

6 accused arrested by police in firing incident, pistol, cartridges recovered

RAIPUR: Police has arrested 6 accused in the firing incident outside PRA India Pvt. Ltd. located near Ring Road No. 01 Udyog Bhawan Telibandha under Telibandha police station area on July 13. Two masked persons attacked with pistols and fled, after which a case was registered against unknown accused.



Despite the appointment of eight medical officers on contract to serve various areas, most have left due to exams and other commitments, leaving only three doctors who are also set to leave soon. This shortage has resulted in the majority of patients, from accident victims to those with other ailments, being referred

lack of doctors, the hospital is operating with only one dresser, whose absence at night forces contracted peons and sweepers to handle dressing wounds, potentially endangering patients. The 30-bed facility also struggles with cleanliness due to the absence of a responsible peon, leading to unsanitary conditions.

One of the most pressing issues is the water shortage, a problem that has persisted since before the hospital's construction. Despite efforts by the Public Health Engineering (PHE) department to supply water through a pipeline, the thin pipe and weak motor fail to deliver sufficient water. The hospital has yet to benefit from the city's Brahmin community's offer to provide water from their private bore.

'BSF on high alert for situation due to B'desh unrest

Anti-quota agitations in the neighbouring country have left more than 100 dead, prompting the government to enforce a curfew to tackle the volatile situation.

AGARTALA: The Border Security Force (BSF) is on high alert to deal with any situation that may arise due to the prevailing unrest in neighbouring Bangladesh, a top official said on Sunday.



he unrest in Bangladesh, sparked by a contentious job-quota system, has prompted the repatriation of 978 Indian nationals, underscoring the necessity of swift and decisive action during crises. As violence escalated, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and the Indian High Commission in Dhaka stepped up to ensure the safe return of our citizens. The situation in Bangladesh deteriorated rapidly, necessitating the imposition of a curfew to curb the violence. Amidst this chaos, the MEA's coordinated efforts provided a lifeline for Indians trapped in the conflict zones. Of the 978 returnees, 778 opted for the land route, while 200 chose to fly back. They not only facilitated safe passage to border crossings but also liaised with civil aviation authorities and commercial airlines to maintain uninterrupted flight services. The meticulous planning extended to ensuring smooth immigration procedures at designated border crossings such as Benapole-Petrapole, Gede-Darshana, and Akhaura-Agartala. The involvement of the Border Security Force (BSF) and land port authorities was crucial in guaranteeing a seamless transit for those opting for the land route. The MEA's proactive stance is further highlighted by their regular contact with over 4,000 students still in Bangladesh. These students, some from Nepal and Bhutan, were provided necessary assistance and reassurances, ensuring their safety and well-being during such turbulent times. This operation underscores the importance of preparedness and swift action in safeguarding the interests of Indian nationals abroad. It is a testament to the unwavering commitment of our diplomatic and administrative machinery, ensuring that even in the face of adversity, the safety and security of our citizens remain paramount.

Sedentary habits growing, health problems escalating

ealth and illness in a country are not solely Ldetermined by the availability of medical facilities, hospitals, or doctors. A significant factor is the daily routine of individuals, which often neglects health-related guidelines, thereby increasing the likelihood of falling ill. Studies have shown that with increasing wealth, people in our country have become more negligent about their health. A recent study published in 'The Lancet Global Health' highlights this issue, revealing that Indians lag behind many other countries in terms of physical activity. Conducted between 2000 and 2022 across 197 countries, the study aimed to measure the level of physical activity in the daily routines of adult citizens. The study assessed 507 surveys from 163 countries, representing 93 percent of the world's population. The findings are alarming: there has been a global decline in physical activity, but the figures for high-income countries in the Asia Pacific region, including India, are particularly concerning. India

ranks second among countries showing a significant increase in adult inactivity. Approximately twenty-five years ago, 22 percent of Indian adults were considered inactive. This figure rose to 34 percent in 2010 and nearly 50 percent in 2022. Post-COVID, the physical activity of half of India's adults has almost come to a standstill, with expectations of this figure reaching 60 percent by 2030. Currently, 42 percent of men and 57 percent of women in India are physically inactive. This rise in inactivity among women is partly due to their shrinking role in household chores. Physical activity includes brisk walking, vigorous exercise, and other energy-burning activities. Globally, adult inactivity increased from 26.4 percent in 2010 to 31.3 percent today. The COVID-19 pandemic played a significant role in this increase. The trend of working from home became prevalent, reducing the necessity of leaving the house and contributing to physical inactivity. The culture of 'work from home' significantly diminished the need for office commutes,

further exacerbating the problem. Lack of physical activity leads to various health issues. Without regular exercise, fat accumulates in the body, which can damage organs, weaken the digestive system, and lead to obesity, high blood pressure, heart disease, and digestive disorders. These lifestyle diseases are emerging as a significant health crisis globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) reported in 2017 that 61 percent of non-infectious deaths in India were due to inactive lifestyles. The study estimated that approximately 1.4 billion people worldwide have low physical activity levels, with a significant portion being from India.

In contrast, countries like China and Australia have launched campaigns to promote physical activity. China's 'Healthy China 2030' campaign and Australia's target to make 15 percent of its citizens active by 2030 are commendable efforts. Britain aims to connect five lakh new people with exercise by 2030, and the USA has launched a campaign to connect a thousand cities with 'free fitness.' In India, however, this laziness is embedded in our lifestyle and work culture. The number of cars is continuously increasing, and people often use them even for short distances. E-commerce has brought the market to our doorsteps, reducing the need for physical exertion. As a result, people often remain sedentary, leading to an increase in lifestyle diseases. Despite medical advancements increasing the average human lifespan, people now suffer more from lifestyle diseases The 'Global Burden of Disease' study published in 'Lancet' in 2017 noted that people in wealthy countries recognize the importance of health and physical activity, whereas this awareness is lacking in countries like India. Consequently people in poorer and developing countries remain ill longer than those in richer countries Understanding the seriousness of these studies, Indians must urgently revise their daily routines to incorporate physical exertion. By doing so, we can combat the rising tide of lifestyle diseases and improve overall health and well-being.

SC's landmark decision on disability rights

The Supreme Court of India's landmark decision mandates the appointment of visually impaired candidates, underscoring the importance of disability rights and inclusion. by Ysah Pal Ralhan



The Supreme Court of India recently issued significant ruling regarding the implementation of the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) Act, 1995, highlighting systemic failures in protecting the rights of persons with disabilities. The case centered on Pankaj Kumar Srivastava, a 100 percent visually impaired candidate who cleared the Civil Services Examination (CSE) in 2009 but was denied an appointment. This decision marks a crucial milestone in the fight for disability rights

Srivastava's journey for justice began when he was excluded from the merit list for the PH-2 (Visually Impaired-VI) category, despite passing the written test and interview. In 2010, the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) directed the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) and the Department of Personnel and Training to calculate backlog vacancies as mandated by the PWD Act within six months. However, Srivastava's name remained absent from the merit list, leading to prolonged legal battles. The recent Supreme Court directive mandates the appointment of Srivastava and ten other visually impaired candidates against the backlog of vacancies for PWD candi-

The Supreme Court criti-

cized the Union of India for its gross default in promptly implementing the provisions of the PWD Act. The court noted that the government's stance at all stages had undermined the very purpose of enacting laws for the benefit of persons with disabilities. The court further stated that had the PWD Act been implemented in its true spirit, Srivastava would not have been forced to seek justice through prolonged legal battles. The Supreme Court exercised its jurisdiction under Article 142 of the Constitution of India, directing that necessary actions for appointments be taken within three months. These appointments will be made prospectively, and the

appointees will not be entitled to arrears of salary or seniority benefits. The court emphasized that these directions were issued as a onetime measure and should not be treated as a precedent for future cases. This judgement serves as a crucial reminder of the systemic negligence towards the rights of persons with disabilities in India. The PWD Act, designed to ensure equal opportunities and full participation for disabled individuals, has often seen lackluster implementation. The Supreme Court's stern stance underscores the need for immediate and comprehensive action by the government to rectify these lapses. The judgement also serves as

a wake-up call for the bureaucratic machinery to ensure that laws designed to protect marginalized groups are implemented effectively and without delay.

Beyond legal and bureaucratic implications, this judgement has significant social ramifications. It sends a strong message that the rights of people with disabilities cannot be overlooked or sidelined. It reaffirms the principle that every individual, regardless of their physical capabilities, deserves equal opportunities to contribute to and benefit from societal progress. The directive to consider Srivastava and other visually impaired candidates for appointment

underscores the importance of merit and capability over physical limitations. It challenges deep-seated prejudices and encourages a more inclusive and equitable approach to public ser vice recruitment. While the Supreme Court's judgement is a step in the right direction, it is just the beginning. Establishing robust mechanisms to monitor the implementation of disability rights laws, regular audits, and accountability frameworks can ensure compliance and address lapses promptly. Investment in accessible infrastructure and technologies that enable disabled individuals to partic ipate fully in educational, professional, and social activities is crucial. This includes making public spaces, transport, and digital platforms more accessible. It is time to review and update policies to address emerging challenges and incorporate best practices from around the world. This includes adopting more inclu sive recruitment practices and providing necessary accommodations during examinations and interviews. The Supreme Court's judgement is a landmark decision and a call to action for the government, public institutions, and society to ensure that persons with disabilities are not just protected by laws but are also empowered to live with dignity and equal opportunities.

Union Bank net profit rises 13.7 pc to 3,679 cr; challenges on margins

MUMBAI: State-owned Union Bank of India reported a 13.7 per cent growth in net profit to Rs 3,679 crore for the June 2024 quarter and flagged challenges on the net interest margin front. The bank's core net interest income grew 6.5 per cent to Rs 9,412 crore on the back of an 11.5 per cent growth in advances. Its net interest margin narrowed by over 0.13 per cent to 3.05 per cent. The other income increased 15.53 per cent to Rs 4,509 crore on healthy growth in the core fee income.

The net interest income and other income were down when compared to the March quarter, and the bank's managing director and chief executive A Manimekhalai attributed the same to a general tendency for a softer first quarter in the industry. Additionally, the reporting quarter also witnessed the general elections, which led to some slack, she added.

NEW DELHI: The adductor niggle that has trou-Neeraj Chopra in the past couple of months "is fine" now and the reigning Olympic champion has entered the high intensity phase of his Paris preparations, his German coach Klaus Bartonietz told PTI, dismissing concerns surrounding the Indian

The 26-year-old Chopra, who scripted history by winning the javelin throw gold at the Tokyo Olympics, is once again the country's best bet for a top podium finish in the Paris Games beginning on July 26.

But his season has been far from perfect in terms of fitness. Bartonietz, however, insisted that things are back on

"Everything is according to plan. At the moment, no issue with that (adductor niggle), it's fine, it looks good, hoping to remain like that till the Olympics," the coach, who has been with Chopra for close to five years, told PTI in an exclusive interview from



Antalya, Turkiye where they are currently based for training.

"It's just over two weeks left in the Olympics, so the intensity of training is high. He is having full throwing sessions."

Chopra withdrew from Ostrava Golden Spike on May 28 as a precautionary measure after he felt "something" in his adductor (group of muscles located on inner thighs). He made a strong comeback by winning gold at the Paavo Nurmi Games in Finland on June 18 with a throw of 85.97m.

He opted out of the Paris Diamond League on July 7, insisting that the event was never a part of his competition calendar this year.

Chopra's competition day is just two weeks away with the qualification round scheduled on August 6.

Asked about the training routine of Chopra, Bartonietz said, "We have sessions of sprinting, jumping or throwing or weightlifting alternately for activation in the morning. Two sessions, one in morning and one in evening, two to two-and-ahalf-hour long each. Bartonietz said the approach is nearly the same as the one adopted before the Tokyo Olympics.



Russia says intercepted US bomber planes over Arctic

UAE orders probe, trail of arrested B'deshi

DUBAI: Authorities in the United Arab Emirates ordered an investigation and an expedited trial of Bangladeshi nationals arrested after protesting against their home gov-

ernment across the Gulf country, state media reported. The protests came as nationwide demonstrations spread across the South Asian country weeks ago to protest a quota system that reserves up to 30 per cent of government jobs for relatives of veterans who fought in Bangladesh's war of independence in 1971. The country's top court scaled back Sunday on the controversial system, in a partial victory for student protesters. The UAE's attorney general's office indicted Saturday the Bangladeshi protesters on several charges, including "gathering in a public place and protesting against their home government with the intent to incite unrest," obstructing law enforcement, causing harm to others and damaging property, according to the state-owned Emirates News Agency, WAM. "Based on the preliminary investigation results, the Public Prosecution has ordered their pretrial detention pending further investigations," WAM reported.

LONDON: Britain's new Treasury chief said Sunday she will run the economy with "iron discipline," but suggested she'll give public sector workers



an above-inflation pay raise to help end a wave of strikes and strife. The Labour Party government is under pressure from supporters and trade unions to spend more on salaries and welfare benefits, two weeks after it was elected on promises not to hike personal taxes or increase public borrowing, "I think people know that things are a mess," Treasury chief Rachel Reeves told the BBC.

Ukrainian civilians wounded in Russian drone and shelling attacks as Russia claims gains in the east



KYIV: Russian strikes wounded at least five people in Ukraine on Sunday, local officials said, as the two countries exchanged drone, missile and shelling attacks. Along the front line in the east, Russia said it had taken control of two villages, one in the Kharkiv region and one in the Luhansk region. Three people were wounded by Russian arone strikes in southern Ukraine's partly occupied Kherson region, local officials said Sunday morning. In the country's northeast, officials in the Kharkiv region said two people were wounded when a village was hit by Russian shells. Overnight into Sunday, Ukraine's air defences intercepted 35

of the 39 drones launched by Russia, according to air force commander Mykola Oleschuk. In addition, Russia launched three ballistic missiles and two guided air missiles, which did not reach their targets, he said.

Russia's Ministry of Defence said Sunday that its troops had taken control of two villages: Pishchane Nizhne in the Kharkiv region and Andriivka, sometimes referred to as Rozivka, in the Luhansk region. Kyiv did not immediately comment. Officials in the northern Sumy region said Sunday that Russia launched a missile strike on "critical infrastructure facilities" in the city of Shostka.

Bangladesh's top court scales back government jobs quota after deadly unrest killed scores



Bangladesh's top court on Sunday scaled back a controversial quota system for government job applicants after it led to nationwide unrest and deadly clashes between police and protesters that have killed scores of people. The Supreme Court in its verdict ordered 93% of the government jobs to be

allocated on a merit-based system, leaving the remaining 7% for relatives of veterans who fought in Bangladesh's war of independence in 1971 and other categories. Earlier, the system reserved 30% of such jobs the relatives of war veterans. Sunday's verdict comes

after weeks of demonstrations - mostly led by students - that turned deadly on Tuesday after protesters began clashing with police.
