More than 122 killed in stampede at a 'satsang'

HATHRAS: At least 122 people, including women and three children, were killed after a stampede broke out at a religious event in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras on Tuesday, officials have said.

The stampede occurred during a 'satsang' (prayer meeting) which was attended by hundreds. Visuals from the Community Health Centre showed several bodies being brought there in buses and tempos in the presence of crying relatives.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has taken note of the incident and, on his directions, a committee has been set up to inves-

Doctors at the community health centre have told me 50-60 people have died. This was a private event and permission had been given by the subdivisional magistrate.

Five Naxals killed in encounter

NARAYANPUR: Five Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district on Tuesday, police said.The gunfight took place in a forest under Kohkameta police station area in Abujhmad, a hilly forest area when a joint team of personnel from different security forces was out on an anti-Naxal operation, a senior police official said. "Five Naxalites have been killed in the action so far. The search operation is still underway in the area and further details are awaited," he said, adding that security personnel were reported to be safe. The operation, involving personnel of the District Reserve Guard, Special Task Force, Border Security Force and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police from different districts, was launched on Sunday, police said.



Woman detected with Zika virus infection in Pune: number of cases rises to 7

PUNE: A 55-year-old woman has been detected with Zika virus injection in Pune, taking the number of cases to seven, health officials said on Tuesday.

The city had on Monday reported six cases of the infection, and two of the patients were pregnant women.

In the latest case, a woman from Dahanukar colony in Kothrud developed rashes and suffered from joint pains. Her reports came positive for Zika virus on Monday, an official from the Pune Municipal Corporation said.

The woman's health is good, and there was no need for hospitalisation, he said. Two pregnant women aged 28 and 35 are among seven cases in the city. Zika virus in pregnant women may cause microcephaly (a condition in which the head is significantly smaller due to abnormal brain development) in the foetus. PTI

Lufthansa plane experiences fire in wheel after landing at Delhi

NEW DELHI: A Lufthansa wide-body A380 aircraft from Munich experienced fire in one of the wheels during landing at the Delhi airport on Monday night, according to sources.

The aircraft, which operated flight LH 762, landed safely at the Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA). Since the plane had to undergo checks and spare parts were not immediately available, the return flight to Munich was cancelled, they added.

Sources said there were around 490 passengers on board the aircraft, which made a controlled landing at the airport. "While LH762 landed safely in Delhi, a short term technical deregistration of the aircraft was required due to the lack of availability of spare parts after a controlled landing. Safety is our top priority at Lufthansa," an airline spokesperson said in a statement on Tuesday. The sources said the fire was noticed in one of the wheels during landing. PTI

Unprecedented heat and rainfall deficit in Northwest India

he northwest region of India has witnessed an alarming climatic shift, experiencing its warmest June since 1901. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the average temperature reached an unprecedented 31.73 degrees Celsius. This disturbing trend is marked by an average maximum temperature of 38.02 degrees Celsius, which is nearly two degrees above normal, and an average minimum temperature of 25.44 degrees Celsius, 1.35 degrees higher than usual. This exceptional heatwave has been compounded by a significant shortfall in rainfall. June saw an 11 percent deficit in rainfall, the highest in five years, with the country receiving only 147.2 mm of rain against a norm of 165.3 mm. This marks the seventh-lowest June rainfall since 2001, a worrying sign for a country heavily reliant on the monsoon season. IMD chief Mrutyunjay Mohapatra highlighted that northwest India faced a stark 33 percent rainfall deficit. The early onset of the monsoon over Kerala and the northeastern region on May 30 quickly lost momentum, resulting in delayed rains across key states, thereby exacerbating the heatwave conditions in northwest India. From June 11 to June 27, India experienced 16 consecutive days of below-normal rainfall activity, contributing to the overall deficit. Regionally, northwest India suffered the most with a 33 percent deficit, followed by central India at 14 percent, and east and northeast India at 13 percent. Only South India recorded a surplus, with rains 14 percent above normal. The IMD data reveals a troubling pattern: 50 percent of the country's sub-divisional areas experienced deficient to large deficient rainfall, while only 12 percent saw excess to large excess rainfall. Despite these grim statistics, historical data offers a glimmer of hope. In 20 out of the last 25 years when June rainfall was below normal, July rainfall turned out to be normal or above normal. Looking ahead, the IMD forecasts a varied rainfall distribution for the remainder of the monsoon season. While below-normal rainfall is expected in northeast India, the northwest is predicted to see normal levels, and central and south peninsular regions are anticipated to receive above-normal rainfall.

India's transformative shift in criminal justice system

ndia is poised to witness a significant transformation in its criminal justice system with the implementation of three groundbreaking laws starting July 1st, 2024. However, this transition raises substantial concerns about the readiness of institutions nationwide to adopt these changes. A comprehensive audit of preparedness across various criminal justice institutions in different states is crucial but

has yet to be conducted. The lack of an in-depth assessment may lead to widespread confusion as the country shifts from the old laws to the new ones. The complexity of transitioning to these new legal frameworks cannot be understated, as it involves re-training personnel, updating procedural protocols, and ensuring consistent application across the

Alternatively, a phased implementation approach could be adopted to test the waters, allowing for adjustments and corrections before a full-scale rollout.

Intense fight for dalit vote in upcoming UP elections

\' eologists say that aftershocks usually follow larger earthquakes in the rupture zone, months or even years after, depending on the size of the main quake. If the Uttar Pradesh (UP) Lok Sabha election result is the main earthquake, the fight for supremacy over the Dalit vote bank that started afterward are the aftershocks being felt in UP's political field. The 2024 Lok Sabha elections saw the total obliteration of the BSP, which had been a dominant force ever since Kanshiram established it in the late 1990s. BSP leader Mayawati became the state's Chief Minister three times-twice with the support of other parties and in 2007 on her own. As recently as the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, the BSP won 10 seats from UP with a 19.42% vote share. Since then, the BSP lost its footing, reaching its lowest point by not winning a single Lok Sabha seat and seeing its vote share drop to 9.39% in 2024.

There were multiple reasons for the BSP's decline. Now, the party realizes the need to fight back to stop the rise of another faction of Dalits under the Azad Samaj Party (Kanshiram). The new party, ASP(K), led by Chandrasekhar Azad, is almost running away with the legacy of Ambedkar and Kanshiram, upon which the BSP and Mayawati's politics were built.

Mayawati's monopolistic politics angered many aspiring Dalit leaders in the state, leading many to leave the BSP and join other parties where they saw better opportunities. Some rebelled but didn't succeed. The exception was Chandrasekhar Azad, a young, energetic activist who championed the Dalit cause and succeeded. His defiance of Yogi Adityanath's orders mobilized the Dalit youth, who gravitated towards his Jai Bhim Army. Having gained acceptance from the new generation of Dalits, Chandrasekhar Azad founded the Azad Samaj Party (Kanshiram). The very name of his party cleverly took away the legacy of both Ambedkar and Kanshiram from Mayawati and her BSP. "Azad" is a catchy word, and Kanshiram is a pioneering Dalit politician. Chan-

drasekhar Azad's recent victory from the Nagina constituency with a majority of around 1.51 lakh votes established him as a new Dalit mascot. Previously, he had been dismissed as a "BJP agent" by Mayawati, who blocked his attempts to join the BSP. At the time, Mayawati was projecting her nephew, Akash Anand, as her political successor and saw Chandrasekhar Azad as a competitor. In the competition between Akash Anand and Chandrasekhar Azad, it is Azad who emerged victorious, forcing Mayawati to rethink her political priorities to reclaim the BSP's lost glory.

The upcoming 10 assembly by-elections in the state are thus seen as a major battle for Dalit leadership. Additionally, three more assembly by-elections are set to be held in Punjab and Uttarakhand. Under normal circumstances, Mayawati would have adhered to the BSP policy of not contesting by-elections. However, with Chandrasekhar Azad and his ASP(Kanshiram) breathing down her neck, she cannot afford to lose the Dalit vote bank she has built over the last

three decades. Not contesting these seats would give Azad an upper hand, potentially pushing Mayawati into political oblivion by the next UP Assembly elections in 2027.

Mayawati is already politically ostracized by the I.N.D.I.A bloc for her adamant politics and is not in the good books of the NDA either. Her focus in the recent Lok Sabha elections was perceived as more anti-SP and hence pro-BJP. This perceived softness on the BJP cost Mayawati heavily in terms of growth.

Now, with both Dalit parties-BSP and ASP(K)-deciding to go solo to establish their grip on the Dalit vote bank, the fight has turned intense. The BSF aims to retain its place in the Dalit imagination, while ASP(K) seeks to expand its newly acquired base. This intra-Dalit rivalry between Mayawati and Chandrasekhar Azad may seriously damage the cohesion of the Dalit vote. Who will ultimately hold the Dalit leadership will be known by the end of this year. Regardless of the winner, the real loss will be to the Dalit vote bank.

the momentum to carry going forward with three new EV models slated for launch this year, starting with the EQA next week. "A much more clear roadmap when it comes to taxation on EVs," Iyer told PTI here when asked about the company's expectations from the upcoming Union Budget. "We understand that the Budget may not address the GST topic, but at least if you are able to get a commitment that for the next eight to ten years, this kind of taxation benefit will continue, this will really help brands like us to plan long term and have more commitments when it comes to investments for the EVs," he said.

For electric vehicles the government has already given 5 per cent GST compared to 48-50 per cent on internal combustion engines, Iyer added.

Highlighting investment on infrastructure as another key aspect, he said, "One of the biggest drivers for our growth has been the growing road infrastructure and intercity road infrastructure that has come up in the last couple of years." He further said, "one big line item that we will see in the Budget is the capital expenditure on infrastructure.

We expect (it) to go up if possible, so that not only it helps demand but also the indirect benefits of it for the country also is great."

Sensex, Nifty settle flat after hitting fresh lifetime high levels in early trade



MUMBAI: Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty hit fresh lifetime high levels before closing flat due to profit-taking in select banking and telecom shares amid concerns over rich valuations on Tuesday. The 30-share BSE Sensex declined 34.74 points or 0.04 per cent to settle at 79,441.45 in a volatile trade. During the day, it jumped 379.68 points or 0.47 per cent to hit a record peak of 79,855.87. The Nifty declined by 18.10 points or 0.07 per cent to 24,123.85. Intra-day, it climbed 94.4 points or 0.39 per cent to hit a lifetime high of 24,236.35.

On Monday, the BSE benchmark settled higher by 443.46 points or 0.56 per cent at an all-time peak of 79,476.19. The Nifty climbed 131.35 points or 0.55 per cent to settle at a fresh lifetime high of 24,141.95. In Asian markets, Tokyo,

Shanghai and Hong Kong settled in the positive territory on Tuesday, while Seoul ended lower. European markets were trading down. US markets ended in the green on Monday. India's gross GST collection increased 8 per cent to Rs 1.74 lakh crore in June, sources said on Monday. Global oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 0.66 per cent to USD 87.17 a barrel. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 426.03 crore on Monday, according to exchange data.

Murray had surgery on June 22 to remove a cyst from his spinal cord.

right leg numb. Murray owns three championships: major The U.S. Open in 2012 and Wimbledon in 2013 and 2016. His 2013 title made him the first British man to win the Wimbledon singles in 77 years.



US signs deal to help Panama remove migrants

WASHINGTON: The United States is going to pay for flights and offer other help to Panama to remove migrants under an agreement signed Monday, as the Central American country's new president has vowed to shut down the treacherous Darien Gap used by people travelling north to the United States. The memorandum of understanding was signed during an official visit headed by Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas to Panama for the inauguration Monday of José Raúl Mulino, the

country's new president. The deal is "designed to jointly reduce the number of migrants being cruelly smuggled



through the Darien, usually en route to the United States," National Security Council spokesperson Adrienne Watson said in a statement Monday.

"Specifically, United States will support Panama's efforts to begin the swift, safe and humane repatriation of migrants who do not have a legal basis to remain in Panama."

Norwegian citizen arrested on suspicion of spying for China

COPENHAGEN: A Norwegian citizen has been arrested on suspicion of spying for China, Norway's NTB news agency reported Tuesday, citing the Scandinavian country's domestic security agency. The person, whose identity wasn't released, was arrested Monday, according to NTB's report, based on information from the security agency, known by its Norwegian acronym PST.

The suspect, who will face a court hearing later Tuesday in Oslo, is suspected of serious intelligence activities involving state secrets, NTB said. PST wasn't immediately available for comment. The suspect's lawyer, Marius Dietrichson, told the VG newspaper that his client denies being an agent for China. In its annual threat assessment, the Norwegian domestic security service said that China "will be a significant intelligence threat in 2024." PTI


