India to be free of Naxal menace by 2026: Shah

State govt would announce a "new look" surrender policy in 1-2 months.

RAIPUR: India will be free from Left Wing Extremism (LWE) by March 2026 and a strong and ruthless strategy is required for the final assault against the menace, Union Home Minister Amit Shah asserted on Saturday.

The minister stated this during a press conference here after he along with Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai and senior central and police officers reviewed the Maoist issue in the state and adjoining areas.

The meeting, attended by senior officials of seven states, reviewed the inter-state coordination and Left Wing Extremism situation, an official said.

Urging Naxals to shun violence, Shah announced that the Chhattisgarh government would announce a "new look" surrender

said Naxal violence is a challenge to democracy and the menace has claimed about 17,000 lives in the country. He said there was a 53 per cent drop in Naxal incidents during 2014-24 as compared to 2004-14. It is time to deal the final blow to the

problem of Left Wing Extremism with a strong strategy, Shah said.

The minister said the government has been working to fill the security vacuum in LWE-hit areas and the security personnel have undertaken operations along with development works.

He said that besides the security forces, central agencies like NIA and ED have also worked to dismantle Maoist finances.

"We believe we will be able to free the country from Left Wing Extremism by March 2026," Shah said.

Asked about the now-scrapped Article 370, which gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, the home minister said that the provision will not be restored ever.

On the probability of starting the delayed decadal census, Shah said it would be carried out at an appropriate time.

Centre launches UPS for Govt employees

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Saturday approved the Unified Pension Scheme (UPS), which aims to provide assured pension, family pension and assured minimum pension to government employees. Under UPS, the government has assured 50 per cent of salary as pension for government employees. In a big announcement ahead of assembly elections in one state and a Union Territory this year, the government has launched the Union Pension Scheme (UPS) amid protests by several non-BJP-ruled states over the New Pension Scheme (NPS). "This scheme will benefit 23 lakh central government employees," announced Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav. The new scheme will be implemented from April 1, 2025 and employees will have the option to choose between the NPS or UPS.

Boat capsizes in Gandak river

Six people were rescued from the Gandak river in Bihar's West Champaran district on Saturday after a boat in which they were travelling capsized, an official said. The accident occurred in Chandrapur village in Bagaha when the motor boat capsized, he said. "The accident took place in the morning. A rescue operation was launched soon after the administration got information about the capsizing of the boat and all six people were rescued," West Champaran District Magistrate Dinesh Kumar Rai told PTI. Meanwhile, a search operation is on for a government school teacher who fell into the Ganga river.

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet on Saturday approved the continuation of three umbrella schemes of the Department of Science and Technology, merged into a unified central sector scheme called 'Vigyan Dhara'. The proposed outlay for Vigyan Dhara is Rs 10,570 crore during the 15th Finance Commission period from 2021-22 to 2025-26. Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnav told reporters.

Govt engineer falls in Ganga river

BHAGALPUR: A senior engineer of Bihar Water Resources Department on Saturday fell in the Ganga river while he was travelling in a boat to inspect an embankment in Bhagalpur district and he was rescued by NDRF personnel, an official said. Water Resources Department's Katihar Zone Chief Engineer Anwa Jamil was on the motor boat of the National Disaster Response Force when the accident took place. He was travelling to inspect the repair work of the 8.26-km-long Ismailpur-Bindtoli embankment.

'Caste census needed for 90 pc people'

PRAAYAGRAJ: Pressing the demand for a nationwide "caste census", Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said 90 per cent people of the country are sitting out of the system and the step should be taken in their interest. He also said for the Congress, the "caste census" is the foundation and a tool for policy making. Addressing the "Samvidhan Samman Sammelan" here, Gandhi said, "90 per cent people are sitting out of the system. They have skill, knowledge but no connections (with the system). That is why we have raised the demand for a caste census." Asserting that before ensuring the participation of various sections of the society, there is a need to ascertain their numbers, the leader of opposition in the Lok Sabha said, "For the Congress, the caste census is the foundation of policy making. It is a tool for policy making. We cannot make policies in the reality of India without a caste census." Gandhi said just like the Constitution, the caste census is a policy framework and a guide for the Congress. "Just like our Constitution, which is a guide in a way and it is being attacked every day, a caste census, a socio-economic survey, an institutional survey will be our second guide," he said. "We want the data. How many Dalits, OBC (Other Backward Classes), tribals, women, minorities, general caste people are there.

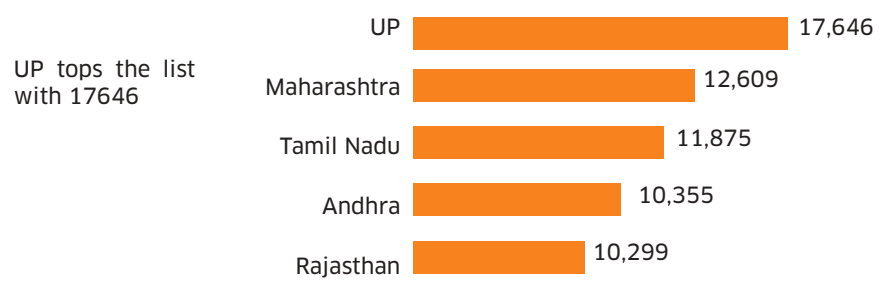

What did the investigation committee found in the investigation:

Let us tell you that on 6 December 2019, the Sub-Divisional Officer Korba had issued a permanent social status certificate of 'Koiri' or 'Koiri' Other Backward Class in favor of Rajkishore Prasad. (It comes under backward class in Bihar state but was issued in Chhattisgarh, that too on the basis of temporary certificate issued from Hardi Bazar tehsil)

According to the high level certification investigation committee, the report of the vigilance cell, statements of witnesses and examination of the documents presented and detailed investigation in this case make it clear that the holder failed to prove his social status. Hence, there is no reason for not cancelling the permanent social status certificate of 'Koiri' or 'Koiri' Other Backward Class issued by the court sub-divisional officer Korba on 6 December 2019. After analyzing the documentary evidence and records provided by the holder, the scrutiny committee has unanimously decided that as per the provisions of the rules framed under the Chhattisgarh Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Classes (Regulation of Certification of Social Status) Act 2013, the permanent social status certificate of 'Koiri' or 'Koiri' Other Backward Class issued in favor of Rajkishore Prasad from the Court Sub-Divisional Officer Korba is cancelled.

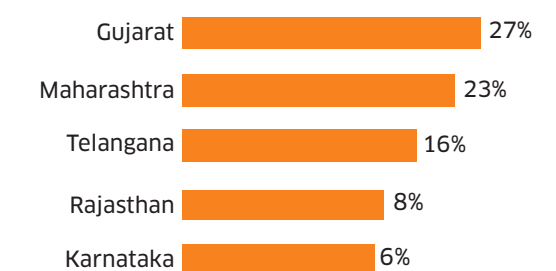

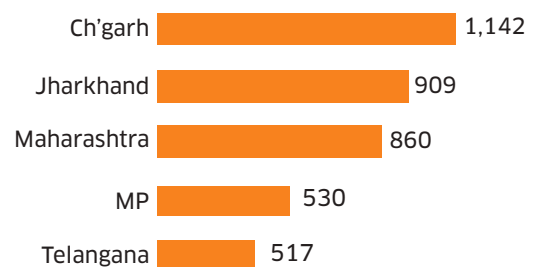

Cheetahs to roam free again in KNP after enclosure stay

African cheetahs and their cubs, born in India will be released, into the wild in a phased manner after the monsoon withdraws from central parts of the country.

NEW DELHI: African cheetahs brought to India as part of the world's first intercontinental translocation of big cats will soon roam free again in the wild, nearly a year after they were returned to enclosures in Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park (KNP) for health check-ups and monitoring, according to officials.

Officials told PTI that the Centre's Cheetah Project Steering Committee decided on Friday to release the African cheetahs and their cubs, born in India, into the wild in a phased manner after the monsoon withdraws

from central parts of the country. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), the monsoon normally withdraws from most areas in Madhya Pradesh by the first week of October.

"Members of the committee and NTCA (National Tiger Conservation Authority) officials conducted field visits to Kuno and discussed the schedule for releasing the cheetahs. While adult cheetahs will be released once the rains end, the cubs and their mothers will be released after December," an official said. All 25 cheetahs -- 13 adults and 12 cubs -- are

doing well. The animals have been administered vaccines to safeguard them against diseases and given prophylactic medicine to prevent infection, according to the official.

The first batch of eight cheetahs from Namibia was introduced in India in September 2022, and

the second batch of 12 cheetahs was flown in from South Africa last February. The cheetahs were initially released into the wild but were brought back to their enclosures by August last year after the death of three -- a female named Tbilisi (from Namibia) and two South African males, Tejas and Sooraj, due to septicemia.

Septicemia is an infection that occurs when bacteria enter the bloodstream and spread.

This condition arose from wounds under the cheetahs' thick winter coats on their backs and necks, which became infested with maggots

and led to blood infections, according to the government's annual report on Project Cheetah. Officials had earlier told PTI that the unexpected growth of winter coats by some cheetahs during the Indian summer and monsoon, in anticipation of the African winter (June to September), was a major challenge in managing the animals in India during the first year.

"Even African experts did not expect this. The winter coat, combined with high humidity and heat, caused itching, leading the cheetahs to scratch their necks on tree trunks or the ground.

CBI to probe financial irregularities at RG Kar Medical College

fore, the investigation should not be fragmented between different agencies. Handing over the investigation to the CBI ensures consistency,” Justice Rajarshi Bhadracharya said.

The high court directed the CBI to submit a progress report on the investigation within three weeks. The court had earlier told the state police to hand over the case diary and necessary paperwork by Saturday at 10 AM. The central probe agency collected all the documents from the police and re-registered the FIR. According to the procedure, the CBI takes over the investigation from state police and re-registers its FIR as its own, keeping the details unchanged. The central agency gives its findings in the final report and submits it before a special court. The High Court had given the directives for a CBI probe on the plea of former Deputy Superintendent of the hospital Akhtar Ali who had alleged financial irregularities in the hospital during the tenure of its former principal Sandip Ghosh and sought a probe by the central agencies. Ali had already filed a complaint with the state police in July 2023. He had given documentary evidence to corroborate the claims of massive corruption, improper utilization of government funds, selling of used hazardous bio-medical waste and transfer of officers for monetary benefit.

Justice Hema report: A missed opportunity for reform

The Hema Committee Report, once heralded as a beacon of hope for addressing the deep-seated issues within the Malayalam film industry, has regrettably become a symbol of missed opportunities and bureaucratic inertia. The report, which was submitted to the Kerala Government in 2019, exposed the pervasive sexual harassment and gender discrimination that women in the industry face. The delayed and censored release of the report has rightfully sparked outrage. The redactions raise serious concerns about transparency and accountability. What is being hidden, and why? Such actions suggest a troubling reluctance to confront the harsh realities of the industry and to hold perpetrators accountable. This evasion only serves to perpetuate the culture of impunity that the report sought to dismantle. The Kerala Government's inaction has deeply undermined the trust of the women who courageously shared their traumatic experiences, hoping for justice and reform. Each day that passes without implementing the committee's recommendations leaves women in the industry vulnerable, reinforcing the systemic barriers that allow exploitation to thrive. The intervention of the Kerala High Court and the state human rights panel underscores the gravity of the situation. The High Court's admission of a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) seeking criminal prosecution for sexual exploitation in the industry, alongside the human rights panel's advocacy for gender justice, highlights the urgent need for action. The Justice Hema Report was meant to be a catalyst for transformative change in Bollywood. Instead, it stands as a stark reminder of the challenges that continue to thwart the fight against workplace harassment. The time to act is now. The government must implement the report's recommendations without further delay, ensuring that the promise of justice is fulfilled and that no more lives are harmed by inaction.

2024 Census: New categories and multilingual support

The Haryana Government has introduced the "Pran Vayu Devta Yojana," a pioneering initiative that provides an annual pension of Rs 2,500 to trees older than 75 years. Launched in 2023, this scheme is a groundbreaking step in environmental conservation, recognizing the importance of ancient trees by treating them with the same respect as human beings. The initiative aims to protect these natural resources, ensuring their survival for future generations.

Background of the scheme

The "Pran Vayu Devta Yojana" was first announced in 2021 by Shri Manohar Lal Khattar, the then Chief Minister of Haryana. Currently, 3,810 such trees in Haryana are receiving pensions through an online system under this initiative.

The environmental impact of the Pran Vayu Devta Yojana is profound. By promoting the care of old trees, the Haryana Government fosters environmental awareness. Mature trees play a crucial role in maintaining ecological balance, with research indicating that a single mature tree can absorb more than 48 pounds of carbon dioxide annually. This initiative is not just a conservation effort; it is a significant step towards mitigating climate change and enhancing environmental sustainability.

Socially, the scheme promotes a sense of responsibility towards the environment across different sections

of society. It also creates employment opportunities in rural areas, where many of these old trees are located, providing a sustainable livelihood source for the rural population.

Challenges and way forward

Despite its innovative approach, the Pran Vayu Devta Yojana faces challenges, such as accurately counting and determining the age of the trees. Ensuring proper use of the pension funds also requires a strict monitoring mechanism. Public awareness campaigns will be essential to ensure the scheme's success.

Conclusion

The Pran Vayu Devta Yojana is a unique and commendable initiative that contributes to environmental protection and raises environmental consciousness. By giving a new lease of life to old trees, this scheme sends a powerful message about the importance of conserving our natural heritage. Unwanted calls: A persistent privacy issue

Unwanted telemarketing calls have become a significant nuisance in India, disrupting daily life and raising serious privacy concerns, despite existing regulations aimed at curbing them. *by Dr Satyavan Saurabh*



Nuisance of unwanted telemarketing calls and the need for privacy protection.

The advent of smartphones revolutionized how we connect, transforming them into more than just communication devices. They bring the world of the internet to our fingertips, offering convenience and connectivity. However, the rise of unwanted or unknown calls has become a significant nuisance. These calls, often from telemarketers selling products, bank loans, or credit cards, disrupt our daily lives, coming at inconvenient times and creating frustration.

In Madhya Pradesh, like in many parts of India, residents are inundated with these unsolicited calls. While many mobile users block these numbers, telemarketing companies often circumvent this by using different numbers, making it a persistent issue. The problem has become so widespread that even the Supreme Court of India has taken notice, stepping in to protect consumers who have registered their numbers under the Do Not Call (DNC) registry. The court has mandated strict action against companies that continue to call consumers who have opted out

of such communications.

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) introduced the Do Not Disturb (DND) service on September 27, 2011, intending to shield consumers from unwanted calls and messages. Despite these efforts, many consumers still find themselves on the receiving end of these disturbances. TRAI has established new rules requiring telemarketing companies to obtain explicit permission from consumers before contacting them. However, enforce-

ment remains a challenge, and complaints about unwanted calls continue to rise.

One significant case highlights the impact of these calls. During a funeral ceremony, a consumer received an unsolicited loan offer call. The Vadodara Consumer Forum ruled in favor of the consumer, ordering the telecaller company, I-Cube, and the caller, Kanhaiyalal Thakkar, to pay a compensation of Rs 20,000 for the disturbance caused. Additionally, I-Cube and Vodafone Essar

Gujarat Limited were fined Rs 10,000 each for violating the complainant's privacy by sharing his personal information without consent. This case, dating back to 2007, underscores the ongoing struggle consumers face with unwanted calls and the need for stricter regulations.

Indian courts and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) have imposed restrictions on telemarketing companies to protect individual privacy. These restrictions, aimed at curbing unsolicited calls for advertising, marketing, and

direct selling, particularly for credit cards and bank loans, reflect a growing concern for consumer rights. Under the revised Banking Ombudsman Scheme, aggrieved customers can file complaints against banks or non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) for violating RBI guidelines on credit cards.

Despite these efforts, telemarketing remains a persistent problem in India. The government needs to strengthen its regulatory framework to ensure that telemarketers respect individual privacy and do not infringe on citizens' fundamental rights. The spirit of recent Supreme Court and consumer court judgments should guide the enactment of a comprehensive law to regulate telemarketing practices, ensuring that businesses can operate without compromising consumer privacy.

In conclusion, while smartphones have brought numerous benefits, the issue of unwanted calls remains a significant challenge. Stronger regulations and enforcement are necessary to protect consumers from this ongoing invasion of privacy.

Centre orders insurance firm to pay Rs 225 cr to Maha farmers in a week

NEW DELHI: The Central government on Saturday directed an insurance company to pay pending claims of up to Rs 225 crore to about 2 lakh farmers in Maharashtra's Parbhani district within a week. The order follows Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan's interaction with farmers in Nanded on August 21, where issues of pending soyabean crop insurance claims were raised. On August 22, the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare held a meeting of the National Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). The committee rejected the insurance company's objections to crop-cutting experiments and ordered the settlement of pending claims, an official statement said. The name of the insurance company was not disclosed in the statement. The Central TAC on Saturday issued a formal order to the insurance company to pay the dues within seven days.

SELLER FEES

Amazon India reduces seller fees by 12% ahead of festive season

MUMBAI: Amazon India on Saturday announced an up to 12 per cent reduction in selling fees across multiple product categories on the marketplace ahead of the festive season. The reductions in fees, which is effective from September 9, will enable sellers to expand their product portfolio on the platform besides providing a boost to growth, Amazon India said. "With the changes, sellers on Amazon India will benefit from a drop in selling fees, ranging from 3-12 per cent, across various product categories", the company said. The new rate card will particularly benefit sellers offering products priced below Rs 500, it said. "At Amazon, we are invested in supporting businesses of all sizes, from small and medium businesses to emerging entrepreneurs to established brands. The fee reduction is directly in response to feedback from our sellers, especially small businesses," Amit Nanda, Director Selling Partner Services at Amazon India, said.

Indian telcos aim for 10% share in 6G patents in next 3 yrs

ICAI leverages AI for professional growth

KOLKATA: The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) is planning to harness the potential of artificial intelligence for the professional growth of students and members, its president Ranjeet Kumar Agarwal said. He said ICAI has set up a committee - 'AI in ICAI' - to explore how the idea can be leveraged, and will also explore and prepare a roadmap for using it in the operations of the institute. The official said a similar 'ICAI CA GPT' was launched in July 2024 for the members and students. ICAI has also come up with an initiative to educate the masses about the basics of taxation, banking, insurance and other areas related to finance, Agarwal said. Besides, the institute is conducting certificate courses for accountants of pan-chayats and municipal bodies, he added.

NEW DELHI: The quality control orders (QCOs) issued by the government for different products will protect MSMEs from unfair competition and help cut the import of sub-standard goods, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Saturday.

He said that through these orders, the government is supporting the MSMEs (micro, small and medium enterprises).

"We are giving time to MSMEs to meet the QCO requirements," he said, adding that MSMEs will benefit from these orders

as "it stops substandard goods imported at strange

rates from outside the country and thus helps the MSME sector by protecting it from unfair competition".

MSMEs should not be looked upon as merely a small enterprise, he added.

The entire ecosystem around big industries and enterprises comprises

thousands of MSMEs, without whom they cannot succeed, he said, adding that MSMEs act both as suppliers and customers of big industries.

The sector also plays an important role in the tourism and infrastructure development of the country and has a big share in India's exports.

"Today, several SMEs have listed their firms at BSE," he said.

Under these orders, items cannot be produced, sold, traded, imported and stocked unless they bear the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) mark. These orders are issued for goods like smart meters, nuts, bolts and fasteners.

Mandatory QCOs help curb the import of sub-standard products, prevent unfair trade practices and ensure the safety and well-being of consumers as well as the environment.

Work-life balance, flexibility challenges women's careers

MUMBAI: Fewer flexible work options, work-life balance and family responsibilities pose substantial challenges for women trying to re-enter the workforce and are the main reasons for quitting their jobs, according to a report.

A survey by Naukri.com has revealed that

work-life balance poses a significant concern, as 39 per cent of the women respondents cited it as a key reason for leaving their jobs.

"These issues pose substantial challenges for women trying to re-enter the workforce, with 41 per cent identifying a lack of flexible work options and 35 per cent highlighting family



responsibilities as significant barriers to continuing with their jobs," the

report said.

The report is based on a survey conducted by

online recruitment company Naukri.com among job seekers registered on its platform.

The report found that 73 per cent of women interviewed said equal opportunities exist for both men and women in employment and leadership positions, and 79 per cent of men agreed that both genders get equal chances at workplaces.

Export Drawback Reduced

Government slashes drawback rates on gold, silver jewellery exports after duty cuts



NEW DELHI: The government has reduced the drawback rates on exports of gold and silver jewellery by more than half to adjust for the significant cut in import duties on these precious metals in the Budget.

A notification regarding this was issued by the Department of Revenue. On the export of gold jewellery, the drawback rate has been brought down to Rs 335.5 from Rs 704.1 per gram of net gold content in the article. The rate of silver jewellery and articles of silver have been cut to Rs 4,468 per kilogram of net gold content in an article. The Duty Drawback Scheme

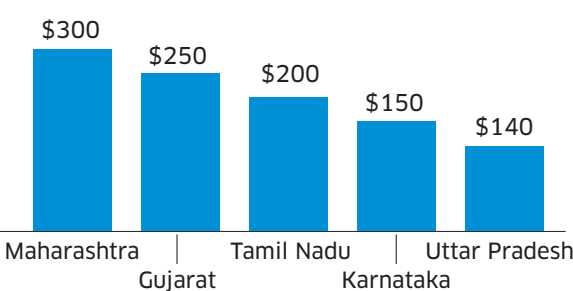
refunds import duties and internal taxes, which are paid while importing goods, which are, in turn, used for manufacturing products for exports. In the Budget, the import duty on gold and silver to 6 per cent from 15 per cent.

Through this notification, "duty drawback on gold and silver jewellery was reduced as the duty on gold and silver lowered in the budget", Federation of Indian Export Organisations Director General Ajay Sahai said. The gems and jewellery exports during April-July this fiscal contracted by 7.45 per cent to USD 9.1 billion.

Govt plans to review 6-decade-old sugar production, pricing norms

NEW DELHI: The food ministry plans to revamp the nearly six-decade-old Sugar (Control) Order and has proposed to regulate the production of the sweetener as well as its by-products including ethanol. The Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution has issued a draft "The Sugar (Control) Order, 2024, and has sought comments from stakeholders by September 23, 2024. The ministry said that there is a need to review the Sugar (Control) Order of 1966 due to the technological advancements in the production process. "...there are multiple changes in the sugar sector which necessitates the revamping of existing the Sugar (Control) Order, 1966," said the ministry while issuing the draft. The draft order details power of the government to regulate the production of sugar as well as restrict its sale, storage and disposal by producers and dealers.

TELECOM

Scindia urges telecom operators to lead in 6G technology development

NEW DELHI: Union telecom minister Jyotiraditya Scindia in second advisory committee meeting with telecom operators on Friday asked them to take lead in the development of 6G technology. According to sources, who were present in the meeting, telecom operators reiterated their old demand of easing right of way permits, rationalisation of power tariffs and lowering of levies in the meeting. "Had a productive meeting with the Advisory Group of Telecom Service providers. Discussed issues pertaining to quality of services, India's 6G vision and promoting research and development to take our sector to new heights of development," Scindia said on social media platform X.

Vedaa: John Abraham's action-packed flop

The latest Bollywood release this week is John Abraham's comeback film Vedaa. The film has shown a disappointing start at the box office and fans are speculating whether John's action heydays are over for the audience. Sharvari Wagh is the lead actress of the film.

In Vedaa, John Abraham delivers his usual high-octane action, but the film struggles to maintain momentum. Directed by Nikhil Advani, the movie promises a deep dive into caste issues but falters with its sluggish pace and stretched screenplay, testing viewers' patience. Abraham, portraying a court-martialled officer from the Gorkha regiment, excels in action sequences, showcasing his signature style of explosive punches and kicks. However, despite his physical prowess, his character's motivations and the film's central theme fail to resonate deeply. the titular character Vedaa, is positioned as a strong woman fighting against societal norms. Yet, her strength is undercut by a lack of impactful moments. The film's portrayal of caste issues is timely but lacks the emotional weight needed to

make a lasting impact. The soundtrack, though emotionally stirring at times, fails to leave a memorable impression, with the Holi song, in particular, feeling jarring given the context of the film. Supporting performances, including Rajendra Chawla's and Tamannah Bhatia's, add some depth, but overall, the film misses the mark in delivering a compelling narrative.

Ultimately, Vedaa might appeal to those seeking action-packed entertainment, but its execution leaves much to be desired. It faces stiff competition from other releases like Stree 2 and Khel Mein, and may struggle to make a significant impact at the box office.

Transportation is becoming a major source of greenhouse gas emissions, forcing us to think of developing technology to provide cleaner and lower carbon emission solutions. Using lightweight metals like aluminum and its alloys in the vehicles without compromising design and performance can be more fuel-efficient, lowering carbonaceous gas emissions. Metals and their alloys are the essential mainstay of aerospace and automotive manufacturing, which boosts economic growth. However, present metal/alloy processing technology is

extremely energy-consuming and causes a huge adverse impact on our environment. Hence, the new eco-friendly processing technologies should replace the present model of material processing.

Aluminum (Al) products are used in the aerospace and automotive industries where weight reduction is the primary goal. However, Al alloys have comparatively low strength values, are difficult to weld, have higher costs, and are difficult to recycle. The strength of Al alloys can be improved by microstructural modification or by introducing ceramic reinforcement. Force convection



New eco-friendly processing technologies should replace the present model of material processing.

(FC) technology is one of the technologies, which can modify the internal microstructure with-

out contaminating the alloy. FC can be created by the external fields, i.e., Mechanical stirring, Electromagnetic field, and Ultrasonic cavitation process. The use of FC alters the solidification mechanism and hence segregation-free, fine equiaxed grain structure can be achieved.

However, introducing the FC technology with the existing metal casters like Direct Chill (DC) caster and Twin Roll Caster (TRC) is extremely challenging. In the indigenously developed Advanced Metal Casting (AMC) Laboratory at NIT Raipur, various casters and FC technologies have been designed, manufac-

tured, and integrated to achieve high-quality cast products.

Presently, Al metal matrix composites (MMCs) produced by the casting route contain several cast defects and the process is also batch type, which increases production cost and decreases production rate. A continuous casting process was also developed to produce high-quality Al-based MMCs. The AMC research group has acquired research funding from various agencies like SERB-DST, Cold Forge Limited, Vedanta Limited, BALCO, and the Royal Academy of Engineering.

NEW DELHI: New Delhi: Shikhar Dhawan, affectionately known as 'Gabbar' of Indian cricket, has officially retired from all forms of the game, marking the end of an illustrious career characterized by brilliance, positivity, and selflessness. In a world where a touch of selfishness is often seen as a necessary trait for elite athletes, Dhawan stood out as an altruist, consistently putting the team before himself. His outlook, though sometimes seen as overly positive, remained free of exaggeration and always grounded in reality.

At 38, Dhawan had been absent from the Indian setup for some time. Rather than fighting against the inevitable, he gracefully accepted his fate and chose to retire. Known for his tenacity, resourcefulness, and willingness to sacrifice for the team's sake, Dhawan's career was defined by his ability to deliver under pres-

His support for his teammates was unwavering, regardless of whether he was part of the squad or not. One defining moment of his character came when he penned a heartfelt note

after the Indian team was announced for last year's ODI World Cup, and again before the T20 World Cup in the Americas, where India broke an 11-year ICC title drought. His retirement message encapsulated his outlook on life: "...don't be sad that you won't play for India again but be happy that you played for your country."

Nick Malouf retires as captain

SYDNEY: Australia men's rugby sevens captain and three-time Olympian Nick Malouf has announced his retirement following the Paris Games. The 31-year-old Malouf, who played in 61 world series tournaments and scored 82 tries for 410 points, made the announcement in a Rugby Australia statement Saturday. NEW YORK: Jannik Sinner fired his fitness trainer and physiotherapist because of his two positive steroid tests in March and said Friday at his pre-U.S. Open news conference – his first public comments on the matter – that he knew he was innocent but worried what the case's outcome would be until finding out he wouldn't be suspended. Sinner's fitness trainer, Umberto Ferrara, and his physiotherapist, Giacomo Naldi, have been at the 23-year-old Italian's side during his rise over the past two years, which included his first Grand Slam title at the Australian Open

in January and ascension to the No. 1 ranking in June. "I'm not feeling that confident to continue with them," Sinner said. "Now I just need some clean air." The International Tennis Integrity Agency (ITIA) announced this week that Sinner failed two drug tests – one during a tournament in Indian Wells, California, and one eight days later – but that it was determined the banned anabolic steroid Clostebol entered his system unintentionally through a massage from Naldi. "Obviously it has been a very tough moment for me and my team," Sinner said. **PTI**

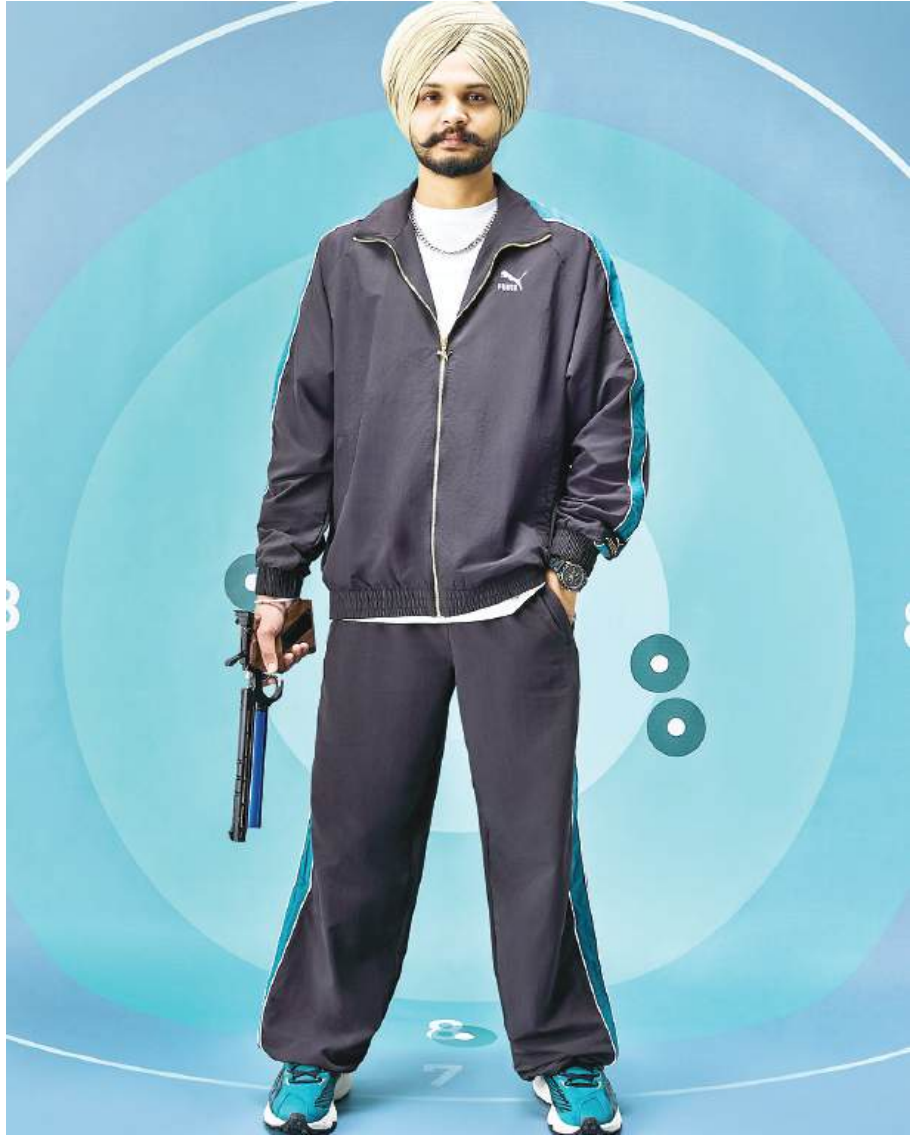
BENGALURU: Sarabjot Singh, who partnered with Manu Bhaker to win India's first ever Olympic medal in a mixed shooting event, on Saturday said they "barely" got to train together in the run-up to their event.

Bhaker and Sarabjot scripted history with a bronze medal in the 10m air pistol mixed team shooting event at the Paris Games.

"My training was due at 9, hers was due at 12, individually. Mixed session lasted for 30 minutes, before which she trained separately, and I separately.

"Our conversation was usually brief and limited to 'Apna 100 per cent dena hai (we have to give our 100 per cent)'. Apart from that, we enjoyed some banter. Sometimes I would make fun of her, sometimes she would of me," recalled Sarabjot.

Sarabjot also revealed his longtime fandom for Yusuf Dikec and said he has been looking up to the Turkish shooting icon for inspiration since 2011. "I have been watching his (Yusuf's) videos since 2011. He has always been

In conclusion, the Olympic medallist stated his ambition for the 2028 Los Angeles Games.

"LA '28; iska colour change karna hai (LA '28, I want to change its colour)," said Sarabjot, gesturing toward his glittering bronze medal.

Mushfiqur leads B'desh to massive total vs Pakistan

Mushfiqur Rahim's brilliant 191 powers Bangladesh to 565, frustrating Pakistan's bowlers.

RAWALPINDI: Mushfiqur Rahim dug in to score a superb 191 and share a record stand with Mehidy Hasan Miraz as Bangladesh nullified Pakistan's pace attack in the first test on Saturday.

Mushfiqur's 11th test hundred, and first against Pakistan, came in more than 8-1/2 hours and lifted Bangladesh to 565 all out on Day 4.

It was Bangladesh's third highest score away from home, as Pakistan's ploy to go with four fast bowlers failed to work on a greenish wicket that eased considerably for batting. Pakistan, which made 448-6 declared in its first innings, lost opener Saim Ayub early in its second and was 23-1 at stumps, trailing by 94 runs. Abdullah Shafique was not out on 12 while captain Shan Masood was unbeaten on 9. Mushfiqur's marathon 341-ball knock, featuring 22 fours and a six, ended in the final session when he attempted a square cut against Khurram Shahzad's good-length delivery and was caught behind. Mushfiqur and No. 8 Mehidy, who scored 77, made the four

Palestinians crammed into shrinking safe zone

The UN estimates that 90% of Gaza's 2.1 million residents have been displaced, with 84% of Gaza now falling within the evacuation zone.

DEIR AL-BALAH: Young girls screamed and elbowed each other in a crush of bodies in southern Gaza, trying desperately to reach the front of the food line. Men doled out rice and chicken as fast as they could, platefuls of the nourishment falling to the ground in the tumult. Nearby, boys waited to fill plastic containers with water, standing for hours among tents packed so tightly they nearly touched. Hunger and desperation were palpable Friday in the tent camp along the Deir al-Balah beachfront,

after a month of successive evacuation orders that have pressed thousands of Palestinians into the area that the Israeli military calls a "humanitarian zone." The zone has long been crowded by Palestinians seeking refuge from bombardment, but the situation grows more dire by the day, as waves of evacuees arrive and food and water grow scarce. Over the last month, the Israeli military has issued evacuation orders for southern Gaza at an unprecedented pace. At least 84 per cent of Gaza now falls within the evacuation zone, according to the UN, which also

estimates that 90 per cent of Gaza's 2.1 million residents have been displaced over the course of the war. Thirteen evacuation

orders have been issued since July 22, according to an Associated Press count, significantly reducing the size of the humanitarian zone declared by Israel at the start of the war while pushing more Palestinians into it than ever before. The increased crowding of evacuees can be seen in satellite photos.

"The food that reaches us from the charity is sufficient for the people in our camp," said Muhammad Al-Qayed, who was displaced from Gaza City and now lives along the beach. "Where do the people who were recently displaced get food from?"

From where do we provide them?" Another displaced Palestinian, Adham Hijazi, said: "I have started thinking that if there is no food, I will go and drink seawater to endure it. I am talking seriously. I will drink water and salt." The military says the evacuations are necessary because Hamas has launched rockets from within the humanitarian zone. In posts on X, the military's Arabic-language spokesperson, Avichay Adraea, has instructed Palestinians to flee immediately, saying the military will soon operate "with force" against Hamas militants in the area.

RUSSIA UKRAINE WAR
Moscow and Kyiv swap prisoners of war

KYIV: Russia and Ukraine exchanged over 100 prisoners of war on Saturday as Kyiv marked its third Independence Day since Moscow's full-scale invasion. Ukraine said the 115 servicemen who were freed were conscripts, many of whom were taken prisoner in the first months of Russia's invasion. Among them are nearly 50 soldiers captured by Russian forces from the Azovstal steelworks in Mariupol. The Russian Defence Ministry said the 115 Russian soldiers had been captured in the Kursk region, where Ukrainian forces launched their surprise offensive into Russia two weeks ago. The ministry said the soldiers were currently in Belarus, but would be taken to Russia for medical treatment and rehabilitation. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said in a post on X that the United Arab Emirates had again brokered the exchange, the 55th since Russia launched a full-scale invasion of its neighbour in February 2022.

Philippines says flares fired from a Chinese island base threatened its fisheries plane

MANILA: A Philippine fisheries bureau plane was threatened by flares fired from a Chinese island base while conducting a routine patrol in the South China Sea, Philippine officials said Saturday, the latest territorial spat between Beijing and Manila over one of the world's busiest trade routes, with confrontations spreading from the disputed waters to the airspace above. China has been at odds with several other countries in the Asia-Pacific for years over its sweeping maritime claims, including almost all of the South China Sea.

ITALY YACHT SINKING

Italian prosecutors open shipwreck and manslaughter investigation into superyacht sinking



ROME: Prosecutors in Italy said Saturday they have opened an investigation into culpable shipwreck and multiple manslaughter after a superyacht capsized during a storm off the coast of Sicily, killing seven people onboard. They included British tech magnate Mike Lynch and his daughter. Termini Imerese prosecutor Ambrogio Cartosio confirmed the investigation has been launched, but said no suspect is currently identified. "We are only in the initial phase of the investigation. We can't exclude any sort of development at present," he told reporters at a news conference. Cartosio said his team will carefully consider each possible element

of responsibility, including those of the ship's captain, the crew, individuals in charge of supervision, the ship-builder and others.
