





Captain among 4 soldiers killed in Doda encounter

This was the third major encounter between security forces and terrorists in the forests of Doda.

JAMMU: Four army personnel, including a captain, died after being injured in a gunfight with heavily armed terrorists in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Tuesday while reinforcements were rushed in to track and neutralize the militants.

Those killed in the encounter have been identified as Captain Brijesh Thapa, Naik D Rajesh, Sepoy Bijendra and Sepoy Ajay, they said. This was the third major encounter between security forces and terrorists in the forests of Doda district in the past three weeks. The latest incident comes a week after a terrorist ambush on an Army patrol in the remote Machedi forest belt in Kathua district claimed the lives of five soldiers and injured as many. Troops of the Rashtriya Rifles and Special Operations Group of Jammu and



The Army's 16 Corps, also known as White Knight Corps, in a post on 'X' late on Monday night, said, "Based on specific intelligence inputs, a joint operation by Indian Army and JKP was in progress in the general area North of Doda. Contact with terrorists was established tonight at about 2100 hrs in which heavy firefight ensued."

"Initial reports suggest injuries to our bravehearts. Additional troops have been moved into the area. Operations are continuing," it said.

Order issued to present **Gangster Aman Sahu in** Raipur Court on July 22

RAIPUR: Despite a court order to present Jharkhand gangster Aman Sahu in Raipur court on July 22, Raipur police are facing significant challenges in bringing him to the city. Sahu, who is involved in extortion activities targeting coal traders and road contractors in Raipur, remains out of their custody.

Raipur police have made two unsuccessful attempts to bring Sahu, who is currently incarcerated in Garhwa and subsequently Giridih jail in Jharkhand. Both attempts were thwarted by local police and jail authorities, who cited the numerous ongoing cases against Sahu in Jharkhand as the reason for denying his transfer. The latest attempt to secure Sahu's presence in Raipur follows a recent shooting incident outside the office of road contractor Prahlad Rai Agarwal on July 13. This attack, attributed to Sahu's associates, has heightened the urgency for Raipur police to bring the gangster to the city.







INDIA bloc's resurgence: A turning point in power politics

month after its impressive performance in the Lok Sabha polls, the INDIA bloc has made sig-**▲**nificant strides, winning 10 out of 13 seats in the Assembly by-elections across seven states. This is a noteworthy achievement for the Congress, which secured four seats—two each in Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. The Trinamool Congress (TMC) swept all four seats in West Bengal, while the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) clinched the Jalandhar West seat in Punjab. The DMK emerged victorious in the Vikrayandi constituency in Tamil Nadu. In contrast, the BJP managed to win just one seat each in Himachal Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh, with an independent candidate securing a seat in Bihar. The victories in Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh are particularly encouraging for the Congress, as it had previously faced a significant defeat in these states during the Lok Sabha elections. Similarly, AAP's win in Punjab comes as a relief, following its modest performance in the parliamentary elections. Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu and Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann can now breathe a sigh of relief. The TMC and DMK, ruling parties in West Bengal and Tamil Nadu respectively, have further solidified their positions with these wins. For the BJP, these losses represent another setback after failing to secure a majority in the Lower House. The defeats in Uttarakhand, where the party currently holds power, are particularly striking given their previous dominance in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls. These by-election results signal a promising future for the resurgent Opposition, which has recently asserted its presence in Parliament. The INDIA bloc is poised to challenge the BJP in upcoming Assembly elections in Haryana and Maharashtra. However, the Opposition must remain vigilant and avoid complacency, as the BJP has a history of overcoming electoral challenges. The BJP now faces the task of conducting an honest introspection to understand the reasons behind their setbacks and to strategize effective course corrections. The changing political landscape suggests a dynamic and unpredictable path ahead. emphasizing the need for both sides to adapt and evolve in response to the electorate's shifting preferences.

Last December, the IBA formally requested the Department of Financial Supervision,

declare all Saturdays as public holidays, citing increased automation and the 24×7 availability of banking services. Previously, only the second and fourth Saturdays were bank holidays. Bank unions have highlighted the growing stress among bank employees and the practicality of online

Generally, if a country's land area is large and resources are abundant, a growing population can support development and help realize the vision of an advanced nation, provided that the population is productive. However, if the population exceeds available resources, numerous problems can arise.



NEW **DELHI:** Twowheeler sales in India are expected to grow around 6-8 per cent this fiscal and could reach the peak level of 2018-19 either in the fourth quarter or the beginning of next financial year, a top official of Bajaj Auto said on Tuesday.

The rising commodity prices, specially natural rubber, have forced the company to increase prices in beginning of this month. "The market sentiment is quite positive in both rural and urban areas. Our expectation is that the two-wheeler market should grow around 6-8 per cent this year," Bajaj

In 2018-19, domestic two-wheeler sales were at 2.12 crore units. In FY24, domestic two-wheeler sales were at 1.8 crore units, according to Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers data. One of the key factors driving growth of two-wheeler sales is the bounce back of retail financing, he said.

"Things have been on an upswing in retail finance with 75 per cent of two-wheeler purchases are getting financed today as compared to 65 per cent around the same time last year," he added. When asked about impact of rising commodity prices, Sharma said, "We have taken price hikes on July 1 in both domestic and internal markets. The impact of this is around 2-3 per cent." Currently it is at a manageable level, he added.

Beyond the severe pain in his right ankle on Sunday night in Miami Gardens, the tears on the face of Argentina's captain showed a deeper anguish. Argentina successfully defended its South American title with a hard-fought 1-0 extra-time win against Colombia. 

playing with, he's somebody who's more agile, more explosive on that surface.

Scientists have confirmed a cave on the moon that could be used to shelter future explorers



CAPE CANAVERAL (US): Scientists have confirmed a cave on the moon, not far from where Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landed 55 years ago, and suspect there are hundreds more that could house future astronauts.

An Italian-led team reported Monday that there's evidence for a sizable cave accessible from the deepest known pit on the moon. It's located at the Sea of Tranquility, just 250 miles (400 km) from Apollo 11's landing site.

The pit, like the more than 200 others discovered up there, was created by the collapse of a lava tube.


Researchers analysed radar mea-

surements by NASA's Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter, and compared the results with lava tubes on Earth. Their findings appeared in the journal Nature Astronomy. The radar data reveals only the initial part of the underground cavity, according to the scientists. They estimate it's at least 130 feet (40 metres) wide and tens of yards (metres) long, probably more.

"Lunar caves have remained a mystery for over 50 years. So it was exciting to be able to finally prove the existence" of one, Leonardo Carrer and Lorenzo Bruzzone of the University of Trento, wrote in an email. PTI
