'Judges are servants of the Constitution'

CJI for writing of judgments in a simple form, keeping in mind common

KOLKATA: Maintaining that "constitutional morality" is a restraining factor on the state, Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud on Saturday said it allows for conditions that respect diversity, promote inclusion and pursue tolerance.

He said that India does not exist only in large cities, but it goes down to the smallest village and the smallest taluka across the nation, connected or not, accessible or otherwise.

CJI Chandrachud said "constitutional morality", unlike morality, which he said is a restraint on the rights of citizens, is a restraining factor on the state.

Constitutional morality addresses itself to every component of society and allows for conditions which "respect diversity, promote inclusion and pursue tolerance", he said, delivering the keynote address at the two-day East Zone II regional conference of the National Judicial Academy. The CJI said it also imposes a duty

on the state to facilitate the achievement of the kind of society that the Constitution envisages.

"The Constitution uses the expression morality, but it does not use the expression constitutional morality," he said.

CJI Chandrachud said the Constitution allows for restrictions to be imposed

by law on the right to freedom and expression on various grounds, including morality.

He said the Constitution also contemplates that restrictions can be imposed on the right to freedom of association on grounds of morality.

At one level, constitutional morality is founded

in the values which the Constitution's Preamble sets out, he said.

"Constitutional morality is an overarching principle which is derived from, but is not confined to, specific rights or values which are enshrined in the Constitution," CJI Chandrachud said.

According to him, it gives a unifying constitutional ethic so that every Indian citizen can think and speak as he wishes to, worship as they intend to, follow whoever they want to, eat what they want to and marry whoever he or she wants to or not marry at all.

Canopy collapses at Rajkot airport

RAJKOT: A portion of a fabric canopy erected at the pick-up and drop area of the Rajkot International Airport collapsed on Saturday after heavy rains, officials said. Nobody was injured in the incident, they said. The accident, which comes days after similar incidents in Delhi and Jabalpur, gave the opposition Congress an opportunity to target the ruling BJP.

In a post on X, the Rajkot airport authorities said that water accumulation was observed on the city side of the canopy at the terminal building at 11.40 am due to heavy rains. "As we came to know about it we gave the information to the civil works department and the area beneath was cordoned off," said Rajkot International Airport in the post. The international airport is located at Hirasar, about 30 km from Rajkot city.

Five soldiers swept away in flash floods

NEW DELHI: Five soldiers, including a junior commissioned officer (JCO), were killed during an exercise early Saturday as their Russian-origin T-72 tank was swept away following flash floods in the Shyok river near the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh, officials said. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said he was deeply saddened by the unfortunate accident that occurred in the river near Saser Brangsa. Two T-72

tanks were trying to cross Shyok around 1 am and one of them got stuck in high currents in the river, the officials said, adding the melting of snow resulted in the increase in the water levels. The Army deployed rescue teams but the mission didn't succeed in view of the raging waters in the river. The deceased personnel are MRK Reddy, Subhan Khan, Bhupendra Negi, E Teibam and Sadar-bonia Nagaraju.

Nitish Kumar renews Bihar special status demand

NEW DELHI: The Janata Dal (United) on Saturday appointed Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Kumar Jha as its working president and urged the Centre to consider either special category status or special package for Bihar, underlining the party's important role in the formation of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government. The party's national executive meeting chaired by its president and Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar flagged price rise and unemployment as "burning issues", as its political resolution expressed confidence that the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government would take more effective steps to handle them.

Children get stroke; although curable

BENGALURU: The lack of awareness when it comes to paediatric stroke is so low and people are often stunned to hear that children can get stroke. Actors like Amitabh Bachchan need to talk about it to create awareness, said Dr Nirmal Surya, president of Indian Stroke Association (ISA) on Saturday.

Speaking at a press conference after the inauguration of the second national paediatric stroke conclave, he said, "Stroke is preventable, but globally paediatric stroke is the sixth leading cause of death in children."

The two-day conclave, organised by ISA, was inaugurated by Dr Devi Prasad Shetty, chairman and founder of Narayana Health.

According to Dr Surya, lack of awareness is the biggest challenge that paediatric neurologists world over have to overcome.

"In India, the situation is even worse. When people are not made aware of the possibility of stroke in children, time is lost on misdiagnosis. Time is of essence because stroke can often be treated with injection if the patient is brought within four and half hours," he added.

75% have not received 4th installment

RAIPUR: In a recent statement, State Congress President Deepak Baij claimed that 75 percent of women beneficiaries have not yet received the fourth installment of the Mahtari Vandan Yojana. This comes despite the fifth installment being scheduled for distribution in July.

Baij pointed out that many women are still awaiting the payment for June, raising suspicions about the government's intentions. Baij accused the government of conspiring to remove a large number of women from the beneficiary list by declaring them ineligible.

He questioned the criteria used to determine eligibility, asking why women who had received the first three installments are now being considered ineligible for the fourth. "If they were ineligible, then why was the money for three months given?"

Dr. Ravi: A beacon of hope for a 15-year-old cancer survivor

The girl becomes an inspiration for other cancer patients.

KORBA: Central India's esteemed cancer and blood disease specialist, Dr. Ravi Jaiswal, has once again demonstrated his exceptional medical prowess by successfully treating a 15-year-old girl suffering from fourth-stage ovarian cancer. The young girl, who had lost all hope, is now completely healthy and has recently passed her high school board examinations with an impressive 80% marks, becoming an inspiration for other cancer patients.

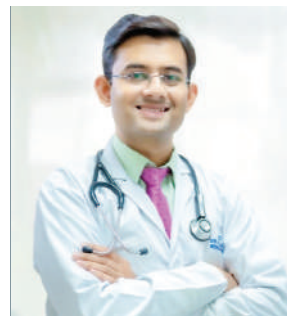
The girl, a resident of Basna, initially complained of severe stomach pain, swelling, loss of appetite, and significant weight loss.

Despite seeking treatment from various doctors over 4-5 months, her condition did not improve, forcing her to stop attending school. She experienced breathing difficulties and lost 7 kg in just two months, leading her family to admit her to Ramakrishna Care Hospital in Raipur in November 2023. A CT scan revealed an 18 cm tumor with lymph node metastasis from her ovary,

from her stomach and severe breathing difficulties, the girl's condition began to improve significantly after the first cycle of chemotherapy. She regained her appetite and strength, and after three cycles, her tumor was completely cured with no symptoms. Blood tumor marker tests and post-chemo CT scans showed excellent results, leading to a successful operation by a team of senior doctors, including Dr. Sandeep Dave, Dr. Siddharth Tamrakar, Dr.

Heavy Rain forecast in Chhattisgarh

RAIPUR: The Meteorological Department has issued Orange and Yellow alerts for Chhattisgarh, forecasting heavy rain in the next 24 hours. The alert predicts significant rainfall in Surguja and adjoining divisions until June 30. Districts in the Raipur, Durg, Bilaspur, and Bastar divisions have been experiencing cloudy skies and light to moderate rain since morning. On Saturday, Bijapur recorded the highest rainfall in the state with 230 mm. Other notable recordings include 90 mm in Nagari, 80 mm in Bhatpara, 70 mm in Baloda Bazar, Jagdarpur, and Patan, and 60 mm in Dornapal, Tongpal, Bastar, and Chhindigarh. Ambikapur, Chhotodongar, Gangalore, Suhela, Jagargunda, Akaltara, Bhairamgarh, Manpur, and Bhopalpatnam saw rainfall ranging from 40 to 50 mm. So far, Chhattisgarh has received 110.2 mm of rain. While 10 districts have recorded normal rainfall, 19 districts have experienced below-average rainfall. The state should have received 172.5 mm of rain by now, indicating a 36 percent deficit. In the next 24 hours, heavy rain and moderate cloud cover are expected in Bilaspur, Gaurela Pendra Marwahi, Korba, Korea, Mandragarh Chirmiri Bharatpur, and Surajpur.

Young man, woman arrested with Ganja at the new bus terminal

RAIPUR: In a significant drug bust, police have apprehended a young man and a woman with ganja at the new bus terminal in the Tikrapara police station area of the capital. Tikrapara police station in-charge reported that they acted on a tip-off from informers who indicated the suspects would arrive in Raipur by bus via Odisha this afternoon. Upon receiving this information, the police team swiftly surrounded the location and arrested the suspects. However, one of the women managed to escape, evading capture. Unconfirmed sources suggest that there might be attempts to hush up the matter within the police station. In a related incident three days ago, police arrested an individual in Raipur for cultivating ganja plants at his residence. The accused, identified as Sunil Pandey, was apprehended after the Anti Crime Unit received information about cannabis cultivation in Deori village near Dharsiwa.

NIA RAID

Two arrested in connection with BJP leader's murder in Kanker



RAIPUR: The National Investigation Agency (NIA), probing the murder case of BJP leader Ratan Dubey, conducted extensive raids across half a dozen villages in the Naxal-affected Kanker district. The raids, which took place late Friday night, resulted in the arrest of two individuals and the seizure of several items, including mobile phones, a printer, and cash amounting to Rs 39,100, along with objectionable documents.

The NIA carried out these operations in the remote villages of Mujalgondi, Kalmuche, Amabeda, and Jivalamari in Kanker district.

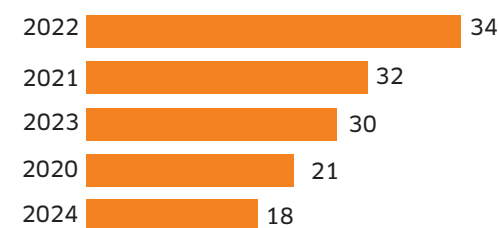
The major industrial organizations of Chhattisgarh were invited to provide their insights and suggestions during the meeting.

10 Juvenile delinquents escape from Raipur Juvenile Home

RAIPUR: In a major security lapse, 10 juvenile delinquents have escaped from the Mana Juvenile Home in Raipur. These boys, who were held for various serious crimes, managed to flee by breaking old windows and jumping over the wall of the correctional facility early this morning. The incident has once again exposed significant flaws in the security measures of the juvenile home. The escape triggered immediate action from the authorities at Mana Juvenile Home, leading to a police search operation by the Mana police station team. Despite the police's efforts, the juvenile delinquents remain at large, raising concerns about the safety and security protocols at the correctional facility.

This is not an isolated incident; the Raipur Juvenile Home has seen similar security breaches in the past. Just five months ago, six juveniles escaped from the same facility, where they were held for crimes including murder and rape. These recurring incidents highlight ongoing negligence and inadequate security management at the Mana Juvenile Home.

for competitive exam preparation. Under this scheme, registered workers and their children will receive free coaching for 4 to 10 months.

competitive exams, based on their educational qualifications. Eligible beneficiaries can apply online through their preferred choice center or labour office. The scheme also extends eligibility to children of beneficiaries who passed away before June 9, 2020, as per the old notification. Additionally, beneficiaries under the Mukhyamantri Nirman Shramik Mrityu and Divyang Sahayata Yojana can apply to avail themselves of this scheme's benefits.

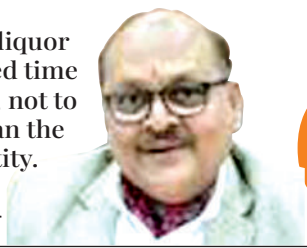

Railway tracks have story to tell, lifeline of IR

BILASPUR: Yes, you heard it right, railway tracks also breathe. Rail tracks, known as 'rail' in English but commonly referred to as 'rail patari' in Hindi. Generally, the entire railway system and even trains are addressed as 'rail'. The main function of rail tracks is to provide a path for the wheels of trains. The length of rail tracks can be up to 260

meters, and they are loaded onto long trains for transportation to the rail line. Although railway tracks appear rigid, they are quite flexible. Railway tracks also expand and contract with changes in temperature. The expansion and contraction of tracks due to temperature changes are measured by 'S.E.J.' or Switch Joint. S.E.J. is a device installed on every joint of long rails (Long Welded Rail/L.W.R.)



that allows for the expansion and contraction of rails due to temperature changes. Rail tracks perform the task of carrying heavy passenger coaches and long freight trains. Due to being made of steel

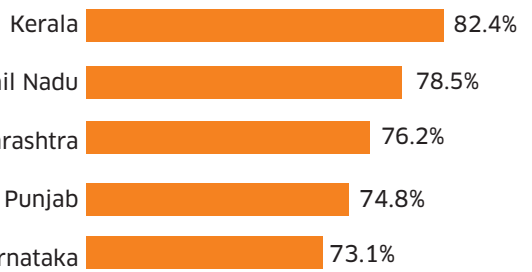
and exposed to the open environment, the average temperature of rail tracks is higher during hot days and lower during cold

days. During hot days, due to the increase in temperature and the load, stress is generated in rail tracks, causing them to lengthen. Conversely, during cold days, due to the decrease in temperature, the length of the tracks decreases. Therefore, to prevent tension or rail fracture, rail tracks are treated. This treatment involves relieving stress by loosening the pins between the tracks and the rails.

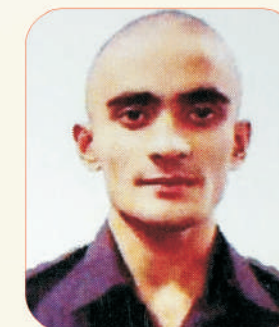

Mizoram taking steps for smooth implementation of new criminal laws

AIZAWL: The Mizoram government has launched a series of initiatives to ensure the smooth implementation of three new criminal laws that will come into force on July 1, a senior police officer said on Saturday. Talking to PTI, Mizoram Inspector General of Police (Law and Order) Lalbiakthanga Khiangte, however, said the three new laws are not being translated into Mizo language. The three new criminal laws – Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam – will replace the Indian Penal Code of 1860, the Code of Criminal Procedure Act of 1898, and the Indian Evidence Act of 1872, respectively. Highlighting the government's efforts to implement the new laws, Khiangte said training for 1,492 police personnel, which constitute 93 per cent of police station staff.

Jaishankar to visit Qatar today; focus on boosting energy and trade ties



NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will travel to Qatar on Sunday to hold talks with Prime Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani with a focus on exploring ways to expand bilateral cooperation in areas of trade, investment and energy. Jaishankar's visit comes four-and-half months after Qatar released eight former Indian Navy personnel, who were sentenced to death after being arrested in August 2022.

"During the visit, he will meet the Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of Qatar Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

It said the visit would "enable both sides to review various aspects of

bilateral relations, including political, trade, investment, energy, security, cultural and people-to-people as well as the regional and international issues of mutual interest".

It is expected that Jaishankar and Al Thani would also deliberate on the overall situation in West Asia against the backdrop of Israel's continuing military offensives in Gaza. Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited Qatar from February 14 to 15 and held discussions with Qatar's Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani. "India and Qatar share historic and friendly relations which are marked by regular exchange of high-level visits," the MEA said in a statement. India and Qatar are looking at broadbasing trade basket with a view to link it to regional trade.

Allowing the plea, Special Judge Sunena Sharma said that Kejriwal be produced in the court on July 12.

A detailed order from the court is awaited. Kejriwal was arrested by the CBI in connection with irregularities in his government's excise policy.

ED attaches land, bank deposits of CPI(M)

Assets worth Rs 28.65 crore have also been attached by the ED after a provisional order under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) was issued.

KOCHI: The Enforcement Directorate alleged Saturday that the CPI(M) in Kerala was holding proceeds of money laundering, as it attached a land parcel and bank deposits worth Rs 73 lakh of the political party in a probe linked to the Karuvannur Service Cooperative Bank "scam". Assets worth Rs 28.65 crore of various individuals and entities linked to the case have also been attached by the federal agency after a provisional order under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) was issued.

Official sources said

the party may be named as an accused in the next supplementary charge-sheet to be filed in this case. If so, it will be the second political party to be arraigned as accused in a money laundering investigation after the Aam Aadmi Party. AAP has recently been named by the ED in the Delhi excise policy case.

The CPI(M) vehemently denied the charges of wrongdoing and money laundering.

The attached assets include 18 immovable properties, valued at Rs 28.65 crore, consisting of lands and buildings in Kerala of the beneficiaries of the "scam",

including an immovable property worth Rs 10 lakh registered in the name of a district secretary of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) for a party office, the ED said in a statement.

The attachment also includes eight movable properties, including a credit balance of Rs 63.62

lakh in eight "undisclosed" bank accounts of the CPI(M) local area committees in Thrissur, it added. The agency claimed that the CPI(M) received these funds from the beneficiaries as donations through the governing body and the party is "in possession of proceeds of crime" which has been invested in the purchase of immovable properties and credited to its five bank accounts in the Karuvannur Service Cooperative Bank Ltd. The bank is promoted by the party.

The CPI(M) rejected the ED charges, saying it would legally and politically fight any move by

the agency to arraign it in the case linked to the alleged multi-crore Karuvannur bank scam.

Party state secretary M V Govindan alleged that the ED was trying to make opposition parties and their leaders accused in various cases due to political reasons.

He also accused the central agency of attempting to create a smokescreen as it had failed to collect any evidence against the party.

The ED believes that the land parcel attached by it was meant for the CPI(M) party office and was purchased using alleged kickbacks from the loanees.

Heatwave havoc in India: Cooling down safely

As India faces a relentless heatwave, understanding effective cooling methods is crucial to protect vulnerable populations and reduce the risks of heat-related illnesses. By Manoj Kumar

As the world grapples with intense heatwaves, India has not been spared from the scorching temperatures. The persistent heatwave has claimed lives across the nation, and even as June draws to a close, the relentless heat continues in several regions. Understanding how to stay cool and prevent heat-related illnesses is crucial in these challenging times.

In India, the elderly, those with pre-existing health conditions, and young children are particularly vulnerable to heat stress. These groups have less efficient mechanisms to regulate body temperature. Elderly individuals, for instance, have diminished sweat gland function and less effective blood circulation, making it harder for them to dissipate heat.

Sweating is our body's primary method of cooling down. As sweat evaporates from the skin, it removes heat.

In extreme conditions, people can lose up to two liters of sweat per hour. However, when the air temperature exceeds body temperature, the body faces additional challenges in

shedding heat.

Another way the body cools down is through vasodilation, where blood vessels near the skin widen, allowing more blood flow and heat release. In extreme heat, up to eight liters of blood per minute can be directed to the skin.

Using cold water or a damp sponge on the skin is effective in lowering body temperature. This method is especially useful for those with limited mobility and older adults. Taking a cool shower or bath with

water around 26-27°C can significantly reduce body heat without causing shivering.

Applying ice packs to areas with numerous blood vessels, such as the groin, armpits, neck, and wrists, can help cool the blood returning to major organs. Ensure ice packs are wrapped in a cloth to prevent skin burns, and cycle them on and off every ten minutes to avoid injury.

Partially filling a hot water bottle and freezing it for use at bedtime, or chilling pillow-

cases, can provide relief during hot nights. While fans can help with sweat evaporation, their effectiveness diminishes when temperatures exceed 33°C. They are less effective for the elderly and those with impaired sweating abilities. Drinking chilled fluids is more effective in lowering core body temperature than neutral or warm liquids.

Hot beverages can activate cooling mechanisms but may lead to dehydration if adequate fluids are not consumed.

Staying in shaded areas

enhances the effectiveness of cooling techniques by increasing the temperature gradient between the body and the environment. Using these methods in the sun is less effective as the ambient temperature is higher. In India, traditional practices like using wet cloths, bathing frequently, and staying in shaded, ventilated areas are complemented by modern techniques such as air conditioning and electric fans. Water immersion, such as dipping feet or hands in cool water, remains one of the most effective methods to lower body temperature. This technique is common among animals in hot climates and works well for humans too.

With the heatwave persisting, it is essential to stay vigilant and adopt effective cooling strategies to protect oneself and loved ones. Whether through traditional methods or modern innovations, staying cool and hydrated can help mitigate the risks associated with extreme heat. In these trying times, awareness and proactive measures can make a significant difference in ensuring safety and well-being during the relentless heatwave.

MUMBAI: India's goods and services exports are expected to cross USD 800 billion this fiscal despite global challenges, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Saturday. In 2023-24, the shipments stood at USD 778.2 billion (goods USD 437.1 billion and services USD 341 billion). He said that the global situation is serious as war is still ongoing

ing between Ukraine-Russia and Israel-Hamas, and the Red sea crisis. The minister added that there are also elections in some of the major democracies like in Europe. "In such a situation it's a positive sign that our exports are growing (9 per cent growth in May) and this also reflects that the world wants to do trade and investments with India. We are confident that this year we will have over USD 800 bil-

In the year-ago period, the current account deficit stood at USD 1.3 billion or 0.2 per cent of GDP, and the same was USD 8.7 billion or 1 per cent of GDP in the preceding quarter ending December 2023.

Govt's gross liabilities rise by 3.4 pc

NEW DELHI: Total gross liabilities of the government increased to Rs 171.78 lakh crore at the end of March 2024 from Rs 166.14 lakh crore at December-end, the finance ministry has said. This represented a quarter-on-quarter increase of 3.4 per cent in the fourth quarter of 2023-24, said the public debt management quarterly report (January-March, 2024). Public debt accounted for 90.2 per cent of total gross liabilities during the quarter, it said. "During the quarter, the yield on Indian domestic bond softened on account of lower than anticipated borrowing plan announced in interim budget, adjustment of the fiscal deficit to 5.1 per cent of the GDP for FY25, a targeted reduction of the fiscal deficit at or below 4.5 per cent by FY26, FPI inflows and steady inflation," it said.

MNP after Sim replacement to face 7-day waiting period

NEW DELHI: There will be a seven-day waiting period after the SIM swap or replacement for a mobile number to become eligible for porting, telecom regulator Trai said. The step has been taken to curb fraud taking place by using mobile phone numbers. "The Telecom Regula-

tory Authority of India (Trai), on 14th March 2024, issued the Telecommunication Mobile Number Portability (Ninth Amendment) Regulations, 2024, which will come into force on July 1, 2024," the regulator said. Earlier, there was a waiting period of 10 days in case a sim is swapped but the regulator has now reduced it to 7 days in the



latest amendment. Trai said that the

amended regulations are aimed at curbing the porting of mobile numbers by way of fraudulent SIM swaps or replacement by unscrupulous elements.

"Through these amendment regulations, an additional criterion for the rejection of the request for allocation of a Unique Porting Code (UPC) has been intro-

duced. Specifically, a UPC shall not be allocated if the request for the UPC has been made before the expiry of seven days from the date of the SIM swap! replacement," the regulator said. Trai in an explanatory note said that few stakeholders were of the opinion that a wait period of 10 days after SIM swap or replacement is appropriate.

Interest rates on small savings schemes remain unchanged for 2nd quarter

NEW DELHI: The government left the interest rates on various small savings schemes unchanged for the quarter beginning July 1, 2024. "The rates of interest on various small savings schemes for the second quarter of FY 2024-25, starting from July 1, 2024, and ending on September 30, 2024, shall remain unchanged from those notified for the first quarter (March 1, 2024, to June 30, 2024) of FY 2024-25," said a finance ministry notification. As per the notification, deposits under the Sukanya Samridhi scheme will attract an interest rate of 8.2 per cent, while the rate on a three-year term deposit remains at 7.1 per cent. The interest rates for popular PPF and post office savings deposits scheme too have been retained at 7.1 per cent and 4 per cent, respectively. The interest rate on the Kisan Vikas Patra will be 7.5 per cent, and the investments will mature in 115 months. **PTI**

TARIFF HIKE

Vodafone Idea to raise mobile tariff by 11-24 pc from July 4

NEW DELHI: Loss-making telecom operator Vodafone Idea will raise mobile tariffs across the board by 11-24 per cent from July 4, according to a company statement. Vodafone Idea (Vi) follows the tariff hike stage set by Reliance Jio on Thursday. Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel will roll out increased mobile service rates from July 3 onward. "In line with its commitment to provide its consumers with simple and comprehensive plans, Vi has curated an optimum range of feature-rich plans to meet the diverse needs of its consumers. Staying true to its philosophy of supporting entry-level users and progressively linking higher prices to increased usage, changes in entry-level plans are nominal," Vi said. The company has raised the entry-level plan, minimum recharge value for 28 days of mobile service, by about 11 per cent to Rs 199 from Rs 179. **PTI**

Forex reserves this week

India's forex kitty jumps by USD 816 Million to USD 653.71 Billion

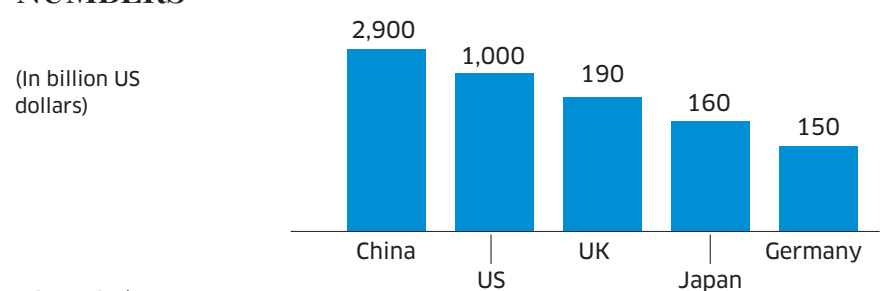


MUMBAI: India's forex reserves jumped by USD 816 million to USD 653.71 billion for the week ended June 21, the RBI said. In the previous reporting week, the overall reserves had dropped by USD 2.922 billion to USD 652.895 billion. The all-time high for the reserves is at USD 655.817 billion achieved on June 7. For the week ended June 21, foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, decreased by USD 106 million to USD 574.134 billion, the data released on Friday showed. Expressed in dollar terms,

the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves. Gold reserves increased by USD 988 million to USD 56.956 billion during the week, the RBI said. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by USD 57 million to USD 18.049 billion, the apex bank said. India's reserve position with the IMF was down by USD 9 million to USD 4.572 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed. **PTI**

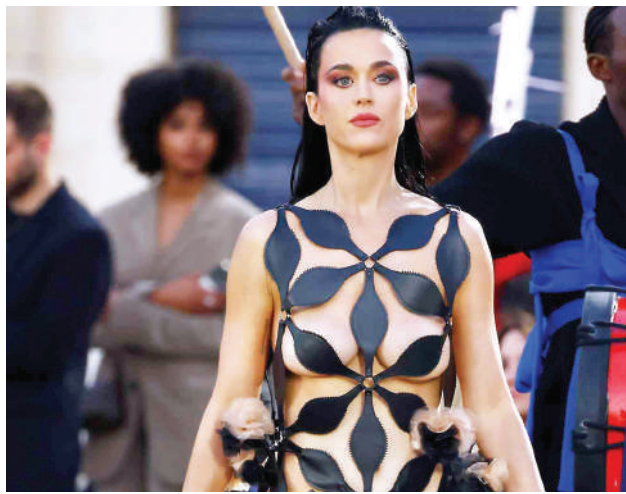

The 19-year-old Khan was behind one competitor at the bell for the last lap, but he sprinted his

way from the final bend and punched the air in celebration after crossing the finish line. Khan, who is currently studying at the University of Florida on scholarships, last competed in a domestic event at the 2023 National Inter-State Championships in Bhubaneswar in June.

Punjab's Gurinder Singh became the fastest man of the championships as he won the 100m dash with a time of 10.32 seconds. Odisha's Animesh Kujur (10.46s) and Assam's Amal Borgohain (10.49s) took the silver and bronze respectively in a

field which had almost all the top short-sprint runners of the country. The 23-year-old Gurindervir struggled the whole of last year as he could not come up with a podium finish in 2023. SS Sneha of Karnataka emerged as the fastest woman of the championships as she clocked 11.62 seconds to win the women's 100m final. However, national record holder in women's 1500m, KM Deeksha was pushed to the third spot with Lili Das of West Bengal winning the race in 4 minute 13.87 seconds while Delhi's Chanda was second

in 4:14.85. Deeksha, who set the national record of 4:02.50 last month in the USA, clocked a disappointing 4:18.38.

The men's 400m final saw a photo finish between Muhammed Anas and Muhammed Ajmal. But Anas, who holds the national record of 45.21 second, won in 45.926 seconds, while Ajmal clocked 45.929s. Abha Khatua of Maharashtra won gold in the women's shot put event with a mediocre throw of 17.63m to add to the Federation Cup title she had clinched last month.

Croatia hit with hefty fine by UEFA for fan misconduct

FRANKFURT: Croatia was fined 105,000 euros (\$112,500) by UEFA for fan misconduct at a European Championship elimination game against Italy, the federation said on Friday. The financial penalty is the biggest by UEFA announced at the tournament, and the second for Croatia. A separate investigation by UEFA is ongoing into alleged racism involving both sets of fans at Croatia's second Euro 2024 game, against Albania.

The separate fines for incidents at the Croatia-Italy game on Monday were 45,000 euros for throwing objects, including beer cups, 30,000 euros for lighting flares and fireworks, and 30,000 euros for "inappropriate behavior" that was not specified.

T20 World Cup poised to become top ICC event

Colombia dominates Costa Rica 3-0 to book quarterfinal berth

GLENDALE: Davinson Sánchez and Jhon Córdoba scored three minutes apart in the second half, and Colombia advanced to the Copa America quarterfinals with a 3-0 win over Costa Rica. US looks to lock in defense partnerships with Asian allies

SOUTH KOREA: The United States wrapped up its first multidomain exercise with Japan and South Korea in the East China Sea on Saturday, a step forward in Washington's efforts to strengthen and lock in its security partnerships with key Asian allies in the face of growing threats from North Korea and China. The three-day Freedom Edge increased the sophistication of previous exercises

with simultaneous air and naval drills geared toward improving joint ballistic-missile defense, anti-submarine warfare, surveillance and other skills and capabilities. The exercise, which is expected to expand in years to come, was also intended to improve the countries' abilities to share missile warnings – increasingly important as North Korea tests ever-more sophisticated systems. Outside of Australia, Japan and South Korea are the only U.S. partners in the

region with militaries sophisticated enough

to integrate operations with the U.S. so that if, for example, South Korea were to detect a target, it could quickly relay details so Japanese or American counterparts could respond, said Ridwan Rahmat, a Singapore-based analyst with the defense intelligence company Janes. "That's the kind of interoperability that is involved in a typical war scenario," Rahmat said. "For trilateral exercises like this the intention is to develop the interoperability between the three

armed forces so that they can fight better as a cohesive fighting force." Such exercises also carry the risk of increasing tensions, with China regularly denouncing drills in what it considers its sphere of influence, and North Korea already slamming the arrival of the USS Theodore Roosevelt carrier group in the port of Busan – home to South Korea's navy headquarters and its Gimhae Air Base – in preparation for Freedom Edge as "provocative" and "dangerous."

He said the officer than "used a weapon in self-defense to shoot the attacker, who died as a result of his injuries." The policeman was conscious when he was transported to Belgrade's main emergency hospital, where an operation to remove the bolt from his neck will be performed, it added.

Five missiles land near ship in Red Sea

Pakistan seeks small arms from US for 'Operation Azm-i-Istehkam'

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's ambassador to the US has urged the US to provide small arms and modern equipment to his country to ensure the success of Operation Azm-i-Istehkam, Islamabad's newly approved counter-terrorism initiative. The decision to launch the 'Azm-e-Istehkam' operation was taken on June 22 at the apex committee meeting of the National Action Plan, a strategy approved in 2014 to eliminate militancy from the country. The federal government

recently approved the reinigorated national counter-terrorism drive. "Pakistan has launched Azm-i-Istehkam (...) to oppose and dismantle terrorist networks. For that, we need sophisticated small arms and communication equipment," Ambassador Masood Khan was quoted as saying by the Dawn newspaper. He made these remarks while addressing US policymakers, scholars, intelligentsia, and corporate leaders at a Washington think tank,

the Wilson Centre, earlier this week.

Eight homeless moms in San Francisco struggle for help

SAN FRANCISCO: They know chronic back pain from couch surfing while pregnant. They tuck their children in at bedtime in the backs of cars and under bridges. Once their kids are asleep, and only then, do they let themselves cry. Since January, a group of eight San Francisco mothers have met regularly as part of a local nonprofit's pilot program to share their stories and learn to advocate for the needs of families like theirs experiencing homelessness. "I feel like I failed my kids," says Teniah Tercero, breaking into tears as she talked about how she hates exposing her three young daughters to the open drug use of the city's gritty Tenderloin neighborhood where they sleep at a shelter.

RUSSIA DRONE STRIKE

Ukrainian drone strike kills five in Russia's Kursk region

KYIV: A Ukrainian drone strike killed at least five people in Russia's Kursk region, local officials said Saturday, while rescuers in the Ukrainian city of Dnipro dug through rubble after a Russian attack ripped through a nine-story residential building, leaving one dead.

Two children were among the victims of the Ukrainian attack in the village of Gorodishche on the Russian-Ukrainian border, Gov. Alexey Smirnov said on social media. In Dnipro, at least one person died and 12 were injured, including a 7-month-old girl, after a Russian strike destroyed the top four floors of the apartment bloc Friday evening, regional head Serhii Lysak said. The attacks came as Russia continues to stretch out Ukrainian forces in several areas along the 1,000-kilo-



meter (600-mile) front. Moscow has stepped up airstrikes in a bid to drain Ukraine's resources, often targeting energy facilities and other vital infrastructure. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said the country had lost about 80% of its thermal power and one-third of its hydroelectric power in Russian strikes.

NEPAL LANDSLIDE |

At least 9 dead when landslides hit Nepal villages

KATHMANDU: Landslides triggered by heavy rainfall on Saturday killed at least nine people including an entire family while they were sleeping in Nepal's mountainous districts, officials said.

The landslides buried houses in three separate areas in the country's mountainous region, about 250 kilometers (156 miles) west of the capital, Kathmandu, according to Nepal's National Disaster Rescue and Reduction Management Authority. Five members of the same family were killed



when their house was swallowed by a landslide while they were asleep at Malika village in Gulmi district. The victims included a couple, their daughter-in-law and two grandchildren including an 8-month-old girl.
