

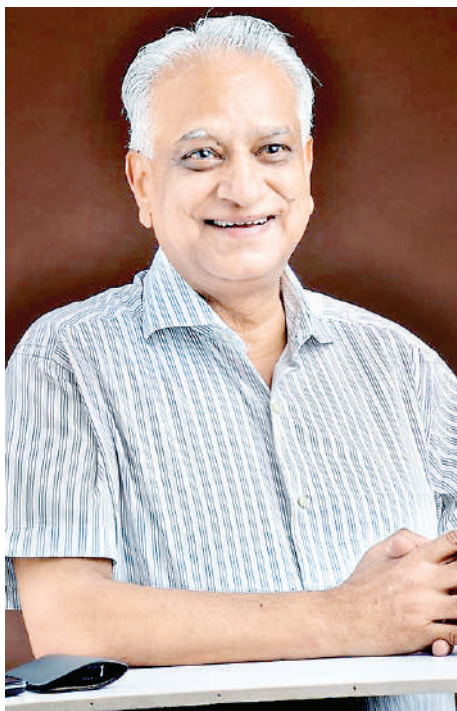

## Shri Vinod Babu Maheshwari leaves for heavenly abode

Sorrowful farewell to a stalwart of Hindi Journalism and Literature

**NAGPUR:** Mr. Vinod Babu Maheshwari, the esteemed Editor-in-Chief of the Navbharat-Navrastra family, has ascended to his heavenly abode. His passing has cast a deep shadow of grief over the Navbharat-Navrastra, Central Chronicle family, and the entire Maheshwari community. He had been unwell for some time and breathed his last at Breach Candy Hospital in Mumbai. On Monday afternoon, his body was brought from Mumbai to his residence, Navbharat Nikunj, in Civil Line, Nagpur. His last rites were performed at Mokshadham at 5 PM. He is survived by his wife, Smt. Shrirangadevi Maheshwari, son Shri Nimish Maheshwari, daughter-in-law Smt. Anupama Maheshwari, grandson Shri Vaibhav Maheshwari, granddaughter-in-law Smt. Shruti Maheshwari, Shri Raghav Maheshwari, and an extended family. Dignitaries from the political, social, cultural, industry, and business spheres have expressed their deep condolences on his passing.

His journalism not only highlighted public services and facilities but also addressed the everyday concerns of his readers. His development-oriented ideas and suggestions significantly contributed to both rural and urban development, with a focus on accessible transportation, railways, and aviation services. His vision was always to ease the lives of common citizens. He advocated for political integrity and non-discriminatory social values through his journalism, inspiring every member of the Navbharat-Navrastra-Central Chronicle family to uphold these values. He was a pioneer of modern journalistic techniques and traveled extensively, including a trip to Japan in the 1970s to learn advanced printing technology.

Lifelong service to Hindi literature

Under the guidance of the respected Shri Ramgopalji Maheshwari, the founder of Navbharat, Mr. Vinod Babu Maheshwari made significant contributions to the activities of the Vidarbha Hindi Sahitya Sammelan throughout his life. After the passing of Bade Babuji 25 years ago, he took on the role of Pardan Mantri of VHSAS. He oversaw the construction of over half a dozen auditoriums at the Vidarbha Hindi Sahitya Sammelan (VHSAS) Mor Bhavan, making them available at minimal fees for literary, cultural, and social activities. He initiated the 'Sahityiki' program to encourage writers and poets from small towns and villages across Maharashtra, including Vidarbha. He promoted the Guru Purnima Utsav, Holi Utsav, and Sharad Purnima Mahotsav. He also developed plans for the preservation and promotion of all regional languages, including Hindi. This year, the Vishva Sindhi Sahitya Sammelan was organized at VHSAS under his leadership. Every year, individuals who have made significant contributions to Hindi journalism and literature are honoured at the annual convention.

## IIT Madras tops rankings for sixth straight year

9th edition of the rankings was announced by Union Minister of Education Dharmendra Pradhan on Monday.

**NEW DELHI:** The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras remained on the top spot in the National Institute Ranking Framework, 2024 for the sixth consecutive year, while the Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru was ranked as the best university for the ninth year in a row, according to the Ministry of Education.

The ninth edition of the rankings was announced by Union Minister of Education Dharmendra Pradhan on Monday. IISc Bengaluru has bagged the second spot in the "overall" category followed by IIT Bombay while IIT Delhi, which was at the third spot last year in the cat-

egory, has slipped to the fourth position. Eight IITs have figured in the top ten besides All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi and the Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU).

In pharmacy, Jamia Hamdard rose to the top spot from its second position last year while the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research, Hyderabad slipped to the second rank. BITS Pilani has retained its third position in the category.

Delhi University's Hindu College and Miranda House have switched positions in the colleges category with the former bagging the top spot. St Stephen's College is in the third position among colleges.

Similarly for law, the National Law School of India University, Bengaluru followed by the National Law University, Delhi and NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad have retained first, second and third spots respectively. For Architecture and Planning, IIT Roorkee has been announced as the best, followed by IIT Kharagpur and NIT Calicut.

## Sex ratio to improve by 2036: Govt Study

**NEW DELHI:** Sex ratio in India is expected to improve to 952 women per 1000 men by 2036 from 943 in 2011, according to a report 'Women and Men in India 2023' released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation on Monday.

The report highlights that India's population in 2036 is expected to be more feminine compared to the 2011 population, as reflected in the sex ratio which is projected to increase from 943 in



2011 to 952 by 2036, highlighting a positive trend in gender equality. By 2036, the population of India is expected to reach 152.2 crore, with a slightly improved female percentage of 48.8 per cent compared to 48.5 per cent in 2011, the report stated. The proportion of individuals under 15 years is projected to decrease from 2011 to 2036, likely

due to declining fertility, it stated. Conversely, the proportion of the population aged 60 years and above is anticipated to substantially increase during this period.

It is evident that from 2016 to 2020, Age Specific Fertility Rate (ASFR) in the age group of 20-24 and

25-29 has reduced from 135.4 and 166.0 to 113.6 and 139.6 respectively. The ASFR for the age 35-39 for the above period has increased from 32.7 to 35.6 which shows that after settling in the life, women are thinking of expansion of family. Adolescent Fertility Rate was 33.9 for the illiterate population whereas 11.0 for the literate in 2020. This rate is considerably lower for even those who are literate but without any formal education (20.0) compared to illiterate women reemphasizing the importance of imparting education to women.

The introduction of the e-auction system is expected to bring increased competition and transparency to the auction process for wood in various timber depots managed by the Forest Department. The system, facilitated by MSTC through an Expression of Interest (EOI), will streamline the auction process, ensuring quicker and more transparent transactions for both the government and bidders. 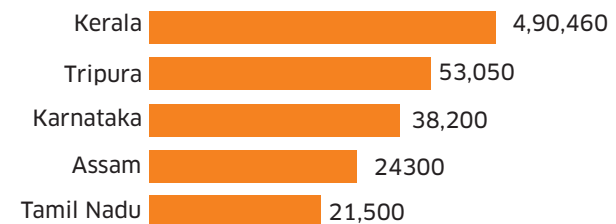

## Comm's surprise inspection continues

**RAIPUR:** Divisional Commissioner Mahadev Kaware conducted a surprise inspection of the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) office and Tehsil office in Raipur on Monday. After arriving at the SDM office in the morning he inquired about revenue cases from the officials present at the office and instructed them to expedite the resolution of revenue-related disputes and non-disputes to reduce the number of pending cases and provide convenience to the public. During inspection, Kaware found several irregularities, including incomplete records and unattended files. He issued a show-cause notice to SDM Nandkumar Choubey for delaying orders without valid reasons. Additionally, he instructed officials to display nameplates with their designations and names, maintain proper records, and verify stocks. At the Tehsil office, Kaware inspected various branches, including law, finance, nazir, and record room. He found several cases without online registration and issued a show-cause notice to the Tehsildar. Kaware instructed officials to resolve cases within the stipulated timeframe, including name verification, boundary disputes, and map verification.

Raja also warned that the violence faced by Hindus in Bangladesh could happen in India if not addressed. He stated that he has been prevented from getting a passport due to cases filed against him by the Congress party, but if he gets one, he will enter Bangladesh and Pakistan to raise his voice against atrocities on Hindus.

## Food Department conducts surprise inspection of Dal mill

**RAIPUR:** Following the instructions of Collector Dr. Gaurav Singh, a team from the Food Department conducted a surprise inspection of a dal mill in Sadguru Industry, Daundekala Gram Panchayat. The inspection revealed a significant discrepancy in the online stock entry. The team found 1408.30 quintals

of dal in the mill, whereas the online entry on the Government of India's portal showed only 220.76 quintals. This discrepancy is a violation of the Food and Civil Supplies Department's order (number 3245/ Food/2024 dated July 2, 2024), which is punishable under Section 3/7 of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955.

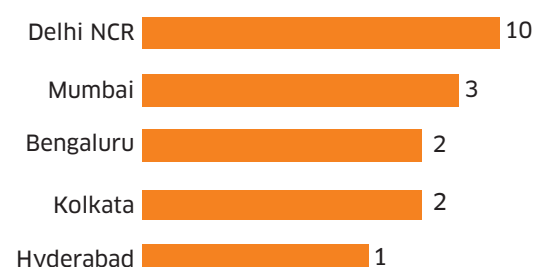

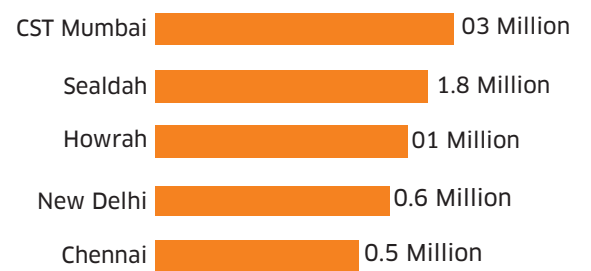

#### No changing date of birth after retirement: Karnataka High Court

**BENGALURU:** The Karnataka High Court has ruled that an employee cannot change the recorded date of birth after retirement. The case involved a man who worked at a pulp drawing processor manufacturing unit from 1983 until he retired in 2006. When he was hired, he verbally gave his date of birth as March 30, 1952, but didn't provide any proof. The employer, however, recorded his date of birth as March 10, 1948, based on his provident fund details and a school certificate. This meant he retired at 58 in 2006. After retirement, the man obtained a birth certificate showing March 30, 1952, as his date of birth. He then asked to be reinstated or be eligible to receive benefits up to 2010, arguing he should have retired four years later. The employer rejected his request, saying the recorded date was correct and that he had already accepted his retirement benefits without raising any issues.

**MUMBAI:** Maharashtra BJP president Chandrashekhar Bawankule on Monday said a vote for the opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi will result in the end of the women-centric Mukhyamantri Ladki Bahin Yojana and stoppage of free power to farmers. ference leader Omar Abdullah, Congress leader and former Haryana chief minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda, and several other leaders, besides many family members, friends and admirers of Natwar Singh gathered at the crematorium to pay tribute. Jaishankar offered a piece of wood to the funeral pyre before Singh's mortal remains were consigned to flames. “Many political leaders came to pay tribute to Natwar sahab,” said a family friend who attended the funeral. The former Union minister breathed his last at Medanta Hospital in Gurugram.

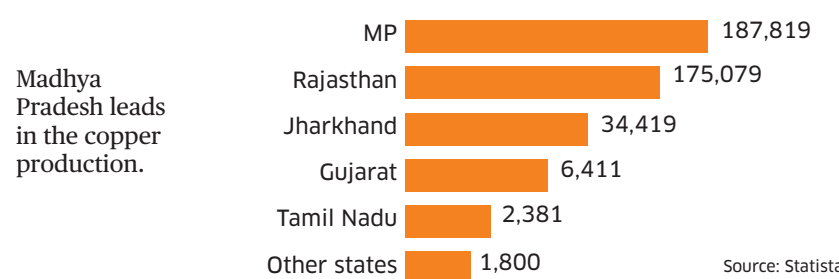

# Get overseas bank work done from India, HC to Indrani

Court asked to finish her bank work in Spain and the UK from India itself.

**MUMBAI:** The Bombay High Court on Monday suggested to former media executive Indrani Mukerjea, the prime accused in her daughter Sheena Bora's murder, that if possible, she complete her bank work in Spain and the UK from India itself instead of travelling to the two European countries.

A single bench of Justice S C Chandak said that if the work was genuine and bona-fide and required Mukerjea's physical presence in Spain and the UK, the CBI could consider her travel to those countries.

The bench also cautioned Mukerjea against adding more work other than what she had mentioned in the application filed before the special CBI court while seeking permission to travel abroad.

A special CBI court on July 19 allowed Mukerjea to travel once to Europe (Spain and the UK) for 10 days between intermittent periods for the next three months.

She had sought permission to travel, claiming pursuant to her divorce from Peter Mukerjea, she needed to change certain bank-related documents and other ancillary work.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had filed a petition in the high court

against the special court order. Last month, the high court granted an interim stay on the special court order.

On Monday, CBI's advocate, Shreeram Shirsat, told the court that the agency verified with the banks in the UK and Spain, and payments Mukerjea needed to make could be made online, and hence, she need not travel.

He said the agency was awaiting reply from one other bank. Mukerjea's advocate, Ranjeet Sangle, however, said she first needs to revive her defunct bank accounts in Spain before she can make any online payment.

## Court directs Indrani Mukerjea to furnish a security deposit of Rs 2 lakh

The special court had, while granting permission, also laid down certain conditions on Mukerjea.

During her travel, she has to attend the office of the Indian Embassy or its allied diplomatic mission offices there at least once during her visit and obtain an attendance certificate, said the court. The court also directed Mukerjea to furnish a security

Sangle pointed out a letter Mukerjea wrote to the Embassy of Spain, wherein she mentioned the work she needed to do. Justice Chandak noted that the letter also mentioned repair work at a residential premises in the country. "You (Indrani) have generated extra work. This was not mentioned in the application filed before the special court. This raises doubts and our eyebrows... Prima facie, such conduct will act against you," Justice Chandak said.

The bench adjourned the matter till August 27, and sought a list from both Mukerjea and the CBI on the work she needs to do in the UK and Spain and if the same can be done from India.

## JNU teachers, students hold protests on campus

**NEW DELHI:** Members of the Jawaharlal Nehru University Teachers' Association began a 24-hour hunger strike on campus on Monday to protest against alleged delays in promotions.

Posters bearing slogans such as "Promoting the truth about promotion", "Promotions are hard earned", and "Waiting for promotions" were put up at the protest site.

The protesters alleged promotions under the University Grants Commission's Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) had been selectively provided and delayed in many cases since 2016.

Currently, CAS appli-

"I was told to come after a week as the doctors are on strike. I was advised to follow the news to see if the strike ends," the 24-year-old patient said. Resident doctors from multiple hospitals in Delhi, including centrally-run facilities AIIMS, RML Hospital and Safdarjung Hospital, have begun an indefinite strike in response to a call from the Federation of Resident Doctors' Association (FORDA) after a postgraduate trainee doctor was raped and murdered at RG Kar Medical College in Kolkata while on duty.

## Ex-cabbie turns snatcher

**NEW DELHI:** The dream of going on a long drive and vacation with his partner landed a former taxi driver into the police net after he was arrested for allegedly snatching mobile phones and vehicle theft, officials on Monday said. The partner of the accused, who was previously involved in snatching and theft cases, allegedly motivated him to commit similar crimes to fund their trip. With the arrest of Om Parkash alias Omi, the Delhi Police claimed to have solved eight cases of snatching, and vehicle theft. "On August 4, an incident of mobile snatching was reported at Dwarka North police station. The complainant told police that he was walking with his dog near the IES Apartment when a man on a motorcycle snatched his mobile phone and fled," DCP said.

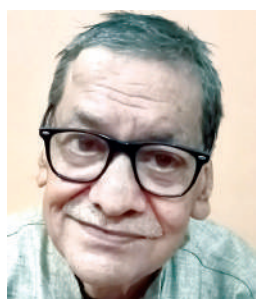
## Hindenburg's allegations put SEBI's credibility at risk

The latest salvo fired by Hindenburg Research against Madhabi Buch, the chairperson of SEBI, and her husband has once again brought the integrity of India's financial regulatory framework under scrutiny. The US-based short-seller, known for its controversial report against the Adani Group, now alleges a conflict of interest involving the Buchs, suggesting their connections to offshore funds implicated in financial misconduct. This allegation, though vehemently denied by both the couple and the Adani conglomerate, raises uncomfortable questions about the independence of SEBI, the very body entrusted with safeguarding investor interests. The Supreme Court's recent endorsement of SEBI's ongoing investigation into the Adani case was seen as a vote of confidence in the regulator. However, the establishment of a separate expert panel to probe regulatory lapses, following Hindenburg's initial report, hints at underlying concerns. If SEBI had indeed been above reproach, why would the apex court feel the need for additional oversight? This dichotomy fuels doubts about the thoroughness and impartiality of SEBI's actions. The political ramifications are equally significant. The Congress party's renewed call for a joint parliamentary committee to investigate the entire episode reflects the deepening mistrust in the regulatory process. Accusations that the government is overly protective of powerful corporate interests have been rife, and dismissing these concerns with counter-accusations against the opposition and Hindenburg does little to restore confidence. Transparency is paramount in this situation. SEBI must act decisively to complete its investigation and present its findings with unequivocal clarity. The perception that the regulator is dragging its feet or is compromised in any way must be addressed head-on. Hindenburg's claims, regardless of the motives behind them, cannot be ignored; they must be met with solid evidence that reinforces SEBI's commitment to fair and transparent market regulation. The stakes are high, and the government's credibility on its pro-investor agenda hinges on the outcome.

## Social factors impacting lifespan: Study

A comprehensive study reveals how gender, marital status, education, and race collectively impact lifespan, emphasizing the critical role of social conditions in shaping health outcomes. by PTI

A combination of four social factors—gender, marital status, education, and race—could impact the risk of early death by up to 18 years, according to a groundbreaking study that analyzed U.S. citizens' data to devise a lifespan scoring system. While individual risks and genetic predispositions partly explain differences in health and death, researchers increasingly point to how social conditions, in which people are born, grow, live, and work, shape one's health.

The researchers at the University of Southern Denmark found that while none of the four factors was more influential than the others, the more of these factors a person has, the higher their risk of an earlier death. The authors devised a "simple scoring system" based on the four factors to identify those most at risk. According to the scoring system, one's lifespan score could range from a lowest of -10 to a highest of eight.

For the study, published in the British Medical Journal (BMJ) Open, the researchers took data on registered deaths and population numbers from national statistics and census for the period 2015-19. Overall, 54 different social groups and 12 specific causes of death, representing 11 leading ones in the U.S., such as lung, breast, and other cancers, were included in the

analysis. The team compared the partial life expectancies between ages 30 and 90 years of the 54 social groups, which included three types of marital statuses, education, and race each.

Partial life expectancy, one of the most commonly used measures of public health, estimates the expected number of years lived between specific ages. In this study, it measures the expected years lived between ages 30 and 90, for a maximum of 60 years of life, the authors explained. Their analysis revealed "very large" differences in the lifespans between the social groups studied.

For example, the authors found that white never-mar-

ried men with a high school diploma or less had the shortest partial life expectancy of 37 years, while white married women with a university degree had the longest one of 55 years. "There is an 18-year difference between the minimum and maximum partial life expectancies between age 30 and 90 years across the (social groups)," they wrote.

The team also found that the advantage of the social groups having longer lifespans was not obvious once multiple factors were considered. For example, even though being a woman was related to a higher lifespan than being a man, specific social groups with men were found to have longer lifespans

than those involving women. "White married men with a university degree have a partial life expectancy of 53.2 years, which is higher than 81 percent of all the women (social groups)," the authors wrote.

Further, the authors found that a social factor curtailing lifespan could be offset by another extending it, and vice versa. For example, having a high school education or lower shortens partial life expectancy by nearly 4 years, but being a married woman increased it by almost 5 years, the researchers said.

The study underscores the importance of considering social determinants of health in public health policies and

interventions. The scoring system developed by the researchers provides a useful tool for identifying individuals at higher risk and could inform targeted strategies to address health disparities. Understanding the interplay between these social factors can help develop more effective health policies aimed at reducing early mortality and promoting a healthier population overall.

In addition, the study highlights the complexity of health determinants and the need for a multi-faceted approach in addressing health inequalities. Policies that focus solely on individual behaviors without considering the broader social context may fail to achieve significant improvements in public health. Therefore, interventions must be designed to address the root social causes of health disparities, ensuring equitable access to education, healthcare, and social support.

Moreover, the findings of this study suggest that public health initiatives should prioritize vulnerable social groups identified through the lifespan scoring system. By targeting resources and interventions towards these high-risk groups, policymakers can make more efficient use of limited resources and achieve better health outcomes for the population.

Production (IIP), was 6.2 per cent in May, 5 per cent in April, 5.5 per cent in March, 5.6 per cent in February and 4.2 per cent in January 2024.

### Sensex, Nifty settle marginally lower in volatile trade amid Hindenburg-SEBI-Adani row



**MUMBAI:** Stock markets closed marginally lower in a highly volatile trade on Monday as investors turned cautious about the potential disruptions from the US short-seller Hindenburg Research report on SEBI chairperson and her husband's undisclosed investments in obscure offshore funds in Bermuda and Mauritius. Recovering from early lows, the 30-share Sensex closed lower by 56.99 points or 0.07 per cent to settle at 79,648.92.

The index had declined by 479.78 points or 0.60 per cent to a low of 79,226.13 in morning trade. The benchmark later staged a sharp recovery climbing 400.27 points or 0.50 per cent to 80,106.18. But at the fag-end, the BSE benchmark slipped into the neg-

ative territory to close lower. The NSE Nifty dipped 20.50 points or 0.08 per cent to 24,347. Intra-day, it hit a low of 24,212.10 and a high of 24,472.80. "The Indian market concluded relatively flat, with its initial path being eclipsed by the continuation of the Adani-Hindenburg-SEBI saga. However, the market tried to brush away these noises, taking positive cues from global markets," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

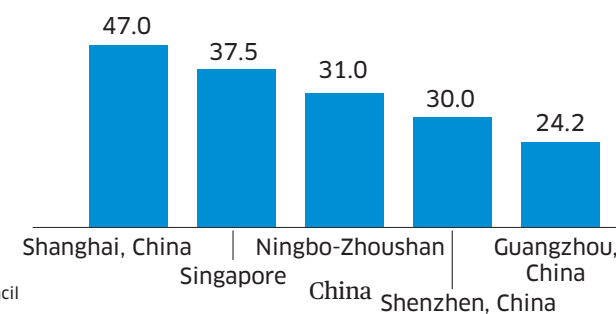

New Zealand named a strong squad for the upcoming Test series against Afghanistan and Sri Lanka, focusing on spin options.

**AUCKLAND:** New Zealand on Monday named a strong squad, which includes five spin bowling options, for next month's one-off Test against Afghanistan and the ensuing two-match rubber against Sri Lanka.

While the one-off Test against Afghanistan will be played in Greater Noida, India, from September 9-13, the Black Caps will fly to Sri Lanka for the two ICC World Test Championship matches, starting September 18 and 26, respectively.

Veteran pacer Tim Southee will lead the side which includes the likes of Kane Williamson, Devon Conway, Glenn Phillips and Rachin Ravindra, while Tom Latham continues to be the vice-captain.

However, head coach Gary Stead hinted that if conditions call for a different balance, the skipper too may have to sit out for a game or two.

"Test tours to the subcontinent can ask some really tough questions of pace bowlers due to the

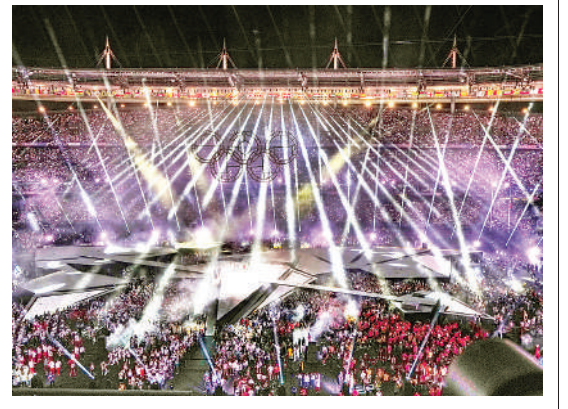

## India awaits verdict on Vinesh's appeal against disqualification

India awaits CAS verdict on Vinesh Phogat's disqualification appeal after Paris Olympics weigh-in controversy.



**PARIS:** India's sports fraternity waited with bated breath as the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), having heard arguments of all parties, got ready to deliver its verdict on wrestler Vinesh Phogat's appeal against her disqualification at the Paris Olympics, on Tuesday.

Vinesh, who stormed into the final of the women's 50kg freestyle event with three convincing wins, including against wrestling royalty Yui Susaki of Japan last Tuesday, was debarred from

the gold medal bout against eventual winner Sarah Hildebrandt of the United States as she was found 100gm above the prescribed limit in the customary morning weigh-in.

Shocked by the dramatic turn of events, the crestfallen grappler last Wednesday appealed against the decision at the CAS and demanded that she be given a joint silver with Cuban wrestler Yusneylis Guzman Lopez, who had lost to Vinesh but was later promoted to the final following the Indian's disqualification.

A day after her heart-breaking disqualification, Vinesh announced her retirement from the sport, saying she doesn't have the strength to continue, as sporting icons from across the world threw their weight behind the 29-year-old wrestler who was appearing in her third Olympic Games.

## World No 22 Sreeja Akula ruled out of UTT

**CHENNAI:** Indian table tennis star Sreeja Akula has been ruled out of the upcoming season of the Ultimate Table Tennis due to a stress fracture.

Sreeja, who along with world No. 25 Manika Batra created history by becoming the first Indian players to enter the round of 16 in individual events at the Paris Olympics, is currently the highest ranked player in the country at the 22nd position. The two-time national champion Sreeja was slated to play for Jaipur Patriots but in a statement released on Monday, the 26-year-old informed that she will need a recuperating period of six weeks. "I am sorry to share that I have been diagnosed with a stress fracture and on my doctor's advice, I will need to rest for six weeks, which unfortunately means (that) I will not be able to participate in the UTT," she said.

## Kamala Harris gains ground in key battleground

### Ethiopia reels from foreign exchange rate reforms

**ADDIS ABABA:** The prices on the menu have been erased at a small hotel in a suburb of Ethiopia's capital. That was no mistake, the waiters said, as businesses in Addis Ababa struggle to keep up with spiralling inflation since the government implemented a flexible exchange rate policy late last month.

Since then, the Ethiopian birr has lost 60 per cent of its value against the dollar as of Monday, sparking anxiety as customers are forced to pay more for basic commodities and some businesspeople are hoarding. The menus at the Samra Hotel in Bole, a leafy suburb of Addis Ababa, captured the instability: There's a new price for every meal at any moment. "Previously, prices would be updated bimonthly but nowadays it's on a daily basis, if not by the hour, to reflect the changing landscape of the market," said Rahel Teshome, who works at the hotel. **PTI**

### Major wildfire rages out of control on fringes of Greek capital; hundreds of firefighters deployed



**ATHENS:** A major forest fire was raging out of control on the northern fringes of the Greek capital Monday, triggering numerous evacuation orders for Athens suburbs and outlying areas as strong winds hampered the efforts of hundreds of firefighters and dozens of water-dropping planes.

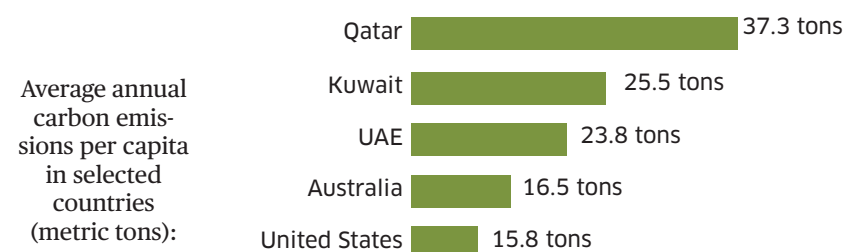
The blaze that began Sunday afternoon was racing through pine forests left tinder-dry by repeated heat waves this summer. June and July of this year were the hottest months ever recorded in Greece, which also recorded its warmest winter ever. Authorities were faced

with "an exceptionally dangerous fire, which we have been fighting for more than 20 hours under dramatic circumstances," Climate Crisis and Civil Protection Minister Vassilis Kikilias said mid-morning Monday.

The fire was burning mainly on two separate fronts, with some parts in particularly difficult to reach areas on a mountain northeast of Athens, Kikilias said. The fire department said 685 firefighters, backed by 27 teams specially trained to tackle wildfires and including more than 80 armed forces personnel, were battling the flames. **PTI**
