



SC raps Kolkata police for 'lapses' in probe

SC asks protesting docs to get back to work, saying 'justice and medicine' cannot be stopped.

NEW DELHI: A tough talking Supreme Court on Thursday tore into the Kolkata police over the delay in registering the unnatural death of the woman doctor, who was raped and killed at the RG Kar Hospital, calling it "extremely disturbing", and questioned the sequence of events and the timing of its procedural formalities.

Making an impassioned appeal to the protesting doctors across the country, the apex court also asked then to get back to work, saying "justice and medicine" cannot be stopped and moreover, it was issuing all the necessary directions to ensure their safety. It further directed no coercive action against them.

in investigation by the Kolkata Police, Justice Pardiwala said, "When you start performing the post-mortem, it means that it is a case of unnatural death. However, case of unnatural death was registered at 11.30 pm on August 9 after post-mortem and the FIR is recorded at 11.45 pm. "The entire

procedure followed by your state is something which I have not come across in the 30 years of my (professional) life,"

NEW DELHI: An ICM-R-led study, which estimated risk of adults in India developing heart disease over a 10-year period, found that those unemployed were at a significantly higher risk, followed by those having high blood sugar levels.

Researchers analysed nearly 4,500 adults aged 40-69 years, about half of whom were younger (40-49 years old). Data was collected using surveys and questionnaires,

## **Cong stages Nationwide** protest outside ED offices

Bhupesh Baghel warns Central Government of political fallout.

RAIPUR: The Congress party launched a nationwide protest on Wednesday outside Enforcement Directorate (ED) offices across various states, with a significant demonstration taking place in Raipur, Chhattisgarh. The protest, led by senior Congress leaders including former Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel and state Congress president Deepak Baij, saw a large gathering of party workers.

Baghel warned that the central government, which he described as "resting on crutches," could fall at any moment. He emphasized that if a Congress-led government comes to power, officials involved in politically

The protest follows Baghel's earlier statements cautioning police and administrative officers in Chhattisgarh against participating in politically driven actions, urging them to consider the long-term consequences of their decisions. He stressed that governments come and go, but actions taken in support of political agendas could cause future repercussions.

The Raipur protest saw the participation of several prominent Congress figures, including former ministers, ex-MLAs, and senior party functionaries like Satyanarayan Sharma, Prem Sai Singh Tekam, and National Secretary Vikas Upadhyay.



### Light Metro Train to launch in Raipur: MoU signed with Moscow's Transport

RAIPUR: In a significant boost to the capital's infrastructure, Raipur is set to introduce a modern light metro train service, aimed at alleviating traffic congestion and enhancing urban mobility. The initiative took a major step forward with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Moscow's Transport Minister and Raipur Municipal Corporation, Mayor Aiyaz Dhebar. Mayor Dhebar, who is currently representing India at the International Transport Summit in Moscow, announced the collaboration, which will bring advanced transportation solutions to Raipur. The summit, held annually from 2022 to 2024, has provided a platform for Dhebar to pursue development opportunities for the city. "After years of continuous effort, today we have achieved a significant milestone. Raipur will now join the ranks of global cities with a light metro train system," Dhebar stated. The Mayor highlighted Raipur's participation in the Light Metro Train Joint Venture, which involves 15 countries, as a proud moment for the city.

**Special Court hands over** Anil Tuteja to EOW on 7-Day conditional remand

This move comes after a crucial decision by the Chhattisgarh High Court on August 20, 2024, where 13 petitions filed against the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and EOW in connection with the liquor scam were dismissed.

### 88 % of fertilizer distribution achieved

**RAIPUR:** The distribution of various chemical fertilizers to farmers continues for the ongoing Kharif season. As of 21 August 2024, nearly 12 lakh metric tons of fertilizers, constituting 88 percent of the target, have been distributed. The fertilizers distributed include 5,81,342 metric tons of urea, 2,62,207 metric tons of DAP, 1,51,259 metric tons of NPK, 50,431 metric tons of potash, and 1,52,664 metric tons of superphosphate. The state has set a target of distributing 13.68 lakh metric tons of fertilizers through cooperative and private sector channels during the current Kharif season. Against this target, 15.24 lakh metric tons have been stocked, out of which around 12 lakh metric tons have been distributed to farmers.

## Politician Vijay unveils party flag ahead of 2026 assly polls

CHENNAI: Popular Tamil actor-turned-polfilm itician Vijay unveiled the flag of his political party - Tamilaga Vetri Kazhagam - on Thursday and hoisted it at his party headquarters in Panaiyur near here. The two-coloured flag with maroon on top and bottom, has a yellow horizontal stripe in the middle with a motif of two fighting tuskers on either side of the Vaagai flower. The "vaagai" flower is also known as the Albizia lebbeck. The word "vaagai" means "victory" in Tamil.

However, the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) objected to the use of the elephant image on TVK's flag saying this violated the Election Commission's rules. BSP Tamil Nadu unit president P Anandan said the elephant was the election symbol assigned to the BSP in 1993 by the ECI.

The unveiling of the flag and also the official launch of the party anthem by Vijay heralds a new chapter in Tamil Nadu politics marked by the entry of the Tamilaga Vetri Kazhagam (TVK), which is gearing up to face the 2026 Assembly elections in the state. Though Vijay announced

the launch of his political outfit in February, he chose not to contest the 2024 Lok Sabha elections nor did it support any party during the polls. While unveiling the TVK flag, the top actor took a pledge along with his party workers.

"We will always appreciate the fighters who fought and sacrificed their lives for the liberation of our country, and countless soldiers who fought tirelessly for the rights of our people from Tamil soil," the pledge read. The party took a vow to remove the differences in the name of caste, religion, gender, place of

birth and also to create awareness among the people and strive for equal opportunities and equal rights for all. "There's an interesting story of historical significance behind the (party) flag. I will explain it along with party principles and plan of action at the upcoming state-level conference," Vijay said, addressing the party workers. "This is

not a mere party flag. I see it as a flag of the victory of Tamil Nadu's future generations," he said at the event which was also attended by his parents, film director S A Chandrasekhar and Shobha Chandrasekhar.

### **Excessive bail** is no bail, says **Supreme Court**

SC said an order which would protect the person's fundamental right under Article 21 of the Constitution and at the same time guarantee his or her presence, would be reasonable and proportionate.

**NEW DELHI:** Excessive bail is no bail, the Supreme Court said on Thursday while observing that granting the relief and then imposing onerous conditions is to take away with the left hand, what is given with the right.

The apex court said an order which would protect the person's fundamental right under Article 21 of the Constitution and at the same time guarantee his or her presence, would be reasonable and proportionate.

A bench of Justices B R Gavai and K V Viswanathan delivered its verdict on a plea filed by a man, against whom 13 FIRs have been lodged in several states for various offences including that of cheating. The petitioner had contended before the apex court that he was granted bail in these 13 cases and he has fulfilled the bail conditions in two of them.

The top court noted the main plea of the petitioner was that he was not in a position to furnish separate sureties, as

## Questions loom over Kolkata police's handling of rape case

he Supreme Court expressed serious concerns over the handling of the investigation into the tragic rape and murder of a junior doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata. The Court's observations highlighted the disturbing delays and inconsistencies in the actions taken by the Kolkata Police, raising questions about the integrity of the investigation. The bench, led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, was visibly troubled by the timing of key legal procedures. It was revealed that the post-mortem of the victim was conducted at 6:10 PM on August 9, yet the case was only registered as an unnatural death several hours later, at 11:30 PM. The Supreme Court found this delay "extremely disturbing," and questioned how such a lapse could occur. To address these concerns, the Court has summoned the Kolkata Police officer who registered the initial entry to appear at the next hearing and provide an explanation. Adding to the gravity of the situation, the Solicitor General, representing the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), pointed out the alarming fact that the First Information Report (FIR) was only registered at 11:45 PM-after the victim had already been cremated. This sequence of events has fueled suspicions of a cover-up, especially given the police's initial claim that the death was a suicide, only to later classify it as murder. The Supreme Court also addressed the ongoing protests by doctors, who have been demanding justice for their colleague. The bench urged the doctors to resume their duties, assuring them that no adverse action would be taken against them for their protest. The Chief Justice emphasized the importance of maintaining public health services, stating, "Once they get back to duty, we will prevail upon authorities to not take adverse action. How will public health infrastructure run if the doctors do not work?" The Court's intervention today marks a crucial step in ensuring that the investigation is conducted with the transparency and rigor that such a heinous crime demands. The transfer of the case to the CBI is a necessary move, but the Supreme Court's continued oversight will be vital in holding all parties accountable and ensuring that justice is delivered swiftly.

## Rising insecurity: Alarming impact on young girls' career dreams

## Ensuring safety on highways: Preventing tragedies on the road

ccidents must be prevented before they stop you because road safety rules are the best tools on highways. The prestigious Samruddhi Mahamarg, or Expressway, connecting Mumbai to Nagpur, has witnessed 125 accidents with 215 casualties in less than two years since it opened to the public. Beyond the common causes, accidents are often attributed

to sleep deprivation from long travel, overspeeding leading to tyre bursts, and road hypnosis—where drivers lose awareness after a monotonous drive, often appearing dazed. While eateries are now visible on both sides of the highway, they are insufficient to keep drivers alert. Highways

and expressways need more trees along their sides and attractively colored medians to engage drivers' attention, reminding them that a fast drive could be their last. Additionally, provisions for drivers to take quick breaks after long drives are essential. Many highways appear deserted and intimidating due to a lack of human activity beyond the speeding vehicles. Prominently displaying distress helpline numbers and ensuring rapid response times are crucial to mitigating the challenges passengers face.

Image visually represents societal critique and gender violence

Stephen Leacock's "Old proverbs Made New" was in our Higher Secondary syllabus. Leacock says that someone should rewrite English proverbs since they are old now. They do not fit in our world anymore. In fact, many of the old proverbs, he argues, are opposite to the new world facts.

He cites an English proverb that says, "People who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones", implying the people who have faults should not criticise other people for having similar faults.

On this, he argues, "They are the very people who ought to throw stones and to keep on throwing them all the time. They ought to keep up such a fusillade of stones from their glass house that no one can get near it. Or if the proverb is taken to mean that people who have faults of their own ought not to talk of other people's faults, it is equally mistaken. They ought to talk of other people's faults all the time so as to keep attention away from their own."

Plenty of instances now pouring in to show that his advice is being followed verbatim by some people. First,

NEW DELHI: Online food delivery platform Zomato will acquire Paytm's entertainment ticketing business for Rs 2,048 crore to strengthen its "goingout" segment in a deal that will help the troubled fintech firm to sharpen its focus on core payments and financial services distribution. Paytm's entertainment ticketing business covers movies, sports, and events (live performances). The boards of Zomato and One 97 Communications Ltd (OCL) have approved the all-cash deal. As part of this agreement, OCL's entertainment ticketing business will transfer business to its 100 per cent subsidiaries Orbgen Technologies Pvt Ltd (OTPL) and Wasteland Entertainment Pvt Ltd (WEPL), followed by the sale of 100 per cent stake in these subsidiaries (which operate the TicketNew and Insider platforms) to Zomato. Subsequently, Zomato will spin off the new business into a new app called 'District'.

MUMBAI: Equity benchmark index Sensex ticked higher on Thursday to settle at 81,000 level while Nifty closed above 24,800 following buying in commodity, telecom and consumer stocks amid a firm trend in global markets. 





At the same time I am convinced that now is the right time to take this step and to concentrate fully on FC Bayern Munich in the future,' Neuer said in a statement. Neuer is the second leading player in the German team to retire from international soccer this week after midfielder Ilkay Gündogan, who captained the team at Euro 2024. 

## **Rizwan**, Shakeel tons dominate first Test

**Rizwan and Sha**keel's centuries put Pakistan in control against Bangladesh in Rawalpindi.

RAWALPINDI: Wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and vice-captain Saud Shakeel smashed centuries as Pakistan piled up 448-6 declared to put the hosts in control of the first test against Bangladesh on Thursday.

Rizwan hit a careerbest 171 not out off 239 balls and left-hander Shakeel continued his imperious form in redball cricket with 141 runs off 261 before Pakistan declared late on the second day. Bangladesh openers Shadman Islam and Zakir Hasan negotiated the last hour against the pace of Shaheen Shah Afridi and Naseem Shah as they took the visitors to a cautious 27-0 at stumps after 12 overs, still trailing by 421 runs. Shadman was unbeaten on 12 while Zakir was 11 not out.

Earlier, Bangladesh pace bowlers toiled hard on a greenish wicket which eased for batting under sunshine and saw both Rizwan and Shakeel combining in a five-hour, fifth-wicket stand of 240 runs which took the hosts from 114-4 to 354-5.

Both batters kept Bangladesh's pace and spin at bay for almost two sessions after Pakistan had resumed its first innings on 158-4. They added 98

Shakeel completed his

third test hundred by driving off-spinner Mehidy Hasan Miraz (1-80) for two runs in the covers and proved a perfect foil to Rizwan, who hit 11 boundaries and three sixes in his unbeaten knock.

The fast bowlers couldn't extract the movement that saw Pakistan slipping to 16-3 on the first day, which was curtailed to 41 overs due to wet patches in the outfield. Shoriful Islam (2-77) and Hasan Mahmud (2-70) didn't get a wicket on the second day and the third seamer, Nahid Rana, returned with unimpressive figures of 0-105 off 19 overs.
