## About the incident

The gunfight took place at around 7 am at a forested hill near Kesamundi village under th Bhairamgarh police station limits when a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxalte operation. Acting on specific inputs about the presence of 10-15 armed sonnel belonging to District Reserve Guard (DRG), Bastar Fighters and CRPF's 222nd bat talion launched the operation on Friday night. When the patrolling team was cordoning off the area on Saturday morning, an exchange of fire broke out between the two sides tha lasted for about haff an hour. After the fire exchange stopped, the body of a Naxalite was found at the spot. Security personnel also recover

some dating back to the British era, in order to foster an environment of ease and simplicity for citizens and businesses alike. With the Union Cabinet
endorsing numerous amendments proposed by the joint parliamentary committee, the bill is poised to usher in a new era of legal reform and public welfare. The Jan Vishwas Act seeks to redefine the contours of criminality
by removing imprisonment as a punitive measure for non-heinous crimes by removing imprisonment as a punitive measure for non-heinous crimes,
and instead, introducing more effective monetary penalties to deter poten-

nized the importance of establishing a single-window system to ensure effiiry to the public. In line with this, the central government has issued guidelines to make all procedures more public--friendly, making
significant strides in improving governance. By minimizing bureaucratic hurdles and leliminating the specter of imprisismment for trivial infractions,
this legislation aims to empower individuals to pursue their endeavors withthis legislation aims to empower individuals to pursue their endeavors with-
