Champai quits as J'khand CM, Hemant stakes claim

Hemant told media all formalities to form the government are complete.

RANCHI: Jharkhand Chief Minister Champai Soren on Wednesday resigned from his post, following which JMM leader Hemant Soren called on Governor CP Radhakrishnan and staked a claim to form the government.
 Earlier in the day, leaders and MLAs of the ruling coalition at a meeting at Champai Soren's residence here unanimously decided to elect Hemant Soren as the JMM legislative party leader.
 "I have resigned as per the decision of the JMM-led alliance. Our alliance is strong," Champai Soren said after coming out of Raj Bhavan.
 "All know what had happened with Hemant Soren Ji... I was given the responsibility by the coalition partners. Now, the alliance has decided in favour of Hemant Soren

Two masked men loot ornaments from shop employees

RAIGARH: Two masked men looted gold and silver ornaments worth Rs 31.50 lakh from two women employees of a jewellery shop in Raigarh district, police said on Wednesday. The incident occurred on Tuesday night at Chakradharnagar Chowk when the employees were heading to their owner's house to deliver a bag of ornaments. "While closing the shop, the two employees were en route to the owner's

house located in front of the shop to drop off jewellery, a routine task. Two motorcycle-borne men with their faces covered suddenly appeared and snatched the bag from the employees on the road," the official said. According to preliminary information, the bag contained gold and silver ornaments valued at Rs 31.50 lakh. Upon being alerted, a police team arrived at the scene and initiated an investigation.

Re-fixing of pension under OROP proposed
 The Union Cabinet is learnt to have considered a proposal to re-fix pension under the OROP scheme. Sources in the know pointed out that pension under the One Rank One Pension scheme is re-fixed or revised every five years. The last revision took place with effect from July 2019. They said the proposal was part of the agenda of Wednesday's Cabinet meeting. But there was no official word.

Situation under control

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police (DGP) R R Swain said on Wednesday that law-enforcement agencies and security forces have full control of the Union Territory's security situation. The DGP maintained that the degree of fear is significantly less compared to three-four years ago and emphasised that the law-and-order situation is much better in Kashmir now.

Sexual offences

NEW DELHI: The newly enacted Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, which replaces the British-era Indian Penal Code, has made sexual offences "gender neutral" for the victim and the perpetrator, according to official documents. "Both boys and girls could get procured for sexual exploitation. The word 'minor girl' in section 366A of the IPC has been replaced with the word 'child' in clause 96 of the BNS to cover both male and female children below the age of 18 years and the offence of procurement has been made punishable," an explanatory note for the new criminal law said.

LS Speaker amends rules



With some Lok Sabha members resorting to sloganeering during oath taking, Speaker Om Birla has amended the rule which now bars MPs-elect from adding any remark to the oath as members of the House. Birla added a fresh clause to 'Direction 1' to the 'Directions by the Speaker' for regulating certain matters related to the functioning of the House that are not specifically provided in the rules.

HUA extends deadline

NEW DELHI: The Union housing and urban affairs ministry on Wednesday said it has extended the deadline for the Smart Cities Mission till March 2025, allowing cities to complete ongoing projects, which account for around 10 per cent of the total projects. In a statement, the ministry said the mission has been getting multiple requests from some states to grant some more time to complete the remaining projects. These projects are in the advanced stage of implementation and got delayed due to various on-ground conditions, the statement said. This is the second time that the mission deadline, which was earlier June 2024, has been extended. "As on July 3, 2024, the 100 cities have completed 7,188 projects (90 per cent of total projects) amounting to Rs 1,44,237 crore as part of the mission.

Docs remove 25 paise coin stuck in man's windpipe

VARANASI: In a rare surgery doctors at Sri Sundarlal Hospital in Banaras Hindu University (BHU) removed a 25 paise coin that was stuck in the trachea (windpipe) of a 40-year-old man for the last eight years. A team of doctors led by cardio-thoracic surgeon Prof Sidharth Lakhota and Prof

SK Mathur removed the coin from the trachea in a procedure that lasted for 20 minutes on Tuesday.
 Dr Lakhota said, "It is very unusual for objects to enter the trachea of adults due to the presence of a strong cough reflex in adults. It is common in children. A case where a foreign body has been lodged in the trachea for the past 8 years is very



rarely reported, especially in adults." "Such foreign bodies are life-threatening and patients may suffocate, develop pneumonia, and damage the lungs. Patients can also die due

to difficulty breathing or other complications. The entire procedure took 20

minutes and the patient is now fine and will be discharged from the hospital within a day of the procedure," he said.
 Dr Amrita Rath of the Department of Anesthesiology, who played a key role in removing the coin, said, "Such procedures require a very high level of precision and even the slightest error can pose a threat to life."

Raipur district admn removed encroachment from a 5 acre plot in Sejbahar

RAIPUR: Taking swift action on the complaint received during Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai's Jandarshan last week, the Raipur district administration has removed encroachment from a five-acre plot adjacent to the main road in Sejbahar.

During the Chief Minister's Jandarshan programme, locals complained that Santosh Dahariya, a resident of Banarsi village in Mana, had illegally occupied nearly five acres of land along the main road in Sejbahar. He had constructed permanent structures and was involved

The illegal occupant had erected shop-like structures on the land and there were complaints of illegal land sales

Today, with the assistance of JCB machines, shop-like structures illegally built on this land were demolished in the presence of SDM Nandkumar Choubey, Tehsildar Pawan Kosma, Additional Tehsildar Tulsi Rathore, police, and revenue staff.

ties. This partnership is aimed at making the Indian agriculture more vibrant through joint dissemination of advanced agricultural technologies through demonstrations, training programmes and field days.

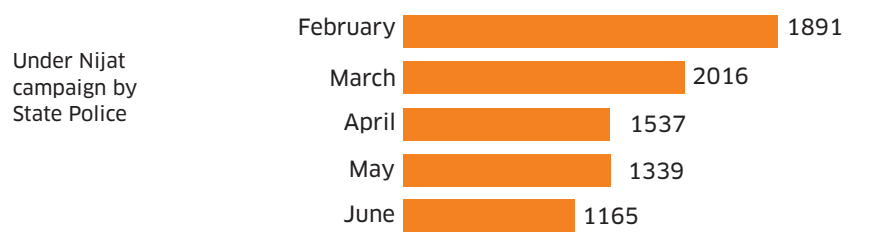

HC order limiting period of bail to two months "incorrect", says SC

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court has termed as "incorrect" an order of the Orissa High Court which limited the period of bail granted to an accused in a case lodged under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act to two months.

The bench, while referring to a verdict passed earlier by the top court, said it is now well settled that the right to speedy trial is recognised as a fundamental right guaranteed by the Constitution and is closely tied to the right to life and personal liberty.

A vacation bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and Ujjal Bhuyan noted that the petitioner had filed a bail application in the high court which had taken notice of the fact that the petitioner was in custody since May 11, 2022 and only one witness was examined so far. **PTI**

No new taxes were announced in the budget, which state Finance Minister Jagdish Devda termed as "sarvparshi" (all-inclusive). Devda presented the budget in the state legislative assembly amid ruckus created by the opposition Congress over the issue of

an alleged nursing college scam.

The CBI is probing the alleged scam pertaining to gross irregularities in the functioning of several nursing colleges that lacked infrastructure while some existed only on paper. Talking to reporters after presenting the budget, Devda said the behaviour of the opposition members in the House was highly condemnable.

"The budget for the year 2024-25 has been made keeping in view the doubling of the budget size in next five years, increasing capital invest-

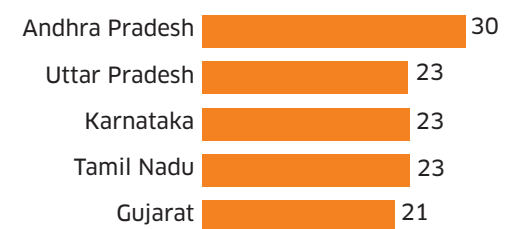

Revenues of top 18 states to grow 8 to 10 per cent this fiscal: CRISIL

KOLKATA: Revenues of top 18 states, which account for 90 per cent of India's gross state domestic product, are likely to grow at a pace of eight to 10 per cent during the current financial year at Rs 38 lakh crore, according to a CRISIL Ratings report. Last fiscal, the revenues of the 18 states grew by seven per cent, it said. The growth will be primarily driven by robust GST collections and devolution of finances from the Centre, which comprise around 50 per cent of the aggregate state revenues, according to the report. It said while revenue on liquor sales, which is ten per cent of the states' revenues, is expected to remain stable, collections of sales tax imposed on petroleum products and grants recommended by the 15th Finance Commission will be modest. Senior director of CRISIL Ratings Anuj Sethi said that the biggest impetus to revenue growth will continue to come from aggregate state GST collections and also from improved tax compliance and greater formalisation of the economy. **PTI**

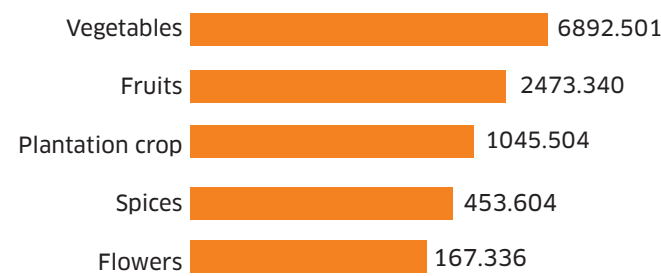

The results for the crucial test, which is a gateway for admission to undergraduate courses, were scheduled to be announced by June 30. However, there has been no update yet from the National Testing Agency (NTA). The delay in announcement of CUET

results is also likely to impact the academic calendar in the universities.

"NTA is working on CUET results and will announce a date soon," the UGC chairman said.

The delay in results come amid a raging row over alleged irregularities in the competitive exams, including NEET and NET.

will be completed in seven days and there will be no normalisation of scores as all exams will be conducted in a single shift.

For 15 subjects, the tests were in pen-paper mode and for the other 48 subjects, the exam was held in computer-based mode.

Over 13.4 lakh candidates had this year registered for the common entrance test for admission to undergraduate courses in 261 central, state, deemed and private universities.

In the first edition of the exam in 2022, the test was plagued by technical glitches. Also, as a result of tests for a subject being conducted over multiple shifts, the scores had to be normalised during the announcement of results.

In the line of fire over alleged irregularities in the medical entrance exam NEET and the PhD entrance NET, the Centre removed NTA Director

General Subodh Singh last week and notified a high-level panel headed by former Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief R. Radhakrishnan to ensure a transparent, smooth and fair conduct of examinations through the NTA.

While the NEET is under the scanner over several irregularities, including alleged paper leak, the UGC-NET was cancelled as the education ministry received inputs that the integrity of the exam was compromised. Both matters are being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

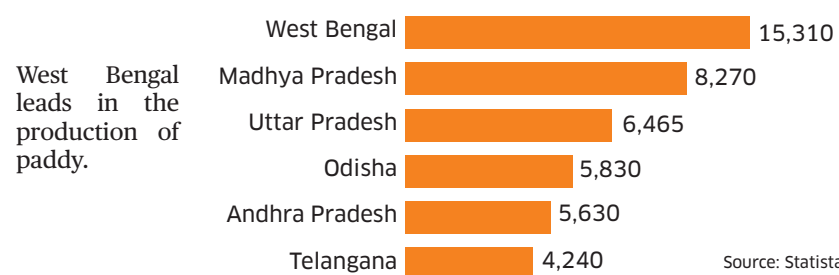

Hathras stampede: Baba's native villagers praise him

Residents of his village said, preacher never asked for donations from anyone.

KASGANJ: A day after the stampede in Hathras where more than 100 people were killed, the residents of controversial preacher Bhole Baba's native village Bahadurnagar in Kasganj district praised him for never asking for any donation or "chadhava" (offerings) from anyone.

Baba Narayan Hari, also known as Saakar Vishwa Hari Bhole Baba, used to work in the police department. However, he left his job and became a religious preacher after he discovered that the people got attached to his ideas and congregated for his 'satsang' (religious congregations).

Earlier, he used to conduct 'satsang' at his village Dham under Patiyali tehsil but he stopped after the programmes started getting crowded and the poor people's crops were getting ruined.

The residents of his village said the preacher never asked for donations or "chadhava" from anyone. When the PTI Videos team asked how Baba made a 'Bhavya Dham', the villagers said it was built out of the donations he received from the devotees, and added that he has not asked for anything from them.

The women residents of his village said Baba's conduct was very good and he only talked about things related to God.

Dhan Singh and Mohit Kumar said Baba lives

near the ashram. Dhan Singh told PTI Videos that "till now nothing untoward had happened in Bhole Baba's satsang. Bahut badhiya mahaul hota tha unke satsang ka (The atmosphere in his 'satsang' used to be very nice)".

Jay Kumar said he is from Baba's birthplace at Bahadurnagar and the people liked him for his religious sermons.

Lakhs of people gather at his 'satsang' but such an incident had never happened. Jay Kumar heaped lavish praise on Baba and said people were frequent visitors to his 'satsang'.

Controversy revolves around Baba's presence in ashram

The locals said Baba is more than 60 of age and does not have any children. They said he had adopted a girl, who died around 16-17 years back. Baba had kept her body at home for two days hoping she would come alive. The police had to intervene and the girl was cremated thereafter, the locals said. Baba is said to be present an ashram in Mainpuri. A large number of police personnel have been deployed out-

CBI court sentences man to lifer for killing two CMOs

CBI claimed that various issues related to the alleged expenditure of NRHM funds were the motive behind the killings.

LUCKNOW: A special CBI court in Lucknow on Wednesday sentenced a man to life imprisonment for killing two chief medical officers of the Uttar Pradesh family welfare department in 2010 and 2011, officials said.

The court also imposed a fine of Rs 58,000 on the convict Anand Prakash Tiwari who was hired by Y S Sachan, the then deputy CMO in the UP family welfare department. Two other accused in

the case, Vinod Sharma and R K Verma, were acquitted by the court for lack of evidence. The CBI had claimed that various issues related to the alleged expenditure of NRHM funds were the motive behind the killings. Chief Medical Officers V K Arya and B P Singh were killed while on a morning walk in the posh Gomti Nagar area of Lucknow in 2010 and 2011, respectively. They were shot dead by bike-borne assailants six months apart -- October 27, 2010, and April 2, 2011. It was alleged that Sachan had hired "contract killers", including Anand Prakash Tiwari, to eliminate Arya and Singh, a CBI spokesperson said in a statement.

Ignoring the legitimate concerns raised by these groups could lead to widespread dissent and operational difficulties. Drawing parallels to the three farm laws, which were repealed after extensive protests, the government must tread carefully to avoid a similar debacle. Comprehensive stakeholder consultation and a willingness to make necessary amendments are essential to avoid widespread backlash and ensure smooth implementation.

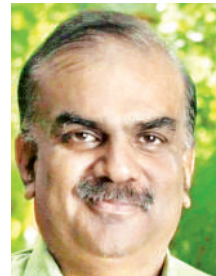
India's cricketing history boasts three previous World Cup victories. Under Kapil Dev's leadership, India won the 60-over World Cup for the first time in 1983.

India's rating upgrade hinges on fiscal deficit falling to 4%

India's sovereign rating could be upgraded within 24 months if the central government reduces the fiscal deficit to 4% of GDP, says S&P Global Ratings' official.

NEW DELHI: A sovereign rating upgrade for India in the next 24 months is possible if the central government is able to prudently manage its finances and bring down fiscal deficit to 4 per cent of GDP, an S&P Global Ratings official said on Wednesday.
S&P Global Ratings Director, Sovereign Ratings, YeeFarn Phua, said

the trigger for upgrade would be general government (Centre + states) deficit falling below 7 per cent of the GDP, and a lot of this would have to be driven by the central government.
"If the central government is able to bring down fiscal deficit to 4 per cent of the GDP, we will consider a rating upgrade over the next 24 months," Phua said.
The central govern-

ment estimates to bring down fiscal deficit to 5.1 per cent of the GDP in the current fiscal, from 5.63 per cent in 2023-24.
As per the fiscal consolidation roadmap, the deficit -- the difference between government expenditure and revenue -- will be brought down to 4.5 per cent by 2025-26.
The US-based rating agency had in May upgraded outlook for India to positive, from

stable, while retaining the rating at 'BBB-'.
Phua further said the Indian economy has clocked an average of 8 per cent growth in the last three years, driven by domestic consumption and infrastructure investment that has made real difference on the ground.
"We see the medium-term growth potential for India at 7 per cent," Phua said.

India's emerging role as one of the vital nodes in future-proofed supply chains across industries opens the door

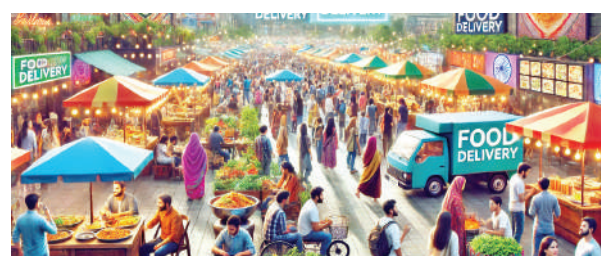
for growth within the country and expansion beyond, he stated.

India's food market to reach Rs 10 lakh cr by 2030

Swiggy Food Marketplace CEO Rohit Kapoor said the Indian food services market, especially food delivery, has witnessed buoyant growth over the last few years.

Jaiprakash Associates Insolvent: Lenders reject one-time settlement

NEW DELHI: Lenders of Jaiprakash Associates Ltd (JAL) led by ICICI Bank on Wednesday rejected the modified one-time settlement proposal, in which the debt-ridden group had offered a higher upfront payment and sales of its cement assets. During a hearing before the insolvency appellate tribunal NCLAT, senior advocate Sajeev Sen representing ICICI Bank informed the bench about the rejection of the OTS (one-time settlement) scheme by the lenders. "The OTS proposal has been rejected by the lenders," said Sen urging the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) to proceed further in the matter over the merit. The NCLAT was hearing a petition filed by Sunil Kumar Sharma, a member of the suspended board of JAL, challenging an order of the Allahabad bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT). **PTI**

Sensex hits historic 80,000-mark, Nifty ends at record high as banking shares advance



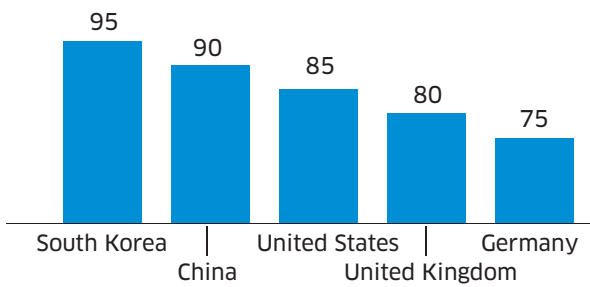
MUMBAI: Benchmark BSE Sensex breached the historic 80,000 level intraday for the first time while Nifty raced more than 162 points to a fresh lifetime high on Wednesday following heavy buying in banking and FMCG shares amid firm global market trends. The 30-share Sensex hit the historic 80,000 mark for the first time earlier in the day. It surged 632.85 points or 0.79 per cent to hit a record intraday high of 80,074.30. The index later closed near the 80,000 level at 79,986.80, up by 545.35 points or 0.69 per cent over the last close. The BSE

Sensex breached the 78,000 level on June 25 and 79,000 for the first time on June 27. The Nifty climbed 162.65 points or 0.67 per cent to an all-time high of 24,286.50. During the day, it zoomed 183.4 points or 0.76 per cent to hit a fresh intraday record peak of 24,307.25.

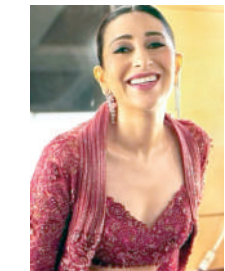

Its identity was rediscovered by Davoli, who matched it to an old drawing. Only seven similar busts of Caligula exist. The artifact will be showcased in an upcoming exhibition, marking its return to public view after decades in private collections.

Anna Magdalena Bach, wife of Johann Sebastian Bach, is renowned for her role in preserving his music. Historically, women like her were overshadowed in classical music. She was highly regarded at court for her singing prowess and managed Bach's music after his death.

The team is scheduled to arrive in New Delhi early Thursday morning at 6:20 AM, after departing from Barbados' Grantley Adams International Airport on a chartered flight with the special call sign - AIC24WC -

Air India Champions 24 World Cup. The departure was delayed due to Hurricane Beryl, but the team, its support staff, players' families, some board officials, and Indian media eventually left Barbados early Wednesday morning.

BCCI Vice-President Rajeev Shukla confirmed the arrangements, stating that the Indian squad, along with BCCI President Roger Binny and Secretary Jay Shah, managed the travel logistics. The

CT Draft: Indo-Pak match on March 1 in Lahore, BCCI yet to give consent

NEW DELHI: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has slotted its team's marquee Champions Trophy match against arch-foes India in Lahore on March 1 next year but the BCCI is yet to give its consent to the tentative schedule, a senior ICC Board member told PTI on Wednesday. The tournament is slated from February 19 to March 9 with March 10 as Reserve Day. It is understood PCB chairman Mohsin Naqvi, who was invited to watch the T20 World Cup final in Barbados, submitted a 15-match schedule with all of India's games kept in Lahore for security and logistical reasons. "The PCB has submitted the draft of the 15-match ICC Champions Trophy. Seven games in Lahore, three in Karachi and five in Rawalpindi," an ICC Board member said. "The opening match will be held in Karachi with two semifinals in Karachi and Rawalpindi, final in Lahore. PTI

Messi Misses Olympics

No Messi in Argentina's Olympic soccer squad; Álvarez and Otamendi selected for Paris Games



BUENOS AIRES: Lionel Messi won't be in Argentina's squad at the Olympics starting later this month in Paris. Coach Javier Mascherano included four World Cup winners in the squad he announced Tuesday, including striker Julián Álvarez and defender Nicolás Otamendi. The 37-year-old Messi, who has struggled with injuries this year, is now playing at the Copa America, aiming to defend the continental title he won in 2021. That victory served as a springboard for Argentina to lift the World Cup in 2022. Messi won the gold medal at Beijing in 2008 in his only Olympic

campaign. The Olympic men's soccer tournament is for under-23 teams, but three older players are allowed on each squad. Mascherano, who won the Olympic gold medal as a player in 2004 and '08, will add goalkeeper Gerónimo Rulli, Otamendi and Álvarez to his squad after Copa America is finished. Midfielder Claudio Echeverri, a recent signing for Manchester City from River Plate, will also join. Argentina will play two friendlies in France before its Olympic soccer tournament opener against Morocco on July 24. Argentina and Morocco are in Group B along with Iraq and Ukraine. PTI

Hardik becomes first Indian to occupy top spot in ICC T20I all-rounders' rankings

DUBAI: Hardik Pandya rose two places to become the first Indian to occupy the number one spot in the ICC's T20I all-rounders' rankings on Wednesday, as the country's cricketers improved their standings following their title-winning performance in the just-concluded World Cup. The 30-year-old, who handed telling blows to South Africa in the T20 World Cup final on July 29 by dismissing half-century Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller in his 3/20 effort, climbed up two places to go level with Sri Lankan star Wanindu Hasaranga as the top-ranked men's T20I all-rounder. Following a topsy-turvy IPL where he was the target of fans' boos as Mumbai Indians' new captain, Pandya turned it around in style in the T20 World Cup in the USA and the Caribbean. Pandya made impactful cameos down the order with the bat and made breakthroughs with the ball when the team needed him to.

Demiral's double sends Turkey to Euro quarterfinals

COLEIPZIG: Merih Demiral's two goals and Mert Gunok's crucial last-second save propelled Turkey to a 2-1 victory over Austria, securing a spot in the Euro 2024 quarterfinals against the Netherlands. Demiral opened the scoring just 57 seconds into the match after Austria's defense failed to clear a corner, making it the second-fastest goal in Euro history.

Turkey's coach Vincenzo Montella praised his team's spirit, while Austria's Ralf Rangnick lamented missed opportunities, noting his team's 21 attempts compared to Turkey's six. Despite Austria's vigorous efforts, including a strong second half and numerous chances, Gunok's impressive reflexes kept them at bay, particularly with a critical save from Christoph Baumgartner's close-range header deep into injury time.

Both teams were missing their captains, with Turkey's Hakan Calhanoglu suspended and Austria's David Alaba recovering from a knee injury. Alaba, however, was present to

support his team, sharing a warm moment with his Real Madrid teammate Guler before the match.

Turkey will now prepare to face the Netherlands, who advanced after a 3-0 win over Romania.

Netherlands reaches Euros quarterfinals again

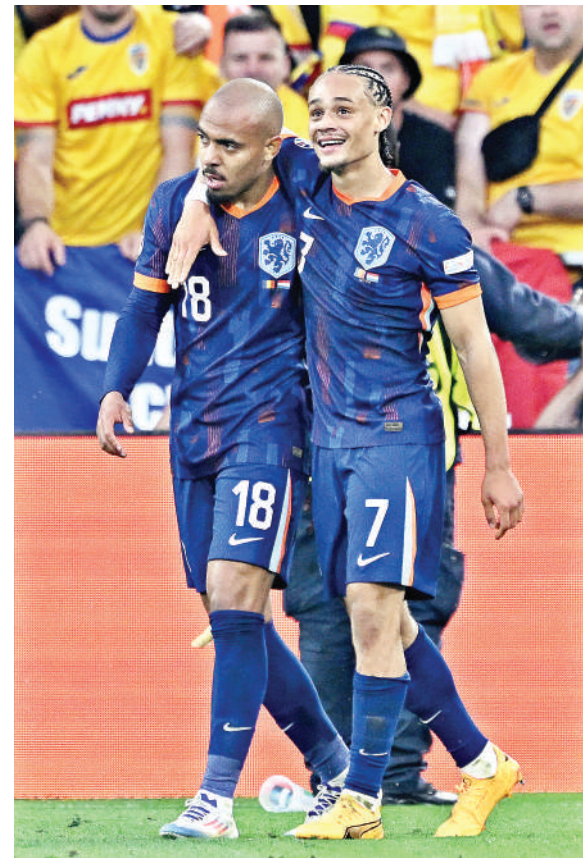

Netherlands secures first Euros quarterfinal in 16 years with a 3-0 win over Romania.

MUNICH: The Netherlands reached their first European Championship quarterfinal in 16 years with a 3-0 victory over Romania, following their best performance at Euro 2024. Cody Gakpo opened the scoring in the 20th minute, and substitute Donyell Malen added two late goals, sending the Dutch to their first quarterfinal since 2008.

Coach Ronald Koeman praised the team's outstanding performance, noting the importance of maintaining this level to continue in the tournament. The Netherlands missed several earlier chances, with captain Virgil van Dijk hitting the woodwork, but improved significantly compared to their group stage struggles.

Romania, supported by a loud and colorful fanbase, dominated possession early but failed to test Dutch goalkeeper Bart Verbruggen. Gakpo's goal, his third of the tournament, boosted Dutch confidence. Despite numerous opportunities, good goalkeeping from Florian Nita kept Roma-

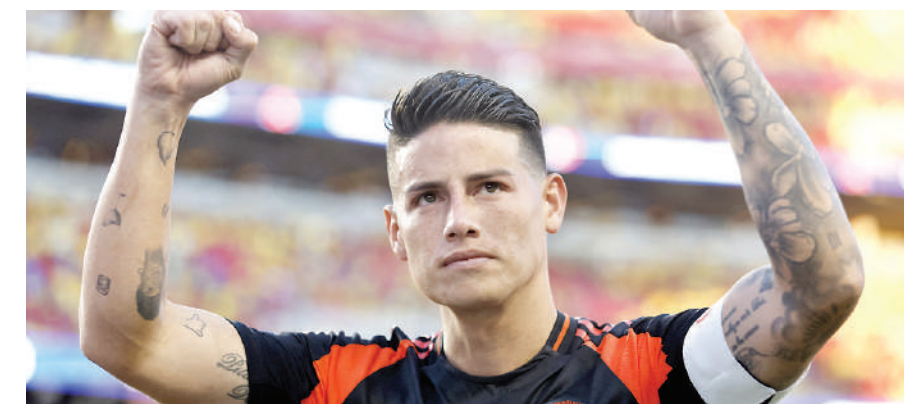
They aim to enjoy the experience without succumbing to pressure, focusing on playing their best game.

Bogdan-Daniel matched Praggnanandhaa move for move and the game was drawn through repetition after 38 moves. It was not so

easy for Gukesh as well as he seemed to withheld his true preparation for the World Championship match against Ding Liren, scheduled in November this year in Singapore.

Alireza stole the show on a dull day in the grand chess tour. He was at his best and crawled back with his second win of

the tournament to be in striking distance of tournament leader Fabio Caruana of the United States.

With just three rounds remaining in the USD 350000 prize money tournament, Caruana seems to be sitting pretty at the top, with three aspirants in Gukesh Praggnanandhaa and Alireza in pursuit.

UK election set to deliver more diverse Parliament

LONDON: The UK general election on Thursday is expected to deliver the most diverse Parliament in the country's history, including in the number of parliamentarians of Indian heritage likely to be elected from across the nation.

According to an analysis by the British Future think tank, the Labour Party is set to have by far the largest number of ethnic minority MPs if the party wins an overall majority and even more in a landslide scenario.

With around 14 per cent of MPs coming from an ethnic minority background this time, the analysis finds that the new Parliament will be closer than ever to reflecting the diversity of the British electorate. "This election will see the biggest rise in ethnic minority representation and the most diverse Parliament ever," said Sunder Katwala, Director of British Future. **PTI**

INDIAN REPUBLICAN DELEGATE

Indian-American attorney elected as alternate delegate to Republican Convention

WASHINGTON: Indian-American community leader and attorney Hardam Tripathi has been elected as an official alternate delegate for the Republican National Convention in Wisconsin later this month that would formally nominate former US president Donald Trump as the party's presidential candidate.



Trump, 78, is the presumptive Republican Party candidate for the presidential election and is pitched against 81-year-old incumbent President Joe Biden from the Democratic Party. The Republican National Party (RNP) convention in Milwaukee from July 14 to 18 would formally nominate Trump as its nominee for the November 5 presidential elections. **PTI**

Nepali Congress urges PM Prachanda to step down after power-sharing deal with CPN-UML



KATHMANDU: The Nepali Congress on Wednesday urged Prime Minister Pushpa Kamal Dahal 'Prachanda' to pave the way for the formation of a new government, a day after the Himalayan nation's largest political party struck a power-sharing deal with the CPN-UML to replace the incumbent government led by the former guerilla leader.

The Nepali Congress Central Work Performance Committee (CWC) met at party president Sher Bahadur

Deuba's residence at Budhanilkantha to discuss the current political situation and the party's future strategy.

The meeting of the party's key committee came a day after the Nepali Congress President Deuba and Communist Party of Nepal-United Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML) chairman K P Sharma Oli finalised an agreement on Monday to form a new government to replace the ruling coalition led by Prime Minister Prachanda.

US TRUMP FUNDRAISING

Trump campaign outraises Biden by \$67 million in second quarter fundraising efforts, surpasses expectations

WASHINGTON: Republican presumptive nominee and former president Donald Trump has outraised incumbent President Joe Biden by over USD 67 million in the second quarter of this year by raising USD 331 million. Trump, 78, the presumptive Republican Party candidate, is pitched against 81-year-old incumbent President Joe Biden from the Democratic Party for the November 5 presidential elections. The Trump Campaign raised USD 331 million against the USD 264 million raised by the Biden-Harris Campaign during the second quarter of this year, according to the figures released by the two campaigns. However, the Biden-Harris Cam-

paign outraised Trump in June, raising a record USD 127 million. Of this, USD 38 million was raised in the four days following the first presidential debate in Atlanta on June 27. The Biden-Harris Campaign has USD 240 million in cash on hand - up from USD 212 million last month. Team Trump's cash on hand at the end of June is USD 284.9 million. "President Trump's campaign fundraising operation is thriving day after day and month after month."

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Mumbai terror accused Rana extraditable to India: US attorney

India has established probable cause to prosecute Tahawwur Rana for his role in the 2008 Mumbai attacks, causing 166 deaths and 239 injuries, says US attorney.

WASHINGTON: Pakistani-origin Canadian businessman Tahawwur Rana, who is sought in India for his involvement in the 2008 Mumbai terror attack, is extraditable under the plain provisions of the US-India extradition treaty, a US attorney has told a federal court.

Assistant US Attorney, Criminal Appeals Chief Bram Alden was mak-

ing a closing argument before the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, where Rana has appealed against the order by a US District Court in California that denied the writ of habeas corpus.

In May, Rana, 63, had filed a writ of habeas corpus challenging the court order, which acceded with the request of the US government that the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks accused

be extradited to India. "Rana is extraditable to India under the plain provisions of the treaty, and India has established probable cause to prosecute him for his role in terrorist attacks that resulted in 166 deaths

and 239 injuries," Alden said.

In his deposition before the court on June 5, Alden, who left the position last week, said both India and the United States have agreed on the meaning of the treaty provision, the non-bis provision in Article 6-1.

"Both parties have now stated what they intended, that that provision be interpreted based on the elements of the

offence and not based on the conduct underlying those crimes. That is consistent with long-standing Supreme Court double jeopardy precedent," he argued. Rana, currently lodged in a jail in Los Angeles, faces charges for his role in the Mumbai attacks and is known to be associated with Pakistani-American terrorist David Coleman Headley, one of the main conspirators of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks.

Israel makes largest ever West Bank land seizure

An anti-settlement watchdog says Israel has approved the largest seizure of land in the occupied West Bank in over three decades.

JERUSALEM: The Israeli group Peace Now said Wednesday that authorities recently approved the appropriation of 12.7 sq km (nearly 5 sq miles) of land in the Jordan Valley. The group's data indicate it was the largest single appropriation approved since the 1993 Oslo accords at the start of the peace process.

The land appropriation was likely to worsen already soaring tensions linked to the ongoing Israel-Hamas war in Gaza.

Bank in March and 2.6 sq km (1 square mile) in February. That makes 2024 by far the peak year for Israeli land seizure in the West Bank, Peace Now said. The parcels are contiguous and located north-east of the West Bank city of Ramallah, where the Western-backed Palestinian Authority is headquartered.

By declaring them state lands, the Israeli government has opened them up to being leased to Israelis and prohibited private Palestinian ownership. The Palestinians view the expansion of settlements in the occupied West Bank as the main barrier to any lasting peace agreement and most of the international community considers them illegal or illegitimate.

The land seizure, which was approved late last month but only publicised on Wednesday, comes after the seizure of 8 sq km (roughly 3 square miles) of land in the West
