JODHPUR: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said the guarantee of simple and accessible justice to all is important as the country moves towards the dream of a developed

Speaking at the concluding ceremony of Platinum Jubilee celebrations of the Rajasthan High Court here, Modi also referred to his Independence Day remark on 'secular civil code' and said that the judiciary has been advocating this for decades.

"As we move forward with the dream of a developed India, there should be a guarantee of simple, easy and accessible justice for everyone. This is very important," he said.

The incident took place at Doctor Hedgewar Hospital in Karkardooma here late on Saturday night while the doctor was providing critical care.

## Shah for ethanol production, coop expansion in Chh'garh

Shah called for complete registration of PACS on NAFED and NCCF portals for agricultural produce sales.

**NEW DELHI:** Union Home and Minister of Cooperation Amit Shah on Sunday laid out a comprehensive plan to boost the cooperative sector in Chhattisgarh, focusing on ethanol production, maize cultivation, and expansion of cooperative societies.

Chairing a review meeting in Raipur, Shah emphasised the need for contracts between NCCF, NAFED, and the state government to promote maize cultivation, an official statement said.



"The central government will purchase all maize from farmers at Minimum Support Price," Shah said, noting the crop's low cultivation cost. The minister called for complete registration of Primary Agriculture Credit Societies (PACS) on NAFED and NCCF portals for agricultural produce sales. Shah proposed mandatory accounts for traders, PACS, and cooperative societies in District Cooperative Central Banks. On ethanol production, he said, "Multifeed ethanol production plants should be set up in the remaining three cooperative sugar mills within six months," assuring central government sup-

### Demanding DA and Arrears

## **Chhattisgarh Sanyukt Morcha to hold** statewide strike on September 9



RAIPUR: The Chhattisgarh Employee Sanyukt Morcha announced a statewide strike on September 9, pressing for the release of dearness allowance (DA) and arrears. In a meeting held in Raipur, the Morcha decided that all government offices, including ministries, directorates, schools, and hospitals, will remain closed on the day of the strike. The employees and pensioners, led by Mahendra Rajput, President of the Mantralaya Sangh, are demanding a 4% increase in DA and dearness relief (DR) effective from January 1, 2024 Currently, the central government provides a 50% DA, while Chhattisgarh offers only 46%. The Morcha argues that the state government should adjust the DA and arrears in the GPF accounts, similar to the Central Government's practice. Despite previous promises in the election manifesto and a memorandum submitted to the Chief Minister, Finance Minister, and Chief Secretary on July 31, the state government has not yet announced the 4% DA/DR increase.

## **Patient falls** to death from fifth floor of hospital

RAIPUR: A tragic incident occurred at Medlife Hospital in Raipur, where a patient died after falling from the fifth floor under suspicious circumstances. The deceased, identified as 60-year-old Ram Biswal, was a resident of Odisha and had been admitted to the hospital for treatment of a mental

The incident took place in the Telibandha police station area. According to initial reports, Biswal fell from a significant height and died on the spot due to the impact. The exact circumstances leading to the fall remain unclear, prompting a police investigation. Upon receiving information about the incident, officers from the Telibandha police station arrived at the scene and have begun probing the case to determine the cause of death. The investigation is ongoing, with authorities looking into whether the fall was accidental or if foul play was involved.

RAIPUR: A political uproar has erupted in Chhattisgarh after Union Minister of State for Housing and Urban Development, Tokhan Sahu, labeled the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed by Mayor Aiyaz Dhebar in Russia for a light metro train project as unconstitutional. According to Sahu, such an MoU cannot be signed without prior approval from the central and state governments. He called it not just an unauthorized move but also an insult to the public, alleging that Dhebar acted outside his official

Adding to the criticism, Deputy Chief Minister Arun Sao said that the mayor's actions were nothing more than a joke played on the public. Sao

claimed that Dhebar failed to secure any permissions from either the state or central governments and that the MoU lacks any legitimate standing. Sao framed it as an election stunt with no real foundation, echoing the aggressive stance taken by several BJP leaders against the agreement.

Mayor Aiyaz Dhebar responded by rejecting the allegations, asserting that his trip to Russia was not a personal visit. He insisted that the invitation

came from the Russian government and emphasized that the light metro train proposai nad aiready discussed and approved by the general assembly as part of the 2024-25 municipal corporation budget.

Dhebar also noted that his visit to Moscow was made known to the relevant authorities prior to his departure.

BJP MLA Rajesh Munat expressed skepticism, arguing that the MoU is not valid if the mayor was on a personal visit.

He insisted that Dhebar was not representing the government in Russia.

Similarly, Chaubey, the leader of the opposition in the corporation, questioned how Dhebar's visit could be considered official when even the Mayor's Council (MIC) was unaware of it.





## Many senior posts lying vacant in Assam Police; running short of resources

**GUWAHATI:** Assam Police is grappling with vacancies at various levels including ADGP, IG, DIG, SP, according to official documents. The state police force is also struggling hard to maintain its pace as it is operating at little over 70 per cent of its vehicle requirement as per official assessment to run its operations efficiently, government records revealed. The total sanctioned strength of Assam Police is 79,852, including 4,835 personnel of Assam Police Radio Organisation (APRO).

Out of this, a total of 12,485 posts, which is 15.64 per cent of the required manpower, are at present lying vacant at various levels, as per official documents of the Home Department. Three posts of Additional Director General of Police are lying vacant against the sanctioned strength of six. Three posts of Inspector General of Police are also lying vacant against 14 posts, while there are no DIG at nine places out of 15 sanctioned posts, it said. PTI





## **Kamala Harris:** The new face of **Democratic hopes**

**T**ith Kamala Harris officially accepting the Democratic Party's nomination for the US presidency, the stage is set for a high-stakes battle in the November 5 election. Just a month ago, Republican Donald Trump seemed unbeatable, exuding confidence after surviving an assassination attempt and watching his opponent, President Joe Biden, struggle. However, the political landscape has shifted dramatically in recent weeks. Faced with declining support and internal party pressure, Biden withdrew from the race, paving the way for Kamala Harris, a candidate who embodies the diverse and evolving face of America. Kamala's acceptance speech hit all the right notes, strategically positioning her as the antidote to what she described as the "extremely serious" threat of a second Trump term. ## Blueprint for sustained growth in Rural India

The Union Budget's provisions for agriculture, employment, and infrastructure aim to drive sustainable growth in rural India, ensuring better livelihoods and development for rural communities. by Satish Singh



The Union Budget has earmarked Rs.1.52 lakh crore for agriculture and allied sectors, with Rs.60,000 crore allocated to the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi. These provisions are aimed at bolstering the agriculture sector and, by extension, rural India. Among the key initiatives, the digitization of land records is a notable step. The budget outlines the inclusion of 6 crore farmers and their lands under a comprehensive land registry. This initiative will streamline GIS mapping, ownership rights, and registration, simplifying access to various government schemes for farmers.

To promote sustainable agriculture, the government has proposed the establishment of 10,000 bio-research centers. These centers are expected to reduce the use of pesticides, decrease soil erosion, and promote the use of animal waste as manure. In tandem, the government aims to bring 1 crore farmers into natural farming practices within the next two years, with provisions for branding and certification. This shift towards natural farming is expected to improve public health by reducing reliance on synthetic chemicals, which often diminish the nutritional value of food.

To address the issue of

food wastage, the government ing their connectivity and plans to develop large clusters near consumption centers, ensuring that surplus produce from villages is utilized efficiently. Furthermore, the expansion of the Kisan Credit Card (KCC) scheme, which was initially launched in 1998, will now extend to five more states where eligible farmers have yet to receive its benefits.

Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) is another significant focus, aimed at integrating farmers and their lands into the digital network within three years. DPI will create a physical network necessary for farmers to access various goods and services, enhanc-

economic opportunities. The National Co-operation Policy is also set to expand the portfolio of agricultural loans by encouraging banks to partner with Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), cooperative societies, and agri-startups.

The budget allocates Rs.86,000 crore for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), ensuring 100 days of employment for adult members of rural families. This scheme proved crucial during the COVID-19 pandemic, providing a safety net for rural youth and their

Health initiatives are also prioritized, with Rs.28,000 crore earmarked for the National Health Mission, which aims to improve healthcare access for children, women, and underprivileged populations in rural areas. In addition, the budget includes Rs.14,600 crore for crop insurance, a critical provision given the dependence of Indian agriculture on monsoons and the recurring threats of floods and droughts.

The Ayushman Bharat Yojana (PMJAY), a health scheme benefiting marginalized communities, receives Rs.7,300 crore, ensuring continued access to healthcare

These budgetary provisions collectively aim to ensure sustained growth and development in rural India, addressing key areas such as agriculture, employment, health, and infrastructure.

## FPIs inject Rs 11,366 cr in debt market; inflow tally crosses Rs 1 lakh crore

NEW DELHI: Foreign investors infused Rs 11,366 crore in the Indian debt market so far this month, pushing the net inflow tally in the debt segment to over the Rs 1-lakhcrore mark. Foreign investors' strong buying interest in the Indian debt market can be attributed to India's inclusion in JP Morgan's Emerging Market government bond indices in June this year. According to data with the depositories, Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) injected Rs 11,366 crore in the debt market this month (till August 24). This inflow came following a net investment of Rs 22,363 crore into the Indian debt market in July, Rs 14,955 crore in June and Rs 8,760 crore in May. Before that, they pulled out Rs 10,949 crore in April. With the latest flow, FPIs net investment in debt has reached Rs 1.02 lakh crore in 2024 so far. Market analysts said that ever since the announcement of India's inclusion came in October 2023 year, FPIs have been front-loading their investments in Indian debt markets in anticipation of the inclusion in global bond indices.







## Spinners guide Bangladesh Novak Djokovic seeks a record 25th to historic Test win vs Pak

Bangladesh shocks Pakistan with historic 10-wicket victory, ends 14-match winless streak despite political unrest; spinners Mehidy and Shakib dominate in Rawalpindi.

Pakistan, which conceded a 117-run first innings lead despite declaring at 448-6, was bowled out by a disciplined pace and spin attack after it resumed on 23-1 and still 94 runs behind.

RAWALPINDI: Rawalpindi: Bangladesh overcame political turmoil back home to achieve a historic 10-wicket victory over Pakistan, who collapsed to 146 all out on the dramatic final day of the first Test on Sunday. Off-spinner Mehidy Hasan Miraz and left-arm spinner Shakib Al Hasan, a former lawmaker in Sheikh Hasina's government, claimed seven wickets between them, following a strong performance from the pace bowlers that dismantled Pakistan's top order. This triumph marked Bangladesh's first win in 14 Test matches against

Openers Zakir Hasan and Shadman Islam remained unbeaten on 15 and 9, respectively, as Bangladesh comfortably reached 30-0 at tea, securing only their seventh away Test win and the first since beating New Zealand in January 2022. Pakistan, despite declaring at 448-6 in the

first innings, squandered a 117-run lead and was undone by Bangladesh's disciplined bowling attack.

This defeat extended Pakistan's winless streak in home Test matches to nine, dating back to their victory over South Africa in Rawalpindi in 2021. The second Test will also be held in Rawalpindi, following a venue change from Karachi due to construction work.

SOLINGEN: A 26-year-old man has turned himself into police, saying he was responsible for the Solingen knife attack that left three dead and eight wounded at a festival marking the city's 650th anniversary, German authorities announced early Sunday.

Duesseldorf police said in a joint statement with the prosecutor's office that the man "stated that he was responsible for the attack." "This person's involvement in the crime is currently being intensively investigated," the statement said.

Federal prosecutors said they were investigating on suspicion of murder, attempted murder and membership in a foreign terrorist organisation. The suspect was to make a first appearance before a judge later Sunday. PTI

LONDON: A brand-new Bollywood orchestra is all set to curate a regular series of performances to bring iconic Hindi film melodies alive on stage in the UK, with a talented ensemble of artists in homage to some of India's best-known musicians. London Bollywood Orchestra will kick off with its inaugural show on October 5 at Wilton's Music Hall in east London, a historic venue dating back to the 1850s and often serving as a film set.

It has been chosen as an ideal setting for singers Rekha and Navin Kundra to croon along with a talented 15-piece orchestra composed of a diverse range of instruments from tabla and dholak to flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, guitars and violins.
