SC raps Kolkata police for 'lapses' in probe

SC asks protesting docs to get back to work, saying 'justice and medicine' cannot be stopped.

NEW DELHI: A tough talking Supreme Court on Thursday tore into the Kolkata police over the delay in registering the unnatural death of the woman doctor, who was raped and killed at the RG Kar Hospital, calling it "extremely disturbing", and questioned the sequence of events and the timing of its procedural formalities.

Making an impassioned appeal to the protesting doctors across the country, the apex court also asked then to get back to work, saying "justice and medicine" cannot be stopped and moreover, it was issuing all the necessary directions to ensure their safety. It further directed no coercive action against them.

The strong reprimand of the Kolkata police by the top court in which a three-judge bench high-

prise that the postmortem of the victim was conducted on August 9 between 6.10 pm to 7.10 pm before the registration of case as unnatural death, the top court pulled up the Kolkata police over "unexplained" delay of 14 hours in lodging of the FIR in the case.

"How was it that the post-mortem was conducted at 6.10 pm on August 9 and yet the unnatural death information is sent to Tala police station at 11.30 pm on August 9. This is extremely disturbing," the bench, also comprising Justice J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, said.

Pointing out the laxity in investigation by the Kolkata Police, Justice Pardiwala said, "When you start performing the post-mortem, it means that it is a case of unnatural death. However, case of unnatural death was registered at 11.30 pm on August 9 after post-mortem and the FIR is recorded at 11.45 pm. "The entire procedure followed by your state is something which I have not come across in the 30 years of my (professional) life," Justice Pardiwala said.

The top court also quizzed West Bengal government over the role of Dr Sandip Ghosh, former principal of RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, who has come under the scanner in the aftermath of the ghastly crime.

Gangrape accused dies of electrocution

RAIGARH: An absconding gangrape accused died in neighbouring Odisha after coming in contact with a live wire laid by farmers to protect their crops from wild animals, police said on Thursday.

'Unemployed at a higher risk of heart disease'

NEW DELHI: An ICM-R-led study, which estimated risk of adults in India developing heart disease over a 10-year period, found that those unemployed were at a significantly higher risk, followed by those having high blood sugar levels.

Researchers analysed nearly 4,500 adults aged 40-69 years, about half of whom were younger (40-49 years old). Data was collected using surveys and questionnaires,



including those developed by the World Health Organization (WHO), such as for gauging one's physical activity levels. Among the study group, about 85 per cent were at a very low-tolow chance of developing cardiovascular diseases, while about 14.5 per cent and one per cent were at a moderate and high-toNUMBER

RAIPUR: The Congress party launched a nationwide protest on Wednesday outside Enforcement Directorate (ED) offices across various states, with a significant demonstration taking place in Raipur, Chhattisgarh. The protest, led by senior Congress leaders including former Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel and state Congress president Deepak Baij, saw a large gathering of party workers.

The demonstration is part of a coordinated response by the All India Congress Committee (AICC) against what they allege is the political misuse of central investigative agencies by the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Addressing the crowd, Bhupesh Baghel accused the ED, along with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Income Tax (IT) department, of acting beyond their constitutional mandate and serving as exten-

The protest follows Baghel's earlier statements cautioning police and administrative officers in Chhattisgarh against participating in politically driven actions, urging them to consider the long-term consequences of their decisions. He stressed that governments come and go, but actions taken in support of political agendas could cause future repercussions.

The Raipur protest saw the participation of several prominent Congress figures, including former ministers, ex-MLAs, and senior party functionaries like Satyanarayan Sharma, Prem Sai Singh Tekam, and National Secretary Vikas Upadhyay.

Party workers from across the state were called to the capital to join the demonstration, making it a significant show of strength.

Light Metro Train to launch in Raipur: MoU signed with Moscow's Transport

RAIPUR: In a significant boost to the capital's infrastructure, Raipur is set to introduce a modern light metro train service, aimed at alleviating traffic congestion and enhancing urban mobility. The initiative took a major step forward with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Moscow's Transport Minister and Raipur Municipal Corporation, Mayor Aiyaz Dhebar. Mayor Dhebar, who is currently representing India at the International Transport Summit in Moscow, announced the collaboration, which will bring advanced transportation solutions to Raipur. 88 % of fertilizer distribution achieved

RAIPUR: The distribution of various chemical fertilizers to farmers continues for the ongoing Kharif season. As of 21 August 2024, nearly 12 lakh metric tons of fertilizers, constituting 88 percent of the target, have been distributed. The fertilizers distributed include 5,81,342 metric tons of urea, 2,62,207 metric tons of DAP, 1,51,259 metric tons of NPK, 50,431 metric tons of potash, and 1,52,664 metric tons of superphosphate. The state has set a target of distributing 13.68 lakh metric tons of fertilizers through cooperative and private sector channels during the current Kharif season. Against this target, 15.24 lakh metric tons have been stocked, out of which around 12 lakh metric tons have been distributed to farmers.



SC said an order which would protect the person's fundamental right under Article 21 of the Constitution and at the same time guarantee his or her presence, would be reasonable and proportionate.

NEW DELHI: Excessive bail is no bail, the Supreme Court said on Thursday while observing that granting the relief and then imposing onerous conditions is to take away with the left hand, what is given with the right.

The apex court said an order which would protect the person's fundamental right under

Article 21 of the Constitution and at the same time guarantee his or her presence, would be reason-

able and proportionate.

A bench of Justices B

R Gavai and K V Viswanathan delivered its verdict on a plea filed by a man, against whom 13 FIRs have been lodged in several states for various offences including that of cheating. The petitioner had contended before the apex court that he was granted bail in these 13 cases and he has fulfilled the bail conditions in two of them. The top court noted the main plea of the petitioner was that he was not in a position to furnish separate sureties, as directed in the remaining 11 bail orders.

Questions loom over Kolkata police's handling of rape case

he Supreme Court expressed serious concerns over the handling of the investigation into the tragic rape and murder of a junior doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata. The Court's observations highlighted the disturbing delays and inconsistencies in the actions taken by the Kolkata Police, raising questions about the integrity of the investigation. The bench, led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, was visibly troubled by the timing of key legal procedures. It was revealed that the post-mortem of the victim was conducted at 6:10 PM on August 9, yet the case was only registered as an unnatural death several hours later, at 11:30 PM. The Supreme Court found this delay "extremely disturbing," and questioned how such a lapse could occur. To address these concerns, the Court has summoned the Kolkata Police officer who registered the initial entry to appear at the next hearing and provide an explanation. Adding to the gravity of the situation, the Solicitor General, representing the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), pointed out the alarming fact that the First Information Report (FIR) was only registered at 11:45 PM-after the victim had already been cremated. This sequence of events has fueled suspicions of a cover-up, especially given the police's initial claim that the death was a suicide, only to later classify it as murder. The Supreme Court also addressed the ongoing protests by doctors, who have been demanding justice for their colleague. The bench urged the doctors to resume their duties, assuring them that no adverse action would be taken against them for their protest. The Chief Justice emphasized the importance of maintaining public health services, stating, "Once they get back to duty, we will prevail upon authorities to not take adverse action. How will public health infrastructure run if the doctors do not work?" The Court's intervention today marks a crucial step in ensuring that the investigation is conducted with the transparency and rigor that such a heinous crime demands. The transfer of the case to the CBI is a necessary move, but the Supreme Court's continued oversight will be vital in holding all parties accountable and ensuring that justice is delivered swiftly.

tephen Leacock's "Old proverbs Made New" was in our Higher Secondary syllabus. Leacock says that someone should rewrite English proverbs since they are old now. They do not fit in our world anymore. In fact, many of the old proverbs, he argues, are opposite to the new world

He cites an English proverb that says, "People who live in glass houses shouldn't throw stones", implying the people who have faults should not criticise other people for having similar faults.

On this, he argues, "They are the very people who ought to throw stones and to keep on throwing them all the time. They ought to keep up such a fusillade of stones from their glass house that no one can get near it. Or if the proverb is taken to mean that people who have faults of their own ought not to talk of other people's faults, it is equally mistaken. They ought to talk of other people's faults all the time so as to keep attention away from their

Plenty of instances now pouring in to show that his advice is being followed verbatim by some people. First, let us focus on the chronology of events in Uttarakhand.

The Uttarakhand Police arrested independent journalist and Jago Uttarakhand editor Ashutosh Negi, based on a complaint lodged by a Pauri Garhwal resident on March 5, 2024. The journalist famously raised his voice for justice to Ankita Bhandari.

Ankita Bhandari, a 19-yearold receptionist at a resort near Rishikesh, was allegedly killed by the resort owner and two accomplices in September 2022. Her body was found in a canal after she

went missing over a week. The main accused in this case is the son of a former BJP Minister in Uttarakhand.

Cut to August 2024. The mutilated body of a 33-yearold nurse at a private hospital was found in Rudrapur, Uttarakhand on August 8. She was allegedly strangled to death, and her head was smashed with a stone after being sexually assaulted. This heinous crime was committed on her when she was returning home from work.

Just after five days, a teenage girl had been gang-raped inside a stationary private bus at the inter-state bus terminus in Dehradun, Uttarakhand, on August 13.

After two days, on August 15, while commenting on the rape and murder case at the R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata, Uttarakhand Assembly Speaker said, "It is very shameful that such a thing happened in a state which is known for its celebration of Navratri and Durga Puja."

"As volumes are growing, the margins are improving because costs are not growing with it. That's one theme on the path to profitability," he said, adding the company would benefit from having a stable fixed cost as it has built a factory for a higher

Aggarwal further said, "As a strategy, we did much more vertical integration of manufacturing and engineering.

Zomato to acquire Paytm's entertainment ticketing business for Rs 2,048 cr

NEW DELHI: Online food delivery platform Zomato will acquire Paytm's entertainment ticketing business for Rs 2,048 crore to strengthen its "goingout" segment in a deal that will help the troubled fintech firm to sharpen its focus on core payments and financial services distribution. Paytm's entertainment ticketing business covers movies, sports, and events (live performances). The boards of Zomato and One 97 Communications Ltd (OCL) have approved the all-cash deal. As part of this agreement, OCL's entertainment ticketing business will transfer business to its 100 per cent subsidiaries Orbgen Technologies Pvt Ltd (OTPL) and Wasteland Entertainment Pvt Ltd (WEPL), followed by the sale of 100 per cent stake in these subsidiaries (which operate the TicketNew and Insider platforms) to Zomato. Subsequently, Zomato will spin off the new business into a new app called 'District'.







MUMBAI: New Zealand captain Tim Southee reckons India pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah has looked more formidable since making a comeback from a back injury, which kept him out of action for a major part of the last

Bumrah, who was recently described as the 'best all-format bowler in the last five-six years" by the legendary Ricky Ponting, has been at the forefront of the Indian team's success since making a comeback in August 2023 after being out of action since September 2022.

"To be able to firstly bounce back from the major injury and come back, he's even better than what he was beforehand. Throw in on top of that, having to juggle multiple formats, can be difficult at times as well," Southee said on the sidelines of the Ceat Cricket Rating Award on Wednes-

day.

"He seems to have been able to do that with ease as well. He's probably more experienced. understands his game a bit more. He probably had that time where

he was injured to come back and be recharged, refreshed."

"We've got nine Test matches in the next few months. There's a lot of Test cricket, so it's all about managing the workloads. But for me, as long as you're fit and ready to go, then I'd like to play every game," he said.

India and New Zealand will be engaged in a three-Test series for the first time since 2016-17 and Southee welcomed the idea.

"As players, you want to play more Test cricket. It's nice to be able to come here and play three Test matches," he said.

With former Kiwi captain Kane Williamson, opening batter Devon Conway and Finn Allen declining New land Cricket's central contracts for 2024-25, Southee said two of those players will still be available for the majority of the Tests. "It's the way that cricket is going and then the amount of T20 leagues that are popping up.

Neuer said he was "tempted" by the prospect of staying on for the 2026 World Cup but decided against it after speaking with family and friends. 

NEW DELHI: Life has consistently thrown challenges at Krishna Nagar but the Indian para shuttler knows how to take them in stride, laugh at adversity, adapt and emerge victorious.

When he was bullied during his childhood for his short height, Krishna

responded with Krishna achievements. refused to let his dwarfism condition hinder his progress. That was the best way to shut the haters. Despite financial struggles in his early years, he explored various sports, including cricket, football, volleyball, long jump, and sprints. The SH6 category is for short stature athletes, who compete standing.

"It's a dream to participate in such a prestigious event. I feel blessed to have another chance at the Paralympics. My main aim is to defend the gold medal and live up to the expectations," he said.

Standing at about 4 feet 6 inches, Krishna is one of 13 Indian para badminton players set to compete in Paris.

Life was not easy for him even after Tokyo success. If an injury threatened to thwart his progress, losing his mother was a bigger setback.

But the strong-willed athlete hasd no option but to rise again.

Talking about his preparations, he said, "I twisted my ankle after the Tokyo Paralympics and faced some other issues, but now everything is fine. The game is evolving, and I'm focusing on adapting my style to different conditions and opponents. Whether fast or slow, I need to stay positive, keep the shuttle in play, and execute smashes safely."

Krishna, who trains under coach Yadvendra Singh in Jaipur, secured his first para World Championship title in February this year in Thailand, defeating China's Lin Naili in the final.

"It's crucial to stay positive, play safe, and remain calm. There are new players this time, and the competition is tougher. We need to be more agile and play with speed and positivity," he emphasised.

RAWALPINDI: Wicketkeeper-batter Mohammad Rizwan and vice-captain Saud Shakeel smashed centuries as Pakistan piled up 448-6 declared to put the hosts in control of the first test against Bangladesh on Thursday. Rizwan hit a career-

best 171 not out off 239 balls and left-hander Shakeel continued his imperious form in redball cricket with 141 runs off 261 before Pakistan declared late on the second day. Bangladesh openers Shadman Islam and Zakir Hasan negotiated the last hour against the pace of Shaheen Shah Afridi and Naseem Shah as they took the visitors to a cautious 27-0 at stumps after 12 overs, still trailing by 421 runs. Shadman was unbeaten on 12 while Zakir was 11 not out.

Earlier, Bangladesh pace bowlers toiled hard on a greenish wicket which eased for batting under sunshine and saw both Rizwan and Shakeel combining in a five-hour, fifth-wicket stand of 240 runs which took the hosts

from 114-4 to 354-5. Both batters kept Bangladesh's pace and spin at bay for almost two sessions after Pakistan had resumed its first innings on 158-4. They added 98
