**MUMBAI:** India captain Rohit Sharma and star batter Virat Kohli lifted the T20 World Cup 2024 trophy in front of the fans during a grand victory parade on a bus-top in Mumbai. Both Virat and Rohit showcased the glittering trophy to thousands of fans who had gathered to witness this historic event.

The parade, which commenced from the National Centre for the Performing Arts (NCPA), saw the players make their way atop an open-top bus. Fans thronged the streets, particularly at the Marine Drive, turning on their flashlights to create a mesmerizing visual spectacle as the champions' caravan progressed. In a heartwarming gesture, Virat Kohli, who has been a stalwart of Indian cricket, asked Rohit Sharma to come forward and lift the trophy together, symbolizing their united effort

## Firearms, explosives recovered post encounter in which 5 Naxals were killed

**RAIPUR:** Security personnel have recovered a cache of arms, ammunition and explosives at the site of an encounter in which five Naxalites were killed in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district a day ago, a senior police official said on Wednesday.

Prima facie, it seems the slain cadres belonged to Maoists' PLGA (People's Liberation Guerrilla Army) Company No. 1 and were part of security detail of senior Naxalites, he said.

Police had said five Naxalites were gunned down on Tuesday in an encounter with security forces in forests under the Kohkameta police station area of Narayanpur district, around 240km from state capital Raipur.

Following the encounter, an ongoing search operation was extended

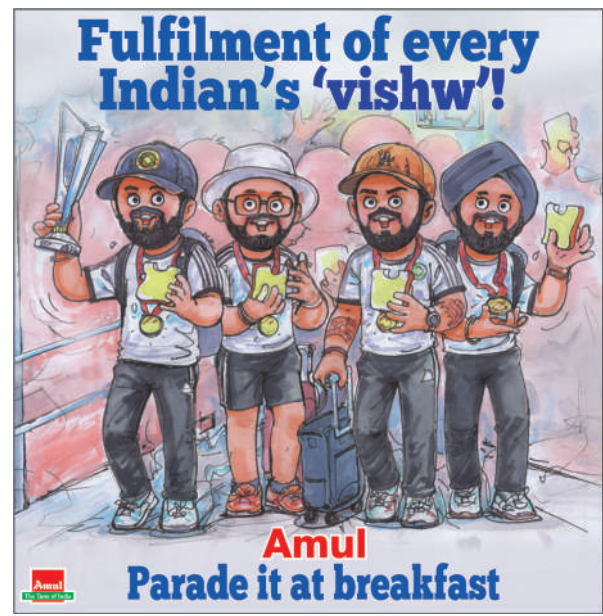
in the area till Wednesday afternoon following which security personnel started returning to their bases, Inspector General of Police, Bastar range Sundarraj P told PTI.

Personnel belonging to the state police's District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Special Task Force (STF), along with the 53rd battalion of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) and the 135th battalion of the Border Security Force (BSF) were involved in four-day long the operation, he said.

On Tuesday, at around 10:30 am when security forces were cordoning off a forest between Hikulnar and Ghamandi villages, a gunfight broke out between the two sides. The intermittent firing lasted till late in the evening at different places, Sundarraj said.

## PM Modi to visit Russia, Austria from July 8 to 10

**NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi will pay a two-day visit to Russia from July 8 to 9 to hold the 22nd India-Russia annual summit that will review the entire range of multifaceted ties between the two countries. After concluding his trip to Russia, Modi will travel to Austria, which will be the first visit by an Indian PM to that country in 41 years.



## ED arrests two in CG liquor 'scam'-linked money laundering case

**NEW DELHI:** The Enforcement Directorate on Thursday said it has arrested two liquor businessmen in connection with its money laundering probe into an alleged excise scam of Chhattisgarh that is estimated to have generated over Rs 2,100 crore of slush funds.

Arvind Singh and Trilok Singh Dhillon were arrested on July 1 at the central jail in Raipur and later a special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court sent them to ED custody till July 6, the federal probe agency said in a statement.

The two were lodged

in jail after the Chhattisgarh Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) arrested them in the case sometime back.

The money laundering case of the ED stemmed from an EOW/ACB FIR filed in January and had named 70 individuals and companies, including former excise minister Kawasi Lakhma, former chief secretary Vivek Dhand and others.

The alleged scam, where the ED has pegged the proceeds of crime at Rs 2,161 crore, purportedly took place between 2019-2022 when the Congress was in power in the state.

## 56 students move SC against any bid to cancel exam

**NEW DELHI:** Over 50 successful Gujarat-based NEET-UG candidates, including several who have been ranked first, have moved the Supreme Court seeking a direction to restrain the Centre and the National Testing Agency from cancelling the controversy-ridden exam. They have sought

a direction from the top court to the Union Education Ministry to probe, identify and take strict action against students and others who indulged in unfair practices like paper leak and impersonation in the NEET-UG exam conducted on May 5 this year.

The National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Undergraduate (NEET-UG) is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for admission to MBBS, BDS, AYUSH and

other related courses in government and private institutions across the country. NEET-UG, 2024 was held across 4,750 centres on May 5 and around 24 lakh candidates appeared in the exam. Allegations of irregularities, including paper leaks, have led to protests in several cities and sparring between rival political parties.

**RAIPUR:** With the onset of the rainy season and the reopening of schools and colleges, air travel has seen a significant decline. Consequently, airlines have reduced their fares, bringing relief to travelers. Currently, airfares from Raipur to Delhi and Mumbai have decreased substantially, with prices ranging from Rs 6500 to Rs 8000.

Travel operator Kirti Vyasa confirmed that airfares from Raipur to Delhi now range from Rs 7000 to Rs 8000, while fares to Mumbai are available for Rs 6500 to Rs 7000. Additionally, fares for other

Vyasa explained that the reduction in air travel during the rainy season impacts airlines, prompting them to lower fares to attract passengers. He also noted the need for regulation to prevent arbitrary fare increases by airlines.

Air passenger movement at Raipur airport has decreased for the past two weeks. From June 17 to June 23, 47,560 air passengers traveled, a 2.44 percent decrease from the previous week.

Similarly, from June 24 to June 30, 46,438 passengers traveled, marking a 2.36 percent decline. Over the last 15 days, 652 flights were operated.

### AVERAGE RAINFALL

#### Chhattisgarh receives 212.6 mm rainfall so far, Bijapur records highest

**RAIPUR:** According to the state level control room established by the Revenue-Disaster Management Department, Chhattisgarh has recorded an average rainfall of 212.6 mm since June 1. The highest average rainfall has been observed in Bijapur district, with 300.8 mm, while Surguja district recorded the lowest at 149.4 mm. Data from the state level flood control room highlights the rainfall distribution across various districts from June 1 to the morning of July 4. Surajpur district recorded 184.2 mm, Balrampur 179.9 mm, Jashpur 203.4 mm, Korea 186.2 mm, and Manendragarh-Chirmiri-Bharatpur 179.6 mm. In Raipur district, the average rainfall was recorded at 195.4 mm, Baloda Bazar 207.8 mm, Gariaband 227.4 mm, Mahasamund 226.4 mm, Dhamtari 222.2 mm, Bilaspur 202.0 mm, Mungeli 194.2 mm, Raigarh 217.6 mm, Sarangarh-Bilaigarh 174.4 mm, Jajgir-Champa 225.1 mm, Sakti 184.7 mm, Korba 219.3 mm, and Gaurala-Pendra-Marwahi 213.9 mm. Durg district saw 176.3 mm of rainfall, Kabirdham 165.2 mm, Rajnandgaon 185.5 mm, Mohla-Manpur-Ambagadhchowki 225.3 mm, Khairagarh-Chhuikhadan-Gandai 133.9 mm, Balod 228.4 mm, and Bemetara 193.9 mm.

**PALI:** The new law has come into force after 12 midnight on July 1. Under this change brought by the central government, many sections of the Indian Penal Code have changed. The post in-charge provided detailed information by organizing a program at the police post Chaitma on the new law.

Till now action was taken under 302 on the charge of murder, but now action will be taken under section 103 A of the Indian Penal Code in this case, similarly, the crime was registered against those who commit fraud under section 420, this has also been changed now. Section 316 of the Indian Penal Code has been changed, similarly there was no section earlier in mass murder, but now death penalty can be given under mob lynching. Similarly, 64 BS will be imposed instead of 376 for rape.

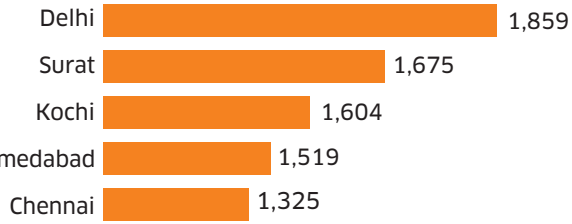

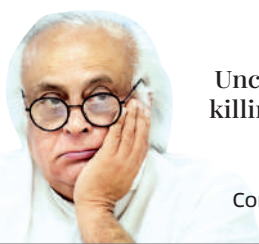

The high court made the observation while dismissing an appeal challenging an order which had rejected a petition seeking a direction to the Supreme Court collegiums to provide detailed reasons while refusing to accept recommendations

for appointment of high court judges.

The appointment of a judge to the high court or Supreme court is an integrated, consultative and non-adversarial process which cannot be challenged in a court of law except on the ground of want of consultation with the named constitutional functionaries or lack of any condition of eligibility in case of an appointment or a transfer being made without the recommendation of the Chief Justice of India, it said.

"Further, publication of reasons for rejection will be detrimental to the interests and standing of people whose names

have been recommended by the high courts, as the (SC) collegium deliberates and decides on the basis of information which is private to the individual being considered. Such information, if made public, will have the effect of stifling

the appointment process," a bench of Acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela said.

The division bench said the single judge has correctly noted that this court cannot sit in appeal over the subjective satisfaction of the Supreme Court collegiums.

It said the law regarding appointment of judges to the Supreme Court and high courts is well settled and the apex court has drawn a distinction between eligibility and suitability of a person to be appointed as a judge of the high court.

Petitioner Rakesh Kumar Gupta also sought

directions to the top court collegium to provide the "qualification" considered for appointment as a high court judge and publish monthly data related to pending and disposed of recommendations.

The petitioner, who claimed to be a victim of delay in disposal of his case pending in the Rohini district court here, said the "high" rejection rate of recommendations by the collegium of the Supreme Court was "extremely disturbing" and showed there was a communication gap between the apex court and high courts regarding the criteria for appointment.

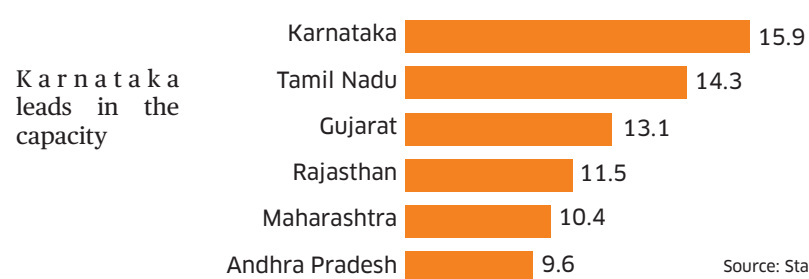

# Courts being used as 'pawns' in illegal construction matters

It has noticed that some lawyers are also blackmailing and extracting money.

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi High Court on Thursday castigated the MCD commissioner over illegal and unauthorised constructions in the national capital and said courts were being used as "pawns" in the process.

"It said one of the reasons for flooding in Delhi is that water outlets are blocked due to unauthorised constructions and asked the civic body chief to take stern action against erring officers.

"We are being used as a pawn in the entire thing. We want to break this nexus, it is a big nexus. The system is collapsing. You do something and take drastic action against your officers," the bench told the MCD commissioner.

A bench of Acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela apprised Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) Commissioner Ashwani Kumar, who joined the proceedings virtually in pursuance of the court's direction, about filing of motivated petitions which cannot be ignored as the fact of illegal and unauthorised constructions is not in dispute.

"Courts are being used as a strategic tool by both the petitioner and the officials of MCD for their ulterior purposes and for extracting money. Professional persons are filing a number of petitions on unauthorised constructions. We are stuck in a strange situation. If we take action, they

tend to extort money from the property owner. If we don't take action, then the unauthorised construction remains," the bench said.

The court said, "The floods in Delhi are because outlets of water are blocked. Drains are choked. This is because of unauthorised constructions. Houses and

buildings have been constructed on public lands and drains so there is no way left for water to flow." Responding to the concerns raised by the bench, the commissioner assured the court that strict action will be taken against erring officials, they will be sensitised, and a strong message will be sent out that such activities are not going to be tolerated. He assured the court that the civic body will take action against unauthorised constructions and they will be removed.

The court was hearing a petition filed by a 20-year-old woman seeking directions to the authorities to stop and demolish an illegal and unauthorised construction being carried out on a land in Paharganj here. During the hearing, the MCD counsel contended that the petition was motivated.

# HC rejects pleas seeking video of election process

The Delhi High Court on Thursday rejected petitions seeking supply of video recording of the election process in Fatehpur Sikri and Aligarh Lok Sabha constituencies in Uttar Pradesh.

Justice Purushendra Kumar Kaurav said merely because the office of the Election Commission of India (ECI) is in Delhi is no reason to entertain the petition in the high court here when all "integral and essential facts" fell outside its jurisdiction.

Petitioners Bijendra Singh and Ramnath Singh, who unsuccessfully contested the 2024 polls from Aligarh and Fatehpur Sikri respectively, sought the video footage on the ground that they observed "certain irregularities" during the counting process.

"It is not disputed that the petitioner seeks to obtain videography in the jurisdiction of Uttar Pradesh (UP) with respect to parliamentary election in Fatehpur Sikri and Aligarh.

"The election admittedly took place in UP. Video recording has also taken place in UP. The petitioners in both the cases belong to the state of UP. The application seeking a copy of the video recording has been made to the returning officer in UP," the court said.

"No doubt the office of the ECI is within the territorial jurisdiction of this court and at least part of the cause of action is said to have arisen here but this itself may not be the reason to invoke the jurisdiction under Article 226 and to entertain a writ petition when a substantial part of cause of action has arisen outside the limits of the high court. The instant writ petition is dismissed," Justice Kaurav said.

The court said the petitioners were at liberty to take appropriate remedy before the competent court. Lawyer Mehmood Pracha, appearing for the petitioners, contended that the petitions were maintainable as the grievance was with respect to the ECI, whose office was in Delhi, adhering with its rules. Advocate Sidhant Kumar, appearing for the ECI, opposed the petitions, saying they were not maintainable in the high court here as the elections were conducted in UP, recording was done in UP and the office of returning officer was also in UP.

# Delhi Zoo implements ayurvedic methods to safeguard animals

As the monsoon season sets in, Delhi Zoo is taking innovative steps to ensure the health and safety of its animals by incorporating traditional ayurvedic methods.

**NEW DELHI:** Delhi Zoo authorities are using ayurvedic methods, including neem oil, turmeric and quicklime, to keep the animals healthy and free from bacterial and viral infections during the rainy season.

"The monsoon has entered the capital and we have to take all necessary measures to keep the animals healthy and safe during this season. We will use some Indian home remedies like neem oil, which will help protect the animals from common biting insects, including mosquitoes, biting midges and fleas," Delhi Zoo Director Sanjeet Kumar told PTI.

Neem oil acts as an herbal disinfectant and fly repellent, said Kumar, turmeric, known for its anti-inflammatory and healing properties, will be used to treat itchy skin conditions, infections and wounds. Turmeric dust will be applied to lesions and foot sores to expedite healing, he said.

Heavy rains often lead

to waterlogging in certain parts of the zoo which create breeding grounds for mosquitoes. To counter this, quicklime (chuna) will be sprinkled in these areas to prevent mosquito proliferation.

"We are using quicklime in waterlogged spots to stop the growth of mosquitoes and keep our animals safe," the official said. After the heavy rains

that lashed the national capital on Friday, recording 228.1 mm of rainfall in just 24 hours – the highest in June since 1936 – the Delhi Zoo was also affected. This incident affected animal enclosures, administrative offices and staff quarters. Referring to this situation, Kumar said that measures have been taken to prevent a recurrence. "The broken boundary is being repaired and barriers are being installed to prevent water backflow, ensuring water does not reach the animal enclosures," he said.

Amid heavy rains, 5600 more begin Yatra



Despite heavy rains, a contingent of over 5,600 pilgrims set off from Jammu towards the twin basecamps, Baltal and Palagam, of the Amarnath cave shrine on Thursday, officials said.

More than 30,000 devotees offered prayers to the naturally formed ice lingam on Wednesday alone, bringing the total number of pilgrims to over one lakh, they said.

The seventh batch of pilgrims included 4,487 men, 1,011 women, 10 children and 188 'sadhus' and 'sadhvis' who departed at 3.13 am in 219 vehicles, under the escort of Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), from the Bhagwati Nagar base camp, the officials said.

Of these, 3,668 pilgrims opted for the traditional 48 km Pahalgam route, while 2,028 chose the shorter but steeper 14 km Baltal route, they said.

Since June 28, when Lt Governor Manoj Sinha flagged off the first batch, a total of 37, 522 pilgrims have left the Jammu base camp for the yatra.

## Hathras tragedy: Urgent need for crowd safety reforms

The Hathras stampede, claiming over 120 lives during a religious 'satsang,' was a disaster waiting to happen. With approximately 2.5 lakh attendees crammed into a venue approved for only 80,000, this tragedy underscores the chronic deficiencies in crowd management and disaster preparedness in India. The organizers had secured permission based on a false undertaking regarding the number of expected devotees, and they allegedly refused to cooperate with the police in traffic control, further exacerbating the chaos. Ironically, in a country where mass gatherings at religious events are routine, crowd management often remains an afterthought. The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) had, a decade ago, issued comprehensive guidelines for managing crowds at events and venues of mass gatherings. These guidelines emphasized the importance of proactive planning and flawless execution by well-trained personnel to prevent man-made tragedies like stampedes. Unfortunately, these protocols were conspicuously absent at the Hathras event. The practice of providing misleading estimates about crowd size to secure administrative approval is a common yet dangerous ploy. At times, bribes smooth the path to approval, bypassing crucial safety checks. However, placing the blame solely on organizers is insufficient. Authorities must exercise due diligence when granting permissions. This includes mandatory spot inspections to ensure that adequate safety arrangements are in place for worst-case scenarios. The Hathras incident highlights the urgent need for a cultural shift in how crowd management is approached in India. Authorities must adopt a zero-tolerance policy towards negligence and corruption in event planning and execution. Exemplary action should be taken against those whose reckless disregard for safety puts lives at risk. State governments and local authorities must rigorously enforce NDMA guidelines and ensure that all organizers adhere to strict safety protocols. The tragic loss of life at Hathras should serve as a sobering reminder of the cost of negligence and the imperative for change.

## Hathras tragedy: No lessons learnt from the past mistakes

Reams have been written about the need for effective crowd control mechanisms in religious congregations. Yet, the quality of crowd management in India remains sub-par. Despite past tragedies leaving unmistakable imprints, stakeholders are reluctant to learn. The tendency to take people for granted and the chronic lack of disaster anticipation are alarming. The stampede near Uttar Pradesh's Hathras, claiming nearly 120 lives of devotees leaving a "satsang," highlights the callousness of the State and event organizers. The discourse took place in a small hall with one narrow exit, others closed for the preacher's passage, and a crowd of nearly one lakh devotees. There was inadequate manpower to control the sudden exodus. The district administration's awareness of the satsang is questionable. Were necessary arrangements like water, food, and adequate fans made? Often, organizers have their personnel, but they are overruled by frenzied crowds. State police rarely manage the main crowd control, leading to tragic repeats like Hathras.

Common reasons for not consuming enough fruits and vegetables include personal preferences, habits, perishability, cost, availability, time constraints, and lack of cooking skills.

Juices and smoothies can help address some of these barriers. They can mask the flavors you might dislike, such as the bitterness of some vegetables, and can make use of imperfect produce.

Preparing juices and smoothies doesn't require much time or skill, especially if you opt for store-bought options. While processing can alter the composition slightly, unsweetened juices still provide significant nutrients and beneficial bioactives.

Juicing can extend the shelf life of produce and make nutrients more affordable. Research has shown that fruit juice offers a high nutrient density relative to its cost.

The positioning of juice in healthy eating guidelines can be confusing. The Indian dietary guidelines include 100% fruit juice but don't specifically mention vegeta-

ble juice.

This could be because vegetable juices were less common when the guidelines were last updated.

The guidelines caution against excessive juice consumption, based on the idea that juice is not as beneficial as whole fruit. Juice contains less fiber, which is essential for gut health, heart health, and satiety.

Juicing releases sugars from the fruit, making them "free sugars," which the World Health Organization recommends limiting for better health.

However, fruits and vegetables are more than just their individual nutrients.

A reductionist approach to nutrition, which focuses on specific features like sugar content or particular vitamins, can overlook the complexity of whole foods.

A recent review of multiple studies looked at the relationship between 100% juice and various health outcomes. Most evidence indicated that juice has either a neutral or positive impact on health.

Pure 100% juice was linked to improved heart health and inflammatory markers and wasn't associated with weight gain, multiple cancers, or negative metabolic markers.

Some observational studies reported risks such as

death from heart disease, prostate cancer, and diabetes. However, these studies are not controlled and might include misclassifications, as people might confuse 100% fruit juice with sugar-sweetened beverages.

The common belief that juice damages teeth often arises from studies that group 100% juice with sweetened drinks or use unrealistic consumption scenarios. Juice is acidic and contains sugars, but proper oral hygiene, including rinsing, cleaning, and using straws, can mitigate these risks.

The nutrients and bioactives in juice can also benefit oral health.

Comparing whole fruits to juice is challenging because they serve different purposes.

The Indian dietary guidelines recommend water as the preferred beverage, assuming essential nutrients are obtained from food.

Whether to eat or drink your fruits and vegetables depends on what fits best into your diet and lifestyle.

Smoothies and juices are not a magic solution and don't work as a "cleanse" or detox.

However, given the low levels of fruit and vegetable consumption in society, having accessible, cheap, and tasty ways to obtain nutrients and bioactives should not be discouraged.

#### Sensex, Nifty close at fresh lifetime highs on gains in ICICI Bank, Infosys



**MUMBAI:** Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty ticked higher to close at fresh all-time high levels on Thursday, following buying in market heavyweights ICICI Bank, Infosys and TCS amid a largely positive trend in global equities. The 30-share BSE Sensex scaled an intraday record high of 80,392.64 in early trade. The index pared most of the gains later due to volatility and profit-taking by investors at record levels. Sensex closed 62.87 points or 0.08 per cent higher at 80,049.67, its all-time closing high. The broader Nifty also hit an intra-day record high of 24,401 in early trade before closing almost flat. The 50-issue index rose by 15.65

points or 0.06 per cent to settle at a record 24,302.15 with 23 of its shares closing higher and 27 with losses. 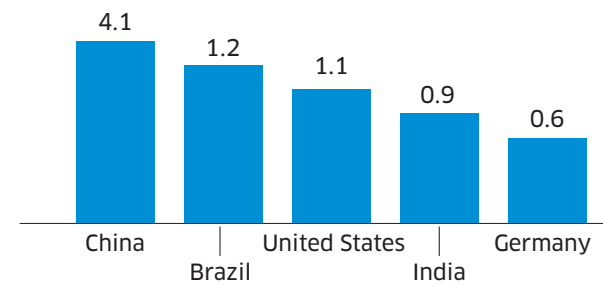

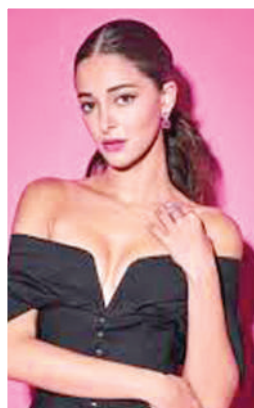

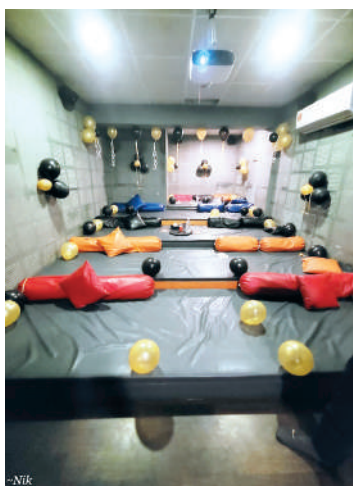

### Indian-origin schoolgirl chess prodigy to be youngest in England team

**LONDON:** Indian-origin schoolgirl chess prodigy to be youngest in England team London: Bodhana Sivanandan, a nine-year-old Indian-origin schoolgirl is set to make chess history after she became the youngest person selected to represent England internationally in any sport.

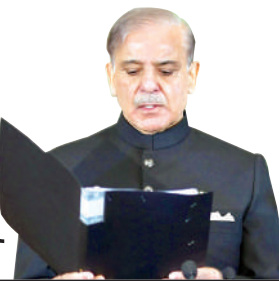

"I'm an engineering graduate, as is my wife, but I'm not good at chess," he said. Bodhana first picked up chess during the pandemic lockdown when Siva's friend was going back to India and gave her a few bags which also had a chess board.

# Isolate countries that provide safe havens to terrorism: India

Delivering PM Narendra Modi's remarks at the SCO Council Summit External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar recalled that one of the original goals of the SCO is to combat terrorism.

**ASTANA:** India on Thursday asked the international community to “isolate and expose” those countries that harbour terrorists, provide safe havens and condone terrorism, saying that if left unchecked, terrorism can become a major threat to regional and global peace, in a veiled jibe at China and Pakistan.

Delivering Prime Minister Narendra Modi's remarks at the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Council of Heads of State Summit in the Kazakhstan capital Astana, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, who was physically present at the meeting, recalled that one of the original goals of the SCO is to combat terrorism.

“Many of us have had our experiences, often originating beyond our borders. Let us be clear

“Cross-border terrorism requires a decisive response and terrorism financing and recruitment must be resolutely countered. We should also take proactive steps to prevent the spread of radicalisation among our youth,” he said.

## France's govt spokesperson attacked on the campaign trail

**PARIS:** Just days before a high-stakes legislative election, French government spokesperson Prisca Thevenot was attacked on the campaign trail, officials said on Thursday.

Thevenot, a candidate for the Macron-led centrist alliance Ensemble, her deputy and a party activist were putting up electoral posters near Paris on Wednesday night ahead of the July 7 legislative election when a group attacked them, Prime Minister Gabriel Attal said on the social media platform X.

Media outlets reported that Thevenot was not injured and will continue to campaign, but her deputy and the party activist were taken to a hospital. It was not immediately clear what type of injuries they suffered.

# Ukraine's army retreats as Russia seizes Chasiv Yar

A spokesperson for Ukraine's military said its army has retreated from Chasiv Yar, a strategically important town, which has been reduced to rubble under Russian assault.

**KYIV:** A spokesperson for Ukraine's military said its army has retreated from a neighbourhood in the outskirts of Chasiv Yar, a strategically important town in the eastern Donetsk region which has been reduced to rubble under a months-long Russian assault.

Chasiv Yar lies a short distance west Bakhmut, which was captured by Russia last year after a bitter 10-month battle. For months, Russian

forces have focused on capturing Chasiv Yar, a town

which occupies a strategic, elevated location. The Ukrainian army retreated from a northeastern neighbourhood in the town of Chasiv Yar, with homes and municipal offices charred, and a town that once had a population of 12,000 has been left deserted.

## Philippine army warns China of retaliation

**MANILA:** Philippine forces will defend themselves with “the same level of force” if they come under assault again from China's coast guard in the disputed South China Sea, where Chinese personnel armed with machetes and spears injured Filipino navy personnel and damaged two

of their boats in a chaotic faceoff last month, the Philippine military chief said on Thursday.

Armed Forces of the Philippines chief Gen. Romeo Brawner Jr. asked China to pay 60 million pesos (USD 1 million) in damages for the two navy boats and return seven rifles which he said were seized by Chinese coast guard personnel during



the June 17 confrontation at Second Thomas Shoal.

Philippine officials relayed the demands, along with a strong protest, during talks with a Chinese government delegation in Manila. The Chinese delegation did not immediately respond to the demands, a Philippine official told The Associated Press on condition

of anonymity because of not being authorized to discuss the sensitive issue publicly.

The Philippine military may also ask China to pay for planned surgery on the hand of a navy officer who lost his right thumb during the clash in the shoal when it was hit by a Chinese navy vessel that rammed his boat, Brawner said.

## Palestinian death toll crosses 38,000

**DEIR AL-BALAH:** The Health Ministry in Hamas-run Gaza said Thursday that the Palestinian death toll from nearly nine months of war has surged past 38,000. The ministry said that in the last 24 hours, the bodies of 58 people had been brought to hospitals, bringing the overall death toll to 38,011.

## Israel weighs Hamas' latest response to Gaza cease-fire proposal

**TEL AVIV:** Israel's Cabinet was set to convene Thursday to discuss Hamas' latest response to a US-backed proposal for a phased cease-fire in Gaza, as diplomatic efforts aimed at ending the nine-month war stirred back to life after a weeklong hiatus.

Fighting, meanwhile, intensified between Israel and Lebanon's Hezbollah, with the militant group saying it fired more than 200 rockets and exploding drones into northern Israel to avenge the killing of a senior commander in an Israeli airstrike the day before.

The relatively low-level conflict has literally set the border ablaze and raised fears of a potentially even more devastating war in the Middle East. Hezbollah has said it will halt its attacks if there is a cease-fire between Hamas – a fellow Iran-backed ally – and Israel. **PTI**

Maros Zilinka said in a statement that the suspect identified only as JC, who was originally charged with attempted murder, now faces the additional charges. **PTI**

## Indian Navy chief meets B'desh Army chief; discusses new avenues for cooperation



**DHAKA:** Indian Navy chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi has met with the newly-appointed army chief of Bangladesh General Waker-Uz-Zaman, and discussed the robust bilateral ties and explored new avenues for cooperation between the two armed forces.

Admiral Tripathi began a five-day visit to Bangladesh on June 30 to consolidate the bilateral defence engagement and explore new avenues of cooperation in the maritime domain. This visit is Admiral Tripathi's first official visit abroad after he took the reins of the Navy two months ago.

“During his ongoing visit to Bangladesh, Adm Dinesh K Tripathi, CNS, interacted with General Waker-Uz-Zaman, Chief of the Army Staff, Bangladesh Army, at Bangladesh Army Headquarters, Dhaka,” the spokesperson for the Indian Navy said in a post X on Thursday.

“The two principals discussed longstanding and robust ties between the two nations and initiatives for enhancing defence cooperation and exploring further avenues in areas of training and joint exercises between the armed forces of Bangladesh and India,” the post said. **PTI**

## Japanese man sentenced to 17.5 yrs in jail in Singapore for rape

**KUALA LUMPUR:** A Japanese hairstylist has been sentenced to 17.5 years in prison and 20 strokes of the cane in Singapore for what the judge described as a “brutal and cruel” assault and rape of a drunk student five years ago, his lawyer said on Thursday. Kita Ikko, 39, pleaded guilty on Monday to one

charge of rape, one charge of sexual assault by penetration, and one charge of making an obscene film, defence lawyer Adrian Wee told. The Kyodo News Agency cited the Japanese Embassy in Singapore as saying that Kita is set to be the first Japanese person to be sentenced to caning in Singapore.
