Girl mauled

Jaipur: A four-year-old girl was allegedly mauled to death by a stray dog on Friday near a dargah in the Udaipur district of Rajasthan, police said. The incident occurred when Reshma was sitting near a place outside a dargah, waiting for her father. The family, natives of Madhya Pradesh, had come to visit the dargah on the occasion of Ramzan, Amba Mata police station Head Constable Ranjeet Singh said. Reshma was attacked by a stray dog and was seriously injured. She was then rushed to a hospital, where she succumbed to her injuries, Singh said.

Court acquits

Thane: A court in Maharashtra's Thane district has acquitted four persons accused of robbery and purchase of stolen jewellery. Additional sessions judge Amit M Shete acquitted Mukhtar Sheru Husain, Mohammad Afsar Sayyad, Aji Hafij Sayyad and Kantilal Anandji Shah who were booked under sections 392 (robbery) and 413 (dealing with stolen property) of the Indian Penal Code. The copy of the order issued on March 18, was made available on Thursday. Three accused were from Kalyan, while Shah, a goldsmith, was from neighbouring Mumbai.

Cash seized

Dhanbad: Over Rs 34 lakh in cash was seized from a car in Jharkhand's Dhanbad district on Friday morning, police said. The car was on the way to Hazaribag from Durgapur in West Bengal when it was stopped at a check-post near the interstate border in the Maithon police station area, they said. A total of Rs 34.74 lakh in cash was seized from it, they added. The Income Tax Department has been informed about it, and the occupants of the car were being interrogated to ascertain the source of the money, police said.

Fire breaks out

Bengaluru: More than 20 people were rescued after a fire broke out at the basement of a four-storey commercial building at RT Nagar here on Friday afternoon, officials said. There was no injury or loss of life reported, they said. A call about a fire was received at 1.50 pm, following which four fire tenders were rushed to the spot, officials said, adding that the fire was doused by 4 pm.

Fire breaks out at storage depot of power company

No casualty reported; transformers worth lakhs gutted in fire

Raipur, Apr 05:

A major fire broke out at a storage facility of Chhattisgarh State Power Distribution Company Limited here on Friday, gutting transformers kept in the premises, an official said. While no casualties were reported in the blaze, people living near the facility located in the Gudhiyari area were evacuated, he said.

Electrical equipment, mostly transformers, stored at the facility caught fire in the afternoon, the police official said. More than 10 fire tenders were pressed into service to douse the flames and additional fire tenders have been called in from the industries, he said. The firefighting operation is underway and the cause of the blaze was not immediately known, the official said. A 132 KV power substation is located next to the storage facility, and efforts are to prevent the blaze from spreading there as it could affect power supply to parts of the city, he added. Senior officials from the district administration and police have reached the spot.

Chhattisgarh liquor scam

SC may quash ED case against former IAS officer

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

The Supreme Court said on Friday it may quash a money laundering case against former IAS officer Anil Tuteja and his son Yash in the alleged Rs 2,000 crore liquor scam in Chhattisgarh, saying there were no proceeds of crime. "We have gone through the ECIR (Enforcement Case Information Report) and the FIR lodged in the case. We find that there is no predicate offence and there are no proceeds of crime. If there is no proceeds of crime, then there is no money laundering. We will quash this complaint," a bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and



Ujjal Bhuyan told Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, who appeared for the Enforcement Directorate. Raju said there is enough material with the probe agency and, if the court is inclined to quash the ECIR, then the ED be given liberty to lodge a fresh complaint and proceed with the case.

LS POLL MANIFESTO

Cong promises to raise 50 pc cap on quotas, right to apprenticeship, make MSP legal

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

Right to apprenticeship, a legal guarantee for MSP, passing a constitutional amendment to raise the 50 per cent cap on reservations for SCs, STs and OBCs, a nation-wide caste census and scrapping of Agnipath scheme are among the promises made by the Congress in its Lok Sabha polls manifesto released on Friday.

The manifesto, focusing on five "pillars of justice" and 25 guarantees under them, was released at the AICC headquarters in the presence of Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and senior party chiefs Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi. In the 45-page document titled 'Nyay Patra',

Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case

SC grants bail to activist Shoma Kanti Sen

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

The Supreme Court on Friday granted bail to academic activist Shoma Kanti Sen, who was arrested in June 2018 in connection with the Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case. A bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose and Augustine George Masih directed that she be released on bail on such conditions as the special court may consider fit and proper. It said the conditions shall include that Sen shall not leave the state of Maharashtra without the permission of the special

court. "The appellant (Sen) shall inform the investigation officer of the NIA about the address where she shall reside during the period she remains enlarged on bail," the bench said while pronouncing the order. It said she shall use only one mobile phone number during the bail period and share it with the investigating officer.

"The appellant shall also ensure that the mobile remains active and charged round the clock so that she remains constantly accessible throughout the period she remains enlarged on bail," it said.

Large-scale climatic phenomena conducive for monsoon: IMD chief

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

As summer scorches large parts of the country, weather scientists have picked up early signs of a favourable monsoon season this year in fading El Nino conditions and lesser snow cover over Eurasia.

In an interview with PTI, India Meteorological Department Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said large-scale climatic phenomena were conducive for the southwest monsoon, which is crucial for the largely rain-fed Indian

Delhi excise case

Court allows CBI to interrogate K Kavitha

New Delhi: A court here on Friday allowed the CBI to interrogate BRS leader K Kavitha, arrested in the Delhi excise policy case, in Tihar jail. Kavitha was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) in a money laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam on March 15.

The order was passed on the plea filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) seeking the court's permission to interrogate Kavitha in judicial custody. Kavitha had urged the court on Thursday for enlarging her on interim bail on account of her 16-year-old son's exams for which he needed his mother's "moral and emotional support".

SC stays HC order scrapping Madarsa Education Act

Says Allahabad HC misconstrued provisions of law

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

In a breather to about 17 lakh madarsa students, the Supreme Court on Friday stayed an order of the Allahabad High Court that scrapped the Uttar Pradesh Board of Madarsa Education Act, 2004 calling it "unconstitutional" and violative of the principle of secularism. Observing that the issues raised in the petitions merit closer reflection, a three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud issued notices to the Centre, the Uttar Pradesh government and others on the pleas against the high



court order. "The object and purpose of Madarsa board is regulatory in nature and the Allahabad HC is not prima facie correct that establishment of board will breach secularism," the bench, also comprising Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, said. The top court said the high court "prima

facie" misconstrued the provisions of the Madarsa Act, which does not provide for any religious instruction. "The finding of the high court that the very establishment of the board would violate secularism appears to conflate Madarsa education with the regulatory powers of the board. "If the concern was to ensure that the students of Madarsas receive quality education, the remedy would not lie in striking down the Madarsa Act but in issuing suitable directions to ensure that the students are not deprived of quality education," the bench said.

Infiltration bid foiled

1 terrorist killed

Srinagar, Apr 05 (PTI):

In a major success ahead of Lok Sabha polls in Jammu and Kashmir, security forces on Friday foiled an infiltration bid along the Line of Control in Baramulla district, killing at least one terrorist, officials said. Alert troops of the army noticed some suspicious movement along the LoC at Sabura Nala Rustam in Uri area of the district and challenged intruders, the officials said. They said the intruders opened fire which was retaliated by the soldiers, re-

sulting in killing of at least one terrorist. The body of one slain ultra has been recovered while the security forces believe another terrorist might have also been killed in the action.

A cache of arms and ammunition were recovered from the scene of the encounter including two AK rifles, three magazines, four hand grenades and Rs 10,250 Indian currency. The security officials said the successful elimination of the infiltration bid was a significant achievement ahead of the Lok Sabha polls next month.

Sector Officers in the election work. Dr Sanjay Kumar Das, Assistant Professor, Master Trainer, Government College, Vaishali Nagar, made the sector officers aware of the election related work in the training programme. He spoke about the instructions prescribed by the Election Commission of India. Sector officers were asked to discharge their assigned duties with full responsibility. They were asked to realise the importance of election work. Sector officers were informed about their responsibilities from the implementation of the model code of conduct till the completion of the election process. They were asked to pay more attention in sensitive areas where disputes are likely to occur during voting. Based on past incidents at the local level, they were asked to take the help of



police officers to ensure law and order in the polling stations. Master Trainer HS Bhuwal, Lecturer, Government Higher Secondary School, Nardha, said that the Sector Officer has the maximum responsibilities in the elections. Their work starts as soon as the election program is announced and they can be

freed only after the voting process is over. A sector officer is in charge of ten to twelve polling stations. He is the friend, philosopher and guide of the polling parties under his charge. He is also the representative of the Election Commission in his sector. They are the link between the polling party and RO/ARO. They should visit the centers of

their charge as soon as they are appointed. They should have complete knowledge about EVM, without any confusion and doubt. The Sector Officer should also have complete knowledge of the voting process. They should also have good knowledge of their area and its access routes. He said that the Sector Officer should visit the

polling stations of his charge before voting and collect information. If there is any obstacle in travelling in the sector, such as broken bridge or culvert or cut road, then the Sector Officer should immediately contact the RO/ARO and can also inform the concerned agency. They should be well aware about lighting, shade, drinking water; toi-

lets, ramp arrangements. The offices of political parties and candidates should be more than 200 meters away from the centre. If the polling station is new then it should be given adequate publicity. Sector officers should also keep an eye on whether the model code of conduct is being followed in their sector. They should also keep an eye on the movement of unauthorized campaign vehicles in their area, misuse of government property and defacement of their and private properties. On the day of voting, the Sector Officers will also have the powers of the Zonal Magistrate. Apart from this, Sector Officers will ensure that a day before voting, all the polling parties reach their respective polling stations and they do not face any problem regarding voting material, any member of the party, or EVM, all security including CPF al-

lotted with the party. The personnel should be present at the centre. Sector officer will send a report to RO. Sector officers will ensure mock polls on the day of voting and will focus on those centers where there are no polling agents. Also ensure that voting starts on time, EEM/VVPAT can be changed if necessary. They will keep an eye on the pace of voting and compile a report every two hours and send it to the RO. During the training, Additional Collector Arvind Ekka and Yogita Dewangan, Additional Collector and Deputy District Election Officer Bajrang Dubey, Joint Collector Harvansh Miri, Deputy Collector Lavkesh Dhruv and Uttam Dhruv, Tehsildar Bhilai BB Panchbhai, Assistant Returning Officers and all the nodal officers were present.

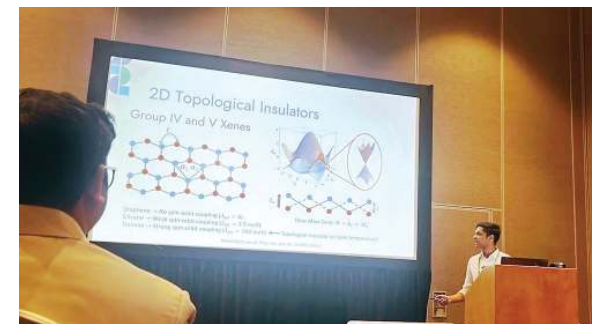

Raipur, Apr 05: Tragedy struck the heart of Raipur's Gudhiyari district as a massive fire tore through the electricity distribution company's primary storage depot, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake. The inferno, which originated from a 24-kilowatt liter diesel tank, quickly spread to three adjacent oil tankers and thousands of transformers, cables, and conductors, engulfing the area in flames and thick smoke.

As the fire raged on for hours, panic gripped the densely populated surroundings, with residents fleeing for safety as chaos ensued. Witnesses de-



scribed scenes of terror as people scrambled to escape the advancing flames, their eyes stinging from the acrid smoke that filled the air. Despite the valiant efforts of firefighting teams and emergency responders, the sheer intensity of the blaze posed unprecedented challenges, hindering their attempts to contain the inferno.

Authorities swiftly moved to seal off the area,

recognizing the grave threat posed by the raging fire. High-ranking officials, including the IG, Collector, SSP, Disaster Rescue Director, and Corporation Commissioner, descended upon the scene, coordinating rescue and containment efforts in a bid to stem the tide of devastation. Political figures, including Home Minister Vijay Sharma, MP Sunil Soni, Education Minister Brijmohan

Agarwal, and MLA Rajesh Munat, also arrived to assess the situation and provide support to affected residents.

Throughout the ordeal, the resilience of the community was tested as fear and uncertainty gripped the region. Thousands of residents found themselves in the midst of a disaster, forced to confront the very real possibility of irreparable loss. As the flames con-

thick smoke had engulfed the vicinity, infiltrating homes and causing widespread distress among the population.

The proximity of densely populated areas such as Krishna Nagar, Ramnagar, and Jyotiba Nagar exacerbated the peril, with the risk of the fire spreading becoming

alarmingly real. Over a hundred families found themselves abruptly displaced from their homes, with Krishna Nagar bearing the brunt of the impact. As billows of heavy smoke billowed from the store depot, the number of affected families soared to over two hundred.



Massive response effort mobilized

Despite the deployment of thirty fire vehicles, which tirelessly made over a hundred rounds, the fire continued its rampage, prompting a desperate call for assistance from neighboring districts such as Mahasamund, Jalai BSP, and nearby industries. Responders from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) also rushed to the scene to bolster containment efforts. More than twenty additional fire vehicles and around a hundred firefighters and police personnel were directly engaged in the grueling rescue operation. Even the city army was summoned to aid in the battle against the relentless flames. At the forefront of the re-

sponse, Collector Gaurav Singh, SSP Santosh Singh, and Municipal Corporation Commissioner Abinash Mishra, along with their dedicated teams, stood steadfast, coordinating relief efforts with unwavering determination. Meanwhile, IPS Ajatshatru Bahadur Singh, Director of the State Relief Disaster Department, led his team in an unyielding fight against the blaze. Relief operations, initiated in four strategic phases by the District Administration, Police, and Municipal Corporation, saw the mobilization of over three hundred personnel, including firefighters, police officers, and municipal workers.

Despite the overwhelming odds, brave firefighters and volunteers worked tirelessly to combat the blaze, risking their lives to protect others and salvage what remained.

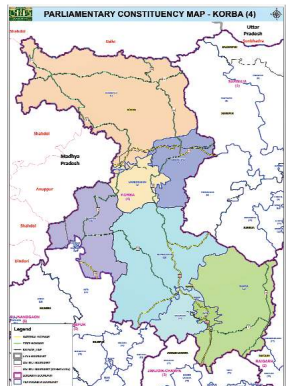

More than 2 lakh voters to be participants of LS 2024

Voting will be held in 306 polling stations of the district on May 7

Korea, Apr 05:

For the commencing Lok Sabha elections 2024, voting will be held on Tuesday, May 7, 2024 under the third phase in Koriya district, which falls under Korba Lok Sabha parliamentary seat. Before this, notification will be published on April 12, and April 19 is the last date for filing nominations, while the scrutiny of nomination papers will be done on April 20 and April 22 is the date of withdrawal of nominations. The inclination of the voters in the Lok Sabha elections will be known during the



counting of votes on Tuesday, June 4, 2024.

There are 228 polling stations in Baikunthpur development block and 78 polling stations have been made in Sonhat (partial) development block. There are 1 lakh 70 thousand 663 voters in Baikunthpur development block, while there are 36 thousand 552

voters in Sonhat (partial) development block. Talking about male and female voters, the number of male voters in Baikunthpur development block is 85 thousand 85 while the number of female voters is 85 thousand 572. Similarly, in Sonhat (partial) development block, the number of male voters is 18 thousand 230 while the number of female voters is 18 thousand 321. In this way 2 lakh 7 thousand 215 voters will be participants of healthy democracy.

According to information, there are 6 thousand 920 new youth voters, 2 thousand 188 disabled voters, the number of voters aged 85 years and above is 640, while 7 third gender voters will exercise their franchise. In last five years, voters increased by about

4 percent in Baikunthpur and 11 percent in Sonhat. In the last Lok Sabha elections, the percentage of male voters in Baikunthpur development block was 77.59 percent and the percentage of female voters was 75.57 percent. Similarly, in Sonhat (partial) development block, the percentage of male voters was 88.59 percent and the percentage of female voters was 85.81 percent, while this time, there has been an increase of 3.84 percent voters in Baikunthpur development block and 11.15 percent increase in Sonhat (partial) development block.

There are 8 assembly constituencies included in Korba parliamentary seat and seat includes 8 assembly constituencies in 4 districts. Rampur, Korba,

Katghora, Pali-Tanakhar of Korba district, Baikunthpur of Korea district, Manendragarh, Bharatpur-Sonhat of MCB district and Gaurela-Pendra-Marwahi are Marwahi assembly seats. As soon as the code of conduct was imposed on March 17, property defacement teams were formed under urban body and gram panchayat wise in the district, under which action was taken against property defacement. Indian Coast Guard rescues 27 Bangladeshi fishermen

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

The Indian Coast Guard has rescued 27 Bangladeshi fishermen whose fishing boat had drifted inside Indian waters after its steering gear suffered a breakdown rendering them stranded at sea, officials on Friday said. The swift rescue operation took place on Thursday, they said.

"At about 1130 hrs on April 4, Indian Coast Guard Ship 'Amogh' during patrol at Indo-Bangladesh International Maritime Border Line (IMBL) sighted a Bangladeshi fishing boat (BFB) 'Sagar II' adrift inside Indian waters," the ICG said in a statement.

The ICG ship launched a boarding team to investigate. During investigation it was found that the boat had a "steering gear breakdown for the last two days

and had been adrift since then which led to the boat drifting inside Indian waters", it said. The BFB had "27 crew/fishermen on-board".

The Indian Coast Guard's technical team tried to identify and rectify the defect, but it was observed that the rudder of the boat was "completely

damaged" and could not be repaired at sea.

"As the sea state and weather conditions were conducive, it was decided that the distressed boat will be towed to the Indo-Bangladesh IMBL and handed over to another Bangladeshi fishing boat operating across IMBL or to Bangladesh Coast Guard Ship in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Indian Coast Guard and Bangladesh Coast Guard," the statement said.

In the meantime, the Indian Coast Guard regional headquarters at Kolkata established communication with Bangladesh Coast Guard and informed them about the incident and plan of action, officials said.

Bangladesh Coast Guard Ship (BCGS)

"Kamaruzzaman" was deployed by BCG for towing of BFB. "BCG ship 'Kamaruzzaman' arrived near the IMBL at about 1845 hrs on April 4. ICGS 'Amogh' handed over the 27 Bangladeshi fishermen along with their boat to BCG ship 'Kamaruzzaman'," the statement said.

"The operation reflects the commitment of Indian Coast Guard towards safeguarding precious lives at sea against all odds. Such successful search and rescue (SAR) operations will not only strengthen the regional SAR structure, but also enhance the international cooperation with neighbouring countries. This is in keeping with the motto of the Indian Coast Guard 'Vayam Rakshamah' which means 'We Protect'," it added.

Independent MP S Ambareesh joins BJP in a boost to NDA ahead of LS polls

Bomma and D V Sadanada Gowda for their cooperation. Veteran BJP leader Yediyurappa, state President B Y Vijayendra, Leader of Opposition in the state Assembly R Ashoka, national General Secretary in-charge of elections in Karnataka Radha Mohan Das Agarwal and Sadananda Gowda were

among those who welcomed her into the party fold at its state headquarters here. With BJP ceding Mandya seat to its alliance partner JD(S) in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls, Sumalatha, after consulting her supporters and wellwishers in Mandya, on Wednesday announced her decision to opt out of the elections, and join the BJP.

The wife of popular film star M H Ambareesh, Sumalatha had earlier staked claim for BJP ticket for re-election from the Mandya seat that was represented by her late husband in the past. But the party convinced her and gave it to JD(S). JD(S) state President and former Chief Minister H D Kumaraswamy is now the alliance's joint candidate from Mandya. Kumaraswamy on Sunday met Sumalatha, and sought her cooperation in the polls.

Alliance with BJP after polls depends on how they treat us: Kumaraswamy

Mandya, Apr 05 (PTI):

JD(S) leader H D Kumaraswamy has said he is sincerely working for NDA's better prospects in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls and the continuation of alliance with BJP, after the parliamentary elections, will depend on how his party and its leaders are treated.

The former Chief Minister further said that given an opportunity and if Prime Minister Narendra Modi has confidence in

him, he wants to be the agriculture minister, in the event of NDA coming back to power at the Centre.

In an exclusive interview to PTI Videos, after filing his nomination from Mandya on Thursday, the state JD(S) President said: "We being part of the NDA depends on how our party leaders are treated in the future.

We are sincerely working and we want a long-standing relationship with BJP. But ultimately we will take a decision depending

on how we are treated and how much respect we get from the BJP."

JD(S) headed by former Prime Minister H D Deve Gowda joined the BJP-led NDA in September last year. As part of the seat-sharing agreement, the BJP would contest in 25 constituencies and the JD(S) in the remaining three — Mandya, Hassan and Kolar — in Karnataka.

Kumaraswamy, son of Gowda, made no secret of his desire to become Union Agriculture Minister. "It is

not only the aspirations of people of Mandya to see me as union minister, even my BJP friends feel that it will be good for the state if I become a minister.

I come from an agricultural background and given an opportunity I want to be the agriculture minister and bring a good name for the government. If the Prime Minister believes that I can do good work and if I am given an opportunity I want to work in the agricultural sector," he said.

Congress rebel sends defamation notice to CM Sukhu

Shimla, Apr 05 (PTI):

A day after Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu claimed six Congress rebels and three independents were sold for Rs 15 crore each, one of them, Sudhir Sharma, Friday sent a defamation notice to him asking for a Rs 5-crore compensation.

Sharma is one of the Congress rebels.

During a rally in Himachal's Una district, Sukhu had on Thursday alleged that the Congress rebels are corrupt and will go behind bars.

He had said "we do not

have money but we have honesty, morality and support of the people" and alleged that the six Congress rebels and three independents were sold for Rs 15 crore each.

"We have proof as the facts have started unfolding in the police investigation and time has come to teach them a lesson," he had added.

The CM had made the remarks against the nine legislators including six Congress rebels and three independents who had voted in favour of BJP nominee Harsh Mahajan in the Rajya Sabha polls held on February 27.

These MLA had later joined the BJP and the six Congress rebels who were disqualified for defying a whip to be present in the assembly and vote in favour of the government during the cut motions and the budget were given tickets by the BJP from their respective assembly constituencies.

The police had registered an FIR against Independent MLA Ashish Sharma (Hamirpur) and Rakesh Sharma, father of Congress rebel Chetanya Sharma (Gagret), and others for "electoral offences", bribery and criminal conspiracy.

The notice sent by the former minister and BJP candidate from Dharamshala assembly seat, Sudhir Sharma, said the statements and speeches of the chief minister which are false, derogatory and defamatory with no basics and substance, have been widely circulated through videos and newspapers, damaging his reputation, especially at a time when he is contesting the bypolls.

"There is neither any iota of truth in the CM's speeches nor he possesses any proof of the alleged false statements made in the public," it said.

Plea by man to take part in ASI's survey of Bhojshala-Mosque complex rejected

Indore, Apr 05 (PTI):

The Indore bench of Madhya Pradesh High Court has turned down the plea of a man seeking permission to take part in the ongoing scientific survey being carried out of the Bhojshala-Kamal Maula Mosque complex in Dhar by the Archaeological Survey of India.

The application of Kuldeep Tiwari, one of the petitioners on whose plea the HC ordered the survey, was dismissed by a division bench comprising Justices SA

Dharmadhikari and Gajendra Singh on Thursday.

"The survey is on the verge of completion. Ultimately, the bunch of petitions shall be finally decided based on the report of the ASI after completion of the survey," the bench observed while dismissing the application.

"In view of the aforesaid, no ground is made out to permit the petitioner to participate or remain present during the survey," read the order, which was uploaded on the MP HC on Friday.

The scientific survey was ordered by the HC on March 11 and its started on March 22.

The SKM party president will campaign across all six districts and will cover all 31 constituencies. It will conclude on April 15 when he will address a state-level "Jansabha" (rally) at Rangpo ground in Pakyong district.

The party supremo, who is contesting elections from two constituencies, Soreng-Chakung and Rhenock, urged party cadres to spread the message of the manifesto across the state.

Bihar minister Maheshwar Hazari's son joins Congress

Bihar minister Maheshwar Hazari's son Sunny Hazari joined the Congress here on Friday, fuelling speculations that he may be fielded in the Lok Sabha polls.

Maheshwar Hazari, a senior JD(U) leader, stepped down as the deputy speaker of the assembly recently and now holds the crucial Information and Public Relations Department portfolio. State Congress president Akhilesh Prasad Singh welcomed Sunny Hazari to the party.

Singh was approached with queries by journalists who sought to know whether it was a "masterstroke" keeping in mind the reserved seat of Samastipur, where Shambhavi Choudhary has been fielded by Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) of Chirag Paswan, an NDA partner.

In a guarded response, he said, "Candidates are not

decided by the Congress at the state level. The screening committee shortlists names of prospective candidates and a final decision is taken by the Central Election Committee."

However, Sunny Hazari, who is a panchayat-level political worker from Samastipur, did not deny that he was raring to go and contest the seat, which has been in the past represented by his father as also his late grandfather Ram Sevak Hazari.

"I had been active in public life since the Mahagathbandhan days of my father's party. I do realise that my father might be upset with my decision to join Congress. I will try to convince him. If the party asks me to contest from Samastipur, I am game," he said.

Notably, Maheshwar Hazari is a cousin of Ram Vilas Paswan and is understood to have lobbied hard with Chirag, the late LJP founder's son, for a ticket for Sunny.

Delhi HC directs inspection of coaching centres in Mukherjee Nagar

New Delhi, Apr 05 (PTI):

The Delhi High Court on Friday directed inspection of the coaching centres operating in the Mukherjee Nagar area by a team of lawyers and the fire services here while seeking a report with respect to their status and safety.

A bench headed by Justice Yashwant Varma also asked the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) to file a status report stating the total number of coaching centres in the locality.

The court's order came on a batch of cases concerning the operation of coaching centres in the area, including a case registered by it on its own after taking suo motu cognisance of a fire that broke out at a coaching centre there in June 2023.

formed the court that six coaching centres have been sealed on account of being non-compliant with the applicable regulations and action would be taken against other defaulters as well.

The court was also informed that around 21 centres have closed down on their own and notice of sealing has been issued to over 20.

Amicus curiae advocate Gautam Narayan said that although some centres have closed their operation, new centres might have come up in their place.

"In view of the aforesaid, we call upon the MCD to submit a fresh status report setting out the total number of coaching centres which may be operating in Mukherjee Nagar as on date," the bench, also comprising Justice Ravinder Dubeja, ordered.

"We also additionally constitute an independent team which would be headed by amicus curiae Gautam Narayan and which would independently inspect the area and submit a report on coaching centres operating there and now many of them are in compliance (with the applicable regulations)," it further said.

The court asked the member secretary of Delhi State Legal Services Authority to nominate five empanelled lawyers to assist Narayan in the exercise.

"We further direct Delhi Fire Services to undertake an independent exercise of verification of the area in question and submit a report on non-confirming coaching centres that may be identified," the court said, while directing that the matter be listed for hearing after 3 weeks.

Bilawal Bhutto calls for judicial reforms

● Month after Pak's apex court terms his grandfather's conviction mistrial

Karachi, Apr 05 (PTI):

A month after Pakistan's Supreme Court observed that the conviction of former prime minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto was the result of a mistrial, his grandson and foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto said that the time had come to introduce judicial reforms.

Last month, Pakistan's Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa-led Supreme Court



bench concluded that Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) founder Bhutto's conviction in 1979 was the result of a mistrial.

The hearing was based on a special case sent in 2011 by then president Asif Ali Zardari to the Supreme Court to revisit his father-in-law Bhutto's conviction

for abetment in a murder case and his eventual hanging in 1979.

Addressing party workers and supporters at an Iftar on Thursday in Larkana district on the occasion of the 45th death anniversary of the late Bhutto, Bilawal said that the PPP would ask the new federal government to undertake such judicial reforms.

"It is time to initiate judicial reforms. The PPP will ask the federal government to undertake these reforms," the PPP chairman told the gathering.

"We want to provide speedy justice to the people. We want to fulfil our

promise," Bilawal, the PPP chairman was quoted as saying by The Express Tribune newspaper.

Bilawal recalled that his mother and former prime minister late Benazir Bhutto had made the judicial reforms an integral part of the Charter of Democracy (CoD), which was signed with Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supreme Nawaz Sharif in May 2006.

In collaboration with the PML-N, Bilawal claimed, that 90 per cent of the CoD had been implemented, including the restoration of the 1973 Constitution in its original form and giving rights to the provinces.

Israel dismisses 2 officers over deadly drone strikes on aid workers in Gaza

Tel Aviv, Apr 05 (AP):

The Israeli military said Friday that it has dismissed two officers and reprimanded three others for their roles in drone strikes in Gaza that killed seven aid workers on a food-delivery mission, saying they had mishandled critical information and violated the army's rules of engagement.

The findings of a retired general's investigation into the Monday killings marked an embarrassing admission by Israel, which faces growing accusations from key allies, including the US, of not doing enough to protect Gaza's civilians from its war with Hamas.

The findings are likely to renew scepticism over the Israeli military's decision-making. Palestinians, aid groups and human rights organisations have repeatedly accused Israeli forces of firing recklessly at civilians throughout the conflict — a charge Israel denies.

"It's a tragedy," the military's spokesman, Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari, told reporters. "It's a serious event that we are responsible for and it shouldn't have happened and we will make sure that it won't happen again."

With pressure mounting on Israel to hold itself accountable, Hagari and other officials late Thursday shared with reporters the results of the military's uncommonly speedy and detailed investigation.

It was unclear whether the punishments and the apology would calm an international outcry over the deaths of the World Central Kitchen workers or reassure international aid groups that it was safe to resume operations in Gaza, where nearly a third of the population is on the brink of starvation.

The food charity itself called the investigation

and disciplinary actions "important steps forward."

"However it is also clear from their preliminary investigation that the IDF has deployed deadly force without regard to its own protocols, chain of command and rules of engagement," the statement said. "Without systemic change, there will be more military failures, more apologies and more grieving families."

According to what spokespeople said were the Israeli army's rules, targets must be visually identified as threats for multiple reasons before they can be hit. But the investigation determined that a colonel had authorised the series of deadly drone strikes on the convoy based on one major's observation — from grainy drone-camera footage — that someone in the convoy was armed. That observation turned out to be untrue, military officials said.

US man executed for killing Indian national and another person

● In Oklahoma in 2002

Houston, Apr 05 (PTI):

A 41-year-old man convicted of shooting and killing two people, including an Indian, in the US state of Oklahoma in 2002 has been executed, the state's first execution of the year.

Michael Dewayne Smith was executed on Thursday by lethal injection at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary in McAlester town, Oklahoma Attorney General Gentner Drummond said in a statement.

Smith had been on death row for the murders of 24-year-old Indian store clerk Sharath Pulluru and 40-year-old Janet Moore in separate incidents on February 22, 2002.

Oklahoma Attorney General released a statement after Smith was declared dead, saying: "I am grateful that justice has been served."

"I pray that today brings

some measure of peace for the families of Janet Miller-Moore and Sharath Pulluru. It has been a long and difficult 22 years for their loved ones, and my heart aches over the agony they have endured," he said.

"I want the people of Oklahoma to know that the victims of Michael Smith were good and decent people who did not deserve their fate," Drummond said.

"Sharath, a bright young man with a generous spirit, was the first in his family to come to the United States to pursue an education. He was fun to be around, was an inspiration to his family, and had a promising future," he said.

He added that the two were murdered because they were in the wrong place at the wrong time. "That was all. I am grateful that justice has been served," he said.

In a statement, the Pulluru family said, "Sharath was the life of our family.

Ukraine fires more than 50 drones against Russia

Kyiv, Apr 05 (AP):

Ukraine fired more than 40 drones into Russia's bordering Rostov region, Moscow defense officials said on Friday, in what appeared to be one of its biggest air attacks in the war and as Kyiv's forces step up their assaults on Russian soil. Russia's Defense Ministry said a total of 44 drones were "intercepted and destroyed" in the Morozovsk district, more than 100 kilometers (60 miles) from the border.

The attack damaged a power substation, Rostov Gov. Vasily Golubev said.

Russian media reported that there is a military airfield near the town of Morozovsk, but it was unclear whether the airfield was the target of the attack.

The Russian defense ministry said nine more drones were intercepted over Russia's border regions of Kursk, Belgorod, Krasnodar and the nearby Saratov region.

Ukrainian officials rarely comment on such strikes and provided no immediate response.

Drone warfare is a key feature of the war, which has extended into a third

year since Russia's full-scale invasion of its neighbour. On the 1,000-kilometer (600-mile) front line, where fighting is largely bogged down, low-cost drones are used by both sides to knock out expensive military hardware.

The Kremlin's forces have used large numbers of Iranian-designed Shahed drones to bombard urban areas of Ukraine.

Kyiv, in turn, has developed small but fast-growing defense industry where drones, including deadly unmanned sea vessels, are proving effective.

UN human rights body calls for halt to weapons shipments to Israel

Geneva, Apr 05 (AP):

The UN's top human rights body called on countries to stop selling or shipping weapons to Israel in a resolution passed on Friday that aims to help prevent rights violations against Palestinians amid Israel's blistering military campaign in Gaza.

The 47-member-country Human Rights Council voted 28-6 in favour of the resolution, with 13 abstentions. The sweeping measure, which takes aim at an array of Israeli actions such as impeding access to water and limiting shipments of humanitarian aid into Palestinian areas, also calls on UN-backed independent investigators to report on shipments of weapons, munitions and "dual use" items — for both civilian and military purposes — that could be used by

Israel against Palestinians. It is not binding.

Western countries were divided, with the US, Germany and others opposing the resolution, several abstaining and some European countries voting in favour.

Israel — at times joined by the United States — has regularly and roundly criticised the council for its alleged anti-Israel bias.

The council has approved far more resolutions against Israel for its actions toward Palestinians over the years than against any other country.

The council is wrapping up its first session of the year, which began on February 26, with action on more than 40 resolutions on subjects as diverse as the rights of the child; the environment and human rights; genocide prevention; and

rights situations in countries like Sudan, Belarus and North Korea.

The resolution comes amid a growing focus on weapons shipments to Israel — notably by its strongest backer, the United States — as Israel continues its military campaign in Gaza that has led to the killings of nearly 33,000 Palestinians that began in response to the attacks in Israel by armed militants on October 7.

In a sign of Washington's growing impatience with Israel's handling of the military campaign, US President Joe Biden issued a stark warning to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Thursday that future US support for Israel's Gaza war depends on the swift implementation of new steps to protect civilians and aid workers.

Pakistan Peoples Party nominates former PM Gilani for Senate chairman

Islamabad, Apr 05 (PTI):

Former Pakistan prime minister Yusuf Raza Gilani has been nominated by the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) as its candidate for the coveted post of Senate chairman as part of the power-sharing agreement between his party and the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), according to a media report on Friday.

A notification nominating Gilani was issued on Thursday by Jamil Soomro, political secretary to PPP

chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, Geo News reported. According to a post-poll agreement between the PPP and the PML-N that formed a coalition government after the February 8 general elections, the post of president, Senate chairman and governorship of Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa were given to the PPP, while the posts of Senate deputy chairman, National Assembly speaker and governorship of Sindh and Balochistan were given to the PML-N.

No evidence of Bushra Bibi being poisoned, says personal physician



Islamabad, Apr 05 (PTI):

Imran Khan's wife Bushra Bibi has not been given any poisonous substance, her personal physician has said following a medical checkup after allegations by the ex-prime minister that the former first lady was poisoned while incarcerated at his private residence which was turned into a sub-jail.

On April 2, Khan during the hearing of the 190

million pound Toshakhana corruption case in Adiala jail informed Judge Nasir Javed Rana that there had been an attempt to poison the former first lady and added that she had marks on her skin and tongue as a side effect of the "poisoning".

"I know who is behind it," the 71-year-old former prime minister said, without naming anyone.

He said that if any harm came to 49-year-old Bushra, the Pakistan Army chief (Gen Asim Munir) should be held responsible as members of an intelligence agency were controlling everything at his Bani

Questionable Tactics

India's Denial Amid Allegations

The report by 'The Guardian', alleging India's involvement in targeted killings of wanted terrorists on Pakistani soil, has raised serious concerns and warrants a closer examination of India's foreign intelligence operations. According to the report, Indian intelligence operatives, purportedly linked to the Research and Analysis Wing (RAW), have been accused of orchestrating nearly 20 targeted killings in Pakistan since 2020. These operations, allegedly carried out by unknown gunmen, have targeted individuals charged with violent terror offenses. The timing of these alleged killings, coinciding with an escalation in tensions between India and Pakistan, raises questions about the motives behind such actions. While India has vehemently denied these allegations, dismissing them as "false and malicious anti-India propaganda," the details presented in 'The Guardian' report cannot be easily dismissed. The report suggests a shift in India's approach to national security following the Pulwama attack in 2019, attributed to the Pakistan-based terror group Jaish-e-Mohammed. It claims that Indian intelligence agencies have adopted a more aggressive stance, targeting elements outside the country before they can launch attacks or cause disturbances. However, the methods described in the report, including the alleged recruitment of jihadists and payments to local criminals, raise ethical and legal concerns. Targeted killings in foreign territories, if proven true, would not only violate international norms but also undermine India's reputation as a responsible member of the global community. India's Ministry of External Affairs has reiterated that targeted killings in other countries are "not the government of India's policy," emphasizing a previous denial made by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar. While such denials are expected, they do little to address the specific allegations presented in 'The Guardian' report. Moreover, the involvement of Indian intelligence operatives allegedly operating from the United Arab Emirates adds another layer of complexity to the issue. If proven true, it would suggest a coordinated effort to carry out extrajudicial actions beyond India's borders, further complicating India's diplomatic relations with its neighbors. The Indian government must address these allegations transparently and thoroughly investigate the claims presented in the report. Any violation of international law or misuse of intelligence resources must be met with accountability and corrective measures. In the face of escalating tensions and security threats, it is imperative for India to uphold the principles of democracy, rule of law, and respect for human rights. Targeted killings, if used as a tool of state policy, not only erode these principles but also undermine India's moral authority on the global stage. As the international community scrutinizes these allegations, India must demonstrate its commitment to upholding the highest standards of ethical conduct and adherence to international law. Anything less would not only tarnish India's reputation but also undermine regional stability and security.

Judicial Prudence Amidst Apprehensions

In the turn of events surrounding the arrest and subsequent bail of Sanjay Singh, a Rajya Sabha member affiliated with the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), several pertinent questions regarding the functioning and integrity of our investigation agencies have come to light. Singh's release on bail after a six-month stint in Tihar Jail due to the lack of established money trails raises eyebrows not just on the specifics

of this case but on the broader functioning of our law enforcement bodies. The fundamental principle guiding our investigation agencies should be one of impartiality, transparency, and adherence to the rule of law. Unfortunately, recent trends suggest a deviation from these ideals. Over the years, particularly in the past decade, concerns have been raised about the politicization of these agencies, with allegations of them being used as tools by the ruling government rather than as impartial arbiters of justice. Even the Supreme Court, the custodian of justice in our democracy, has expressed reservations about the modus operandi of these agencies, issuing strictures against their methods. Singh's case underscores the delicate balance between justice and political vendetta. The Enforcement Directorate (ED) arrested Singh last October, alleging his involvement in a money laundering scam. However, during the subsequent legal proceedings, the ED failed to furnish concrete evidence linking Singh to the alleged crime. The Supreme Court, rightfully demanding transparency and evidence, found the ED's case lacking, leading to Singh's bail. One of the key issues highlighted by this case is the stringent provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). Under this law, individuals are often presumed guilty until proven innocent, contrary to the basic tenets of justice. The burden of proof falls heavily on the accused, making it challenging for them to secure bail. This inversion of the presumption of innocence contradicts the very essence of our legal system and warrants a critical review of such provisions. Moreover, the manner in which arrests are conducted under the PMLA raises serious concerns. The law grants wide-ranging powers to investigating officers, including the authority to arrest individuals based on mere suspicion. Such arbitrary use of power undermines the principles of due process and fair trial, resulting in prolonged detention and undue hardship for the accused. The decision by the Supreme Court to grant bail to Singh should serve as a wake-up call for our investigation agencies to introspect and reevaluate their methods. It is imperative that these agencies operate within the confines of the law, devoid of any political influence or bias. Justice must not only be done but also seen to be done, without fear or favour. Furthermore, the central government must take proactive measures to dispel any perception of misuse of investigation agencies for political ends. Upholding democratic values and ensuring the integrity of our institutions is paramount for the credibility and reputation of our nation on the global stage. While the bail granted to Sanjay Singh may be a victory for justice, it also raises pertinent questions about the functioning of our investigation agencies. It is incumbent upon us, as a society committed to the rule of law, to demand accountability, transparency, and fairness in our criminal justice system. Anything less would be a disservice to the principles upon which our democracy stands.

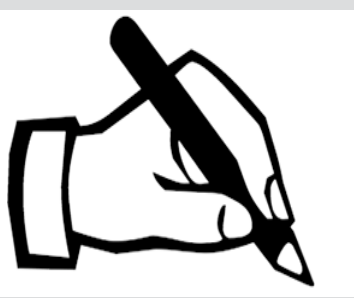

And how can we forget that specimen of ultimate humanity in Kerala where azan got sounded from the podium within a temple complex followed by breaking of Ramadan fast (with the authorities arranging dates, dry foods and snacks) amidst ringing of temple bells for evening aradhana! And all spontaneously without any planning.

It was a daylong religious function organised at the Santhagiri Ashram in Kozhikode with the imam of the Palayam mosque (Thiruvananthapuram) and few other dignitaries following Islam in attendance. As the Kerala Opposition leader VD Satheesan took the mike; he realised that for some of the guests, it was time for their evening prayers. Without any prodding from anybody, Satheesan vacates the podium after intimating that he would start his presidential address

only after the imam and the others had broken their fast! This is called sensitivity and humanity at its divine best.

Soon after a Muslim gentleman takes the mike and sounds the azan, the audience(irrespective of religious faith) stands up in respect with coincidentally the temple bells starting ringing for evening aradhana! The ashram hurriedly arranges food and water enabling the imam and his co-religionists to break the fast with none other than Satheesan joining them.

Let's hope that the combined divine force of the good human beings of "God's own country" will enjoy the last laugh and uproot the merchants of hatred from the soil of Kerala and India on a permanent basis. Let the religious syncretism of Kerala win the day for India also.

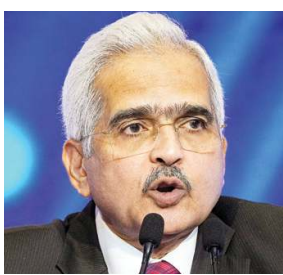
RBI holds repo rate at 6.5 pc for 7th consecutive time; home, auto EMIs to remain unchanged

Mumbai, Apr 05:

The Reserve Bank of India on Friday kept the benchmark interest rates unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row, citing concerns over food inflation in view of IMD's prediction of above normal maximum temperatures during April to June.

As RBI has held key policy rates steady, the EMIs on home and auto loans are likely to remain stable for some more time. The central bank has kept interest rates unchanged since February, 2023. While unveiling the first bi-monthly monetary policy for the current financial year, RBI has retained its growth and inflation forecast for the current fiscal at 7 per cent and 4.5 per cent respectively.

"After a detailed assessment of the evolving macroeconomic and finan-



cial developments and the outlook, it (MPC) decided by a 5 to 1 majority to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.50 per cent," RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said. He further said that the six-member MPC would remain focused on withdrawal of accommodation to ensure that inflation progressively aligns to the target, while supporting growth. Referring to inflation, Das said food price uncertainties continue to weigh on the inflation trajectory going forward. Also, the tight demand-supply situation in pulses

and the production of key vegetables warrant close monitoring, given the forecast of above normal temperatures in the coming months. "Wheat harvesting is by and large over... wheat availability will not be affected as much as it did 2 years ago, when there were heatwave conditions starting from March. So, in wheat there is not so much concern. But vegetable prices will have to be watched and any other impact that heat wave conditions may produce," Das said at a post policy press briefing.

Retail inflation in February was 5.1 per cent, with food basket inflation at 8.66 per cent. For the full 2023-24 fiscal, inflation is projected at 5.4 per cent. In the current fiscal, the RBI expects inflation to be around 4.5 per cent; Q1 at 4.9 per cent; Q2 at 3.8 per cent; Q3 at 4.6 per cent; and Q4 at 4.5 per cent.

Equity markets gain marginally to scale new peaks after RBI policy decision

Mumbai, Apr 05:

Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty registered marginal gains to hit fresh lifetime highs on Friday after the Reserve Bank maintained the status quo on key interest rates amid a negative trend in global markets. The six-member rate-setting panel of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday kept the benchmark interest rates unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row. It also expressed concerns over food inflation given IMD's prediction of above-normal maximum temperatures during April-June.

The 30-share BSE



Sensex inched up 20.59 points or 0.03 per cent to settle at 74,248.22. The index oscillated between the intra-day peak of 74,361.11 and the low of 73,946.92. The broader NSE Nifty with a marginal gain of 0.95 points at 22,513.70. As many as 28 components

of the 50-share benchmark ended in the red. "Although the RBI policy meeting unfolded as anticipated, concerns over food inflation and warnings of a heat wave tampered sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

Need to watch veggie prices in summer; inflation may take time to moderate to target: RBI

Mumbai, Apr 05:

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Friday said "we need to watch for movements in vegetable prices in this year's summer", which the Met office has predicted to be warmer. Speaking to reporters after the rate-setting panel voted in favour of the seventh consecutive status quo in rates, Das said the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) key objective is to get the inflation rate to the 4 per cent target set for it by the government on a durable basis, and the "last mile" is the most challenging. "We have to watch what impact it (higher temperatures) has especially



on food crops, and in that, I have mentioned certain key vegetables," Das said, replying to a question on the Indian Meteorological Department's warning of heat waves till June.

He, however, sounded more confident on wheat, saying much of the harvesting is by and large over. "Wheat there is not so much worry, but vegetable

prices have to be watched... and any other impact that the heat wave conditions may produce," he said.

Deputy Governor Michael Patra said food inflation has been highly volatile in the recent past, and while actors pushing it up keep changing constantly, the efforts are focused on ensuring that this does not spill over into the rest of the consumer price inflation (CPI).

Stating that inflation pressures are emanating from items such as egg, meat, and fish, and also rice, Patra said in the recent past there have been short-term episodes where cereals, vegetables have led to a spike in food inflation.

India building up gold reserves: Das

Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das on Friday said India has been building up gold reserves as part of its forex deployment. "We are building up gold reserves that is a part of our reserve deployment," Das told reporters at the customary post-policy review press conference here.

He did not give any specifics on the quantum of gold buys, but pointed to the official data which shows an increase in the value of gold reserves. As per official data, the value of gold in the forex reserves stood at USD 51.487 billion as on March 22, which is USD 6.287 billion higher than the value as at end-March 2023.

As per a recent news report, RBI bought 8.7 tonne of gold in January alone which is the highest in two years. The central bank's gold holdings had touched 812.3 tonne at the end of January from 803.58 tonne in the preceding month, as per the World Gold Council. The price of gold

has also seen a rally over the last few months. Earlier in the day, Das announced that the overall forex reserves have touched an all-time high of USD 645.6 billion as of March 29, a breakup of which will be made available on Friday evening with the release of the weekly statistical supplement (WSS). Speaking to reporters, Das said RBI has consciously focused on building forex reserves over the last four-five years to act as a buffer against any future risks where there are dollar out-

flows from India.

He also said the central bank's approach on the forex front adds strength to the national balance sheet as well. Das also said that having a stable rupee is a priority for the Reserve Bank. After acting against two non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) following concerns on their business practices, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said there is no "system-wide" problem with such lenders.

Addressing the customary post-policy press conference, Das said it is not fair to perceive the actions "which came on consecutive days last month" as a "spate" of regulatory interventions. "As a part of the supervision, we take regular review of all players, particularly the major players. I don't want to say that this is a system-wide problem because we have supervised all the players. The action is only in outlier cases," Das said. Earlier, he also said the country's financial sector is "stable".

Rupee rises 9 paise to close at 83.30 against US dollar post RBI policy decision

Mumbai, Apr 05:

The rupee appreciated 9 paise to close at 83.30 (provisional) against the US dollar as the Reserve Bank of India on Friday kept the benchmark interest rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row. However, a strong US dollar against major rivals overseas and elevated crude oil prices capped sharp gains for the local unit, forex traders said. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the local unit opened at 83.44 against the greenback. The unit hit an intra-day high of 83.26 and a low of 83.45. The local unit finally settled at 83.30 (provisional) against the dollar, 9 paise higher from its previous close. On Thursday, the rupee recovered 14 paise to close at



83.39 against the US dollar. The rupee gained as the RBI's monetary policy remained the focus. The central bank kept CPI and GDP projections for FY25 unchanged at 4.5 per cent and 7 per cent, respectively, said Anuj Choudhary Research Analyst, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas. "After a detailed assessment of the evolving macroeconomic and financial developments and the outlook, it (MPC) decided by a 5 to 1

majority to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.50 per cent," RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said. He further said that the six-member MPC would remain focused on the withdrawal of accommodation to ensure that inflation progressively aligns with the target while supporting growth. While unveiling the first bi-monthly monetary policy for the current financial year, the RBI has retained its growth and inflation forecast for the current fiscal at 7 per cent and 4.5 per cent, respectively. "We expect the rupee to trade with a slight negative bias on risk aversion in global markets and a strong US dollar. The surge in crude oil prices and FI outflows may also weigh on the rupee.

Gold declines Rs 150; silver tumbles Rs 700

New Delhi, Apr 05:

After hitting an all-time high, gold price declined Rs 150 to Rs 69,900 per 10 gram in the national capital on Friday amid fall in rates of the precious metal in the global markets, according to HDFC Securities. The yellow metal had closed at Rs 70,050 per 10 gram in the previous session.

Silver tumbled Rs 700 to Rs 81,000 per kg. In the previous trade, it had ended at Rs 81,700 per kg. "Spot gold prices (24 carats) in the Delhi markets are trading at Rs 69,900 per 10 gram, down by Rs 150 against the previous close," Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst -



Commodities at HDFC Securities, said. In international markets, spot gold at Comex was trading at USD 2,287 per ounce, down USD 10 from the previous close. "The ongoing trend in gold is

expected to persist as long as geopolitical tensions in the Middle East and expectations of interest rate cuts remain in focus," Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst at LKP Securities, said.

Also, silver was quoting lower at USD 26.75 per ounce. In the previous close, it had ended at USD 27.05 per ounce. "The US nonfarm payroll report (March) to be released on Friday, will be crucial for the yellow metal prices.

A robust report will weigh on the metal as it is looking somewhat over-bought in the near term, though prospects remain positive for medium to long term horizons. "However, geopolitical tensions are resurfacing, which may limit the downside," Praveen Singh - Associate VP, Fundamental Currencies and Commodities at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said.

RBI's decision shows resolve to ensure price stability, says experts

Mumbai, Apr 05:

Reserve Bank's monetary policy decision of keeping the key interest rate unchanged and focus on moderating inflation shows a resolve on the part of the central bank to ensure price stability and sustained economic growth, experts opined on Friday.

The RBI kept the benchmark interest rates unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row, citing concerns over food inflation in view of IMD's prediction of above-normal maximum temperatures from April to June. As the central bank held key policy rates steady, the EMIs on home and auto loans are likely to remain stable for some more time. The RBI has kept interest rates unchanged since February 2023. "We stand by RBI's commitment for 'unwavering focus on price stability' to ringfence the

economy from global headwinds, including geopolitical situation and the resultant supply chain disruptions," ASSOCHAM Secretary General Deepak Sood said. The central bank has successfully shielded the economy from global uncertainties over the past few years, he added. President of industry body PHDCCI Sanjeev Agrawal too said the RBI's decision on its policy rates will propel economic activity and boost economic growth.

"We expect a repo rate cut as and when headline inflation softens around 4.5 per cent," he said. The RBI also retained its growth and inflation forecast for the current fiscal at 7 per cent and 4.5 per cent, respectively. Raul Kapoor, Co-CEO of Andromeda Sales and Distribution, the RBI governor highlighted how inflation is gradually decreasing and emphasised

the robust growth in India's economic landscape. "These domestic conditions of diminishing inflation and promising growth prospects set the stage for a potential rate cut.

We anticipate that in the upcoming MPC meetings, the RBI will likely announce a rate cut ranging from 25 to 50 basis points, provided the current conditions continue to improve," he said. Commenting on the monetary policy, S K Narvar, Group Chairman of Trident Realty, said the RBI's decision reflects a strategic approach aimed at nurturing economic recovery and fostering stability.

"This move is set to benefit potential homebuyers by ensuring affordability and sustaining momentum in the housing market. With consumer demand driving the real estate sector, especially in

luxury housing, the decision to maintain the repo rate status quo supports feasible macroeconomic indicators and encourages new homebuyers to invest in property," Narvar said.

HS Bhatia, managing director, Kelwon Electronics and Appliances Pvt Ltd, the manufacturing partner of Daewoo India, opined that while the RBI's decision to hold the repo rate is positive for consumer durables, a wait-and-watch approach might emerge.

"Consumers may prioritise essentials if inflation remains a concern. However, a strong 7 per cent GDP growth (projection) is a confidence booster," he added.

Ayush Lohia, CEO of Lohia Auto, was of the opinion that the central bank's decision offers a sense of steadiness within the broader economic framework. "Within the EV sector, stable interest

rates can have a favourable influence on the accessibility and financing of electric vehicles, stimulating greater consumer adoption of cleaner transportation alternatives. This corresponds with our objective of advancing sustainable mobility and mitigating carbon emissions," he added. While unveiling the monetary policy, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das also announced several other developmental and regulatory measures. Das announced that certain modifications to the Liquidity Coverage Ratio (LCR) framework are proposed towards facilitating better management of liquidity risk by banks. Anil Gupta, Senior Vice President, Co Group Head-Financial Sector Ratings at ICRA, said typically the savings deposits attract a lower outflow rate of 5 per cent in the next 30 days while calculating the LCR.

Police bust spurious liquor racket in Mudhipar

● Cache of illicit liquor seized, accused apprehended

Khairagarh, Apr 05: In a significant operation, the police have uncovered a clandestine operation involved in the production and distribution of spurious liquor in Mudhipar village, the largest village in the Khairagarh zone, located 20 km from the district headquarters.

SP Trilok Bansal, addressing the press conference, disclosed that the Cyber Cell and Gatapar Jungle Police Station received intelligence from an informant regarding the manufacturing, bottling, labeling, and sale of counterfeit country liquor in government-authorized liquor shops. The perpetrators were allegedly affixing fake holograms to mimic authentic products.

Acting swiftly on the tip-off, a joint team comprising Gatapar police and the cyber cell conducted a raid at the residence of Nanhu Sinha in the Lalmati locality of Mudhipar village. The raid resulted in the seizure of 459 bulk liters of spurious liquor.

Among those apprehended during the operation were Gamendra Sen, aged 24, Nand Kishore Sinha alias Linda, aged 30, and Kailash Rajak, aged



28, all residents of Khairbana and Pandadah police stations. Additionally, Harish Verma (Nagpure), aged 23, hailing from Ghatni police station in Maharashtra, was detained. Notably, a minor involved in the illicit activity was also apprehended at the scene.

SP Bansal stated that during the legal proceedings, a thorough search of the premises was conducted. The search yielded a significant quantity of illegal liquor-making materials and related paraphernalia.

Among the recovered items were 1250 quarter bottles of country liquor, each containing 180 liters, totaling 225 bulk liters valued at Rs 112,500. Additionally, six blue-colored jars, each with a capacity of 35 liters, were discovered unlawfully, along with 234 bulk liters of liquor prepared from DHB, valued at Rs 117,000.

Furthermore, the search uncovered 14

empty jars of 17 liters valued at Rs 2,800, two full jars of 17 liters of water valued at Rs 460, and a 50-liter jerrycan containing a spirit-like liquid bearing the label of Agriflame Agri Product Company, valued at Rs 20,000.

Additionally, 35 liter empty jerrycan of blue color is priced at Rs 500, 150 liter empty blue colored drum is priced at around Rs 800, 3 White colored chadi worth Rs 100, empty quarter bottles 200 worth Rs 2000 wherealso recovered.

Moreover, authorities discovered 1,150 fake holograms, labeled with manufacturing dates spanning 2022-23, priced at Rs 1,030. Additionally, 140 blue-colored bottles bearing the inscription "Chhattisgarh Distillies Limited Kumhari" in English were found, valued at Rs 400 each.

Among other seized items were an old Honda Dream Yuva motorcycle with serial number CG 08

AM 8437, estimated at Rs 40,000, and an old Honda Activa motorcycle with serial number CG 04 MU 5890, valued at approximately Rs 50,000.

Furthermore, five mobile phones were recovered, valued at around Rs 50,000 collectively, along with a cash amount of Rs 12,000. The cumulative value of

the recovered items amounted to Rs 409,590. This evidence prima facie indicates violations of Section 34(1A), 34(2), 36, 49A, and 59A(1)(2) of the Excise Act. Moreover, the nature of the crime also implicates sections 420, 465, 468, 471, and 34 of the Indian Penal Code. Subsequently, a case has been registered, and the investigation is underway.

Illicit liquor syndicate dupes government

The accused orchestrated a scheme wherein they replicated and distributed country-made plain liquor from government liquor shops in the surrounding areas. Gamendra Sen and Nand Kishore Sinha were involved in procuring empty bottles from country liquor shops and individuals selling such bottles. These bottles were then stored at the residence of a minor accomplice until a sufficient quantity was amassed. Once the requisite number of bottles was acquired, the accused would inform Harish Verma (Nagpure), a resident of Gondia, Maharashtra, to arrange for the spirit from Maharashtra and deliver it to Mudhipar. Subsequently, all the accused collectively prepared country-made plain liquor from the sourced spirit, which was then filled into the empty bottles procured earlier.

Dhanshyam Singh Rajput, aged 45, a resident of Dewarbiya district, Bemetara, presently residing in Jayanti Nagar, Durg, facilitated the bottling process, ensuring that the counterfeit liquor was packaged in bottles resembling those from government liquor shops. The accused meticulously replicated stickers, holograms, and lids, thereby deceiving consumers into believing that the liquor was genuine government-issue product. The illicitly produced liquor was then distributed in the area, with the proceeds from sales divided equally among the accused. Consequently, the scheme not only undermined government revenue but also posed a significant threat to public health and safety.

Four accused arrested are habitual criminals

During the press conference, SP Bansal, alongside Additional SP Neha Pandey and SDOP Lalchand Mohle, disclosed that Gamendr Sen, Nandkishore Sinha, Kailash Rajak, and Ghanshyam Singh Rajput are habitual offenders with prior criminal records. These individuals have had cases registered against them in various police stations under the Excise Act.

Crackdown on illegal sand mining

● Multiple cases registered to curb royalty theft

Korba, Apr 05: In a concerted effort to curb illegal sand excavation, transportation, royalty theft, and storage, the Mineral Department in the district, under the directive of Collector Aji Vasant, has intensified its enforcement actions. Regular patrols and monitoring activities are being conducted by mineral staff across both urban and rural areas of the district.

According to reports from the Mineral Officer, significant progress has been made in preventing royalty theft related to mineral sand. Between March 30th and April 1st, the departmental staff registered a total of 11

cases across various locations including Uрга, Kanaki, Kurudih, Barampur, Imliduggu, and Bhilai Khurd.

In response to these cases, fines totaling Rs 3,34,160 have been imposed. Specifically, in six cases involving mineral sand, fines amounting to Rs 1,32,693 have been collected, while fines totaling Rs 2,01,414 have been recovered from five cases involving mineral stone.

The penalties collected have been promptly deposited under the mineral income head, reflecting the administration's commitment to upholding the rule of law in the mineral sector. In addition to imposing fines, vehicles involved in illegal activities are being seized, and appropriate actions are being taken under relevant acts governing mines and minerals, including minor minerals.

Farmers left waiting for payments on paddy

SDO of PHE arrested by ACB while taking bribe

Contractor's complaint leads to officer's arrest

Khairagarh, Apr 05: The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) carried out a decisive operation in Chuikhadan on Thursday, resulting in the arrest of a Sub-Divisional Officer (SDO) of the Public Health Engineering (PHE) department, Rajesh Madave, caught red-handed while accepting a bribe.

The ACB team, in collaboration with the Economic Offenses Investigation Bureau, conducted a raid at the PHE office following



complaints of corruption. During the operation, Madave was apprehended as he was allegedly demanding bribes from contractors in exchange for facilitating the

passage of bills. The arrest comes after a contractor, Praveen Kumar Tiwari, lodged a complaint against Madave for demanding illicit payments over several months.

Frustrated by the persistent demands, Tiwari approached the Economic Offenses Investigation Bureau, triggering the ACB's intervention. The raid resulted in the confiscation of a bribe amounting to Rs 1.5 lakh, marking a substantial breakthrough in the fight against corruption within the public sector. Authorities have indicated that the accused officer will face legal action under economic offenses laws, alongside charges of violating civil service conduct regulations.

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Mungeli's lifeline Agar River drying up

Mungeli, Apr 05: The Agar River, once a lifeline flowing through the heart of Mungeli city, is now grappling with a severe drying crisis exacerbated by pollution and neglect. Despite its historical significance, the river has witnessed a dramatic decline in water levels, compounded by the inflow of dirty water from drains.

In recent years, the Agar River has struggled to maintain its flow, with water scarcity becoming increasingly apparent as early as January. What was once a vibrant watercourse has now

been reduced to a channel of wastewater, tainted by the discharge from city drains. The accumulation of pollutants has led to the proliferation of rot and decay within the river.

Residents lament the sorry state of the river, yearning for the return of clean flowing water. Traditional discharge points such as Pachari Ghat, Kachari Ghat, Pulpara, and Bada Bazaar have become conduits for sewage, exacerbating the pollution problem.

Efforts to bolster water levels through structures



like the stop dam near Pandara Kapa have been hampered by neglect and lack of maintenance. The anicut constructed by the Irrigation Department in Bada Bazar has failed to impound water effectively due to its low height.

Plans for river beautification and infrastructure development, including roads and promenades along the riverbanks, have languished despite announcements from political leaders. The failure to implement these initiatives underscores the urgent need for concerted action to rejuvenate the Agar River.

Residents are calling on public representatives and government authorities to prioritize the restoration of the river, including comprehensive measures to address pollution and ensure sustainable water management. Failure to act swiftly risks consigning the Agar River to mere history, depriving future generations of its once-vital presence in Mungeli's landscape.

The work will be started as soon as the plan is approved in the name of river bank beautification.

India's exceptional abilities and unwavering determination were evident as they clinched victories in three out of four matches in Bhubaneswar (with-

in regulation time) and re-

mained unbeaten in Rourkela (also within regulation time). However, they had lost both their matches against Australia.

With the two sides drawn in the same group at the Olympics, the Test series provides the perfect platform for both to gauge each other's strengths and weaknesses before the ultimate showdown in Paris Games. "We are geared up

for the challenge that lies ahead. Every match is an opportunity for us to showcase our skills and make our nation proud. We are aware of the tough competition Australia presents, but we are confident in our abilities and our preparations," captain Harmanpreet said.

"As a team, we are united and determined to give our best on the field. Our goal is to not only perform well in this series but also to learn and grow as a unit, laying a strong foundation for our campaign in the Paris Olympics."

India and Australia have clashed on the hockey field a total of 43 times since 2013, according to data from the FIH Data Hub.

Among these matchups, Australia have emerged victorious 28 times, while India have celebrated triumph in eight games. Additionally, seven matches have concluded in a draw.

With India ranked fourth and Australia fifth in the current world rankings, the stage is set for a gripping battle between two hockey powerhouses.

RCB, RR look to tackle similar worries to make headway in IPL

Struggling Royal Challengers Bengaluru and high-flying Rajasthan Royals bizarrely have similar worries to address when they face each other in the Indian Premier League here on Saturday.

The eighth place where RCB are currently on the 10-team table is a fair indication of their troubles, but Rajasthan's all-win record so far and the resultant second place do not necessarily mirror their turmoil.

An overwhelming top-order is the intertwining factor between them. The RCB top-order comprising skipper Faf du Plessis, Glenn Maxwell, Cameron Green and Rajat Patidar is a storehouse of talent and explosiveness. But none of them have fired either in isolation or in unison, except star batter Virat Kohli, the current Orange Cap holder with 203 runs, who has made two fifties.

Patidar showed a glimpse of his clean shot-making abilities while registering 29 in their 28-



run defeat against Lucknow Super Giants, but he needs to do a lot more to prop up the RCB middle-order. The Bengaluru outfit will hope for a reversal at the

Sawai Man Singh Stadium, a venue that carries similar traits as RCB's home - Chinnaswamy Stadium - in terms of a smooth pitch and a blistering out-

field adding value to the batters' shots.

But the aforementioned RCB quartet has company in the Royals' ranks. Yashasvi Jaiswal entered this iteration of IPL on the back of some excellent recent efforts, but the left-handed opener has made just 39 runs from three matches, and Jos Buttler offers a similar story.

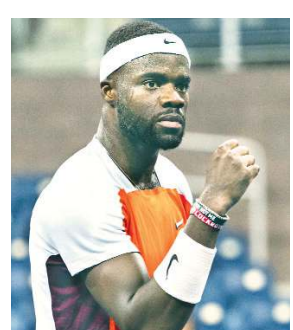
The England T20 captain is yet to be in his intimidating self, and has managed 35 runs from three outings and his strike-rate across these matches is a mere 85.

The Royals' batting has largely revolved around captain Sanju Samson (109 runs, one fifty) and the highly-improved Riyan Parag (181 runs, 2 fifties) and at some point, the duo will require solid support from others.

However, Rajasthan have an edge over their opponents in the bowling department.

Pacers Trent Boult and Nandre Burger and veteran leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal have worked up a nice early rhythm and have shared 16 wickets between them.

"I wish I won in straights, but I definitely played pretty well," Tiafoe said. "I thought I played really well in the first set. He can serve really well. I had some chances, some break points, but good serves from him and he really made it tough for me."

Mumbai Indians get Suryakumar boost

Ahead of clash against Delhi Capitals

Mumbai, Apr 05 (PTI):

In a big boost for struggling Mumbai Indians, world number one T20 batter Suryakumar Yadav trained with the team here on Friday after a long injury layoff and unleashed his trademark shots without any visible discomfort, raising hopes that he could compete in the team's next IPL match against Delhi Capitals.

Five-time champions Mumbai Indians are languishing at the bottom of the 10-team table, having



lost all three matches so far and if Suryakumar plays, the Hardik Pandya-led team will hope that his presence helps them with the anticipated turnaround.

The 33-old aggressive batter has been out of action since January. He un-

derwent a surgery to treat sports hernia and was also nursing an ankle injury which he had sustained during India's tour of South Africa late last year.

Suryakumar was the first to arrive for the training session at the Wankhede Stadium, more

than an hour before his teammates came for the afternoon session.

Suryakumar walked into one of the two nets and batted for more than an hour, not looking to exert himself but getting his body in rhythm and getting his strokes going a few days after he was given the clearance to join the Mumbai Indians' squad by the National Cricket Academy (NCA) staff.

The right-handed batter unleashed strokes in all parts of the ground while batting against throw-down specialists and MI spinner Kumar Kartikeya.

Yuki-Olivetti pair advances to Marrakech Open semifinals



Marrakech, Apr 05 (PTI):

India's Yuki Bhambri and his French partner Albano Olivetti knocked out third seeds Nicholas Barrientos and Rafael Matos to breeze into the men's doubles semifinals of the ATP Marrakech Open here.

The unseeded Indo-French combine upset Colombian Nicholas Barrientos and Rafael Matos of Brazil, eking out a close 7-6(5) 6-7 10-7 win in the quarterfinal that lasted almost two hours on Thursday.

They will face second seeds Lucas Miedler and Alexander Erler of Austria in the last-four stage of the ATP 250 event.

The quarterfinal was fought on an even keel with both pairs winning 50 per cent of the total points. Bhambri and Olivetti hit 10 aces as compared to their opponents' three.

Bhambri has teamed up with Olivetti for the first time this season, having played with Dutch player Robin Haase in most of the tournaments.

The Indian had paired with former partner Michael Venus from New Zealand at the Miami Masters where they made a first round exit.

Bhambri's best performance of the season came at in ATP 500 Dubai, where as qualifiers the Indian and Haase reached the semifinals, earning crucial 225 ranking points.

Ranked 62, the 31-year-old Bhambri is India's second highest ranked player behind world number one Rohan Bopanna.

It will be interesting to see if Bopanna chooses Bhambri as his partner for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games. Bopanna being a top-10 player will have the choice of selecting his partner.

Virat Kohli under lot of pressure this IPL: Steve Smith

Mumbai, Apr 05 (PTI):

Virat Kohli is "under a lot of pressure" in the on-going IPL owing to the collective failure of Royal Challengers Bengaluru batters, feels former Australia captain Steve Smith who wants the RCB teammates to come good in the supporting act.

Kohli has waged a lone battle for RCB this IPL season with 203 runs in four matches at 67.66 with two fifties. The second-best batter, Dinesh Karthik, is way behind with 90 runs in as many games. Despite Kohli's consistency, RCB have fal-



tered with three losses in four matches throwing them as far back as the seventh spot in the points table.

The likes of Glenn Maxwell, skipper Faf du Plessis and Cameron Green have been underwhelming so far with the bat. "He needs the other

key batters to stand up with him, and if they do that, they can turn things around for their season. But, at the moment, they're not so a lot of pressure is on Virat," Smith, a member of the Star Sports Incredible Star Cast, told PTI in an exclusive interaction at the channel's studio here.

"I doubt he'd be putting extra pressure on himself. (But) some of the other top-order and middle-order (batters) need to help Virat," he said.

Smith warned that Kohli is not going to score runs in every match and RCB batters must get their act together.

NZ will come good against Pak: Allen

Eight of their senior players are missing from the line-up due to IPL duties but young New Zealand batter Finn Allen is confident that the new-look side would still be a handful for hosts Pakistan when the two sides clash in a five-match T20 International series starting April 18. Trent Boult, Lockie Ferguson, Matt Henry, Daryl Mitchell, Glenn Phillips, Rachin Ravindra, Mitchell Santner and Kane Williamson are all missing from the line-up for the away engagement due to the ongoing league. "It is an awesome opportunity with players being away at the IPL, for young guys such as Tim



Robinson, who have shown their talent and had a good Super Smash tournament here in New Zealand during the summer," Allen told PTI Videos in an interaction facilitated by Sony Network which has acquired broadcast rights of

New Zealand cricket's home engagements. "...it is rewarding for those guys and allows them to get an opportunity at the top level to see where they stand against a formidable Pakistan side," he said. All-rounder Michael Bracewell will be leading the side. He has not been seen in international cricket since March last year following a ruptured Achilles and a broken finger and returned to domestic engagements only recently. "I guess with the upcoming series, we batted out with them at home not too long ago but it is on their turf now and we know from tours in the past, that they are pretty tough to beat at home," the 24-year-old said.

Jofra Archer a concern but Ben Stokes has taken right call: Stuart Broad

Former England pacer Stuart Broad has backed talismanic all-rounder Ben Stokes' decision to opt out of this year's T20 World Cup due to fitness reasons but expressed concerns about fast bowler Jofra Archer's never-ending injury woes.

Supporting Stokes' pull-out from the upcoming T20 World Cup in the Caribbean and the USA, Broad said the defending champions will miss his aura but have enough resources to replace him as a player. "Whatever Ben decides to do for the well-

being of himself is the right decision. Ben Stokes has made some incredible decisions in his career that have paid off for him," Broad, a member of the Star Sports Incredible Star Cast, told PTI in an exclusive interaction at their studio here.

"He wants to get back to (being) the all-rounder that he was and he feels like getting some workload through the knee in a controlled environment, without the help of a scale to pressurise the nature of a T20 World Cup, is the best choice," he said.

While Archer has found it difficult to cope with the elbow injury to his bowling arm, getting an England contract for two years is a sign that the management believes the ace pacer would be back to his best soon. Broad said he is hoping to see him back in the World Cup.

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RJD promises 3 LS seats from its quota to VIP

Former Bihar minister Mukesh Sahni on Friday joined RJD-led Mahagathbandhan in the state, less than three years after he had quit the alliance to join the NDA. The announcement came at a press conference addressed by RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav along with Sahni, a Bollywood set designer turned politician who heads Vikasheel Insaan Party (VIP). Yadav said, "Seat-sharing formula has already been announced for the

INDIA bloc in Bihar. The RJD has got 26 seats. We will give three from our quota to Sahni's party." Notably, in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, the VIP had contested as a Mahagathbandhan ally, but ahead of state assembly elections a year later, Sahni quit the alliance and joined the NDA. In the new government headed by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Sahni became a minister, understandably at the instance of the BJP, which also helped him become a member of the legislative

council since he had failed to get elected to the assembly. Sahni, who uses the sobriquet "son of mullah" to project himself as a leader of castes traditionally involved in fishing, was expelled from the cabinet after he rubbed the BJP the wrong way while campaigning for his party in Uttar Pradesh. Subsequently, all four VIP MLAs also joined the BJP while Sahni was left high and dry after his legislative council term ended, shortly after his expulsion from the cabinet.

Woman accused in JNU sexual harassment case 'Pronounced guilty before trial'

New Delhi, Apr 5 (PTD)

A former JNU student and sole woman co-accused in a sexual harassment case, which is being protested by the victim at the varsity's main gate since April 1, has alleged that she has been "unfairly targeted" by students affecting her mental wellbeing. A complaint of an alleged sexual harassment was filed against four people, including two former students, by a female student on March 31 demanding action by the university. The woman co-accused in the alleged incident said that she is already branded as "guilty" and her photographs are being circulated publicly tarnishing her reputation while the inquiry is still underway. "The baseless accusations and the subsequent public destruction of my character have seriously affected my mental wellbeing. I feel unfairly targeted and humiliated in the eyes of the JNU community," she told PTD. "My picture was released without my consent, further violating my privacy and dignity," the co-accused said alleging that a one-sided story was

being propagated among the students with vested interest. Slamming the administration, the co-accused said, "I find it alarming that I have been immediately put out of bounds by the administration without a fair and impartial inquiry, essentially being labelled guilty without due process." "The shock I feel is profound and deeply personal. I believe in the principle of fair inquiry and am willing to cooperate fully in the event of an actual investigation," she added. The varsity administration had declared the two former students out-of-bound on April 1 and initiated an inquiry into the matter, Chief Proctor Sudhir Kumar told PTD earlier. On Thursday, the varsity administration issued proctorial inquiry notice to 21 students, including the victim and JNUSU president Dhananjay, for blocking the main entrance gate of the campus. The victim initiated an indefinite strike on April 1 outside the main gate of the campus against perceived inaction by the administration over her complaint.

CPI(M) manifesto calls for BJP's defeat, warns of 'existential crisis'

New Delhi, Apr 5 (PTD)

The CPI(M) manifesto for the 2024 Lok Sabha polls called for the defeat of the ruling BJP and strengthening of the Left, a call which was also made in its manifesto for 2019, and alleged the secular character of democracy was affected both the times. This time, the appeal in the manifesto, which was released on Thursday, emphasises that India is facing an "existential crisis". While the Left party stuck to its stand on several issues, the manifesto for the first time promised scrapping laws like the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) and the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). In its manifesto in 2019, the Left party had called for the defeat of the BJP blaming the ruling party for "sharpening communal polarisation", and assault on all constitutional authorities. The manifesto this time gives a call to "every patriot" to ensure the defeat of the BJP and its allies. Defending secularism featured prominently in the CPI(M) manifesto, and was a key issue

in 2019 as well. Last time, they had flagged "attacks on democracy", citing examples like functioning of the Parliament allegedly being curtailed, undermining the primacy of the CBI, and attacks on the right to freedom of expression, while this time the manifesto called for scrapping laws like the UAPA, National Security Act (NSA) and PMLA, as well as the contentious CAA. The Left party's poll promise came in the backdrop of a chief minister and a former chief minister from the opposition parties - Arvind Kejriwal of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and Hemant Soren of the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) - being arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), and allegations by several opposition parties of central agencies being misused by the Union government. The CPI(M) promised a legal guarantee of a minimum support price (MSP) for farmers according to the Swaminathan Commission's recommendations. An MSP for farmers found place in the 2019 manifesto of the party as well, where they backed farmers' right to sell their produce at an MSP which is at least 50 per cent high-

er than the total cost of production. While calling unemployment the "biggest failure" of the Modi government, the CPI(M) promised inclusion of 'Right to Work' in fundamental rights, a law to guarantee employment in urban areas as well as unemployment allowance, filling up all vacant posts in government departments, doubling the MGNREGA budget and removing the 100-day cap. These issues were there in the party manifesto in 2019 as well. While in 2019, the party had called for reservation for women in the Parliament and assemblies, this time, as a bill for reservation has already been passed, the party demanded that it should be implemented immediately. The Left party's manifesto also had a section on children, where they promised universalisation of the ICDS to cover all children from the age of 0-6 years, and for youths, they have promised a new "National Youth Policy". Both the promises were also made in the 2019 manifesto too. On economy, the CPI(M) called for reversing privatisation of the public sector; and called for a tax on the super rich.

Nomination form of SP's Khajuraho candidate rejected

The nomination form of the Samajwadi Party's (SP) candidate from Khajuraho Lok Sabha constituency in Madhya Pradesh was rejected after scrutiny by the returning officer on Friday. The Congress had left the seat for SP as per the seat-sharing arrangement within the opposition's INDIA bloc. "The Panna district collector, who is also the returning officer, rejected the nomination papers of Meera Yadav as she had not signed the 'B form' and also failed to attach a certified copy of the 2023 Assembly elections voters' list," a senior official told reporters.

The BJP has fielded sitting MP and its state unit president Vishnu Dutt Sharma from Khajuraho. Yadav's husband Deep Narayan Yadav told reporters that they would move the high court against the returning officer's order. "The form was verified yesterday after scrutiny. There is a rule that if there is any discrepancy, it is the duty of the returning officer to get it rectified even if the candidate is illiterate," he said. "Yesterday, the form was found to be alright. Today, two shortcomings were pointed out. First, the voters' list attached with the form is not certified or it is old. Signature was supposed to be made at two

places, but it was made only in one place," he added. Yadav also claimed that they did not get a certified copy of voters' list till April 3, and hence attached a copy that was available. "We requested him (collector) that we still had time as we had come before 3 PM (deadline), and it could be rectified. He should have told us yesterday about it and we could have done it by now," Yadav added. To a question, he said there were 15 other candidates in the fray, and "we will support one of them after consulting our senior leaders." The election will be contested under any circumstances, he added.

Man thrashed for giving money to kids to buy savouries

Thane, Apr 5 (PTD)

The police in Maharashtra's Thane district on Friday registered a case against two individuals for allegedly thrashing a carpenter after he gave money to two kids to buy savouries, an official said. The incident took place on Thursday when the 25-year-old complainant was on his way to a dar-gah in the Bhiwandi area. Two children approached the complainant and asked him for money to buy savouries, the official said. However, when the carpenter obliged, two men got into an argument with him, demanding to know why he had given money to the children.

Cal HC orders NIA probe into death of BJP activist

Kolkata, Apr 5 (PTD)

The Calcutta High Court on Friday directed the central government to hand over to NIA the investigation into the death of a BJP activist in violence before the 2023 panchayat elections in West Bengal. Deceased Bijay Krishna Mohanty's son Prasenjit in a petition sought handing over of investigation from the state police to the NIA, stating that his BJP activist father died after being attacked by ruling Trinamool Congress supporters in East Midnapore district's Moyna area with bombs and other weapons.

The state had sent a report on the incident to the central government since the incident of violence involved alleged bursting of bombs, which is a scheduled offence under the NIA Act.

SC asks Delhi finance secy to release money, makes DJB party to AAP gov't's plea

New Delhi, Apr 5 (PTD)

The Supreme Court on Friday asked the Delhi government's Principal Secretary (Finance) to release funds to the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) and made the utility, responsible for supplying potable water to the national capital, a party to a plea filed by the ruling AAP dispensation alleging non-release of

money. A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra took note of the submissions of senior advocate Mahesh Jethmalani, appearing for Principal Secretary (Finance), that the Delhi government, which has filed the plea against its own official, has not made

the DJB a party. "They have not made the DJB a party. This is the authority which is making requisitions for the funds," Jethmalani said. "We will implead DJB (as a party) to find out from them (about the dues)...In the meantime, please release funds which are liable to be paid," said the bench. At the outset, senior ad-

vocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for the Delhi government, said the minister concerned has written six times to the finance secretary and yet the entire fund has not been released. Observing that it wanted to know about the outstanding funds from the water utility itself, the bench said these issues needed to be sorted out.

92-yr-old man to exercise his franchise for first time this LS polls

Ninety-two-year-old physically challenged Khalil Ansari will exercise his right to cast vote for the time in the Lok Sabha elections after Jharkhand Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) directed Sahibganj district election officials on Friday to register his name in the electoral roll with immediate effect, an official said. CEO K Ravi Kumar was in Sahibganj on Friday and made surprise inspections at polling booths in Mundra block of the district, around 450-km from Jharkhand's capi-

tal Ranchi. He also visited several villages and met senior citizens and physically challenged voters, according to an official release. During his visit, he asked Ansari if he was a registered voter. "I never exercised my franchise as my name is not there in voter list," Ansari told the CEO. A resident of Badkhori village, Ansari is a resident of Rajmahal parliamentary constituency, which will go to polls on June 1. Kumar directed the officials to enroll his name in the electoral roll with immediate effect.

Ansari expressed his thanks to the CEO and said, "I will cast my vote for sure for the first time."  **गंजोपन का इलाज**
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
