Thane: A 54-year-old woman from Panvel in Maharashtra lost more than Rs three lakh to an online fraud while buying dry-fruits, police said on Wednesday. As per the woman's complaint, she came upon an advertisement for a dry-fruits store on Facebook on September 20 and ordered some dry-fruits. When she contacted the number mentioned in the advertisement, the person at the other end instructed her about how to make payment through a UPI-based app.

Mahadev app owner Chandrakar detained in Dubai

■ ED may file fresh charge sheet

Interpol at the behest of the ED.

The sources said Chandrakar's location in Dubai has been intimated to the federal agency and he has been put under "house detention".

Indian agencies are working, through diplomatic channels, to secure the deportation or extradition of the two who are vital to the money laundering and police investigation into the alleged illegal activities of the 'Mahadev Book Online' app that also have political links in Chhattisgarh and elsewhere, the sources said.

The ED is also expected to file a fresh (supplementary) charge sheet in this case against two people arrested by it in November from Chhattisgarh - alleged cash courier Asim Das and police constable

The agency, in its first charge sheet filed before a special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court in Raipur, had named Chandrakar and Uppal along with some others.

In this charge sheet, it had quoted the statement of Dilip Chandrakar, the uncle of Sourabh Chandrakar, that before Sourabh went to Dubai in

2019 he ran a juice shop named 'juice factory' along with his brother in Bhilai town of Chhattisgarh.

The ED claimed Sourabh Chandrakar got married at Ras Al Khaimah, UAE in February 2023 and about Rs 200 crore "in cash" were spent for this event in which private jets were hired to ferry his relatives from India to the UAE and celebrities were paid to perform. Uppal, 43, was detained last week in Dubai.

Both businessmen are being probed by the ED in the money laundering case linked to alleged illegal betting through online apps, apart from investigations by the Chhattisgarh and Mumbai Police Crime Branch.

A red notice was issued against the two by Interpol on the basis of the ED's request that was based on a

court-issued non-bailable warrant.

The projected proceeds of crime in this case are about Rs 6,000 crore, according to the ED.

The agency had claimed in November, just before the first phase of Chhattisgarh assembly polls, that forensic analysis and statement made by a 'cash courier' Asim Das have led to "startling allegations" that Mahadev betting app promoters have paid about Rs 508 crore to former Chhattisgarh chief minister and senior Congress leader Bhupesh Baghel, adding that these allegations were "subject matter of investigation".

Das had later submitted before the special court in Raipur that he had been framed as part of a conspiracy and he had never delivered cash to politicians.

Cabinet nod to open Consulate General of India

In Auckland

New Delhi, Dec 27 (PTI): India will soon open a consulate general in Auckland, which is home to a large number of non-resident Indians in New Zealand.

The Union Cabinet, at a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday, approved the proposal to open a Consulate General of India in Auckland, an official statement said. The consulate is likely to be opened and fully operationalised within 12 months, it added. India

currently has a consulate in Auckland, which is headed by a honorary consul. The opening of a consulate general would pave the way for the appointment of a consul general, a post usually held by an officer of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS). Opening the Consulate General of India in Auckland would help increase the country's diplomatic footprint and strengthen its representation in view of its increasing global engagement, the statement said.

PARI SECURITY BREACH CASE

Accused Neelam Azad challenges police remand

New Delhi, Dec 27 (PTI): Neelam Azad, an accused arrested in the December 13 Parliament security breach case, Wednesday approached the Delhi High Court alleging her police remand was illegal as she was not allowed to consult a legal practitioner of her choice to defend her during the trial court proceedings.

In her petition seeking a writ of habeas corpus directing her production before the high court as well as an order to "set her at liberty", Azad said not allowing her to consult a

lawyer of her choice amounted to violation of her fundamental right guaranteed under the Constitution, making the remand order unlawful. The trial court has remanded her in police custody till January 5.

The matter is likely to be mentioned for urgent hearing before a vacation bench of the high court on Thursday.

Under Indian laws, a detainee or a person on their behalf can file a habeas corpus petition in a high court or the Supreme Court for their production if they feel they have been detained illegally. Upon production, if the court

concerned concludes that the detention is illegal, it can order their release.

"Upon her arrest, the petitioner's family wasn't informed. It was informed only in the evening of 14.12.2023. Further, she wasn't permitted to meet any person including advocates which is mandatory under Article 22(1) of the Constitution of India.

Even at the court a single DLSA (Delhi Legal Services Authority) counsel was appointed to all the accused persons without giving them any choice among counsels," the plea, filed through lawyer Suresh Kumar, alleged.

'Govt working to make cooperatives strong aspect of rural life'

New Delhi, Dec 27 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday said his government is working to make cooperatives a strong aspect of rural life, asserting that they are being scaled up in fisheries and different sectors of agriculture after making a mark in dairy and sugar industries.

In a virtual interaction with beneficiaries of the ongoing 'Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra', he batted for protecting the interests of small farmers saying they are at times forced to sell their produce at low prices due to a lack of storage facilities and his government will boost storage capacity massively across the country. "We have to build

lakhs of such storage facilities," he said.

grammes in the last 10 years has been a story of courage, satisfaction and dreams. Modi said it has been a great source of satisfaction for him to see the self-confidence of people when he interacts with them. It has been not even

50 days since the yatra began and it is a record that it has already covered 2.5 lakh villages, he said. During the yatra, he said, one crore people have been given 'Ayushman' cards to benefit from the government-run health insurance scheme for the poor, 1.25 crore people have undergone health check-ups while more than 70 lakh were inspected for tuberculosis.

The activists of the Narayana Gowda faction of the KRS held rallies in various parts of the city, especially in business hubs such as MG Road, Brigade Road, Lavelle Road, UB City, Chamarajapet, Chickpet, Kempe Gowda Road, Gandhi Nagar, St Marks Road, Cunningham Road, Residency Road and Sadahalli Gate near Devanahalli. From New Year for next five years

Food Department issued letter to Collectors

67 lakh 92 thousand 153 ration card holding families of the state will get benefits.

Raipur, Dec 27: Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai has taken a big decision in the interest of poor families. Poor families of Chhattisgarh will get free rice through fair price shops from the new year for the next five years. The Food and Civil Supplies Department has issued instructions to all the collectors in this regard. Chief Minister Sai, on the lines of Prime Minister Narendra Modi distributing free monthly entitlement rice on Antyodaya and priority category ration cards under the National Food Security Act for



the next 5 years from January 2024 to December 2028, has announced Antyodaya under the Chhattisgarh Food and Nutrition Security Act. Instructions have been given to distribute free rice to priority, disabled and single destitute categories of the state will get free rice through government fair price shops as per their eligibility.

Officials of the Food Department said that under the Food Security Act, 14 lakh 92 thousand 438 ration card holders of Antyodaya category, 52 lakh 46 thousand 656 of priority category, 37,708 of single destitute category and 15,351 disabled category ration card holders will be eligible from January 2024 and will get benefit from

free rice distribution for five years. With this decision, 67 lakh 92 thousand 153 eligible ration card holders of Antyodaya, Priority, Disabled and Single Destitute categories of the state will get free rice through government fair price shops as per their eligibility.

In this regard, a letter has been issued by the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Protection Department located at the Ministry Mahanadi Bhawan, Atal Nagar Nava Raipur, and instructions have been given to all the Collectors and concerned officers to provide free rice as per their eligibility.

16-member pro-talks ULFA delegation leaves for New Delhi

● For signing peace accord

Guwahati, Dec 27 (PTI):

A 16-member delegation of ULFA pro-talks faction led by chairman Arabinda Rajkhowa left for New Delhi on Wednesday for the proposed signing of a tripartite peace accord with the central and the state governments on December 29. Besides Rajkhowa, other senior members of the delegation comprises the outfit's foreign secretary Sasadhar Choudhury, finance secretary Chitrabon Hazarika, cultural secretary Pranati Deka, deputy commander-in-chief Raju Barua, among others.

The outfit's general secretary, Anup Chetia, has been camping in New

Delhi since Monday and held talks with peace interlocutor AK Mishra on Tuesday. Rajkhowa told reporters at the Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport here before their departure that they were 'optimistic' that the accord will be in the interest of the people of Assam and will resolve a long-standing issue'.

He said the peace talks, which began in 2011, was a long process of discussions and negotiations but 'we are now going to New Delhi with the hope that there will be an amicable solution'. Union home ministry officials were likely to hold talks with the ULFA leaders on Wednesday evening.

The peace accord was likely to be signed on December 29 in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah and

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma.

The Centre had sent a draft of the proposed agreement to the pro-talks faction in April this year. Another round of discussions were held with the faction in New Delhi in August.

India-Russia relations reflect geopolitical realities, strategic convergence and mutual benefit, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said Wednesday as he held a wide-ranging and "useful" meeting with his Russian counterpart Sergey Lavrov here during which they discussed the international situation and contemporary issues.

Jaishankar, who is on a five-day visit to Russia, and Lavrov also exchanged views on the Indo-Pacific region, the Ukraine conflict, the Gaza situation, Afghanistan and Central Asia, BRICS, Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, G20 and the UN.

"A wide-ranging and useful meeting with FM Sergey Lavrov of Russia.

As strategic partners, discussed the international situation and contemporary issues," Jaishankar said in a post on X.

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan had openly linking ratification of Sweden's NATO membership to the US Congress' approval of a Turkish request to purchase 40 new F-16 fighter jets and kits to modernize Turkey's existing fleet.

Erdogan also called on Canada and other NATO allies to life arms

embargoes imposed on Turkey.

The White House has backed the Turkish F-16 request but there is strong opposition in Congress to military sales to Turkey.

The Turkish parliament's foreign affairs committee had begun discussing Sweden's membership in NATO last month. The meeting however was adjourned after legislators from Erdogan's ruling party submitted a motion for a postponement on grounds that some issues needed more clarification and that negotiations with Sweden hadn't "matured" enough.

On Tuesday, a majority of legislators in the committee voted in favor of Sweden's application to join.

Sweden and Finland abandoned their traditional positions of military nonalignment to seek protection under NATO's security umbrella, following Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. Finland joined the alliance in April, becoming NATO's 31st member.

NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg welcomed the development, saying that he counts on Turkey and Hungary "to now complete their ratifications as soon as possible. Sweden's membership will make NATO stronger."

Toxic Waters

Arsenic and Fluoride in groundwater

The new development that has far-reaching implications for the well-being of millions across the nation, the National Green Tribunal has taken a commendable step by issuing notices to 24 states and four Union Territories. The matter at hand pertains to a grave concern: the alarming presence of arsenic and fluoride in groundwater sources. It becomes abundantly clear that swift, comprehensive action is imperative to protect the health and future of our citizens. The states to which notices have been issued include Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, and Nagaland. The inclusion of these states underscores the widespread nature of this crisis and the urgent need for collective action. The National Green Tribunal, an institution entrusted with safeguarding the environment and public health, rightly recognized the gravity of the situation. Describing the presence of these harmful elements as "very serious," the tribunal emphasized the urgent necessity of preventative and protective measures. This is not merely a matter of environmental concern; it is an issue of paramount public health importance. The tribunal's intervention stems from its suo motu cognizance of a media report that shed light on the disturbing reality of arsenic and fluoride contamination beyond permissible levels in groundwater across various states and Union Territories. This report, a harbinger of the impending crisis, exposed the widespread presence of arsenic in groundwater across 230 districts in 25 states, as well as the contamination of fluoride in 469 districts spanning 27 states. The gravity of the situation cannot be overstated. The bench, comprised of Judicial Member Justice Sudhir Agarwal and Expert Member A Senthil Vel, rightfully scrutinized the actions of the Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA), the body responsible for regulating groundwater resources. In its submission, the CGWA acknowledged the presence of arsenic and fluoride in numerous districts and states. These chemicals have well-documented toxic effects on human health, posing severe health hazards to our citizens. It is disconcerting to note that the CGWA attempted to evade its statutory responsibility by invoking water as a state subject. However, this feeble excuse had already been unequivocally dismissed by a 1997 Supreme Court verdict and a 2022 tribunal order. The tribunal rightly expressed its astonishment at the CGWA's audacity in shirking its obligations, particularly in the face of such a dire and well-established crisis. The issue at hand demands immediate and concerted action from all concerned authorities. The presence of arsenic and fluoride in groundwater sources across numerous states and districts is not a matter to be taken lightly. It necessitates a unified, intergovernmental approach to tackle this pressing problem. The National Green Tribunal has rightfully expanded the scope of parties involved in this critical matter, encompassing 28 states and Union Territories, along with the Central Ground Water Authority and the Union Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change. This comprehensive approach is essential to ensure that all stakeholders are held accountable and contribute to finding effective solutions.

Learning from empathy cards

A shika Singh, a Madhyamik examinee was unable to find the right bus for her destination in the absence of her parents. As there was not much time left for the start of the examination, she became nervous and began crying. When Souvik Chakraborty, a police officer-in-charge of Howrah Bridge traffic guard in West Bengal, saw the unknown girl crying alone near Howrah bridge, he realised that the time was really short to reach to the examination centre. He then promptly took her to his police vehicle and dropped her off to the venue after taking help from his colleagues and seniors in Lalbazar police headquarters to turn all the traffic signals on their way green ensuring a clear pathway. On reaching the centre in the nick of time, he wished the girl best for her examination. According to the Cambridge dictionary the word 'empathy' means the ability to share or experience by imagining what it would be like to be in that person's situation. The action taken by Souvik Chakraborty is an excellent example of empathy. A few months ago, the Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud rightly pointed out that India needed institutions of empathy more than institutions of eminence. He also suggested some steps to stop such nasty incidents like the suicide by a Dalit student at IIT Bombay and another Dalit student's suicide last year at National Law University in Odisha. Indeed, every society needs empathy that is the ability to share the feelings of others more than eminence which is nothing but fame or acknowledged superiority within a particular sphere. A society needs good human beings rather than highly intelligent serial killers or extremely greedy, unscrupulous business tycoons. These people may be superior and smart in their respective field but they damage and destroy the country, society and environment and do not do anything constructive. Whereas an ordinary, honest and caring person contributes a lot to the society. From the tunnel collapse in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi to flooded streets in Chennai after a few hours of rain highlight that there is something wrong in urban planning. We do not need smart brutes but smart human beings to make anything be it a city or a country look smart. Parents and educational institutions must realise that cooperation is more important than competition among citizens for a country's survival and progress. Media has a great role to play in this regard. They should highlight and report elaborately about acts of empathy like the 12 rat-hole miners who rescued 41 trapped workers from a tunnel in Uttarkashi after working at a stretch for nearly 24 hours inside a narrow steel pipe of 800mm diameter on their toes. After the rescue operation, one of them said, "Labourers have saved fellow labourers. May be some day we will be trapped somewhere during work and these rescued workers will save us." This very thought, "May be some day we will be trapped" blooms from "the ability to share or experience what it would be like to be in that person's situation". Such acts of empathy need to be highlighted and discussed in educational institutions at least in one period in every week so that what the Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud underscored could be translated into reality. A teacher can use empathy cards to help young children develop their ability to empathise. Each card outlines a particular situation and asks how the person would feel if he or she were in that very situation. Now let us play with empathy cards. Suppose I myself get an empathy card asking, "Imagine you were a Kashmiri. Then how would you feel now if you have been living in Jammu and Kashmir before and also after it becoming two union territories?" Honestly, my answer would be, had my state been turned into two union territories, it would have made me sad.

To make the youth self-reliant and strengthen the country's economy, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had launched "Start Up India" scheme on 16 January 2016, which can be considered a successful initiative started by the government today. India is progressing rapidly with the help of "Start Up India" Scheme. Only 111 unicorn startups had employed 4,42,714 people by July 2023, which is 12,765 more than the 4,29,949 employees recorded in September 2022. The Unicorn startups are those whose value is more than 1 billion US dollars. From this figure, the increasing importance of startups in India can be estimated.

According to data from Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) and Ministry of Commerce and Industry, the number of startups in India was 8635 in 2018, 11279 in 2019, 14498 in 2020, 20046 in 2021 and 26542 in 2022. Though, the number of tech startups in India was 68 thousand by June 2023, which is expected to increase to 1.8 lakh by 2030, whereas, between 2014 and June 2023, the number of startups has increased to more than 99 thousand, out of which about 50 percent are headquartered in Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities, which shows that today startups are thriving not only in metros but also in small towns.

There is more risk in startup, but when the business runs, it gives significant returns to the promoter and provides employment to many others.

To promote startups, the government has started Credit Guarantee Scheme for Startups. To provide loans to startups, financial institutions must comply with the conditions of the DIPP. Only financial institutions approved by DIPP can provide loans to startups. Financial assistance

to startups is given in the form of working capital, debentures, term loans etc. Member lending institutions of DIPP can provide loan amount up to Rs.5 crore to startups without third party guarantee or collateral security.

If a startup wants to take a loan of Rs.1.5 crore under this scheme, then 75 percent of its financial assistance is given by the institute and the remaining 25 percent amount must be arranged by the entrepreneur himself or herself. At the same time, the financial institution gives up to 85 percent of the loan to entrepreneurs seeking a loan of less than Rs.5 lakh and the entrepreneur must arrange 15 percent of the amount himself or herself.

The government has also launched Atal Innovation Mission, Startup India Seed Fund Scheme etc. to promote innovation in startups. With this, the e-Biz portal, developed by Infosys, is serving as a communication hub for all business investors and entrepreneurs, helping startups to grow. However, to ensure the growth of startups, there is also a need to create a conducive environment in India, simplify regulatory requirements, provide appropriate facilities, etc.

Young population equipped with technology, large number of middle class who have less capital but are equipped with innovative ideas, favourable regulatory scenario etc. have important contributions for the sharp increase in the number of startups in the country.

Due to the increasing number of startups, the contribution of startups to India's gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to increase by 5 to 10 percent by 2030.

The biggest obstacle in the development of startups is investment, but this obstacle is gradually being eliminated with the support of the government.

Government banks and other financial institutions are not averse to funding startups. Domestic and foreign multi-national companies are also in-

vesting in Indian startups. With the strengthening of the Indian startup ecosystem, investor participation can increase to 46 percent by 2030. At the same time, by 2027, the number of Indian high-net-worth individuals (HNIs) may increase to 1.7 million at a compound annual growth rate of 16 percent.

Indian startups are expanding not only within the country but also globally. The growth of startups in India has ushered in a new era of economic progress and innovation. With the help of startups in India, people's income and employment generation are increasing and people are becoming self-reliant.

It is believed that the start-up will manufacture goods in the country, which will reduce their prices. Importing goods from abroad increases their price, because the expense incurred in bringing the products from abroad is also added to the price of the products. If any item is manufactured in the country, then the needs of the people of the country will be fulfilled, at the same time foreign exchange will come to the country through export, rise in income, profit in domestic trade, increase in government treasury, upsurge in growth rate, strength in Gross Domestic Product (GDP), growth in employment rate etc. may be possible.

In view of the steady improvement in the Indian economy, it is expected to reach the level of Rs. 3 trillion to Rs. 5 trillion by the year 2025. At the same time, in the recent report of HSBC, the Indian economy has been estimated to reach the level of Rs.7 trillion in 5 to 10 years, because the phase of rapid improvement in the economy continues. In this way, with the help of startups, the possibility of the country's economy becoming even more rosy has increased.

Despite the Chhattisgarh government's recent change, the Excise Department delivered stock to Dongargaon earlier this week. However, due to the high demand from retail customers, the supply of country liquor could not keep up.

Country liquor is known for its affordability, but with the non-availability of their preferred choice, patrons are reluctantly pur-

chasing more expensive English liquor. The overcrowded English liquor shop witnessed operators selling liquor arbitrarily, offering whatever brand they had on hand to customers, who accepted it amid the hustle and bustle. Excise Officer Kusumata Jolhe explained that the shortage isn't limited to Dongargaon alone; the entire

Chhattisgarh region is grappling with a lack of country liquor due to stock supply issues. After stock depletion, replenishments are ordered from the warehouse. Despite instances of alcohol being sold at higher prices recently, concrete actions have yet to be taken, and the transfer of stock continues among different shops.

The removal of Chakhna shops near government liquor shops, once a hot topic, now appears ineffective. Chakhna shops continue to operate near the Dongargaon liquor shop. Additionally, liquor consumption remains rampant in open spaces, fields, and barns in the area. Liquor enthusiasts are leaving plastic pouches,

glasses, and broken glass pieces scattered in the vicinity, with little government and administrative control. Dongargaon Police is actively arresting Kochiyas (local liquor vendors) involved in the illegal liquor trade almost daily, confirming the sale of liquor in rural areas through Kochiyas for substantial profits.

Large numbers of Kochiyas are operating, making liquor readily available from government liquor shops in Dongargaon and Arjuni. During recent police operations, only plain country liquor has been seized. On December 25th, a Kochiya was apprehended in Rudgaon village within the police station area.

Ton-up Rahul takes India to 245

KL Rahul scored one of his most satisfying hundreds in extremely difficult batting conditions to take India to an above-par first innings score of 245 against South Africa on the second day of the opening Test here Wednesday.

At lunch, South Africa were 194 for 3 at tea. Dean Elgar with an elegant century (115 not out) and David Bedingham at 32 were at the crease.

Pakistan's openers had survived the new ball before Lyon made the initial breakthrough in the 16th over, removing Imam-ul-Haq caught at second slip for 10 at 34 for one.

Cummins changed the momentum of the day's play by claiming a diving return catch to dismiss Shafiq at 124 for two. Cummins leapt into the air in delight in his next over after bowling Babar Azam for one, finding a gap between bat and pad with a fabulous off-cutter as the crowd of 44,837 roared with delight.

Skipper Shan aimed a mighty swipe down the ground, advancing down the pitch and edging a

IOA forms 3-member ad hoc committee to run affairs of suspended WFI
