisions necessarily imports an element of doubt, moreover a reasonable doubt," the court said.

Man posing as RAW officer and cheating people arrested

A h m e d n a g a r (Maharashtra), Jun 23 (PTI) The Maharashtra Police has arrested a man who posed as an officer of the Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) bearing code name "Chanakya" and duped people by promising jobs in the income tax department and armed forces, officials said here on Friday.

The arrest, based on a tip-off from the military intelligence unit of the army's southern command, came months after Kiran Patel, a conman from Gujarat was arrested by the Jammu and Kashmir Police for posing as an official in the prime minister's office (PMO).

Rathore, 35, was arrested from a rented accommodation in Ahmednagar district in Maharashtra where he stayed with his girlfriend, they said.

Officials said a forged ID card of RAW and an Aadhaar card were recovered from his possession.

The designation mentioned in the fake identity card was deputy secretary (internal security) with his code name "Chanakya", they said.

Military intelligence officials had tipped the local police about the presence of a person in Shevgaon in Ahmednagar who was posing as an agent of the RAW.

Preliminary investigation revealed that the ac-

cused was collecting money from locals on the pretext of helping them get jobs in the income tax department, armed forces and other government departments.

A fake letter of appointment from the Department of Personnel was also recovered from his possession.

He was being questioned by a joint team of police and military intelligence.

Earlier, Kiran Patel, a resident of Gujarat, was arrested by the Jammu and Kashmir Police in March this year for posing as an official in the PMO and enjoying security and other amenities.

He had three cases of cheating registered against him in Gujarat.

Heavy rain triggers landslides in several parts of Arunachal

Itanagar, Jun 23 (PTI)

Relentless rain has triggered landslides and flood-like situation in several parts of Arunachal Pradesh, throwing life out of gear, officials said on Friday.

A stretch of the National Highway-415 between Banderdewa and Nirjuli, near here, was washed away on Thursday evening, while a portion of culvert formation at Karisngsa block point also eroded, Capital DC Talo Potom said.

He said PWD engineers have diverted vehicular movement via Harmut-Gumto-Doimukh till the road is restored.

The lone hanging bridge connecting the Puroik

Colony in Papu-Nallah with NH-415 has also been damaged, Potom said.

The Balipara-Charduar-Tawang (BCT) road between Elephant and Sessa has been blocked after a massive landslide struck, officials in West Kameng district said.

Blockades have also been reported at numerous points along the Aalo-Pangin Road in West Siang district, PWD (Highway) Assistant Engineer Gernar Padu said.

The department has engaged men and machinery to clear the debris, Padu said.

The appellant, Betty Rame, was apprehended by an NCB team in April 2018 at the IGI Airport and two packets weighing three kg and containing a crystalline substance — later confirmed as Methamphetamine — were recovered from her.
