India win back-to-back Olympic hockey bronze

Harmanpreet Singh lead India beat Spain 2-1 to claim 2nd consecutive bronze medal.

PARIS: Skipper Harmanpreet Singh rose to the occasion once again with twin strikes as the Indian hockey team beat Spain 2-1 to claim a second consecutive bronze medal at the Olympics and give a perfect send-off to veteran custodian P R Sreejesh here on Thursday.

The Indians recovered from the heart-wrenching 2-3 defeat to Germany in the semifinal and played positive hockey for most part of the match to come out trumps. Harmanpreet (30th, 33rd minutes) converted two penalty corners after Spain skipper Marc Miralles gave his side the lead against the run of play in the 18th minute from a penalty stroke. The Indians regrouped themselves and showed their mental strength to claim another podium finish at the world's biggest sporting spectacle. This was

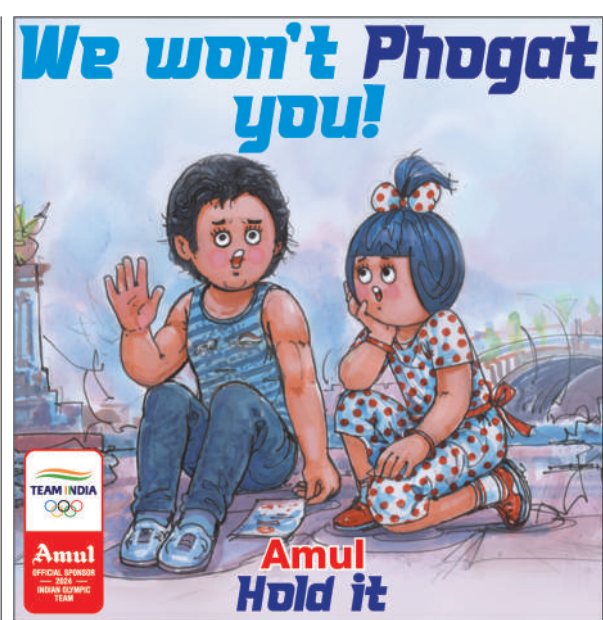
ED attaches Rs 113-crore assets

The Waqf Properties (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants), Bill, 2014 was introduced in Rajya Sabha on February 18, 2014 by erstwhile minority affairs minister K Rahman Khan.

NEW DELHI: The government on Thursday withdrew the Waqf Properties (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants) Bill 2014, which sought to provide for a mechanism for the eviction of unauthorised occupants from waqf properties, in Rajya Sabha.

The Waqf Properties (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants), Bill, 2014 was

introduced in Rajya Sabha on February 18, 2014 by erstwhile minority affairs minister K Rahman Khan.

It was referred to the Standing Committee on Personnel, Public Grievances, Law and Justice on March 5, 2014.

Assets dedicated for religious or charitable purposes are referred as Waqf properties.

Minister of Minority Affairs Kiren Rijiju sought the leave of the House to

withdraw the bill and the withdrawal was approved by voice vote in Rajya Sabha by the members.

CPI (M) MP John Brittas and IUML MP Abdul Wahab opposed the withdrawal of the bill in the Upper House.

Explaining about his stand, Brittas said the bill was introduced in Rajya Sabha precisely because it was intended to free the properties of Waqf properties. The objec-

tives of the bill are model objective which should be adhered to, he pointed out, and added that this government deliberately delayed getting confirmation of the House and the Parliament. He stated that this bill is being withdrawn precisely to bring another bill to encroach upon Waqf properties, (with diametrically opposite intention. "The intention of the government is suspect. They want to create polarisation in the society. They want to polarise the Indian people. They want to play politics," he alleged.

Bareilly on edge as serial killer eludes police

Serial killer in UP? 9 women murdered in 13 months.

BAREILLY: A strangler on the loose has sent locals in the Shahi-Sheeshgarh area of Bareilly in Uttar Pradesh under a grip of fear, with the police bereft of a solid lead and clutching onto a few sketches in way of clue to get to the serial killer who has taken nine lives.

Nine women have been killed in the Shahi-Sheeshgarh area since last year and police suspect they all have been perpetrated by the same person who strangled all his/her victims, at least one, by her own saree.

The latest victim, Anita Devi from Haujpur village, was found strangled on

July 2, a year since the first murder took place on July 22 last year, when Kusma from Khajuria village met a similar fate. The lack of leads

The local police have not been able to crack the case, and this inactivity cannot continue," Singh said on Wednesday. The timeline of these murders paint a grim picture. According to the police, the second victim in the series was Veeravati from Seva Jwalapur village, who was strangled on August 23 last year. Mehmoodan, an elderly woman, was found in a sugarcane field on October 31, 2023.

Anxiety surge among elderly in Rural India

NEW DELHI: Anxiety levels have increased in rural India, a report released on Thursday revealed, stating that nearly 45 per cent respondents said they have suffered anxiety.

The prevalence of mental health disorders in India has risen steadily in recent years, contributing to the escalating public health

concern, according to the State of Healthcare in Rural India Report - 2024, which covered a total of 5,389 households in 21 states.

"One of the major findings of the survey was related to mental health, revealing that anxiety levels have risen in rural India, making it no longer just an 'urban' phenomenon," the report said. "The study reveals that



45 per cent of the respondents across gender most of the time have anxiety and worry that impacts their state of mind. The data reveals that anxiety and worry impact mental health

much more among the older cohorts than those who are younger," it added. The report said that 40 per

cent of those aged 18-25 years admitted feeling anxiety, with the proportion increasing to 53 per cent among those who are 60 and above. The report also talked about the concept of "Neighbourhoods of Care" as a fundamental shift in the approach to health delivery. The report found that 73 per cent of rural households with elderly members need constant care.

FIR FILED

FIR filed against KK Srivastava in Rs 15 crore fraud case

RAIPUR: An FIR has been lodged against KK Srivastava, a prominent figure from Chhattisgarh, in connection with a massive fraud involving Rs 15 crore. The complaint, filed at Telibandha police station, accuses Srivastava of deceiving a Delhi businessman by promising to secure a Smart City project contract. The victim, Ashok Rawat, owner of Rawat Associates, alleges that KK Srivastava, claiming to be well-connected with political figures during the Congress regime, promised to secure a Rs 500 crore Smart City project. Srivastava purportedly demanded Rs 15 crore as a performance bond to facilitate the deal. According to the FIR, Srivastava prepared fake documents and directed Rawat to deposit the money into seven different bank accounts.

He directed officials to pay special attention to the health security of newborns and to achieve targets set under the Prime Minister's TB Free India Campaign.

Ranu granted bail by SC, still held on EOW charges

RAIPUR: Ranu Sahu, currently imprisoned in connection with the coal levy recovery and money laundering case, has been granted regular bail by the Supreme Court. However, due to ongoing proceedings by the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) related to the same matter, Sahu will remain in jail for the time being. Along with Ranu Sahu, businessmen Sunil Agarwal and Deepesh Tank have also received regular bail from the Supreme Court. Despite this development, Sahu's release is pending due to an unresolved money laundering case filed by the EOW in January of this year. He has yet to secure bail for these charges. In a separate legal matter, rice miller Roshan Chandrakar, who is incarcerated in connection with the custom milling incentive scam, was denied bail by the special court. Chandrakar's lawyer reported that the court rejected his bail application today.

ARRESTED

3 siblings and 2 buyers arrested for stealing from multiple houses

RAIPUR: In a major breakthrough, Raipur police have arrested three siblings and two buyers involved in a series of thefts from vacant houses in the DD Nagar police station area. The suspects are accused of breaking into eight different houses and stealing goods valued at Rs 16,51,000, including gold and silver jewelry, cash, mobile phones, and a vehicle used in the crimes. The main accused include Suraj Singh alias Ashutosh (20 years) and Siddharth Singh alias Naintu (24 years): These brothers have a history of theft-related offenses and have served jail time for similar crimes and Aditi Singh alias Simmi (30 years): The sister of Suraj Singh, who was involved in selling the stolen jewelry. The buyers were Sanjay Kumar Jaiswal (40 years) and Arvind Kumar Verma (31 years): Jewelry shop owners from Chandauli, Uttar Pradesh, who purchased the stolen jewelry. On June 25, Garima Sharma reported to DD Nagar police that upon returning from her maternal home in Arang, she discovered her house had been burglarized. Locks on the main door and cupboard were broken, and valuable items, including gold and silver jewelry, mobile phones, and cash, were missing.

PRODUCTION WARRANT

Anwar Dhebar and Arunpati Tripathi brought to Raipur for questioning



RAIPUR: Businessman Anwar Dhebar and former officer Arunpati Tripathi were transported from Meerut to Raipur on Thursday under a production warrant issued by the Enforcement Directorate (ED). The pair, who were initially involved in a fake hologram case and had been held in Meerut, appeared before the special court in Raipur around 1 pm. The production warrant was issued by the ED as part of an ongoing investigation into a liquor scam. Following the failure to present the challan in the Karnataka case related to the liquor scam, the ED registered a new case. Anwar and Tripathi had been arrested by the Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (UP STF) in connection with the fake hologram case and were held on judicial remand in Meerut.

The institute will be established on a 120-acre land identified in Tendua, Nava Raipur, which will be allotted to the Sports and Youth Welfare Department by the Revenue Department.

The regional institute will offer specialized courses in physical education and sports, with a capacity to accommodate 1000 students per academic session. It will be a fully residential institute.

Consequently, the entire traffic load falls on VIP Road and the Amalidih road, creating a constant risk of accidents. If a service road is constructed in Amalidih, the citizens here will have convenient access to Shankar Nagar, Devendra Nagar, Fafadih, the industrial area, the railway station, and

the airport. This will also reduce traffic pressure on VIP Road and in Amalidih village, thereby preventing accidents.

Landowners have donated their land to the Chhattisgarh Road Development Authority through deeds for the construction of the service road, and it has been recorded in the revenue records. However, the construction of the service road has not yet

Karnataka High Court rejects PIL against renaming of Basavanagudi ward

Tanwar said the river originates in Nag mountains of Ajmer and travels about 495 km before merging into the Rann of Kutch in Gujarat.

"The river travels 350 km in Rajasthan through Ajmer, Nagaur, Jodhpur, Pali, Jalore and Barmer districts but hardly reaches Barmer and even during heavy rain," he said.

Former union minister of state Kailash Chaudhary and others also offered prayers at the river while similar scenes were witnessed at a few other places as well.

Tribal students to be trained in semiconductor technology

The protestors, scores of whom gathered under the Kankarkheda bypass flyover here, also burnt an effigy of "fundamentalists in Bangladesh".

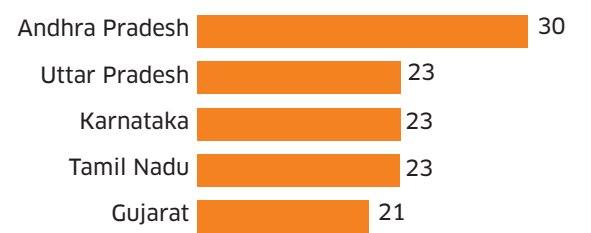
"We demand from the prime minister that all the Sanatani Hindus living in Bangladesh should be given

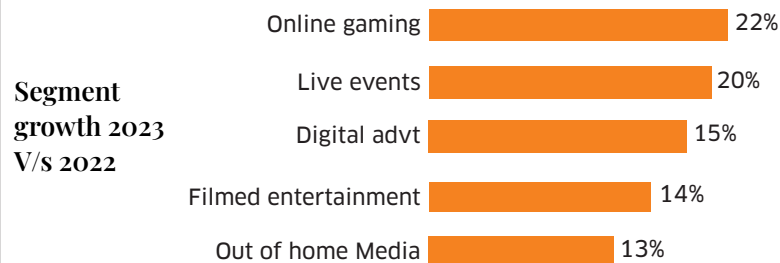

Concrete action in this matter hinges on the forensic report and other technical investigations. In the police's preliminary investigation, the possibility of murder is uncertain. However, the post-mortem report provided by the doctor has confirmed that it is indeed a case of murder, adding a layer of complexity to the situation. The conflicting nature of these findings has complicated the investigation, making it difficult for authorities to proceed. The police are now awaiting further forensic analysis and technical evidence to clarify the circumstances surrounding the case and to determine the next steps in their inquiry.

Amid the protest, ASP Neha Pandey, SDOP Lalchand Mohle, TI Jitendra Banjare and other police personnel kept appealing to the MLA and his family to end the blockade and assured speedy justice

in a span of 15 days. It is worth noting that in the police investigation so far no concrete clue has been found regarding the murder of the deceased Rajeshwar, due to which any suspect could be arrested.

Police procures 700 face detection cameras for I-Day

North district will get 346 CCTV cameras, the central district will get 354.

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police has procured 700 facial recognition CCTV cameras to ensure robust security arrangements for the Independence Day celebrations in the city, officials on Thursday said. These cameras will be installed in and around the north and central districts - particularly the Red Fort from where Prime Minister Narendra Modi will deliver his Independence Day speech -- to monitor VVIP movements and keep a close eye on any suspicious activities, they said. While the north district will get 346 Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras, the central district will be allotted 354 cameras, officials said.

“These cameras will have pan-tilt-zoom features with high resolutions which will allow police to identify anyone from a distance. These cameras will be installed in and around the fort,” a senior police officer said. The cameras with facial recognition and video analytic systems will ensure foolproof security, the officer said, adding that more than 10,000 security personnel will be deployed at the Mughal-era fort

when Modi addresses the nation. The areas surrounding the Red Fort will be demarcated as a “no kite flying zone” until the programme is over. Personnel will be deployed with necessary equipment on strategic locations to intercept kites, police said.

“Of the 700 cameras, 40 will be used for facial recognition, 15 for detecting intrusions, 10 each for reading registration plates of vehicles and counting people and five for detecting abandoned objects,” the officer said.

Police bans aerial platforms for security reasons from Aug 2-16

But when we look at the reality on the ground, the areas we had freed from terrorism are once again reeling under the fear of guns,” he said. “People in areas, where there used to be no Village Defence Committees, are now demanding weapons to safeguard themselves and their villages.

The army, (personnel) packed in scores of trucks, is being reinducted into areas where the number of troops was decreased by us,” Abdullah said.

He said that “our rulers did not pay attention to these areas”.

‘No agreement with Kenya on cheetahs’

NEW DELHI: No agreement has been signed with Kenya for bringing cheetahs to India, the government informed Parliament on Thursday.

In response to a question, the Union Minister of State for Environment Kirti Vardhan Singh told the Rajya Sabha that 17 cheetah cubs have been born at the Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh after the introduction of cheetahs in India.

“No, Sir. No agreement has been signed with the government of Kenya for translocation of cheetahs to India,” he said.

The first batch of eight cheetahs was introduced in India in September 2022, and the second batch of 12 cheetahs was flown in from South Africa last February.

Recent attacks on immigrants and Muslims, including the stabbing of three girls, have been cynically exploited by far-right agitators to fuel hatred and incite chaos. This violence has transcended mere protests, evolving into widespread unrest with shops looted, cars set on fire, and mosques and Asian-owned businesses targeted. This alarming trend underscores a deeper societal malaise. The far-right's hostility towards immigrants is not simply a reaction to isolated events but a symptom of broader social anxieties and political failures. Misguided beliefs about immigration and cultural integration have been stoked by influencers like Tommy Robinson and politicians such as Nigel Farage. These figures spread dangerous misinformation, such as the false claim that the attacker was a Muslim immigrant, to rally support for their divisive agendas. Prime Minister Keir Starmer's condemnation of the riots as "organized illegal thuggery" is a necessary step, but it is not sufficient. Despite the arrest of nearly 400 people in a week of violence, including clashes between rioters and the police, more must be done. The government must make concerted efforts to combat the spread of misinformation online, which has proven to be a potent tool for radicalizing individuals and inciting violence. Furthermore, addressing the underlying socio-economic issues that far-right groups exploit is crucial. Problems such as unemployment and inadequate social services often breed resentment towards immigrants. By tackling these root causes, the government can undermine the far-right's appeal and prevent the exploitation of these issues to foster division and hatred. While condemning and policing far-right violence is essential, it is equally important to address the broader social and economic issues that give rise to such extremism. Only through comprehensive and multifaceted strategies can the UK hope to overcome the dangerous rise of far-right violence and ensure a more inclusive and harmonious society.

Judicial hierarchy ensures independence, not subordination

The Indian judiciary is unique for its relative non-interference from the executive and legislature. Its hierarchical system ensures that litigants can appeal if dissatisfied with a particular court's verdict. The Supreme Court (SC) has reiterated that no court is superior to another. Under Article 141 of the Constitution, SC judgments are binding on all courts in India. However, the High Courts (HC) remain independent in their administrative functions. The SC consistently refuses to direct HCs to resolve cases within a specific timeframe, respecting their autonomy. Justice Abhay Oka of the SC aptly remarked during a hearing that "a court is a court." In 2022, Chief Justice DY Chandrachud criticized the use of the term "subordinate judiciary" to describe district courts, noting the lack of a constitutional definition for "subordinate." While the HC, as an appellate court, can overturn district court judgments and has administrative control over district courts, this relationship does not imply subordination. The perceived subordination stems from the HC's authority to review and reverse district court decisions and its administrative oversight, but the judiciary remains a cohesive and independent entity.

Indigenous peoples, comprising 6.2% of the global population, are vital to our cultural heritage. Protecting their rights and cultures is crucial for preserving our planet's diversity.

Human society is enriched by diverse cultures, with indigenous tribes being some of the oldest and most unique groups. Comprising about 6.2% of the global population, indigenous peoples live in 90 countries worldwide. India is home to 705 tribes, accounting for 8.6% of its population. Recognizing their importance, the United Nations has celebrated International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples on August 9 since 1994, advocating for their development and the preservation of their unique cultures.

Global and Domestic Context

The United Nations has emphasized protecting the rights of uncontacted tribes, with approximately 200 such tribes globally, mostly in remote forests. The Amazon rainforest hosts around 100 of these tribes in countries like Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, Indonesia, Papua New Guinea, Peru, and Venezuela. In India, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are home to tribes like the Jarawa, Onge, and Sentinelese. The Sentinelese, residing in North Sentinel Island for about 60,000 years, remain uncontacted and hostile to outsiders. Attempts to study them have failed, leading the Indian government to declare their habitat a prohibited area. Despite lifting some restrictions in 2018 to promote tourism, the Sentinelese territory remains off-limits to protect them from external threats and diseases.

Challenges and Legal Protections

Indigenous communities face numerous challenges, including exploitation of natural resources, deforestation, and developmental activities that threaten their livelihoods. Tribes like the Akuntsu and Awá in Brazil face extinction, while others in the Philippines, Paraguay, and Peru struggle to survive. The natural resources in their areas have often become a curse, leading to activities such as agriculture, rubber tapping,

Various laws protect indigenous rights in India, such as the Forest Rights Act of 2006, the PESA Act of 1996, and specific constitutional articles. Autonomous councils in northeastern India and the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act of 1989 further safeguard their rights. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Protection of Aborigi-

nal Tribes) Regulation of 1956 controls outsider entry, and the Indian Forest Act of 1927 regulates forest protection and resource use. Commissions like the Dhebar and Xaxa have provided valuable suggestions for their development.

Globally, several laws protect the rights of indigenous peoples, such as the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) of 2007 and the ILO Convention of 1989. Organizations like Survival International contribute to their development and protection, highlighting the critical need for safeguarding their cultural, physical, and economic integrity.

NSE adds 1 crore investors in 5 months, total goes up to 10 crore

NEW DELHI: The National Stock Exchange (NSE) on Thursday said its unique registered investors have crossed the 10 crore mark, with the latest 1 crore addition taking place in just five months. The investor base has seen more than 3-time jump in the last five years, facilitated by rapid growth in digitisation, rising investor awareness, financial inclusion and sustained market performance. "The unique registered investor base on the National Stock Exchange of India crossed the 10-crore mark on August 8, 2024," the bourse said in a statement. With this, the total number of client codes (accounts) registered with the exchange stands at 19 crore. This includes all client registrations done till date. Notably, clients can register with more than one trading member. Investor registrations at NSE have seen an accelerating trend over the last few years.

Sensex, Nifty tumble nearly 1 pc post RBI monetary policy decision



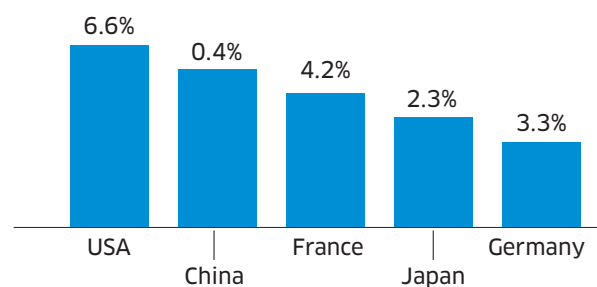
MUMBAI: Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty closed nearly 1 per cent down on Thursday after the Reserve Bank of India decided to keep the policy rate unchanged for the ninth time in a row, saying food inflation remains stubborn. The 30-share BSE Sensex declined by 581.79 points or 0.73 per cent to settle at 78,886.22 in a volatile trade. During the day, it tumbled 669.07 points or 0.84 per cent to 78,798.94. After a day's breather, the NSE Nifty retreated to close lower by 180.50 points or 0.74 per cent to 24,117. During the day, it

tanked 217.8 points or 0.89 per cent to 24,079.70. MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank of India on Thursday expectedly kept the benchmark interest rate and stance unchanged for the ninth straight policy meeting, saying it cannot afford to look through persisting high food inflation and has to remain vigilant to prevent spillover. Retaining its unambiguous focus on inflation, the Monetary

Policy Committee (MPC), which consists of three RBI and three external members, kept the benchmark repurchase or repo rate unchanged at 6.50 per cent. Four out of the six members of MPC voted in favour of the rate decision. The panel, whose four-year term ends in October, also decided to retain a policy stance at "withdrawal of accommodation" to aid MPC's

focus on bringing inflation towards its 4 per cent tar-

get. Inflation climbed to 5.08 per cent in June, primarily driven by the food component. RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said food inflation remains "stubbornly" high.

"Without price stability, high growth cannot be sustained," he said, adding that "monetary policy must continue to be disinflationary". He said the MPC could have looked through high food inflation if it was transitory.

"But in an environment of persisting high food inflation, as we are experiencing now, the MPC cannot afford to do so. It has to remain vigilant to prevent spillovers or second round effects from persistent food inflation and preserve the gains made so far in monetary policy credibility."

The MPC last revised interest rate in February 2023, when it was hiked to 6.5 per cent.

COLOMBO: India's captain, Rohit Sharma, hinted at potential changes in team selection for spin-friendly conditions after their first ODI series loss to Sri Lanka in 27 years. Sri Lanka's spinners outclassed the Indian batters on slow, turning pitches, leading to a 2-0 series win, capped by a 110-run defeat for India in the final game. Rohit stressed the need for a "horses-for-courses" approach, implying that India might select different personnel tailored for specific conditions in the future. He acknowledged the team's effort but pointed out the necessity of having clear strategies and maintaining momentum on challenging pitches. "I don't see a lack of effort in how we want to try and play different shots. Players attempted reverse sweeps and paddles, but these aren't their natural shots," Rohit stated post-match. He emphasized the importance of individual plans and consistent bravery, especially on tricky pitches. "Everyone needs to understand their plan and execute it. If the pitch suits your plan, go for it. If not, adapt and find alternatives," he added. Rohit praised Sri

Lanka's consistent sweeping strategy, contrasting it with India's struggle to adapt. "They were very consistent with their sweeps, targeting deep square leg and mid-wicket. We failed to replicate that as a batting unit," he noted.

Despite growing up on slow pitches, Rohit felt Indian batters lacked

self-belief. "We've all played on turning pitches, but it's about having a plan and believing in it," he said, urging his team to stay calm and confident. Reflecting on his own performance, Rohit explained his aggressive approach during power plays. "I aimed to maximize runs in the power play to ben-

efit the team. My plan is straightforward: be aggressive at the top and maintain momentum," he said. Rohit concluded by emphasizing the need to support his players and avoid overanalyzing the defeat. "It's important to stay calm and provide confidence. This is what is required," he asserted.

Rafael Nadal withdraws from US Open, raises retirement speculations

NEW YORK: Rafael Nadal pulled out of the US Open on Wednesday, making it the third Grand Slam tournament he's missed this season and raising more questions about his future in tennis at age 38. Nadal's announcement on social media was not much of a surprise. Yes, he was on the official entry list released last month for New York, but that was more of a formality than anything and did not preclude the 22-time major champion from withdrawing at any point before competition begins Aug. 26. Plus, Nadal telegraphed this news a week ago after his participation in the 2024 Olympics for Spain ended with a quarterfinal loss in doubles alongside Carlos Alcaraz. That followed a second-round loss in singles to rival Novak Djokovic, who left Paris with the men's gold medal. **PTI**

Epic Redemption Achieved

Oleksandr Khyzhniak punches his way to a Paris gold after a last-minute loss in Tokyo



PARIS: Oleksandr Khyzhniak was one minute away from winning an Olympic gold medal three years ago when he was rocked by one miraculous punch. Khyzhniak went down, the fight was stopped and the most fearsome boxer in Tokyo had to settle for silver.

The middleweight from Ukraine decided he would wait three years to make it right. Khyzhniak got his epic redemption Wednesday night at the Paris Games with a gold medal finally around his neck – but only after he paid for it in time, sweat and pain.

Khyzhniak beat Nurbek Oralbay of Kazakhstan 3:2 in a thrilling final at Roland Garros, securing the cham-

ampionship that evaded him in heart-breaking fashion in Tokyo. The fighters unloaded on each other for three action-packed rounds, but Khyzhniak clinched the win by dominating a final three minutes filled with a jaw-dropping number of uppercuts, combinations and power punches for an Olympic fight.

When Khyzhniak's hand was raised, the 29-year-old dropped to his knees in cathartic relief. Even though he is an obvious blue-chip professional prospect, Khyzhniak put any other chapters of his life on hold because he was determined to do what he couldn't in Tokyo. **PTI**

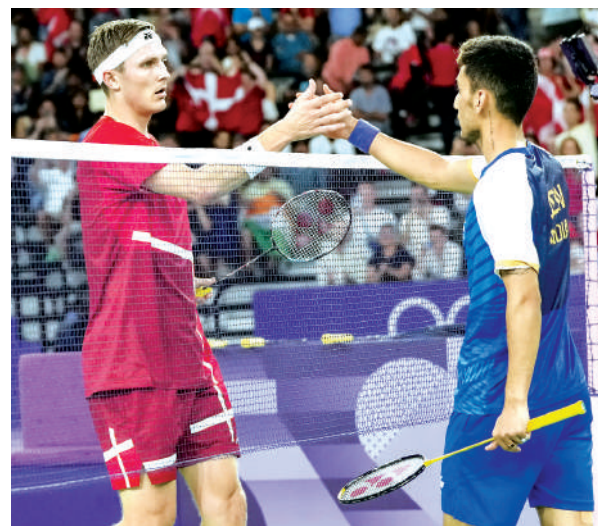

Avinash Sable finishes 11th in men's 3000m steeplechase final

PARIS: India's Avinash Sable failed to keep pace with the best in the business as he finished 11th in the Paris Olympics men's 3000m steeplechase final race here on Wednesday. The 29-year-old Sable clocked 8 minutes 14.18 seconds while crossing the finish line after running in the lead briefly in the dramatic race. Sable had recently broken his own national record with a time of 8:09.91 seconds at the Paris Diamond League. He has been training abroad for a long time in preparation for the Paris Games on funding from the government. Soufiane El Bakali of Morocco defended his title, clocking his season's best of 8:06.05 while Kenneth Rooks (8:06.41) of USA and Abraham Kibiwot (8:06.47) of Kenya took silver and bronze respectively. World record holder Lamecha Girma of Ethiopia did not finish the race as he fell on the track towards the end.

Praveen Jayawickrama charged for breaching ICC anti-corruption code

India clinches historic hockey bronze again

The Indian men's hockey team secured a historic bronze medal at the Paris Olympics, their second successive Olympic bronze after 52 years, with a thrilling 2-1 comeback win over Spain, providing a perfect farewell for veteran goalkeeper PR Sreejesh.

India came back from a 2-3 semi-final defeat to dominate possession against Spain.

PARIS: In a historic achievement, the Indian men's hockey team clinched a bronze medal at the Olympic Games, marking their second successive bronze medal win after 52 years. The thrilling 2-1 comeback victory over Spain not only secured the medal but also provided a fitting farewell to veteran goalkeeper PR Sreejesh on Thursday.

The match was a nail-biting affair, especially in the final minutes, as India faced two short corners within the last minute. However, the defense stood firm under immense pressure, ensuring the team's victory. This bronze medal adds to India's previous success in the Tokyo Games, where they ended a 41-year medal drought.

The last time India won back-to-back Olympic medals was in the 1968 (bronze) and 1972 (bronze) editions. The bronze in Paris was a much-needed triumph for the Indian contingent, which had faced six fourth-place finishes and the heartbreaking disqualification of wrestler Vinesh Phogat.

Spain initially took the lead in the 18th minute with skipper Marc Miralles converting a penalty stroke. However, India captain Harmanpreet Singh turned the tide with two goals in the

30th and 33rd minutes, securing a brace and stealing the limelight. Despite their heart-wrenching 2-3 defeat against Germany in the semifinal, India came out determined

to dominate possession from the start. In the first quarter, they were offensive, regularly penetrating Spain's defense and creating scoring chances. Vice-captain Hardik Singh orchestrated a fine

move from the right, passing to Sukhjeet Singh, whose shot narrowly missed the Spanish goal. Spain increased their intensity in the second quarter, pressing hard

on the Indian goal. They took the lead through Miralles' penalty stroke after Manpreet Singh's unnecessary foul inside the D. Despite back-to-back penalty corners in the 20th minute and

another in the 28th, India's defense held strong.

Trailing, India pressed hard on Spain's defense, securing their first penalty corner in the 29th minute but failing to convert. Just 21 seconds from halftime, Manpreet compensated for his earlier mistake by earning another penalty corner, which Harmanpreet successfully converted, equalizing the score.

In the 35th minute, India earned another penalty corner, but Harmanpreet's fierce stroke was blocked by Spanish goalkeeper Luis Calzado. Mandeep Singh's run resulted in another short corner, but Spanish defender Jordi Bonastre's knee blocked the attempt. Sreejesh's save maintained India's 2-1 lead until the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, Hardik Singh had to leave the field due to a hand injury after a collision. India made another short corner save, with Manpreet accidentally landing the ball on Hardik's foot. Spain's Marc Recasens missed the opportunity, much to India's relief. With three minutes left, Spain removed their goalkeeper in a desperate bid to equalize, but India's defense held firm. The final hooter confirmed India's 2-1 victory and a historic bronze medal, giving PR Sreejesh the perfect farewell.

The first Indian to compete in the 100m hurdles in the Olympics, the debutant produced another below-par show as she clocked 13.17s in her repechage heat to finish 16th overall out of 40 total runners.

It was well below the 24-year-old's national record of 12.78s and even worse than the 13.16s she clocked in her heats on Wednesday.

The top two in each repechage heat advanced to the semifinals.

South Africa's Marioune Fourie (12.79s) and Dutch athlete Maayke Tjin-A-Lim (12.87s) advanced to the semifinals from Heat 1.

Indian weightlifter Mirabai Chanu narrowly missed a second Olympic medal, finishing fourth in the women's 49kg event.

PARIS: Indian weightlifter Mirabai Chanu came tantalisingly close to clinching a second Olympic medal but a faltered lift in her final attempt cruelly snatched the dream from her grasp, leaving her with a fourth place finish in the women's 49kg event here on Wednesday. Mirabai, who turns 30 on Thursday, lifted a total of 199kg (88kg+111kg) at the South Paris Arena. It was 3kgs less than what she heaved at the Tokyo Olympics (202 kg) for a silver medal. Mirabai could manage

only three lifts out of six attempts. She had only one successful lift in the clean and jerk section.

"I am happy with the performance because I managed this despite having very little time for recovery," Mirabai told reporters.

PARIS: India's first individual Olympic gold medalist shooter Abhinav Bindra on Thursday paid glowing tributes to wrestler Vinesh Phogat, saying her fight resonated with him and she embodies the "true spirit of a warrior."

The 29-year-old, who had become the first Indian woman wrestler to reach an Olympic final, was left heartbroken after she was disqualified from the

50kg gold-medal bout for being 100gm overweight, prompting her to announce a shock retirement.

"It is said that sport is a celebration of human will. I have known that to be true many times in my career but never has it resonated more than today. As I look around me, I see a nation and its people celebrate your unyielding resolve," Bindra posted on 'X' along with a couple of pictures of meeting



her. "You are a fighter - on and off the mat. Through you, we are learning what it means to never lose the fight in us, even as a loss weighs heavily. You embody the true spirit of a warrior."

A three-time Olympian Vinesh, who has won gold medals in both the Asian and Commonwealth Games, took desperate measures to keep her weight within 50kg, which included going hungry, avoiding fluids and staying up all night

to sweat it out.

However, it was not to be as she still fell short of the mark and eventually ended up so dehydrated that she had to be put on IV fluids at a polyclinic in the Games Village.

"Not all victories look alike. Some end up as a glittering souvenir in a cabinet but the ones that matter more find their way into the stories we tell our children," Bindra continued in his post.

Broken Vinesh Phogat announces retirement

NEW YORK: Roughly three in every four American adults believe the upcoming presidential election is vital to the future of US democracy, although which candidate they think poses the greater threat depends on their political leanings, according to a poll. The survey from The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research finds that most

Democrats, Republicans and independents see the election as "very important" or "extremely important" to democracy, while Democrats have a higher level of intensity about the issue. More than half of Democrats say the November election is "extremely important" to the future of US democracy, compared to about 4 in 10 independents and Republicans. Democrat Pamela Hanson, 67, of Amery, Wisconsin, said she has grave

concerns for the future of democracy in the country if Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump gets elected. "His statements tend towards

him being a king or a dictator, a person in charge by himself," Hanson said. "I mean, the man is unhinged in my opinion." But Republican Ernie Wagner from Liberty, New York, said it's President Joe Biden's administration -- of which Vice President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee, is a part -- that has abused the power of the executive branch. "Biden has tried to erase the student loans, and he's been told by the courts

that it's unconstitutional to do that," said Wagner, 85. "He's weaponised the FBI to get at his political opponents." The poll findings suggest that many Democrats continue to view Trump as a threat to democracy after he tried to overturn the results of the 2020 election, embraced the rioters who attacked the US Capitol on January 6, 2021, and threatened to seek retribution against his opponents if he wins reelection.

Policemen in B'desh slowly returning to working places

DHAKA: Policemen in Bangladesh were slowly returning to work from Thursday in response to the call by the newly-appointed chief, the official media reported, amidst the political turmoil and street violence in the country. Following the fall of the Sheikh Hasina government on Monday due to student-led protests, several police stations were attacked and set on fire, leading to many officers evacuating their stations due to the threat of more attacks. More than 400 people, including police personnel, were killed in the violence centring the students' movement. On Wednesday, the newly-appointed Inspector General of Police, Md Mainul Islam, ordered officers to join their respective units within the next 24 hours.

The tsunami advisory was lifted from most coastlines except those along the Miyazaki prefecture. Seismologists at the agency held an emergency meeting to analyse whether

the quake had affected the nearby Nankai Trough, the source of past devastating earthquakes. They later issued an assessment that the potential for a future quake in the area from Kyushu to central Japan is higher than previously predicted. The agency said it will continue to closely watch movements of plates near the Nankai Trough. That does not mean there's an imminent danger of a big quake in the near future, but they urged residents on the coasts along the trough -- which spans about 500 kilometres (310 miles) -- to review their quake preparedness, University of Tokyo seismologist Naoshi Hirata, a member of an expert panel, told a joint news conference with JMA officials.

PRESIDENT'S RESIGNATION DEMANDED Police hurl tear gas at protesters in Kenya as Cabinet ministers are sworn in



NAIROBI: Police hurled tear gas at protesters calling for the president's resignation in the Kenyan capital on Thursday as a new Cabinet was sworn in. The protests in Nairobi were organised by activists upset with President William Ruto even after he dismissed almost all of his ministers and added opposition members to what he called a "broad-based" government. Businesses in the city were closed and public transport vehicles remained out of the central business district where they nor-

mally operate. Police also mounted roadblocks on roads leading to the city. The president's office, where the new ministers were sworn in on Thursday morning, also remained cordoned off. Major towns and cities including the lakeside city of Kisumu -- an opposition stronghold that has previously witnessed protests -- remained calm with some residents telling journalists they were not protesting because the opposition figures had been incorporated into the new Cabinet. **PTI**

LONDON: British anti-racism campaigners filled the streets of towns and cities across the country and police put on a massive show of force, largely stifling a threatened wave of far-right demonstrations. Carrying signs saying "Refugees Welcome" and chanting "Who's streets?" people turned out in force on

the offices of immigration attorneys that had been listed as potential targets for hard-right attacks. The government also declared a national critical incident, putting 6,000 specially trained police on standby to respond to any disorder. Police said that protests and counter-protests were largely peaceful, though a small number of arrests were made.

"The show of force from the police and, frankly, the show of unity from communities together defeated the challenges that we faced," Commissioner Mark Rowley, the head of London's Metropolitan Police Service, said Thursday. "It went off very peacefully last night, and the fears of extreme right disorder were abated."
