In a special ceremony in St. Andrew Hall, President Putin conferred the award on Modi.

MOSCOW: Prime Minister Narendra Modi was on Tuesday officially conferred the 'Order of St Andrew the Apostle' award by Russian President Vladimir Putin for his contribution to fostering bilateral ties between the two countries.

In a special ceremony in St. Andrew Hall in the Kremlin, President Putin conferred the award on Prime Minister Modi. The award was announced in 2019. Prime Minister Modi is the first Indian leader to be conferred with this award, which was established in 1698 by Tsar Peter the Great in honour of Saint Andrew, the first apostle of Jesus and patron saint of Russia. While accepting the award, Prime Minister Modi dedicated it to the people of India and to the traditional bonds of friendship between India and Russia. He further



Smart Electricity Meters to be installed in every household

Prepaid recharge system introduced, to be installed free of cost

RAIPUR: In a significant move towards modernization, Chhattisgarh is set to install smart electricity meters in every household, allowing consumers to recharge their meters like prepaid mobile phones, DGH, and broadband. This initiative is rapidly progressing across the state, including Raipur, aiming to streamline electricity consumption and billing.

With over 54 lakh consumers in the state, these smart meters will function similarly to mobile SIM cards. Consumers will need to recharge their meters based on a fixed package, and their electricity consumption will be limited

Electricity supply will not be interrupted if the recharge gets over at

to the amount recharged. The electricity supply will stop once the recharge is depleted, much like mobile services cease when the balance is exhausted. However, power supply will not be interrupted at night if the recharge runs out, allowing consumers to recharge the next morning.

Officials from the Chhattisgarh State Power Distribution Company Limited (CSPDCL) stated that the entire system would become automatic with the installation of smart meters. Currently, these meters are being installed in various colonies on a trial basis to address issues related to outstanding electricity bills.

Consumers will receive weekly SMS updates on their recharge budget and alerts when the balance is low, three times a week.

Major negligence in Raipur **Central Jail: prisoner serving** life sentence released

RAIPUR: A major lapse has occurred in Raipur Central Jail, where a prisoner serving a life sentence was mistakenly released without government permission. The prisoner, Mahavir Satnam, who was convicted of murder, was released and remained free for eight days before being recaptured and returned to jail. This incident has caused a significant stir within the jail.

Mahavir Satnam, a resident of Madwa village in Balodabazar district, had been imprisoned for 14 years. The error came to light when jail employees realized the paperwork was incomplete, leading to his re-arrest. In response to this serious oversight, action has been taken against three jail employees. Notices have been issued to Assistant Jail Superintendent Khushboo Mishra, Deputy Jail Superintendent Mokhnath Pradhan, and Head Guard Lekhram Dhruv by Jail Superintendent Amit Shandilya. The incident underscores the critical need for stringent procedures and oversight within the prison system to prevent such negligent occurrences in the future.



Delhi HC refuses to reject plea against election of **AAP MLA Durgesh Pathak**

The petition has challenged Pathak's election as a lawmaker from the Rajinder Nagar Assembly constituency here in the June 2022 by-polls on the grounds of indulging in corrupt practices. Pathak was declared as a winner from Rajinder Nagar constituency by defeating his nearest rival by a margin of 11,468 votes.

Justice Yashwant Varma, in a 103page order passed on Monday, dismissed the application of Pathak seeking rejection of the election petition filed against him, saying there was no justification to do so at this stage. BAHRAICH (UP): Six nurses have been suspended after a video of them playing with a monkey while on duty at a government women's hospital here went viral on social media, officials said on Tuesday.

In the viral video, some nurses are seen playing with a baby monkey while sitting on hospital chairs wearing aprons. Dr M M Tripathi, Chief Medical Superintendent of Maharishi Balark Hospital, run under Maharaja Suheldev Autonomous State Medical College, on Tuesday said the staff nurses were posted in the the hosdepartment. Taking cognisance of the viral video, Sanjay Khatri, Principal of the medical college, suspended all six of them -- Anjali, Kiran Singh, Aanchal Shukla, Priya Richard, Poonam Pandey and Sandhya Singh -- on July 5, Tripathi said.

A five-member committee of doctors is investigating the matter, the doctor added. "The image of the medical college is being tarnished due to the video that went viral on social media due to these nurses making reels with a monkey during duty hours and being negligent in their work," pital's gynaecology and obstetrics principal said in his order. Man threatens to jump from 5th floor of Mantralaya building; held

MUMBAI: A dramatic scene unfolded at the Mantralaya here on Tuesday as a 55-year-old man threatened to jump off a fifth floor window, triggering panic for about half-an-hour before he was detained by police. Kathua attack: DGP reviews ongoing search operation

JAMMU: A massive search operation was underway on Tuesday to track down the terrorists behind the deadly attack on an Army patrol party in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district, as Director General of Police R R Swain flew to the area to oversee the operation on the ground.

The bodies of the five soldiers killed in the attack have been handed over to the Army after postmortem and were airlifted to their homes for last rites, officials said.

Accompanied ADGP Anand Jain, DGP Swain conducted an

aerial survey of the area and reviewed the ongoing operations, they said.

The scope of the search operation has expanded encompass large areas in the adjoining districts of Udhampur and Kathua, including Basantgarh, Seoj (a high-altitude area in Udhampur), and the upper reaches of Bani, Daggar, and Kindli in Kathua district.

Special forces of the Indian Army's 'Para' unit have been deployed to conduct surgical operations against the terrorists in specific areas, the officials said.

PIL alleging nonfunctional statutory panels closed in J&K

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday closed the proceedings on a PIL, which claimed non-functional statutory panels exist in Jammu and Kashmir, after being told by the union Territory administration that these are now functional and the powers of some like the State Human Rights Commission are being exercised by the NHRC.

The top court had earlier issued notices to the Centre on the 2020 PIL, filed by Pune-based lawyer Asim Suhas Sarode, and sought the assistance of Solicitor General Tushar Mehta in deciding it. Railways to build 10,000 non-AC coaches

NEW DELHI: The Indian Railways has said it will manufacture 10,000 non-AC coaches over the next two fiscal years. "This initiative aims to enhance facilities for common railway passengers. In the next two years, the overall count of non-AC coaches will be increased by 22 per cent," the Northern Railway said in a statement.

NEET-UG 2024 scandal: Ensuring exam integrity

he recent leak of the NEET-UG 2024 question paper has raised significant concerns about the integrity of one of India's most critical entrance examinations. The Supreme Court's involvement underscores the gravity of the situation. If the sanctity of the NEET exam is compromised, it is imperative to consider a re-test to maintain the credibility of the selection process. Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud's emphasis on understanding the extent of the breach and identifying the beneficiaries is crucial. The National Testing Agency (NTA) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) must provide a comprehensive report on the leak's timing and scope, as well as the methodologies employed by the wrongdoers. The identification of the culprits and the geographical spread of the beneficiaries are essential steps toward restoring faith in the examination system. The significant number of perfect scores this year, particularly the unprecedented 67 students scoring 720 out of 720, raises red flags. Historical data shows that such a high concentration of perfect scores is anomalous, suggesting potential manipulation. This anomaly further necessitates a thorough investigation and possibly a re-test to ensure fairness. Moreover, the NTA must transparently disclose the steps taken to address these irregularities. The Supreme Court's suggestion of a multi-disciplinary team of experts to prevent future breaches is commendable. Such a team could develop robust mechanisms to safeguard the examination process against digital leaks and impersonation. While the Centre and NTA argue that canceling the exam could jeopardize the future of many honest candidates, the long-term damage to the credibility of NEET is a more significant concern. The integrity of the exam process is paramount, and any breach, if left unaddressed, undermines public trust. The NEET-UG scandal serves as a wake-up call for systemic reform. Ensuring the integrity of entrance examinations is not just about immediate corrective measures but also about building a resilient system that can withstand future challenges. It is essential to balance the interests of all candidates while upholding the principles of fairness and transparency.

Air pollution: A growing global health crisis for children

The State of Global Air (SoGA) 2024 report, released by the Health Effects Institute (HEI) and UNICEF, highlights air pollution as a major global health threat. It is now the second leading cause of child deaths worldwide, surpassing poor sanitation and inadequate clean water. In 2021, air pollution caused 8.1 million deaths,

including nearly 464 daily deaths of children under five in India. Noncommunicable diseases like heart disease, stroke, diabetes, lung cancer, and COPD are linked to this pollution. The climate crisis exacerbates air quality issues through severe droughts, wildfires, and dust storms. Children, particularly vulnerable, suffer from premature

birth, low birth weight, asthma, and lifelong respiratory diseases due to pollutants like ozone and PM2.5. The report stresses the urgent need for global action to mitigate air pollution's harmful effects, emphasizing the importance of reducing emissions, improving air quality standards, and protecting public health to save lives and combat climate change.

Congress cracking under severe cold war in Karnataka

arnataka, under Congress governance headed Siddaramaiah, is following Nehruvian secular principles, but it is damaging its own government, which just completed a year in office. Nehru believed that religious divide is dangerous, whereas caste division is acceptable. Following that dictum, the Karnataka Congress won the May 2023 election, accusing the BJP of propagating Hindu vs. Muslim politics. The corrupt image of the BJP government under Basavaraj Bommai also helped Congress secure 135 out of 224 assembly seats.

After winning, Congress unleashed its caste agenda, playing one caste against the other to settle internal leadership tussles. This caste politics, coupled with corruption, including a minister resigning over a cooperative scam, restricted the party to 9 Lok Sabha seats in the state. Post-Lok Sabha election, a storm started brewing among CM Siddaramaiah, Deputy CM D.K. Shivakumar (DKS), and Mallikarjuna Kharge, pulling the party in different directions. Congress leaders in the state are unsure of coming back to power in the 2028 elections, leading to a scramble for positions in the next four years. Hence, the cold war between CM Siddaramaiah and his deputy DKS. Though publicly cordial, they engage in a high-intensity cold war through political maneuvers.

Before Mallikarjuna Kharge expressed his intention to return to state politics, DKS, the chief strategist and financier for Congress, was a contender for the CM post. The high command reportedly brokered a deal to share the CM post, with Siddaramaiah serving the first half and DKS the second. However, Siddaramaiah, not ready to vacate the CM seat, denied such a deal. Confident of Congress' victory in Lok Sabha elections, he aimed for a national role. To checkmate DKS, Siddaramaiah worked against DKS's political interests, planning his brother's defeat in the Lok Sabha election and reducing DKS's influence in Vokkaliga strongholds. Many seats in the Vokkaliga-dominant Old Mysore area

went to D.K. Kumaraswamy, now a cabinet minister in the Modi government, thus diminishing DKS's stature.

Siddaramaiah's supporters demanded three more deputy CMs to dilute DKS's significance. In response, Vokkaliga Swamiji Chandrasekhara urged Siddaramaiah to step down for DKS. To counter, other Congress factions rallied Lingayat leaders to push for a Lingayat CM.

This caste-based power struggle escalated, with Siddaramaiah's supporters warning of severe consequences, including the party's downfall in Karnataka if he was replaced. They also invoked the party's "one man, one post" policy to challenge DKS's dual roles as Deputy CM and state party president.

This internal discord has left the administration rudderless. Karnataka faces financial challenges, with a large portion of the budget allocated to six populist guarantees. Public dissatisfaction is rising due to increased prices for milk and fuel, and impending hikes in taxes on water and liquor to

fund these schemes. The middle class is particularly discontented, doubting the effectiveness of freebies, especially after Andhra Pradesh CM Jagan's defeat despite similar policies. As Siddaramaiah approaches the midpoint of his term, the leadership struggle is expected to intensify, further destabilizing the Congress government.

Siddaramaiah's coalition (Muslims, backward castes, and Dalits) remains a significant force, but even this support base is showing signs of strain. The coalition is becoming increasingly restless with the ongoing power struggles and lack of clear direction in the government's policies If the Congress high command does not address these issues soon, it could face severe electoral setbacks.

The upcoming state budget will be a critical test for Siddaramaiah's leadership, as he needs to balance populist promises with fiscal responsibility. The ongoing leadership tussle and financial mismanagement may erode public trust, making it difficult for Congress to retain power in the next election.

Focus on present for better governance

Effective governance demands focus on the present, learning from past mistakes without dwelling on them, and addressing current issues to safeguard democracy. by Sujit De



Balance between learning from the past and addressing present issues for effective governance

The present is the only area where a person has an option to work. Bhagavad Gita says, "You are only entitled to the action, never to its fruits." But we are entitled to the action only in the present. Therefore, the present is all that matters. It will become past and can take care of the future. This is a simple truth. Lord Buddha famously said, "Do not dwell in the past, do not dream of the future, concentrate the mind on the present moment."

However, to study the past is not dwelling in the past. It is for taking appropriate actions in the present and not to repeat a mistake of the past. It is not for living in the past but for making the present actions more prudent. For example, the study on the Holocaust is done all over the world not to abuse the Germans but to tell the world leaders not to repeat the dangerous act of demonising

the members of a religion. Germans have learned their lessons from the Holocaust and have thrown any trace of Nazism into a dustbin. Recently, Germany has withdrawn jerseys with number 44 immediately after it was pointed out that there was a resemblance between that number and the stylized SS used by Nazi Party's Schutzstaffel group.

The Holocaust should be discussed to prevent any kind of totalitarian inclination of a government and any attempt to demonise a minority community that happened during the Nazi regime. But to invoke the Holocaust to criticise the Germans, who themselves are ashamed of it, is totally unacceptable.

Former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi publicly apologised for all the mistakes and excesses committed during the Emergency and declared that she was taking "the entire responsibility for the same". To criticise the

Congress now for the Emergency that happened nearly fifty years ago and for which its leader had sought public apology long ago, could only be compared with flogging a dead horse.

Given the people in power are to take action, they should not dwell in the past and remain in the present. They need to concentrate on how to safeguard our constitution now in 2024 rather than dwelling in the distant past period of the 1975 Emergency.

A government in a democratic country gets the mandate from the people to

govern. Similarly, the opposition MPs get the mandate from the people to make the government answerable to the people and to critically review every government

parliamentary democracy, opposition parties are there to have checks and balances on the government to prevent it from becoming a totalitarian one. It is said, "dissent is the highest form of patriotism". It means dissent is necessary to protect democracy, and democracy is necessary to protect the nation. The people in power need to concentrate on how to safeguard our constitution now in 2024 by not gagging the voice of dissent by misusing technology and the UAPA.

India is ranked 159 out of the 180 countries in the 2024 World Press Freedom Index A few months ago, several iournalists from across the country had written to the Chief Justice of India. They observed, "Journalism cannot be prosecuted as terrorism" and the invocation of the UAPA was "especially chilling".

Also, the people in power must focus on the pressing problems of the present, like rising inequality, unemployment, inflation, train accidents, question paper leaks, airport roof and bridge collapse, highway cave-in corruption, and pollution. It would be equally damaging for all of us if they start dreaming about the future as distant as 2047.

In conclusion, focusing on the present is crucial for effective governance and safeguarding democracy. While learning from the past is essential, dwelling on it or dreaming excessively about the future can distract from addressing pressing current issues like inequality, unemployment, and corruption, ensuring a better, more just

PNB introduces **Safety Ring mechanism** to enhance security

NEW DELHI: State-owned Punjab National Bank (PNB) on Tuesday introduced a new security feature 'Safety Ring' within its internet banking system and mobile banking system in response to the increasing number of cyber frauds. This mechanism provides an additional safety layer to minimise potential losses in case of unauthorised access by fraudsters, PNB said in a statement. Safety Ring is an optional feature that allows customers to set a daily transaction limit with respect to term deposits (TDs) on online closure or availing overdraft facility on TDs up to the set limit amount, it said. The limit set by the customer should be the consolidated digital channels limit up to which the customer can close the TD or avail overdraft facility on TD, it said. Once set, it said, the safety feature 'Safety Ring' ensures that TD cannot be closed, withdrawn, or used for loans (overdraft) beyond the customer-defined limit through any digital channels.

Govt may relax payment rule for MSMEs in Budget

NEW DELHI: The government may relax the requirement of making payments to MSMEs within 45 days of buying goods and services to check large corporate from looking at other sourcing avenues, sources said. The announcement to this effect could be made in the Budget likely

to be presented on July 23. The government is considering suggestions regarding changes to Section 43B(h) of the Income Tax Act made by MSMEs during pre-Budget consultations, sources said. The government in last year's Budget added a new clause under Section 43B of the Income Tax Act to address the challenge of delayed payments faced



by MSMEs in the country. According to Section 43B(h) of the Income Tax Act, introduced through the Finance Act 2023, if a larger company does not pay an MSME on time

-- within 45 days in case of written agreements -- it cannot deduct that expense from its taxable income, leading to potentially higher taxes. MSMEs fear that due

to this provision, large buyers could cold-shoulder MSME suppliers and start buying either from those MSMEs that are not registered with Udyam or from non-MSMEs. The





Taliban's morality police contributing to a climate of fear: UN

NEW YORK: The Taliban's morality police are contributing to a climate of fear and intimidation among Afghans, according to a UN report published Tuesday. Edicts and some of the methods used to enforce them constituted a violation of human rights and fundamental freedoms, the report said. The Taliban set up a ministry for the "propagation of virtue and the prevention of vice" after seizing power in 2021. Since then, the ministry has enforced decrees issued by the Taliban leadership that have a disproportionate impact on women and girls, like dress codes, segregated education and employment, and having a male guardian when they travel. "The punishments attached to non-compliance with instructions and decrees are often arbitrary, severe and disproportionate," said the report from the UN Mission in Afghanistan. PTI

Rescuers search for dozens buried in an Indonesian landslide



JAKARTA: Rescue workers searched for dozens of missing people Tuesday, digging through tons of mud and the rubble left by a landslide that hit an unauthorized traditional gold mining area on Indonesia's Sulawesi island and killed at least 11 people. More than 100 villagers were digging for grains of gold Sunday in the remote and hilly village of Bone Bolango when tons of mud plunged down the surrounding hills and buried their makeshift camps, said Heriyanto, head of the provincial Search and Rescue Office. DUBAI: A suspected attack by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeted a ship in the Gulf of Aden on Tuesday, the latest assault blamed on the group on the crucial maritime trade route. The captain of the ship reported an explosion in close proximity to the vessel off the coast of Nishtun, Yemen, close to the country's border with Oman, the British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations centre said. The ship, whose name and flag were not released, and all crew are safe, the UKMTO said in a warning to mariners. The explosion took place in the far-

thest reaches of the waterway earlier targeted by the rebels, the centre said.

It did not elaborate on what caused the explosion, though the Houthis have been known to use drones and missiles as well as bomb-carrying drone boats. The Houthis did not immediately comment. It can take hours or even days before they acknowledge carrying out an attack. The last reported Houthi attack in the region took place June 28.

The rebels have targeted more than 60 vessels by firing missiles and drones in their campaign that has killed a total of four sailors. **PTI**

Interim UK Oppn Leader Sunak names shadow Cabinet

LONDON: Rishi Sunak, the interim UK Opposition Leader until his Conservative Party finalises the process to choose his successor, has named a shadow Cabinet who will take their place in the House of Commons as the new members of Parliament begin being sworn in on Tuesday.



The 44-year-old British Indian leader had to contend with some high-profile resignations and missing Tory MPs who lost their seats in the party's worst electoral defeat in last week's general election, which the Labour Party won with a landslide. David Cameron, a former prime minister who was parachuted into the House of Lords by Sunak

resigned and the portfolio will now be shadowed by his former deputy Andrew Mitchell. "It's been a huge honour to serve as foreign secretary, but clearly the Conservative Party in Opposition will need to shadow the new foreign secretary from the Commons," said Cameron in a social media post.
