# 'Judges are servants of the Constitution'

CJI for writing of judgments in a simple form, keeping in mind common

KOLKATA: Maintaining that "constitutional morality" is a restraining factor on the state, Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud on Saturday said it allows for conditions that respect diversity, promote inclusion and pursue tolerance.

He said that India does not exist only in large cities, but it goes down to the smallest village and the smallest taluka across the nation, connected or not, accessible or other-

CJI Chandrachud said "constitutional morality", unlike morality, which he said is a restraint on the rights of citizens, is a restraining factor on the

Constitutional morality addresses itself to every component of society and allows for conditions which "respect diversity, promote inclusion and pursue tolerance", he said, delivering the keynote address at the twoday East Zone II regional conference of the National Judicial Academy. The CJI said it also imposes a duty

on the state to facilitate the achievement of the kind of society that the Constitution envisages.

"The Constitution uses the expression morality, but it does not use the expression constitutional morality," he said.

CII Chandrachud said the Constitution allows for restrictions to be imposed

by law on the right to freedom and expression on various grounds, includ-

ing morality. He said the Constitution also contemplates that restrictions can be imposed on the right to freedom of association on grounds of morality.

At one level, constitutional morality is founded in the values which the Constitution's Preamble sets out, he said.

"Constitutional morality is an overarching principle which is derived from, but is not confined to, specific rights or values which are enshrined in the Constitution," CJI Chandrachud said.

According to him, it gives a unifying constitutional ethic so that every Indian citizen can think and speak as he wishes to, worship as they intend to, follow whoever they want to, eat what they want to and marry whoever he or she wants to or not marry at all.

#### Children get stroke; although curable

BENGALURU: The lack of awareness when it comes to paediatric stroke is so low and people are often stunned to hear that children can get stroke. Actors like Amitabh Bachchan need to talk about it to create awareness, said Dr Nirmal Surya, president of Indian Stroke Association (ISA) on Saturday.

Speaking at a press conference after the inauguration of the second national paediatric stroke conclave, he said, "Stroke is preventable, but globally paediatric stroke is the sixth leading cause of death in children.'

The two-day conclave, organised by ISA, was inaugurated by Dr Devi Prasad Shetty, chairman and founder of Narayana Health. According to Dr Surya,

lack of awareness is the biggest challenge that paediatric neurologists world over have to overcome.

"In India, the situation is even worse. When people are not made aware of the possibility of stroke in children, time is lost on misdiagnosis. Time is of essence because stroke can often be treated with injection if the patient is brought within four and half hours," he added.

#### Canopy collapses at Rajkot airport

**RAJKOT:** A portion of a fabric canopy erected at the pick-up and drop area of the Rajkot International Airport collapsed on Saturday after heavy rains, officials said. Nobody was injured in the incident, they said. The accident, which comes days after similar incidents in Delhi and Jabalpur, gave the opposition Congress an opportunity to target the ruling BIP.

In a post on X, the Rajkot airport authorities said that water accumulation was observed on the city side of the canopy at the terminal building at 11.40 am due to heavy rains. "As we came to know about it we gave the information to the civil works department and the area beneath was cordoned off," said Rajkot International Airport in the post. The international airport is located at Hirasar, about 30 km from Rajkot city.

### Five soldiers swept away in flash floods

**NEW DELHI:** Five soldiers, including a junior commissioned officer (JCO), were killed during an exercise early Saturday as their Russian-origin T-72 tank was swept away following flash floods in the Shyok river near the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh, officials said. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said he was deeply saddened by the unfortunate accident that occurred in the river near Saser Brangsa. Two T-72 tanks were trying to cross Shyok around 1 am and one of them got stuck in high currents in the river, the officials said, adding the melting of snow resulted in the increase in the water levels. The Army deployed rescue teams but the mission didn't succeed in view of the raging waters in the river. The deceased personnel are MRK Reddy, Subhan Khan, Bhupendra Negi, E Teibam and Sadarbonia Nagaraju.

#### Nitish Kumar renews Bihar special status demand

NEW DELHI: The Janata Dal (United) on Saturday appointed Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Kumar Jha as its working president and urged the Centre to consider either special category status or special package for Bihar, underlining the party's important role in the formation of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government. The party's national executive meeting chaired by its president and Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar flagged price rise and unemployment as "burning issues", as its political resolution expressed confidence that the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government would take more effective steps to handle them.

#### **Heavy Rain** forecast in **Chhattisgarh**

RAIPUR: The Meteorological Department has issued Orange and Yellow alerts for Chhattisgarh, forecasting heavy rain in the next 24 hours. The alert predicts significant rainfall in Surguja and adjoining divisions until June 30. Districts in the Raipur, Durg, Bilaspur, and Bastar divisions have been experiencing cloudy skies and light to moderate rain since morning. On Saturday, Bijapur recorded the highest rainfall in the state with 230 mm. Other notable recordings include 90 mm in Nagari, 80 mm in Bhatapara, 70 mm in Baloda Bazar, Jagdalpur, and Patan, and 60 mm in Dornapal, Tongpal, Bastar, and Chhindgarh. Ambikapur, Chhotedongar, Gangalore, Suhela, Akaltara, Jagargunda, Bhairamgarh, Manpur, and Bhopalpatnam saw rainfall ranging from 40 to 50 mm. So far, Chhattisgarh has received 110.2 mm of rain. While 10 districts have recorded normal rainfall, 19 districts have experienced below-average The state should have received 172.5 mm of rain by now, indicating a 36 percent deficit. In the next 24 hours, heavy rain and moderate cloud cover are expected in Bilaspur, Gaurela Pendra Marwahi, Korba, Korea, Manendragarh Chirmiri Bharatpur, and Surajpur.

#### Young man, woman arrested with Ganja at the new bus terminal

RAIPUR: In a significant drug bust, police have apprehended a young man and a woman with ganja at the new bus terminal in the Tikrapara police station area of the capital. Tikrapara police station in-charge reported that they acted on a tip-off from informers who indicated the suspects would arrive in Raipur by bus via Odisha this afternoon. Upon receiving this information, the police team swiftly surrounded the location and arrested the suspects. However, one of the women managed to escape, evading capture. Unconfirmed sources suggest that there might be attempts to hush up the matter within the police station. In a related incident three days ago, police arrested an individual in Raipur for cultivating ganja plants at his residence. The accused, identified as Sunil Pandey, was apprehended after the Anti Crime Unit received information about cannabis cultivation in Deori village near Dharsiwa.

#### **NIA RAID**

#### Two arrested in connection with BJP leader's murder in Kanker



RAIPUR: The National Investigation Agency (NIA), probing the murder case of BJP leader Ratan Dubey, conducted extensive raids across half a dozen villages in the Naxal-affected Kanker district. The raids, which took place late Friday night, resulted in the arrest of two individuals and the seizure of several items, including mobile phones, a printer, and cash amounting to Rs 39,100, along with objection able documents.

The NIA carried out these operations in the remote villages of Mujalgondi, Kalmuche, Amabeda, and Jivalamari in Kanker district.

#### New Industrial Policy for state

RAIPUR: As the Chhattisgarh government works on formulating the Industrial Policy 2024-29, the Urla Industries Association organized a crucial meeting on June 28 with various industrial organizations across the state. #### 75% have not received 4th installment

RAIPUR: In a recent statement, State Congress President Deepak Baij claimed that 75 percent of women beneficiaries have not yet received the fourth installment of the mantari vandan yojana. This comes despite the fifth installment being scheduled for distribution in July.

Baij pointed out that many women are still awaiting the payment for June, raising suspicions about the government's intentions. Baij accused the government of conspiring to remove a large number of women from the beneficiary list by declaring them ineligible.

He questioned the criteria used to determine eligibility, asking why women who had received the first three installments are now being considered ineligible for the fourth. "If they were ineligible, then why was the money for three months given?"

She experienced breathing difficulties and lost 7 kg in just two months, leading her family to admit her to Ramakrishna Care Hospital in Raipur in November 2023. A CT scan revealed an 18 cm tumor with lymph node metastasis from her ovary,

her stomach and from severe breathing difficulties, the girl's condition began to improve significantly after the first cycle of chemotherapy. She regained her appetite and strength, and after three cycles, her tumor was completely cured with no symptoms. Blood tumor marker tests and postchemo CT scans showed excellent results, leading to a successful operation by a team of senior doctors, including Dr. Sandeep Dave, Dr. Siddharth Tamrakar, Dr.

Saurabh Jain, and Dr. Vikram Sharma, who ensured the preservation of her fertility. Dr. Kavi jaiswai emphasized that fourth-stage cancer is no longer a death sentence, thanks to advancements in treatments such as targeted therapy and immunotherapy. He noted that germ cell tumors, commonly found in ovarian and testicular cancers in young children and adults, are highly treatable. Dr. Jaiswal has successfully treated thousands of cancer patients, including over 60 germ cell tumor cases in the last five years, achieving a 90 percent success rate.

Dr. Jaiswal believes in the power of positive thinking, stating that a cancer patient's determination to fight and defeat cancer significantly aids in their treatment. He reiterated that cancer is no longer incurable and can be completely defeated with appropriate treatment.

#### 10 Juvenile delinquents escape from Raipur **Iuvenile Home**

RAIPUR: In a major security lapse, 10 juvenile delinquents have escaped from the Mana Juvenile Home in Raipur. These boys, who were held for various serious crimes, managed to flee by breaking old windows and jumping over the wall of the correctional facility early this morning. The incident has once again exposed significant flaws in the security measures of the juvenile home. The escape triggered immediate action from the authorities at Mana Juvenile Home, leading to a police search operation by the Mana police station team. Despite the police's efforts, the juvenile delinquents remain at large, raising concerns about the safety and security protocols at the correctional facility.

This is not an isolated incident; the Raipur Juvenile Home has seen similar security breaches in the past. Just five months ago, six juveniles escaped from the same facility, where they were held for crimes including murder and rape. These recurring incidents highlight ongoing negligence and inadequate security management at the Mana Juvenile Home.



### Railway tracks have story to tell, lifeline of IR

**BILASPUR:** Yes, you heard it right, railway tracks also breathe. Rail tracks, known as 'rail' in English but commonly referred to as 'rail patari' in Hindi. Generally, the entire railway system and even trains are addressed as 'rail'. The main function of rail tracks is to provide a path for the wheels of trains. The length of rail tracks can be up to 260

meters, and they are loaded onto long trains for transportation to the rail line. Although railway tracks appear rigid, they are quite flexible. Railway tracks also expand and contract with changes in temperature. The expansion and contraction of tracks due to temperature changes are measured by 'S.E.J.' or Switch Joint. S.E.J. is a device installed on every joint of long rails (Long Welded Rail/L.W.R.)

#### Mizoram taking steps for smooth implementation of new criminal laws

The three new criminal laws - Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam - will replace the Indian Penal Code of 1860, the Code of Criminal Procedure Act of 1898, and the Indian Evidence Act of 1872, respectively. #### Jaishankar to visit Qatar today; focus on boosting energy and trade ties



**NEW DELHI:** External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will travel to Qatar on Sunday to hold talks with Prime Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani with a focus on exploring ways to expand bilateral cooperation in areas of trade, investment and energy.

Jaishankar's visit comes four-andhalf months after Qatar released eight former Indian Navy personnel, who were sentenced to death after being arrested in August 2022.

During the visit, he will meet the Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of Qatar Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

It said the visit would "enable both sides to review various aspects of bilateral relations, including political, trade, investment, energy, security, cultural and people-to-people as well as the regional and international issues of mutual interest".

It is expected that Jaishankar and Al Thani would also deliberate on the overall situation in West Asia against the backdrop of Israel's continuing military offensives in Gaza. Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited Oatar from February 14 to 15 and held discussions with Qatar's Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani. "India and Qatai share historic and friendly relations which are marked by regular exchange of high-level visits," the MEA said in a statement. India and Qatar are looking at broadbasing trade basket with a view to link it to regional trade.

KOHIMA: The ruling NDPP swept the civic body polls in Nagaland on Saturday, winning all three municipal councils and most of the town councils, officials said. The polling for the 24 urban local bodies -- three municipal councils and 21 town councils -spread across 10 districts was held on Wednesday. Nearly 82 per cent of the over 2.23 lakh voters exercised their franchise in the elections. they said.

The counting began at 8 am in 16 centres. and has been slow since the elections were held on ballot papers, they added.

NDPP won all three municipal councils Mokokchung Kohima, and Dimapur. Of the 21 town councils, it secured a majority in all, except Wokha, Bhandari and Phek, officials said.

#### Woman poisons 9-month-old son

CHANDRAPUR: A 27-yearold woman poisoned her 9-month-old son, who survived, before hanging herself in Maharashtra's Chandrapur district, an official said on Saturday.

The police have registered a case against the woman's husband and in-laws after her mother accused them of harassing her daughter. Pallavi Vinod Dhoke fed some insecticide to her baby and hanged herself at her matrimonial home in Snegaon (BK) village, about 60 km from the district headquarters, on Friday evening when other family members were away.

After returning home, her family members called the police who rushed Pallavi and the baby to a hospital, where doctors declared her dead, the official said. The baby was then shifted to a private hospital in Chandrapur and he is said to be in a stable condition. However, Pallavi's mother accused her in-laws of torturing her daughter over money. On her complaint, police registered a case against Pallavi's husband and his parents, the official said.

# Heatwave havoc in India: Cooling down safely

As India faces a relentless heatwave, understanding effective cooling methods is crucial to protect vulnerable populations and reduce the risks of heat-related illnesses. By Manoj Kumar

the world grapples with intense heatvaves, India has not been spared from the scorching temperatures. The

persistent heatwave has claimed lives across the nation, and even as June draws to a close, the relentless heat continues in several regions. Understanding how to stay cool and prevent heat-related illnesses is crucial in these challenging times.

In India, the elderly, pre-existthose with ing health conditions, and young children are particularly vulnerable to heat stress. These groups have less efficient mechanisms to regulate body temperature. Elderly individuals, for instance, have diminished sweat gland function and less effective blood circulation, making it harder for them to dissipate heat.

Sweating is our body's primary method of cooling down. As sweat evaporates from the skin, it removes heat.

In extreme conditions, people can lose up to two liters of sweat per hour. However, when the air temperature exceeds body temperature, the body faces additional challenges

shedding heat.

Another way the body cools down is through vasodilation, where blood vessels near the skin widen, allowing more blood flow and heat release. In extreme heat, up to eight liters of blood per minute can be directed to the

Using cold water or a damp sponge on the skin is effective in lowering body temperature. This method is especially useful for those with limited mobility and older adults. Taking a cool shower or bath with

water around 26-27°C can significantly reduce body heat without causing shivering.

Applying to areas with numerous blood vessels, such as the groin, armpits, neck, and wrists, can help cool the blood returning to major organs. Ensure ice packs are wrapped in a cloth to prevent skin burns, and cycle them on and off every ten minutes to avoid injury.

Partially filling a hot water bottle and freezing it for use at bedtime, or chilling pillowcases, can provide relief during hot nights. While fans can help with sweat evaporation, their effectiveness diminishes when temperatures exceed 33°C. They are less effective for the elderly and those with impaired sweating abilities. Drinking chilled fluids is more effective in lowering core body temperature than neutral or warm liquids.

Hot beverages can activate cooling mechanisms but may lead to dehydration if adequate fluids are not consumed.

Staying in shaded areas

enhances the effectiveness of cooling techniques by increasing the temperature gradient between the body and the environment. Using these methods in the sun is less effective as the ambient temperature is higher. In India, traditional practices like using wet cloths, bathing frequently, and staying in shaded, ventilated areas are complemented by modern techniques such as air conditioning and electric fans. Water immersion,

such as dipping feet or hands in cool water, remains one of the most effective methods to lower body temperature. This technique is common among animals in hot climates and works well for humans too.

With the heatwave persisting, it is essential to stay vigilant and adopt effective cooling strategies to protect oneself and loved ones. Whether through traditional methods or modern innovations, staying cool and hydrated can help mitigate the risks associated with extreme heat. In these trying times, awareness and proactive measures can make a significant difference in ensuring safety and well-being during the relentless heatwave.

# Interest rates on small savings schemes remain unchanged for 2nd quarter

**NEW DELHI:** The government left the interest rates on various small savings schemes unchanged for the quarter beginning July 1, 2024. "The rates of interest on various small savings schemes for the second quarter of FY 2024-25, starting from July 1, 2024, and ending on September 30, 2024, shall remain unchanged from those notified for the first quarter (March 1, 2024, to June 30, 2024) of FY 2024-25," said a finance ministry notification. As per the notification, deposits under the Sukanya Samriddhi scheme will attract an interest rate of 8.2 per cent, while the rate on a three-year term deposit remains at 7.1 per cent. The interest rates for popular PPF and post office savings deposits scheme too have been retained at 7.1 per cent and 4 per cent, respectively. The interest rate on the Kisan Vikas Patra will be 7.5 per cent, and the investments will mature in 115 months. PTI

#### Vodafone Idea to raise mobile tariff by 11-24 pc from July 4

NEW DELHI: Loss-making telecom operator Vodafone Idea will raise mobile tariffs across the board by 11-24 per cent from July 4, according to a company statement. Vodafone Idea (Vi) follows the tariff hike stage set by Reliance Jio on Thursday. Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel will roll out increased mobile service rates from July 3 onward. "In line with its commitment to provide its consumers with simple and comprehensive plans, Vi has curated an optimum range of feature-rich plans to meet the diverse needs of its consumers. Staying true to its philosophy of supporting entry-level users and progressively linking higher prices to increased usage, changes in entry-level plans are nominal," Vi said. The company has raised the entry-level plan, minimum recharge value for 28 days of mobile service, by about 11 per cent to Rs 199 from Rs 179. PTI

#### Forex reserves this week

# India's forex kitty jumps by USD 816 Million to USD 653.71 Billion



MUMBAI: India's forex reserves jumped by USD 816 million to USD 653.711 billion for the week ended June 21, the RBI said. In the previous reporting week, the overall reserves had dropped by USD 2.922 billion to USD 652.895 billion. The all-time high for the reserves is at USD 655.817 billion achieved on June 7. For the week ended June 21, foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, decreased by USD 106 million to USD 574.134 billion, the data released on Friday showed. Expressed in dollar terms,

the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves. Gold reserves increased by USD 988 million to USD 56.956 billion during the week, the RBI said. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by USD 57 million to USD 18.049 billion, the apex bank said. India's reserve position with the IMF was down by USD 9 million to USD 4.572 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.

tory Authority of India (Trai), on 14th March 2024, issued the Telecommunication Mobile Number Portability (Ninth Amendment) Regulations, 2024, which will come into force on July 1, 2024," the regulator said. Earlier, there was a waiting period of 10 days in case a sim is swapped but the regulator has now reduced it to 7 days in the



after getting a Railways job," she said.

"My mother is sportsminded, she used to compete at the local level when she was young. She encouraged me to do sports when I was in class 2 or 3. She used to take me to the playing ground, I chose athletics only because of her. Even now she would come to watch me on and off during championships.

Asked about her next competition, she said, "I will compete in the Inter Railways Meet in August and then the National Open. I won a gold here (Inter-State) and if I do well in the upcoming events, I am hoping to get promotion to chief OS (office superintendent).

#### Ukrainian drone strike kills five in Russia's Kursk region

KYIV: A Ukrainian drone strike killed at least five people in Russia's Kursk region, local officials said Saturday, while rescuers in the Ukrainian city of Dnipro dug through rubble after a Russian attack ripped through a ninestory residential building, leaving one

Two children were among the victims of the Ukranian attack in the village of Gorodishche on the Russian-Ukrainian border, Gov. Alexey Smirnov said on social media.

In Dnipro, at least one person died and 12 were injured, including a 7-month-old girl, after a Russian strike destroyed the top four floors of the apartment bloc Friday evening, regional head Serhii Lysak said.

The attacks came as Russia continues to stretch out Ukrainian forces in several areas along the 1,000-kilo-



meter (600-mile) front. Moscow has stepped up airstrikes in a bid to drain Ukraine's resources, often targeting energy facilities and other vital infrastructure.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said the country had lost about 80% of its thermal power and one-third of its hydroelectric power in Russian strikes.
