Tushar Bhatt, principal of Jay Jalaram School Purushottam Sharma and middlemen Vibhor Anand and Arif Vohra. The CBI did not seek remand of education consultant Par-suram Roy. All the five are currently lodged in Godhra sub jail.

Principal District Judge of Panchmahal, CK Chauhan, expressed apprehension on CBI's remand

application saying police or investigative agencies cannot seek custody of an accused beyond the initial 15 days following arrest.

Citing a 1992 decision by the Supreme Court in the CBI Vs Anupam Kulkarni case,

judge Chauhan said new remand after the lapse of 15 days from arrest can be granted only when the accused was hospitalised during that period or he did not cooperate during the initial remand. Malik, however, argued that

remand beyond the first 15 days of the arrest can be granted under section 167 of the Code of Criminal Procedure if the judge finds it fit.

Malik informed the court that the CBI is probing a larger conspiracy spread across Gujarat, Rajasthan, Bihar, Delhi and Jharkhand.

He said though the accused were earlier remanded to the custody of Panchmahal police for a period ranging from 4 days to 11 days, the CBI needs their custody to conduct a "fresh investigation". As per the CBI's preliminary probe, the accused had asked some candidates to choose Jay Jalaram school.

NEW DELHI: Deputy National Security Adviser (NSA) Vikram Misri was on Friday named as the next Foreign Secretary, according to an official order. Misri, a 1989 batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer, has been

appointed to the post with effect from July 15, it said. He will succeed Vinay Mohan Kwatra, who was in March this year given a six months' extension. The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Misri, Deputy NSA in the National Security Council Secretariat, to the post of Foreign Secretary with effect from July 15, said the order issued by the Personnel Ministry.

Flight receives bomb threat

MUMBAI: A Thiruvananthapuram-Mumbai flight of Vistara received a bomb threat on Friday following which a search was being carried out, police said here. A note saying 'bomb on board' was found by a crew member, said an official of Sahar police station. As the flight landed at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport in Mumbai around 3.15 pm, the airline informed the police, he said. The passengers were informed about the threat after landing and a search of passengers and their luggage was underway though nothing suspicious had been found so far.

"...The petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 50,000 with two sureties of the like amount each," said the order passed by Justice Mukhopadhyay.

Soren, the executive president of the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate on January 31 in connection with its investigation into the money laundering case.

Centre to prematurely retire non-performers

NEW DELHI: Irked over non-adherence to its directives, the Centre has asked all ministries to timely review the working of the employees so that the non-performers are prematurely retired from service. In an order, the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) asked ministries concerned to direct the public sector undertakings (PSUs), banks, autonomous institutions and statutory bodies under their administrative control to undertake the exercise of periodic review of employees. It said instructions have been issued from time to time for undertaking periodic review of the government servants' performance with a view to ascertaining whether they "should be retained in service or retired from service prematurely, in public interest". The administrative ministries and departments have repeatedly been requested to adhere to guidelines issued in this regard and furnish a report to this effect.

Phoolodevi Netam faints during NEET protest

RAIPUR: Rajya Sabha MP from Chhattisgarh, Phoolodevi Netam, fainted during a heated protest over the NEET paper leak case in the special session of Parliament on Friday. The session witnessed significant uproar in both houses, particularly during discussions on the President's address, leading to intense opposition protests. Phoolodevi Netam, actively participating in the protest, reached the well of the House, raising slogans along with other opposition MPs. During the commotion, her health suddenly deteriorated, causing her to stumble and fall unconscious in the well. Immediate medical assistance was provided, and she was taken to RML Hospital by ambulance.

The opposition MPs were protesting vigorously over the NEET paper leak case, with many of them, including Phoolodevi Netam, moving to the well of the House to express their dissent. Her sudden collapse prompted concern among her colleagues, who ensured she received prompt medical attention. As of now, Phoolodevi Netam is under medical care, and further updates on her condition are awaited.

APPOINTMENT

Chhattisgarh to appoint new Director General of Police next month

RAIPUR: Chhattisgarh is set to welcome a new Director General of Police (DGP) as the current DGP, Ashok Juneja, is retiring on July 21. Juneja, a 1989 batch IPS officer, has held the position since November 11, 2021, with his tenure extended for two years by the then Congress government.

The race for the new DGP has narrowed down to two leading contenders: Arun Dev Gautam and SRP Kalluri. Arun Dev Gautam, a 1992 batch IPS officer, currently serves as Additional Director General (ADG) and is scheduled to retire in September 2027. On the other hand, SRP Kalluri, from the 1994 batch, has a longer service period with retirement slated for 2031.

Kalluri, who previously served in Bastar during the BJP government, was later sidelined by the Bhupesh government. Speculation is rife that he may be appointed to a significant position this time around.

Raipur Sky Walk Project to be completed after seven years

The project is set to resume after a seven-year hiatus

RAIPUR: In a significant decision, the Vishnudeo Sai Government has announced the completion of the half-finished Sky Walk in Raipur. This project, which was halted by the previous Congress government in 2018, is set to resume after a seven-year hiatus. Initially deemed unnecessary and halted by the Congress administration, the project has now been deemed viable by the Public Works Department (PWD) following a structural review.

The Sky Walk, initially proposed to be a major infrastructure addition, will primarily serve as a foot overbridge. PWD officials have indicated

that construction work is expected to restart in September-October, post-monsoon, with the tender process set to be completed before the urban body elections code of conduct comes into effect.

The Sky Walk project was initiated by the BJP government in 2016-17, with the contract awarded to M/s GS Express of Lucknow. The project, originally estimated to cost Rs 42 crores and to be completed within eight

months, saw its costs escalate to Rs 77 crores. When the Congress government took office in 2018, they halted the project and initiated an inquiry. By 2020, the General Advisory Committee advised against demolishing the structure, leading to the current decision to complete it.

Raipur to build Sports Court under Expressway

RAIPUR: In a bid to provide more sports grounds for players amid a growing population, Raipur's Municipal Corporation has initiated a project to build sports courts under the expressway overbridge, similar to successful projects in Mumbai and Ghaziabad. This innovative approach aims to address the shortage of sports grounds in the city by utilizing the space beneath the expressway.

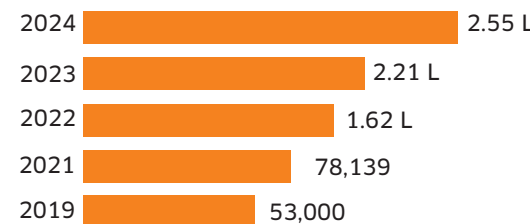

SUICIDE

Woman commits suicide by jumping from under-construction building

RAIPUR: A woman tragically ended her life by jumping from the eighth floor of an under-construction building in the Boriyakhurd area of Raipur. The incident took place on Friday afternoon, causing immediate alarm among local residents who promptly informed the police. The case falls under the jurisdiction of the Tikrapara police station. The deceased, identified as 41-year-old Shabnam Parveen, was a resident of Boriyakhurd. According to reports, Shabnam hurriedly entered the under-construction building at RDA Colony Block-H, Boriyakhurd, and ascended to the top of the eighth floor before jumping. She was pronounced dead at the scene upon impact.

Eyewitnesses reported seeing Shabnam's actions and immediately contacted the authorities. Upon receiving the information, police officers quickly arrived at the scene and began their investigation. Shabnam's body has been sent for post-mortem examination. Initial inquiries suggest that Shabnam lived with her family, leading police to suspect that a domestic dispute may have prompted her to take this fatal step.

RAIPUR: Heaps of garbage lying unattended in the gullies of Raipur has raised questions about the Waste Management system in the city.

Although the Raipur Municipal Corporation (RMC) sends its workers to clean the roads and collect garbage regularly, the piles of waste on the roadsides go unattended. The drains clogged with garbage, mostly plastic

93.8 mm rainfall recorded

'Children pacified with gadgets could have anger issues in future'

A research study has found that pacifying children by handing them digital devices when they are throwing tantrums can disable them in managing emotions later in their life.

NEW DELHI: Pacifying children by handing them digital devices when they are throwing tantrums can disable them in managing emotions later in life, which can grow into anger management issues, a research has found. Conversely, parents of children, who already had poor emotional control, were found to be overly relying on electronic devices to silence them, worsening the pre-existing conditions.

It is known that a child learns much about self-control, including how

to choose a deliberate response over an automatic one, during the first few years of their life. However, a team of researchers from Hungary and Canada found that the recent trend of distracting children by showing them content on tablets and smartphones to control their unpleasant emotional responses can cripple their ability to effectively recognise and manage emotions later in life.

"Tantrums cannot be cured by digital devices. Children have to learn how to manage their negative emotions for themselves. They need the help of their parents during this learning process, not the help of a digital

device," Veronika Konok, a researcher at Eotvos Lorand University, Hungary, and first author of the study published in the journal *Frontiers in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry*, said. Following 300 parents of children - aged two to five years old over a period of one year - the researchers found that children, who were pacified using digital devices, showed poorer anger and frustration management skills. Parents were asked to respond to questionnaires which assessed how they and their children used media. Conversely, the

team also found that poorer behaviour control in a child meant parents resorting to digital devices more often as a management tool. The more the children were given devices when they threw tantrums, the lesser they were seen to make a deliberate effort in order to control their behaviour, the authors found.

"It's not surprising that parents more frequently if their child has emotion regulation problems, but our results highlight that this strategy can lead to the escalation of a pre-existing issue," Konok said.

NEET UG Row: Students groups' agitation enters 3rd day

In the incident, which happened at around 5 am on Friday, one person died and a few others sustained injuries.

DIAL said that due to heavy rains and winds

through the night in Delhi, a canopy at the old departure forecourt of Terminal 1 (T1) partially collapsed. "While the cause for the collapse is being assessed, the primary cause seems to be the continued heavy rainfall over the past few hours," it said in a statement. The Delhi International Airport Ltd has set up a technical committee to investigate the cause of the incident and will give the report as soon as possible.

Following the incident, flight operations have been suspended at T1. According to the sources, the airport operator is looking at temporarily shifting operations from T1 to T2 and T3, they added. The sources also said that soon after

Rain Delayed For Over A Week

Southwest monsoon covers entire Jharkhand amid 69 pc rain deficit: Met office



RANCHI: The southwest monsoon covered entire Jharkhand on Friday despite a significant 69 per cent rain deficit, with five districts experiencing over 80 per cent shortfall, a Meteorological Department official said.

Although the monsoon arrived on June 21, which was 11 days later than usual, it took approximately eight more days to encompass the entire state due to its delayed progress.

The weather department predicted widespread rainfall with possibility of one or two spells of heavy rains in few pockets of the state on June 29 and 30 under influence of a low pressure.

As of June 1-28, the state has

received 53.2 mm of rainfall, significantly lower than the normal precipitation of 170.3 mm during this period. Among the 24 districts, five are facing severe rain deficits, with Pakur district recording the highest deficiency at 90 per cent. Over the past 24 hours, light to moderate rainfall was recorded in some parts of Jharkhand, with Musabani in East Singhbhum district recording the highest 32.4 mm.

Looking ahead, the weather department has forecast increased rainfall activity from Saturday onwards, influenced by a low-pressure system forming over the Northwest Bay of Bengal off the north Odisha coast. **PTI**

Arunachal to use English, Hindi versions of new criminal laws: Official

ITANAGAR: Arunachal Pradesh will use the English and Hindi versions of the three new criminal laws since the state's people speak in "innumerable" dialects, an official said on Friday. Officials and other people concerned are being trained on the new laws in English and Hindi, he said. English is the official language of the northeastern state. From July 1, three new criminal laws, Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Adhiniyam 2023, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam 2023, will come into effect across the country. These laws will replace the Indian Penal Code 1860, Indian Evidence Act 1872 and the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973. "We will use the English and Hindi versions. They are not being translated into any local language. We have 26 major and over 100 sub-tribes," the official said. He said all investigating officers in the northeastern state are being imparted training on the laws. **PTI**

Petrol to be cheaper by 65 paise, diesel by Rs 2.60 in Mumbai region

MUMBAI: The Maharashtra government on Friday slashed the value-added tax (VAT) on fuel in the Mumbai metropolitan region, which will make petrol cheaper by 65 paise per litre and diesel by Rs 2.60 per litre.

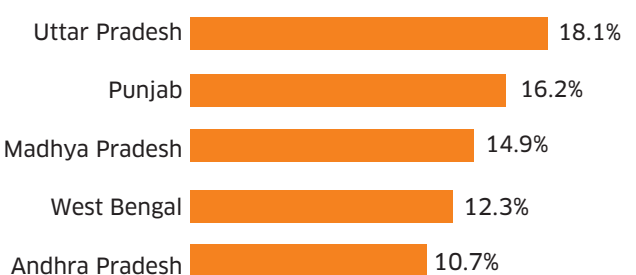

Deemed university not covered under RTI Act

CIC refused to provide the information on the ground that the institute was not a "public authority" and the data pertained to its internal administration.

NEW DELHI: A deemed university is not a "public authority" which is covered in the ambit of the Right to Information (RTI) Act unless it is under the control of or is financed by the government, the Delhi High Court has said.

The court's order was passed on a petition by an RTI applicant seeking information with respect to the details of students, including roll number, name and father's name, who completed MSc in Chemistry through distance learning from 2007 and 2011 from Vinayak Mission University, a deemed university.

Stating that there was no reason to interfere

with the decision of the CIC, Justice Subramonium Prasad noted that the RTI Act deals with entities, including non-government organisations, which are owned, controlled or substantially financed by the government and merely because a university has been deemed to be a university, it would not be considered a public authority under the act.

"It is not the case of the Petitioner that the Respondent University is either a government authority or a non-government organisation which is substantially financed by the government, either directly or indirectly. The Respondent No. 3 university, thus, cannot be held to

be a 'public authority' under Section 2(h) of the RTI Act and will not be amenable to the provisions of the RTI Act," the court said. "It has also been recently held by a Full Bench of the Bombay High Court...that merely because a university has been deemed to be a university by virtue of a notification under Section 3 of the UGC Act, it will not be considered a public authority under the (RTI) Act," the court recorded. The petitioner contended that being the

custodian and a "public authority", UGC should be held to be duty bound to supply the information to him. The court, however, observed that the information sought by the petitioner was "personal" in nature and exempted under the RTI Act, and he has also not shown any material to indicate what was the public interest that would outweigh the concerns of privacy.

"In the absence of any larger public interest justifying the disclosure of such information, this court is not inclined to accede to the information sought for by the Petitioner," it opined.

"This court, therefore, does not find any reason to interfere with the deci-

sion of the CIC denying to give information as sought for to the petitioner on both accounts i.e., the respondent university being a deemed University is not a public authority in the absence of any material advanced by the petitioner to show that the respondent university comes under the direct control of the Government or financed by the Government, and secondly, the information sought for will result in unwarranted invasion of privacy of all the individuals concerned and without there being any larger public interest involved which will outweigh the privacy of the persons whose information has been sought for," the court held.

24 held for killing over 60 cows and oxen; conspiracy hatched in Nagpur, say cops

BHOPAL: Police have arrested 24 persons in connection with the killing of more than 60 bovine animals, including cows, in Seoni district of Madhya Pradesh last week, officials said on Friday.

Eight of the arrested accused are from Nagpur, where the conspiracy to kill these animals was hatched to whip up communal frenzy,

the police said.

Carcasses of 18 cows with their necks slit were found in Vainganga river near Pindrai village in Seoni, while those of 28 cows and oxen were found in Kakartala forest area under Dhuma police station limits in the district on June 19 and 20. More such carcasses were found in the district later.

"Police have so far arrested a total of 24 persons in this connection. The accused persons

were assigned the job of killing the bovine animals in return for money and local residents (of Seoni) were also found to be involved in the crime," a police official said.

"The Police Headquarters in Bhopal was also monitoring the case as the incident was aimed at disrupting the communal harmony, and it had directed its personnel to ensure the arrest of those involved in this inhuman act," he said.

PETA India seeks rehabilitation of jumbo in Idukki

IDUKKI (KERALA): Following a tragic killing of a mahout by a jumbo called Lakshmi last week at an allegedly illegally run elephant park in this high range district of Kerala, animal rights organisation PETA has urged the state's wildlife department to rehabilitate the pachyderm at a sanctuary. The People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) India has also called for permanent closure of all illegal safari parks in Kerala and rehabilitation of all the elephants held captive there, the organisation said in a release. "PETA India is appealing to the chief wildlife warden to immediately protect Lakshmi and humans who may encounter her by sending her to a sanctuary for care and to shut all illegal parks that dangerously force elephants to carry tourists," PETA India Director of Advocacy Khushboo Gupta.

Water in reservoirs dips to 20% of live storage capacity: CWC

The Central Water Commission has reported a significant drop in live storage levels across 150 major reservoirs in India.

NEW DELHI: Water available in the 150 main reservoirs across the country has dipped to just 20 per cent of their total live storage capacity, according to the Central Water Commission.

For the past two weeks, the reservoirs were at 21 per cent of their total live storage capacity and the week before that it was 22 per cent. The Central Water Commission (CWC) has reported a significant drop in live storage levels across 150 major reservoirs in India.

According to the latest CWC bulletin, the total live storage available is 36.368 billion cubic meters (BCM) which is just 20 per cent of the total live storage capacity of these reservoirs.

This is a significant decrease from 46.369 billion cubic meters (BCM) recorded during the same period last year and also below the normal storage of 42.645 BCM.

The total live storage capacity of these reservoirs is 178.784 BCM, which is about 69.35 per cent of the estimated total live storage capacity of 257.812 BCM in the country. The northern region, comprising Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, and Rajasthan, has a total live storage capacity of 19.663 BCM in 10 reservoirs. Currently, the storage level

there is 5.239 BCM or 27 per cent of the capacity. The eastern region, including Assam, Jharkhand, Odisha, West Bengal, Tripura, Nagaland, and Bihar has a total live storage capacity of 20.430 BCM in 23 reservoirs. The current storage level is 3.643 BCM or 17.83 per cent of the capacity, slightly less than the 17.84 per cent recorded last year. The western region, comprising Gujarat and Maharashtra, has 49 reservoirs with a total live storage capacity of 37.130 BCM. However, the current storage is 7.471 BCM, or 20.12 per cent of the capacity. The central region, which includes Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh, has a total live storage capacity of 48.227 BCM across 26 reservoirs. The current storage level is 11.693 BCM, or 24 per cent of the capacity. On the other hand, the southern region, covering Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu, has a total live storage capacity of 53.334 BCM in 42 reservoirs. The current storage is 8.322 BCM, or 16 per cent of the capacity, down from 20 per cent last year.

Comprehensive strategies to combat terrorism in J&K

The spike in terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir demands a multifaceted and robust response from the region's security forces. The Jammu and Kashmir Police (JKP), in collaboration with various agencies, has rolled out a series of comprehensive measures aimed at countering terrorism. These efforts, spanning legal, operational, and technological dimensions, reflect a determined approach to ensuring peace and stability. One of the most significant legal measures considered is the invocation of the Enemy Agents Act, carrying a minimum sentence of life imprisonment and extending to the death penalty. This move underscores the gravity with which the state views any support for terrorism, signaling a no-tolerance policy. Additionally, the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) remains a key legislative tool, providing the framework to detain individuals suspected of terrorist activities and prevent potential threats. The proposed establishment of special courts for trials under these stringent laws aims to expedite the judicial process, ensuring swift and decisive action against those involved in terrorism. Operationally, the JKP has intensified its counter-terrorism strategies. Following the terror attack in Hiranagar, the Special Investigation Agency (SIA) took over the investigation, highlighting the importance of specialized units in handling complex cases. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has also been entrusted with probing significant terror attacks, such as the Reasi attack, bringing a higher level of investigative proficiency and uncovering intricate terrorist networks and financial links. In the contemporary era, the role of technology in both facilitating and countering terrorism cannot be overstated. Pakistani handlers exploit it to coordinate attacks and smuggle weapons. To counter this, the JKP has ramped up their cyber capabilities by establishing cyber police stations in all revenue and police districts.

Confronting the growing menace of drug abuse

Drug abuse and the illegal drug trade have become significant societal problems, affecting individuals across all age groups, especially the youth. As the Lok Sabha session commenced, a plethora of conflicting views emerged from political parties regarding the selection of the pro tem Speaker, the Speaker election, and the swearing-in ceremony of the newly elected members. These issues have already attracted considerable attention.

For the first time in the 72-year history of India's Parliament, the contest for the Speaker's post did not demand a division; instead, the decision was made by voice vote. This notable departure from tradition marks a significant milestone in the parliamentary proceedings.

Rahul Gandhi has been declared the Leader of Opposition, a post that remained officially vacant for the last two consecutive terms. His inaugural speech, though brief, was impressive and signaled his commitment to playing a responsible role in opposition. This is expected to strengthen the democratic fabric of the country.

Amritpal Singh, currently jailed under the National Security Act (NSA), has been elected as a Member of Parliament from Punjab. However, he could not attend the oath-taking ceremony. It falls upon the Speaker to review his case to determine if it is permissible for Singh to take the oath under these circumstances. Similarly, the case of Rashid Engineer, which is already in court, requires careful consideration.

Media reports have highlighted that this election to the Speaker's post is unprecedented. However, historical records show that elections for the Speaker have been held thrice before: in 1952, between GV Mavalankar and Shankar Shantaram; in 1967, between Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy and Opposition candidates Shankar Shantaram More, Tenniti Vishwanathan, and Jagannath Rao Joshi; and in 1976, during the Emergency, between Baliram Bhagat and Jagannath Rao. In each instance, the ruling party's nominees—Mavalankar, Bhagat, and Reddy—

emerged victorious. To maintain impartiality, Dr. Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy resigned from his party post in 1967, setting a notable precedent. The current Speaker, Om Birla, the MP from Kota, is in his second term, and while emulating Reddy's gesture might be ideal, it is not anticipated.

A two-minute silence was observed in the Lok Sabha on June 26 to mark the 50th anniversary of the Emergency declaration. However, only NDA members participated in this observance, which is an unhealthy sign of political division.

The oath-taking ceremony of new parliament members sparked controversy when AIMIM Chief and Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi raised the slogan "Jai Palestine." Constitutional experts and the law minister have expressed differing opinions on what action, if any, should be taken in such cases. Further clarification from the law minister is awaited before any definitive comment can be made.

With a strong opposition

presence in the Lok Sabha, the expectation is for healthy and robust discussions on every bill. It is also anticipated that many bills will be referred to parliamentary select committees, ensuring thorough scrutiny and debate.

The early days of this Lok Sabha session have already set the stage for a term filled with significant historical moments and potential controversies. The commitment of the elected representatives to uphold democratic principles and engage in constructive dialogue will be crucial for the effective functioning of the Parliament and the overall governance of the country. The actions and decisions made in this session will undoubtedly shape the future of Indian democracy.

In conclusion, the new Lok Sabha session promises to be a dynamic period in Indian politics, marked by significant events and vigorous debates. The nation watches with hope that its leaders will rise to the occasion, demonstrating a commitment to progress and the well-being of all citizens.

Private institutions proliferated, and the focus on skill development and professional courses intensified to meet market demands. The establishment of large-scale industries created a high demand for a substantial workforce, which, driven by unemployment and poverty, seemed like a legitimate necessity. This led to intense competition for limited seats in professional and technical courses. Entrance examinations

became the norm, and private coaching centers flourished. These exams, based on multiple-choice questions, encouraged rote memorization over comprehension and critical thinking. Karl Marx noted that the prevailing educational system, influenced by the dominant global capitalist mindset, produces passive and obedient workers. Avijit Pathak described this system as book-centric and exam-oriented, where students become strategists or exam-warriors, far removed from learning with joy, wonder, and creativity.

When education is reduced to mere information, knowledge, wisdom, and critical thinking are lost. Consequently, education fails to instill meaning into life, becoming a burden that suppresses intellect and consciousness. "Where is the life we have lost in living? Where is the wisdom we have lost in knowledge? Where is the knowledge we have lost in information?" These lines poignantly highlight the diminishing impact of education when it focuses solely on gathering information, neglecting

deeper understanding and wisdom.

The pressure and stress imposed by entrance examinations are distressing, and the educational structure fails to equip students with the ability to manage this pressure. Jogender Singh, an educationist, argues that the competitive exam system hides the educational system's inadequacies, shifting the blame onto students and keeping a large portion of the population from accessing quality education.

Students suffer the most in this process, as education

diverges from its philosophical and societal interpretations. Commercialization has led to unchecked competition, where entrance exams are used for exclusion rather than inclusion. Paulo Freire criticized this "banking" model of education, where teachers deposit knowledge into passive students, disconnected from the real world. This structure has rendered education meaningless and hollow, turning institutions into advertising agencies rather than shaping personalities.

Academic distress is a widespread issue, affecting students' academic performance and mental well-being. Research indicates that a significant number of students, particularly those in high schools and professional courses, experience "academic distress." This condition severely impacts their academic performance and mental health. Academic stress includes factors that contribute to tension or pressure, known as "stressors," which can be personal, impersonal, social, health-related, or environmental.

Structural stress, caused by factors like economic inequality and inadequate healthcare, often requires collective social action for change.

MUMBAI: RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das on Friday emphasised on the need to eliminate biases in algorithms as the use of artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML) is on the rise. Delivering the inaugural address at the 18th Statistics Day Conference organised by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), he said the use of statistics

has been ever growing as a preferred tool for drawing inferences in diverse fields and the discipline has moved beyond collection of facts to focusing more on interpretation and drawing inferences, taking into account the level of uncertainty.

This shift, Das said has allowed statistics to become an integral part of other major disciplines. The surge in computing power is being

increasingly harnessed in combination with statis-

tical methods to improve efficiency in decision making and enrich end-user experience in various fields of human knowledge.

“Looking ahead, the year 2025 has a special significance for compilation of official statistics the world over. Global efforts are expected to culminate in new global standards for compilation of macroeconomic statistics, especially for national

accounts and balance of payments,” he said, and added the team in the Reserve Bank is closely tracking these developments.

He further said RBI is making efforts to harness the availability of huge computing power and growing digital footprints to analyse measures of expectations, sentiment indicators and policy credibility measures from alternative data sources.

Key infra sectors growth rises 6.3 pc in May

NEW DELHI: The eight key infrastructure sectors' growth rose by 6.3 per cent in May on healthy expansion in the production of coal, natural gas, and electricity, according to official data released on Friday. The production of the eight sectors grew 6.7 per cent in April. The growth of these core sectors -- coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertiliser, steel, cement and electricity -- was 5.2 per cent in May 2023. The official data showed that fertiliser, crude oil, and cement output recorded negative growth in May. During April-May this fiscal, the output of these sectors was up 6.5 per cent against 4.9 per cent in the same period last fiscal. The eight core sectors contribute 40.27 per cent to the country's Index of Industrial Production (IIP).

“Borrowed money, household savings going into F&O bets”

MUMBAI: Sebi chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch said the capital markets regulator has anecdotal evidence of people borrowing money to place speculative bets in the derivatives segment and rued that household savings are going into such risky bets. Making it clear that

it is “not a good thing”, Buch said people are borrowing money and even mortgaging their parents' homes for raising funds to punt in the derivatives segment.

Reminding about Sebi research pointing out retail investors losing money in nine of ten trades, Buch said big money is being lost in such aspects, and also



underlined broader macroeconomic concerns.

“There is a large

amount of money that is going from household savings into what is essentially not productive economic activity. This is speculative activity, this is not going into any capital formation in the economy,” she said. Buch elaborated that most of the trades are speculative because they are done on expiry date or in the last hour of

trade, and have no hedging, which make it clear about the nature of the operation being speculative. She said that apart from investor protection, another dimension of the concerns on the F&O market involves systemic risks in the capital markets ecosystem but was quick to add that we are reasonable well protected on this front.

TARIFF HIKE

After Jio, Bharti Airtel announces 10-21 pc hike in mobile tariffs

NEW DELHI: Bharti Airtel on Friday announced a 10-21 per cent hike in prepaid and postpaid mobile tariffs, a day after larger rival Reliance Jio announced an increase in rates. The move assumes significance, as it marks the first major increase in tariffs by the telecom industry, in two-and-a-half years.

Airtel's tariff hike across various plans ranges from 10-21 per cent, and will be effective from July 3. While the rate of daily data add-on (IGB) will see an increase by Rs 3, rising from Rs 19 to Rs 22, in the case of 365-day validity plan offering 2GB/day, the increase works out to as high as Rs 600, as rates are set to rise from Rs 2,999, all the way to Rs 3,599. In the unlimited voice plan category, tariff has been raised from Rs 179 to Rs 199, marking a Rs 20 increase in this 28-day validity plan that offers 2GB of data to users.

Markets snap record-breaking rally as profit booking hammers banking, finance stocks

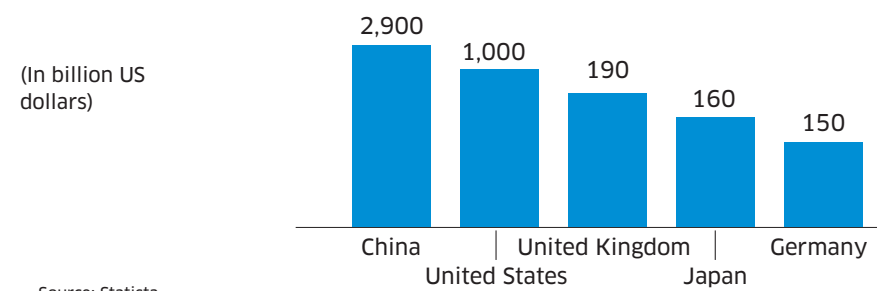


MUMBAI: Market benchmarks Sensex and Nifty halted their three-day record-hitting rally to close with losses on Friday as investors booked profit in banking, finance and tech stocks despite a positive trend in global equities. Snapping a four-session winning run, equity indices succumbed to selling pressure after mid-session when profit-taking emerged on select counters. After hitting fresh all-time high level in early trade, the 30-share index declined 210.45 points or 0.27 per cent to settle at 79,032.73. During the day, it jumped 428.4 points or 0.54 per cent

to hit a fresh record peak of 79,671.58. The Nifty went lower by 33.90 points or 0.14 per cent to 24,010.60. During the day, it climbed 129.5 points or 0.53 per cent to hit a new lifetime high of 24,174. “Profit taking in banking stocks led the downfall in key benchmark indices, which had hit fresh intra-day highs in early optimism. While markets displayed volatility and ended weak in late selling, both Sensex and Nifty managed to close above their psychological levels of 79k and 24k, respectively,” Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd, said.

Injured triple jumper Eldhose Paul pulls out of Olympic qualification race

NEW DELHI: Commonwealth Games champion triple jumper Eldhose Paul pulled out of the race to qualify for next month's Paris Olympics due to a heel bone fracture. The 27-year-old Paul, who was set to make a final attempt at the qualification at the ongoing National Inter-State Athletics Championships in Panchkula, announced his withdrawal on social media. Unfortunately, I sustained an injury during the last competition I took part in, which occurred towards the end of the qualifying period. Shafali Verma's record double ton powers India

Shafali Verma's 205 and Mandhana's 149 lead India to a record 525/4 in one-day; Rodrigues 55, Harmanpreet 42*, and Ghosh 43* contribute crucial runs.

CHENNAI: Young opener Shafali Verma scored a sensational double century, propelling India to a record-breaking total on the opening day of the one-off women's Test against South Africa. Verma's 205 off 194 balls and her 292-run partnership with Smriti Mandhana (149) led India to a monumental 525/4, rewriting multiple records. Shafali surpassed Annabel Sutherland's double-century record and became the second Indian woman after Mithali Raj to achieve the feat. Raj's 214 came off 407 balls in 2002. India's 525/4 broke the 89-year-old record for the highest single-day total in women's Test cricket, previously held by England with 431/2 in 1935. After electing to bat, Shafali and Mandhana dominated the South African bowlers, reaching 130/0 at lunch. They continued their onslaught post-lunch, both scoring centuries and pushing the total past 250. Mandhana fell for 149, her best Test score, and Shafali was eventually run out for 205. Jemimah Rodrigues (55) and skipper Harmanpreet Kaur (42*) along with Richa Ghosh (43*) added crucial runs, making India the first team to cross 500 runs in a single day of a women's Test.

Surprise Olympic Qualifier Unheralded Kiran secures surprise Olympic berth in women's 400m



PANCHKULA: Unheralded Haryana athlete Kiran Pahal on Thursday surprised herself by qualifying for the Paris Olympics in the women's 400m event, clocking a personal best time of 50.92 seconds on the opening day of the National Inter-State Championships here. The automatic Olympics qualification mark in women's 400m is 50.95 seconds, which the 23-year-old Kiran managed to breach to secure her berth at next month's Games. She easily won her semifinal heat, finishing

ahead of Devy Aniba Zala of Gujarat, who was a distant second with a timing of 53.44, while Kerala's Sneha K came third by clocking 53.51s. She had clocked a fast time of 52.33 seconds in the preliminary round heats earlier in the day. Her earlier personal best was 51.84 second which she had recorded in 2022. Kiran is the first Indian female quarter-miler to qualify for the Olympics after a gap of eight years since Nirmal Sheoran (Haryana) ran in the 2016 Rio Games. **PTI**

FORT WORTH (USA): India's Priyanshu Rajawat has stormed into the men's singles quarterfinals with a straight-game win over Chinese Taipei's Huang Yu Kai in the US Open Super 300 badminton tournament here. Eighth seed Rajawat, who had won the Orleans Masters in 2023, notched up a 21-18 21-16 win over Huang to set up a clash with fourth seed Lei Lan Xi of China. Commonwealth Games bronze medallists Treesa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand also advanced to the women's doubles quarterfinals with a 16-21 21-11 21-19 win over Chinese Taipei's Hsieh Pei Shan and Hung En-Tzu in the second round. The second seeded Indian pair, who received a bye in the opening round, will next face sixth seeded Japanese Rui Hirokami and Yuna Kato. Also making it to the last eight is Malvika Bansod, seeded seventh. She beat Czech Republic's Tereza Svabikova 15-21 21-19 21-14 in a women's singles match. **PTI**

DP Manu faces doping suspicion; NADA halts competitions



PANCHKULA (HARYANA): Javelin thrower DP Manu has been asked to stay away from competitions by the Athletics Federation of India on the instructions of the National Anti-Doping Agency as the Olympic hopeful is suspected to have been caught in the dope net. Five key contests that can impact the outcome

CHENNAI: As India and South Africa gear up for the T20 World Cup final on Saturday, here are five pivotal contests that could shape the match's outcome.

1. Rohit Sharma vs Marco Jansen

Although not a historic rivalry, Rohit Sharma's known vulnerability to left-arm pace could be tested by Marco Jansen. Jansen, in excellent form, may exploit this weakness with his probing line outside off-stump, aiming to disrupt India's early momentum. However, Sharma's stats against Jansen are favorable; in nine T20I innings, Sharma has scored 113 runs and been dismissed only once. This matchup will be crucial in setting the tone for India's innings.



2. Virat Kohli vs Kagiso Rabada

Kohli's form has been a concern, scoring just 75 runs in seven matches. Facing Kagiso Rabada, who has taken 12 wickets with a remarkable economy rate of 5.88, will be a significant challenge. Rabada's effectiveness in powerplays and death overs makes him a key player. Kohli, dismissed by Rabada four times in

13 T20I innings, needs to be cautious with his trademark flick shot to counter Rabada's precise deliveries.

3. Rishabh Pant vs Keshav Maharaj

Rishabh Pant, with 171 runs at a strike rate of 129, will likely face Keshav Maharaj early in the innings. Maharaj, with nine wickets in the tournament, must bowl accurately to prevent

Pant's unconventional shots. Pant's tendency to play risky reverse sweeps, which has led to his dismissal three times, will be something Maharaj aims to exploit. This contest could significantly impact India's middle overs.

4. Jasprit Bumrah vs Quinton de Kock

Quinton de Kock, South Africa's top scorer with 204 runs at a strike

rate of 143, will face Jasprit Bumrah, who has been exceptional with 13 wickets and an economy rate of 4.12. De Kock's aggressive starts will be tested by Bumrah's lethal bowling. Scoring runs or even surviving against Bumrah will be crucial for de Kock to provide a strong foundation for South Africa.

5. Axar Patel/Kuldeep Yadav vs Heinrich Klaasen

Heinrich Klaasen's struggle against spin in this tournament, with only 138 runs at a strike rate of 112, contrasts with his reputation as a destructive player. Axar Patel and Kuldeep Yadav, known for their accurate lines and subtle variations, will aim to restrict Klaasen. Klaasen needs to find his rhythm and range-hitting form to boost South Africa's middle overs, crucial for either setting or chasing a target.

A precious treasure: Shafali Verma

Shafali made her double century in 194 balls, breaking the record for the fastest 200 in women's cricket held by Australia's Annabelle Sutherland. Her innings helped India post a record 525 for four at the end of the day. This was Shafali's maiden international century across all formats.

"It's a special moment for me, and I will cherish



it as a precious treasure for the rest of my life. It is

Cup title win," Shafali said at the post-day press meet.

The hard-hitting right-hander highlighted her work ethic before the series. "I couldn't convert the starts I gained in the ODIs against South Africa in Bengaluru. Today, my plan was to take my time as the ball was moving initially. With God's grace, I managed to get my first 100 and 200 simultaneously, which is a tribute to my hard work."

Shafali's previous best was 96 against England three years ago, and she admitted to feeling nervous in the 90s. "No one forgets getting dismissed on 96. When I was on 96 today, all I was thinking was to score those four runs."

Survivors of Israel music festival massacre unite

They have found solace in massage therapy, ice baths, yoga or surfing with the only people who could truly understand what they had been through.

TEL AVIV: In the months since Hamas' surprise attack sent them scattering across fields or hiding in desert brush, thousands of survivors of a massacre at a trance festival in Israel have come together as a community to heal. For some, the way back has come through dancing again. On Thursday, thousands of people attended the Nova Healing Concert in Tel Aviv, the first Tribe of Nova mass gathering

since the October 7 attack. "We understood that people needed to be together, and we're a community that takes care of itself," said Omri Sasa, one of the founders of the Tribe of Nova, which organised the festival last October. "I'm in trauma, and I wanted to be with people who also went through this." He was among around 3,000 people dancing through the night in a field just miles from Gaza when rockets lit up the sky at 6:29 am. Heavily armed Palestinian militants ram-

paged through the festival, killing at least 364 people and taking more than 40 hostage. Many of them are still held in Gaza. Hila Fak-

liro, a communications student who was tending bar at the festival, escaped by zigzagging through fields, hiding and running for over five hours, until she reached the safety of a village some 20 kilometres away. Six of her friends were killed and another three were taken hostage. "Someone asked me if I can dance again, and in the beginning I said no," she said. At a memorial in January for one of her friends, she tried to dance, had a panic attack,

and then tried again. "I was crying and dancing at the same time," she said. But after attending events organized by Nova survivors, she was once again able to find solace in the trance music she loves. At a recent event, she slid into an ice bath while others attended yoga and art classes in a cluster of tents. Omri Kohavi, 35, one of Nova's founding organisers, said they had felt abandoned by Israel's security forces, who took hours to respond to the October 7 attack.

15-year-old boy convicted

BERLIN: A German court on Friday convicted a 15-year-old boy of plotting an Islamic extremist attack on a Christmas market and gave him a four-year sentence. The boy was convicted of conspiracy to murder and disturbing the public peace by threatening crimes.

PAK LAWMAKERS
Pak court accepts apology of two lawmakers for contemptuous media talks

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Supreme Court on Friday accepted the apology of two lawmakers who criticised the judiciary that resulted in a case of contempt against them. A three-judge bench led by Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa heard the case against independent Senator Faisal Vawda and Member of the National Assembly Mustafa Kamal of Muttahida Qaumi Movement. They had criticised the judiciary in press conferences in May. During the hearing, the court was informed that Vawda on June 26 submitted an apology to the court in the case. The chief justice asked: "Have you also apologised?" Vawda responded in affirmative saying he had submitted an unconditional apology. Kamal's counsel Barrister Farogh Naseem on his turn informed the court that his client had also apologised and expressed regret during a press conference.

SLOVAKIA TRAIN CRASH
Slovak train and bus collision caused by human error: Minister



BRATISLAVA (SLOVAKIA): A collision between a EuroCity train with a bus in southern Slovakia that left seven people dead was likely caused by human error, the Slovak transport minister said on Friday. Some 200 people were aboard the train traveling from the Czech capital of Prague crossing through Slovakia on its way to the Hungarian capital of Budapest when the accident took place shortly Thursday after 5 p.m. (1500 GMT) at a crossing near the town of Nove Zamky.

JAPAN ROCKET

Japan's space agency delays launch of upgraded observation satellite



TOKYO: Japan's space agency said Friday its planned launch this weekend of a satellite on its new flagship H3 rocket will be postponed until Monday due to expected bad weather. The Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, or JAXA, said it is postponing the launch because of rain and thunder predicted for Saturday night when the rocket was to be moved to the launch site at the Tanegashima Space Centre on a southwestern Japanese island. The launch was initially scheduled for Sunday.

The rocket will be carrying an Advanced Land Observation Satellite, ALOS-4, tasked primarily with Earth observation and data collection for disaster response and mapping, as well as with monitoring military activity, such as missile launches, with an infrared sensor developed by the Defence Ministry. The ALOS-4 is a successor to the current ALOS-2 and can observe a much wider area. Japan will operate both for the time being. The launch will be the H3's third, after a successful launch on Feb. 17 that followed a shocking failed debut flight a year earlier when the rocket had to be destroyed with its payload - a satellite that was supposed to be the ALOS-3. Japan sees a stable, commercially competitive space transport capability as key to the country's space program and national security.

Princess Anne leaves hospital after treatment

LONDON: Princess Anne has left the hospital and returned to her southwestern England estate after an accident thought to involve a horse left her with a concussion. The king's 73-year-old sister had been to Southmead Hospital.

Reform UK campaigner filmed making racist slurs

LONDON: A campaigner for the far-right Reform UK was filmed using a racist slur for British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, forcing the party's leader and general election candidate Nigel Farage to condemn the actions as "appalling". Reform UK is fielding hundreds of candidates in the July 4 election on an anti-immigration stance with the hope of posing a major challenge for the incumbent Conservative Party, which is heavily trailing in the polls. However, with the election called earlier than expected, the party has been unable to fully vet all its campaigners and one of them - Andrew Parker - was filmed by an undercover reporter from Channel 4 attacking Sunak's South Asian heritage.

Bolivia's president denies being behind attempted coup

arrests in a failed coup that shook the economically troubled country a day earlier. Bolivia's government announced that a total of 17 people had been arrested for their alleged involvement in the attempted government takeover, including the army chief, Gen. Juan José Zúñiga, and former navy Vice Adm. Juan Arnez Salvador, who

were taken into custody the day before. The South American nation of 12 million watched in shock and bewilderment Wednesday as military forces appeared to turn on the government of President Luis Arce, seizing control of the capital's main square with armored vehicles, repeatedly crashing a small tank into the presidential palace and unleashing tear gas on protesters. Senior Cabinet member Eduardo del Castillo did not elaborate on the other 15 people who were arrested, except to identify one civilian, Anibal Aguilar Gómez, as a key "ideologue" of the thwarted coup. He said the alleged conspirators began plotting in May.

Biden and Trump take swings at each other's golf skills

WASHINGTON: They debated the economy, immigration and foreign policy, but it was an argument over golf handicaps that brought out some of the feistiest comments in Thursday's debate between President Joe Biden and former President Donald Trump. Answering a ques-

tion about his fitness, Trump, who would be 82 at the end of a second term, bragged that he was in "very good shape" and had recently won two championships at one of his golf courses. "To do that, you have to be quite smart and you have to be able to hit the ball a long way," Trump said. Biden, he said, "can't hit



a ball 50 yards." Biden then touted his his own golf abilities. "I got my handicap, when I was

vice president, down to six," Biden said. He again challenged Trump to a golf match, but only if Trump carried his bag of clubs himself. "Think you can do it?" asked Biden, whose handicap is listed on the United State Golf Association's website as 6.7, with the last update in July 2018. Trump's handicap last updated in June 2021

is listed as 2.5. Biden would be 86 at the end of his second term. Trump called Biden's handicap claim "the biggest lie of all," adding: "I've seen your swing. I know your swing." Trump then sought to shut down the golf discussion. "Let's not act like children," Trump said. "You are a child," Biden retorted.
