NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked Indian Medical Association (IMA) president R V Asokan whether his unconditional apology to the apex court over his "damaging" statements in an interview to PTI was published in all those newspapers which carried his interview.

In the interview to PTI, where he had answered queries about Patanjali Ayurved Ltd's mislead-



The cases filed by the Hindu side seek the "removal" of the Aurangzeb-era mosque they claim was built after demolishing a temple that once stood there.

The Hindu litigants claim the mosque holds signs suggesting that it was a temple once.

The mosque management committee and the UP Sunni Central Waqf

Board had argued that the suits were barred under Places of Worship Act and other laws. On May 31, the Allahabad High Court reserved its judgment on this maintainability plea after hearing both sides.

However, the court reopened the hearing at the request of Shahi Idgah counsel Mehmood Pracha.

The high court has now fixed August 12 as the date for framing of issues.

The Mathura dispute mirrors the legal tussle in Varanasi, where the Gyanvapi mosque and the Kashi Vishwanath temple are located next to each other.

'Many Indian districts prone to extreme heat waves'

8 out of 10 Indians will be highly exposed to extreme events by 2036.

NEW DELHI: More than 84 per cent of the districts in India are prone to extreme heat waves and 70 per cent are experiencing a rise in the frequency and intensity of extreme rainfall events, according to a new analysis. The report, "Managing Monsoons in a Warming Climate" by the independent developmental organisation IPE Global Limited and Esri India Technologies, said the country was experiencing extended summer-like conditions during the June-September monsoon. Abinash Mohanty, head of Climate Change and Sustainability Practice at IPE Global Limited and the author of the study, said, "Our analysis suggests that eight out of 10 Indians will be highly exposed to extreme events by 2036."

"Embracing granular risk assessments and establishing mate-risk observatories should become a national imperative to safeguard Indian agriculture, industry and large-scale infrastructural projects from the vagaries of climate change," he said. The report said Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Tripura were the top five heatwave hotspot states in the

NEW DELHI: The Lok Sabha on Monday approved about Rs 140 lakh crore expenditure demands of different ministries of the central government, completing two-thirds of the legislative approvals needed for the full Budget for 2024-25. The lower house, which had last week debated on the Budget, approved the demands for grants as well as the Appropriation (No 2) Bill 2024, which authorises the government to use certain sums out of the Consolidated Fund of India for the services of the financial year 2024-25. Bangladesh in turmoil: Sheikh Hasina's fall from power

The upheaval in Bangladesh marks a turbulent chapter in its history, as Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina faces her most challenging test. In her two separate terms and 20 years of leadership, the ongoing protests, which have claimed over 300 lives, represent an unprecedented crisis. The 76-year-old Hasina has resigned and fled from Ganabhaban, her official residence. Army Chief General Waqar-uz-Zaman announced that an interim government would take over, responding to massive protests against Hasina's administration. In a televised address, the general declared, "I'm taking all responsibility (of the country). Please cooperate," amid reports of Hasina's departure to India. This dramatic shift comes after Hasina's long tenure since 2009 and her recent re-election for a record fourth consecutive term in January's 12th general election, boycotted by the main opposition party, the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), led by former premier Khaleda Zia. The catalyst for the unrest has been the controversial quota system, which reserves 30 percent of jobs for the families of veterans from the 1971 liberation war. Over the past two days, the country has witnessed fierce demonstrations resulting in over 100 deaths. As protests intensified, the army chief instructed the military and police to refrain from firing shots, urging protesters to cease the violence and promising "justice" for all. Following General Zaman's announcement, celebratory crowds filled the streets, marking the end of Hasina's rule. Protesters stormed and looted Ganabhaban, set fire to the Awami League party office, and vandalized Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan's house. The government's response included a complete internet shutdown, though broadband was partially restored. Despite this, violence continued with six more people killed during fresh clashes. The interim government and military now face the task of restoring order and addressing the grievances fueling the unrest, hoping to lead to a more inclusive and just governance.

India's economic blueprint: Path to global leadership

India's budget aims to transform sectors like agriculture, employment, and infrastructure, propelling the nation towards becoming the world's third-largest economy by 2030. by *Satish Singh*

ndia's budget aims to transform sectors like agriculture, employment, manufacturing, services, rural and urban development, energy, infrastructure, and research. This approach is vital for maintaining India's strong economic performance. The Economic Survey projects a GDP growth rate of 6.5 to 7.0 percent for 2024-25, contrasting with lower rates in the US, Eurozone, and Britain. India's consistent growth suggests it could become the world's third-largest economy by 2030, surpassing Japan and Germany. The Finance Ministry forecasts the economy will reach \$5 trillion by 2027 and \$7 trillion by 2030.

At a NITI Aayog meeting on July 27, 2024, discussions focused on making India a developed nation by 2047, its centennial of independence. Inclusive development was emphasized, urging state collaboration. The report "The Indian Economy: A Review" supports this vision, predicting a \$5 trillion economy by 2027 and \$7 trillion by 2030. Capital expenditure is critical, with the budget allocating Rs 11.11 lakh crore. Strengthening the rural sector is also essential, with Rs 2.66 lakh crore earmarked. Initiatives include

and IT facilities. Developed countries also have high Human Development Index (HDI) scores, indicating longer life expectancy and higher education levels. By 2047, India's economy could reach \$30 trillion, with a population of around 1.65 billion and a per capita income of approximately \$18,181. However, income inequality poses a challenge.

India's demographic dividend is crucial for its economic growth. With a young population, the country has the potential to drive innovation and productivity. The

government's focus on skill development and education is expected to harness this advantage effectively. Moreover, infrastructure development is pivotal for sustained growth. Investments in highways, railways, ports, and airports will enhance connectivity, reduce logistics costs, and boost trade. The National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP) aims to attract private and public investments in infrastructure projects.

Emphasis on renewable energy and sustainability is set to transform India into a global leader in green energy. The budget includes provisions for increasing solar and wind energy capacities, promoting electric vehicles, and supporting research in sustainable technologies.

These initiatives reduce carbon emissions and create new economic oppor tunities and jobs. Lastly, India's strategic geopolitical positioning and role in international trade agreements will strengthen its global economic standing. Participation in organizations like BRICS G20, and the World Trade Organization (WTO) will open new markets and enhance trade partnerships, contributing to the overall growth trajectory.

Stock markets stumble after early gains; Sensex loses 166 pts, Nifty ends below 24,000 mark



MUMBAI: Stock markets surrendered early gains and settled lower in volatile trade on Tuesday with Sensex losing 166 points and Nifty ending below the 24,000 level due to fag-end selling in banking and telecom stocks. Falling for the third straight day, the 30-share BSE Sensex settled at 78,593.07, down 166.33 points or 0.21 per cent, as 17 of its constituents declined and 13 gained. The index opened sharply higher and rallied further 1,092.68 points or 1.38 per cent to a high of 79,852.08 on value-buying by investors driven by a rebound in Japanese and other Asian stocks. However, the barometer faltered later and hit a low of 78,496.57 as banking shares came under selling pressure anead of the KBI policy decision on Thursday. Similarly, the NSE Axis Bank and Bajaj Finance

Nifty declined 63.05 points or 0.26 per cent to settle below the 24,000 level at 23,992.55. The index surged 327 points or 1.35 per cent to 24,382.60 in intra-day trade but failed to hold onto gains. Sensex and Nifty has declined for the third straight day, losing more than 4 per cent as weak jobs data fanned fears of possible recession in the US market. "The domestic market tried to rebound mirroring the Asian

D-Street investors' wealth erodes by Rs 22 lakh crore

NEW DELHI: Investors' wealth eroded by a whopping Rs 22 lakh crore in three days of market slump with the BSE benchmark Sensex tanking 4 per cent. In three days, the Sensex tumbled 3,274.48 points or 3.99 per cent. The massive correction came after the benchmark index hit its all-time high of 82,129.49 on August 1. Market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms tumbled Rs 22,02,996.27 crore to reach Rs 4,39,59,953.56 crore (USD 5.24 trillion) in three trading days.

On Monday, the Sensex plummeted 2,222.55 points or 2.74 per cent to settle at 78,759.40. During the day, it tanked 2,686.09 points or 3.31 per cent to 78,295.86. The benchmark ended 166.33 points or 0.21 per cent lower at 78,593.07 on Tuesday even after surging 1,092.68 points or 1.38 per cent in intra-day trade. "Negative sentiment continued to prevail in the US and European equities which weighed on local markets as indices fell sharply towards the close on profit-taking in banking, telecom and auto shares.

Veg thali price rises 11 pc in July due to high tomato prices

MUMBAI: Vegetable thali's price increased 11 per cent in July compared to June this year due to higher prices of tomatoes on a monthly basis, according to a report. Non-veg thali also turned costlier by 6 per cent in July compared to June 2024, the Crisil Market Intelligence and Analysis' monthly 'Roti Rice Rate'

report stated. The cost of veg thali, which comprises roti, vegetables (onions, tomatoes and potatoes), rice, dal, curd and salad was at Rs 32.6 per plate in July 2024 against Rs 29.4 per plate in June 2024, according to the report. "Compared to the previous month of June, the prices of vegetable thali increased 11 per cent in July, mainly due to a surge in tomato prices,



which accounted for 7 per cent of the rise," the report said. Prices of non-veg thali, which comprises the same

ingredients but dal gets replaced by chicken, rose by 6 per cent to Rs 61.4 per plate in July 2024 compared to Rs 58 per plate in June this year. However, on a year-over-

year basis, prices of veg thali eased by 4 per cent mainly due to a high base impact of tomato prices. Veg thali prices were Rs 34.1 per plate in July 2023. In July 2024, tomatoes were priced

lower than the Rs 110 per kg in July 2023. The higher price in 2023 was due to flash floods in the northern states and pest infestations in Karnataka. 



PARIS: Defending champion Neeraj Chopra turned on the style as he stormed into the men's javelin throw final of the Olympic Games with a season's best effort of 89.34m in his very first attempt in the qualification round here on Tues-

Much like his qualifying round performance in the Tokyo Olympics, the 26-year-old crossed the automatic qualifying mark of 84m in his opening throw to occupy the top spot in Group B.

The tremendous effort, which is the second best of his career, also set aside surrounding concerns Chopra's fitness after he revealed that he had been battling an adductor niggle in the build-up to the Games. His personal best continues to be 89.94m achieved back in 2022.

Julian Weber of Germany, who won Group A with 87.76, was third overall, while reigning Commonwealth Games champion Arshad Nadeem of Pakistan also qualified for the finals with a throw of 86.59m in Group B.

Tokyo Olympics silver medallist Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic, who was the only man to have beaten Chopra this year in Doha Diamond League, was seventh overall with a first round throw of 85.63m. All those who

throw 84m or above, or at least the 12 best performers from Group A and B combined will advance to the final. In fact nine throwers crossed the automatic final round qualification distance, which showed the quality of the competition. In the final, Chopra will

have a chance to become only the fifth man in Olympic javelin throw history to defend the title. If he wins gold, and for that matter a medal, he will become the most decorated Indian in Olympics in individual sport. Shuttler PV Sindhu (one silver, one bronze), wrestler Sushil Kumar (one silver, one bronze) and shooter Manu Bhaker (two bronze) have won two Olympic medal each post Independence. Chopra

produced the most eyecatching performance of the day lasting just a few minutes -- quite literally a case of 'he came, he threw and he conquered'. His 89.34m throw may

raise hopes of millions of Indian fans to see Chopra cross the elusive 90m mark on Thursday.

Vinesh shocks champion Susaki, enters maiden Olympic semis

Having endured two Olympic heartbreaks, the feisty 29-year-old, is now only one win away from ensuring her maiden Olympic medal.

PARIS: Vinesh Phogat pulled off the biggest upset at the Paris Games by outwitting hitherto invincible Yui Susaki with a perfectly planned strategy before edging past Ukraine's Oksana Livach to storm into the women's 50kg semifinal as she inched closer to an elusive Olympic medal, here Tuesday.

The Tokyo Games gold medallist and four-time World Champion Susaki had not lost any of her 82 bouts in her international career but the Japanese top seed hardly had an idea as

to what was about to hit her in the opener which she lost 2-3. Later, Vinesh quelled the challenge of former European champion and 2018 world championship bronze-medallist Livach 7-5 in the quarterfinal.

Thrown in at the deep end, Vinesh came up with a strategy to look for that one attack in the dying moments and pulled that off successfully. There was no action for the first 90 seconds as the two wrestlers measured each other.

Vinesh was put on the clock for passivity and lost the first point. The first period passed and in the second one too, neither Vinesh nor Susaki initiated any attacking move. She lost one more point for passivity to trail 0-2.

When only 20 seconds were left, both Vinesh and Susaki got into some action. Vinesh looked to grab the left leg of the Japanese but could not do it from the standing position. With less than 9 seconds to go, Vinesh capitalised when a leaning Susaki did not have her feet placed on the mat firmly and the Indian managed to push her on the mat for a two-pointer takedown.

The Japanese corner challenged the last points awarded but it was unsuccessful. No one gave her a chance but what she did was unthinkable. Vinesh had to drop down to 50kg class for the Paris Games because of Antim Panghal's qualification in the 53kg category. It must have affected her strength but came unhurt against Livach, who ran her close. If the bout against Susaki was all smartness, it was a battle of strength and technique against the Ukrainian. She led 4-0 with consecutive takedowns, the first one coming on counter and the second was a dou-

UK calls for UN-led probe into Bangladesh events

Foreign Secretary David Lammy issued a statement on Monday to condemn "unprecedented levels of violence and tragic loss of life" over last two weeks in Bangladesh.

called for a United Nations led investigation into the violent incidents of the past few weeks in Bangladesh, which led to ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina fleeing to India "for the moment" before reportedly seeking asylum in the UK.

Foreign Secretary David Lammy issued a statement on Monday to condemn the "unprecedented levels of violence and tragic loss of life" over the last two weeks in Bangladesh and said the UK wanted to see action towards a democratic future for the country.

The government has made no official comment on reports of Hasina seeking political asylum in the UK, with Home Office sources only indicating that the country's immigration rules don't specifically allow individuals to travel to the UK to seek asylum.

"The last two weeks in Bangladesh have seen unprecedented levels of violence and tragic loss of life. A transitional period has been announced by the Chief of the Army Staff," reads David Lam-

The UK and Bangladesh have deep people-topeople links and shared Commonwealth values," he added. Meanwhile, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar updated Parliament in New Delhi on Tuesday to confirm that Hasina had arrived in the country after a forced resignation amid public agitation. "At very short notice she requested

approval to come for the moment to India. We simultaneously received a request for flight clearance from Bangladesh authorities. She arrived yesterday evening in Delhi," he said in a statement in the Rajya Sabha.

China launches new rocket

TAIPEI: China says it launched a rocket Tuesday carrying a constellation of a reported 18 satellites as part of efforts to assert its presence in space. The satellites were carried aboard a Long March-6 carrier rocket from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Centre in north China's Shanxi Province early on Tuesday afternoon. The official Xinhua News Agency said the rocket had reached pre-programmed orbit without incident. China's space program has launched numerous crewed missions.

US urges its citizens not to travel to Bangladesh

WASHINGTON: United States on Tuesday recommended its citizens not to travel Bangladesh, witnessing civil unrest, crime, and terrorism following the resignation and fleeing of former prime minister Sheikh Hasina. Elevating its travel advisory to the highest 'Level 4: Do Not Travel' category, the US State Department has also recommended the departure of non-emergency US govt employees and family members.
